A reliable source was advised by PU, Chao-min, New China News Agency, Ottawa, that on June 17, 1971 PU was contacted by Susan WARREN of New York. WARREN advised PU that she would come to Ottawa on June 19, 1971 as she had "some interesting things" to talk over with him.

- 2. On June 19, 1971 source advised that Susan WARREN arrived in Ottawa and was met at the Airport by PU, Chao-min. Source was unable to supply any information concerning the meeting between PU and WARREN.
- 3. Source indicated that following the meeting WARREN was driven to the airport by PU where she departed Ottawa.

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
