The reaction in Havana to the assassination of President KENNEDY has been calm but cautious. Only isolated Communist groups have shown any rejoicing. The radio and news reels are reporting objectively and in a correct manner, without showing regret [2 gr G] statement by the government. The newspapers are printing today the statements of the Cuban Ambassador to the United Nations.
