I've been following the progress of the House Select Committee on Assassinations and its chief counsel as well as newspaper and wire service stories permit.

I gather, at least from a Newhouse News Service report, that the committee unanimously has agreed to support your request for a staff of 170 but that the actual funding will not follow until after January 1.

If that's the case, and you can use me now, I'd like to come to Washington and get involved as early as possible. I think I can be more effective in the role of press liaison officer if I arrive on the scene before the great bulk of the staff.

I have received a formal letter from Bulletin management confirming an extended lewve of absence. But this does not preclude a short-term leave. Even if Congress ultimately refuses to fund the investigations fully and they are cut short, I feel I could return to the Bulletin without loss of face or funds. The experience of working for even a few weeks or months with the committee would be worth the effort.

Also, even though I would move to Washington immediately, Shirley and Sharon would remain in Philadelphia to June 30. I, therefore, would not get involved with a long-term me lease until the summer. So, if the investigations are terminated early, there would be little financial hardship on my part.
