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

The assualt to which President KENNEDY was exposed created deep emotion and regret among the people as well as among government circles. There have been announcements by press and radio about the life of (B val the deceased) and the great problems which he brought to successful conclusions.

The King sent telegrams of condolences to Mrs. KENNEDY and to the new President and he summoned the American Ambassador to personally express his regrets. Monday, the twenty fifth of the month, was proclaimed a day of mourning in all Morocco.

A delegation of ten persons, led by Prince ABDULLAH, left for Washington [6 gr G/U] to represent the King at the funeral ceremony. Included in this delegation are the Ministers of Foreign Affairs and [1 gr G], a general and the Director of Palace Protocol.



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
