On 4/24/69, STENT edvised that on 4/8/69 former NT 2524-S telephonically contacted LIN, solvising LIN that ha had recently seen a New York Times prticle dealing with possible restoration of China-Conada Relations and in which LIN's name appeared and he whiled to interview LIM. By way of documentation, former NY 2524-S advised LIN that he had interviewed CHOU En-Lai in Nor Celhi in 1955 and he was personally acquainted with SZETO KUNG, a New China News Agency representative in Hong Kong. Former NY 2524-S was advised by LIN to contact his later at which ties he would have a definite answer. On 4/10/69. former NY 2524-S recontected LIN, telephonically, at which time LIN stated that he would not submit to an interview honever, he would be very much interested in talking to former NY 2524-S. A luncheon date with former NY 2524-S was set for April 29, 1969, at the faculty longe at McGill University, Nontreal, Canada.

On 4/29/69, and contacted WFO and advised as follows:

On 4/28/69, he set with PAUL LIN at the faculty lotinge at McGill University, Montreal, Canada, as previously arranged through talaphonic contact with LIN. (He had been furnished LIN's mane by and prior to that had never heard of LIN.) He spent approximately two bours with LIN and LIN was vory receptive and friendly towards and the China hainland, possibly during the October celebrations; however, LIN suggested that the letter has not have to wait that long. LIN suggested that a lotter be directed to CHOU En-Lai indicating his desires. When any set if sent directly, LIN cuggested the possibility of sending it through the Chinese Labassy, Paris.
