In connection with this Committee's investigation into the circumstances surrounding the death of President John F. Kennedy, we respectfully request access to Volume One of the Cuban Mugbooks reviewed by-AMMUG/1 at his home on 9 April 1971. AMMUG/1's case officer, [Eustace D. KLOOCK,] COS/WH/Miami was present when AMMUG/1 reviewed this mugbook. This review is reported in a CIA Dispatch dated 13 April 1971. The dispatch is numbered UFAA-2925.

We also respectfully request that the personnel files for [George Witner,] aka [Doug Gup-ton,] for the period 1959 to 1964, be made available for review by HSCA staff members. Mr. Witner was a CIA case officer who worked on the Bay of Pigs project. We would also appreciate it if you would make [Mr. Witner] available for an interview by HSCA staff members. It is our understanding that he is presently employed by your Agency and is located in the Washington metropolitan area.
