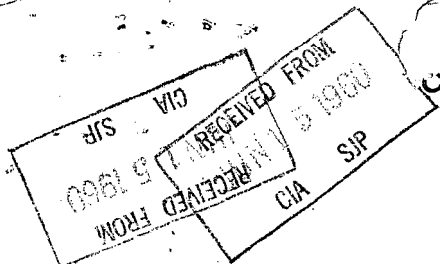

1. This office requests clearance for passing [redacted]  
the following information contained in a memorandum from  
Cleveland, Ohio, dated 8 January 1959, subject and file number as  
indicated above:

a. "William Alexander MORGAN was born 19 April 1928 in  
Cleveland, Ohio. His family moved to Toledo, Ohio when  
he was one year old. He attended Rosary Cathedral School  
and for two years was a student at Central Catholic High  
School. He spent one year in the United States Merchant  
Marines and then enlisted in the United States Army from  
which he was dishonorably discharged. During 1957  
MORGAN was employed by Munart Music Company in  
Dayton, Ohio and at that time his residence was listed  
as 99 Patterson Village Drive, Dayton, Ohio. He had  
previously been employed as custodian at the Holy Rosary  
Cathedral, Toledo, Ohio. He met the Cuban rebel leaders  
in Miami, Florida. He was married to Theresa (nee name  
not given) in Miami, Florida in 1954. They have two  
children. As of January 1959, his wife and children were  
residing in Toledo, Ohio.

b. "According to MORGAN's father, William ran away from  
his problems since he was a youngster. MORGAN senior  
stated that in his opinion his son was emotionally disturbed  
and believed he was in need of psychiatric help. In  
December 1958 MORGAN senior stated that his son left  
home on December 26, 1957, and he had not heard from  
him or seen him since that time.

- c. "An article appearing in the January 9, 1959 edition of the Toledo Blade, a Toledo, Ohio, daily newspaper reflected that William A. MORGAN, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. W. MORGAN, 2909 Collingwood Boulevard, has been named Army Chief of the Fidel CASTRO forces in Cienfuegos Las Villas Province, Cuba.
- d. "The indices of the Toledo Police Department contain the following data on William Alexander MORGAN aka "SINBAD" aka "GABBY", 2909 Collingwood Boulevard, Toledo, Ohio.

Federal Reformatory Chillicothe, Ohio	William A. MORGAN	2-18-49 arrested for robbery and escape 3 years
Federal Correction Institute, Milan, Michigan	William A. MORGAN	4-22-49, (Arrested for robbery, <sup>and escape</sup> in transit and escape from Federal Reformatory, Chillicothe, Ohio <sup>11</sup> )

2. The records of the Toledo Police Department also indicated that "on April 4, 1946, following his arrest on the previous day, MORGAN was questioned and admitted participation in a number of armed robberies. An officer of the Toledo Police advised on January 5, 1959, that MORGAN also had a rather extensive arrest record as a juvenile and had the reputation of being an associate of the hoodlum element in the City of Toledo."
