Government according to a report of 12 December He has drafted a stinging out of reply to the American Ambassador's protest over official celebration by the Cambodian Government of Marshall SARIT's death, which by implication was linked to that of President KENNEDY. SIHANOUK also intends to break off U.S./Cambodian negotiations over the termination of economic and military aid, giving AID and MAAG personnel five days to leave Cambodia, withdraw Cambodian Ambassador NONG KIMNY from Washington, and abandon his proposal for a conference to guarantee Cambodian neutrality and independence.
