SSC letter of 11/26/75, contained 28 requests for access. We previously have submitted 4 FBI memoranda dated 12/8/75, 12/18/75, 1/6/76, and 1/7/76, responding to these requests. This memorandum responds to the remaining items that have been outstanding and which are mentioned in this memorandum.
