Subject: Letter from Alberto Muller to President Kennedy

P1. Muller gained prominence in 1960 when he led demonstration of protest in laying of a wreath by Mikoyan on statue of Marx. He now heads DRE, a Miami-based exile organization created by CIA. Muller was infiltrated into Cuba on 19 Nov 1960 to carry on clandestine propaganda & political action among students. Work includes broadcasting, publication of student newspaper,  
(both clandestine), bombing for psychological effects & organization of student resistance. Most important accomplishment has been organization of a student strike which has caused GOC to take violent countermeasures.

A letter to Pres. Kennedy arrived in U.S. 7 Feb. to be delivered personally by 3 DRE members. Similar letter also going to President Quadros of Brazil. Letter expresses aspirations of Cuban students for a truly democratic, social, economic & political betterment of Cuba. Letter appeals for understanding of DRE's revolutionary aims, for

reorientation of Panamericanism toward a policy of deeds in defense of liberty & justice.

DRE now maintains a pool of capable & qualified students available for 3-6 month assignments in any given area. They are experienced clandestine agents in Cuban struggle. Capabilities include: act as authentic representatives of Cuban struggle for progress but against communist tyranny;

- Establish local press, TV, Radio, student intellectual, professional contacts;
- Plan, organize & participate in anti-communist activities as CIA stations might direct;
- Counteract influence of Cuban diplomatic establishment on host populations.

Request stations indicate interest & inform what cover mechanisms (i.e. invitations, scholarships) available - also what desire for contact, control or guidance.

Report of interview with Eliot Mas of DRE

Mas said DRE entered CRC with aim of waging war against Castro but discovered Council members were more concerned with politics and quarreling among themselves, even to the point of creating internal problems within their own organizations.

Notes from WAVE monthly report

DRE withdrew from CRC on 13 March 1962 because they felt Council was not carrying the war to Cuba.

Attachment A: ~~At the time of Alberto Mueller's arrest in Cuba, the DRE continued to be guided by CIA but resented its absolute control over them. CIA's inability to help Mueller caused bitter criticism among DRE members.~~ Control over DRE became superficial & material until late 1961 when time had worn away some of the shock & other activities were intensified. This resulted in higher morale & confidence in future support. Propaganda campaigns in support of Mueller & Miguel Garcia saved them twice from the firing squad.

Juan Saloat & other DRE members left Marathon Key on 24 August ~~25~~ in two vessels & fired on Hotel Rosita Hornedo & <sup>Blanquita (correction cable)</sup> Chaplin Theatre. Operation without knowledge or consent of CIA.

DRE experiencing friction with CIA & displays contempt for CIA & U.S. govt. Feel U.S. is a weak, vacillating nation which does not understand power or action. ~~CIA~~ Cable expresses opinion that real potential of DRE is in psychological field, which activity is least appealing to the group.

WAVE feels relationship with DRE deteriorating & recommends early termination of AMSPELL project.

② 8 Dec. 1962 Memo for - McGeorge Bundy from Richard Helms, DDP

A reliable penetration source in DRE says this group preparing a letter for Pres. Kennedy that they still expect him to "fulfill his promise to liberate Cuba." Further will state that if steps are

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not taken by U.S. govt, the DRE "will act." Assume this statement means DRE would resume commando raids against Cuba. Source has been asked to head the projected political movement & Helms says source will try to dissuade DRE from sending letter.

Activities focused on International Student Conference at Quebec & the infiltration from Cuba of AMHINT-53 who had infiltrated Cuban on 20 May 1962.

② Undated statement . Subject: DRE  
Item 7 - The DRE is perhaps the most militant and most deeply motivated of all the Cuban exile groups. Is prone to undertake independent operations without warning or permission of CIA. Control over this organization does not exist. Monthly support amounts to about \$20,000 for student operations in LA and \$25,000 for salaries, office expenses, propaganda & training.

- ① Alemán recently arrived from Cuba & had a list of war materials allegedly purchased by Castro from Soviet Bloc Countries. On 13 Dec 1960, Luis C. Rodriguez visited Alemán about this information.
- ② Subject gave DOB as 12/28/31, Havana, Cuba.
- ③ Is in Miami looking over property inherited from his father who was Minister of Education in Administration of Ramon Grau San Martin.
- ④ Alemán's father allegedly misappropriated about 60 million pesos from Public Treasury which he invested or deposited in Miami. Subject inherited father's fortune & spent a large amount supplying Castro with weapons & equipment. After Castro assumed power, he confiscated Alemán's estate in Cuba & his homes there have been

repeatedly searched.

Aleman stated he has been furnishing local FBI with information concerning Cuban intelligence agents in this area.

Also supplied info. to CIA about cases 34090 and 34196.

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
