ADMINISTRATIVE

By letter dated April 30, 1959 the Bureau advised that it would obtain through liaison the records of the Senate Select Committee on improper activities in the Labor and Management field as related to MARCELLO.

By communication dated February 10, 1959, the New York Office advised the Bureau that CI FRED BARON had information that EDDIE FLYNN, true name TOMMY HYLAND, had given a Mr. MARCELLUS (PH) a briefcase containing money that was apparently an errand for VITO GENOVESE, New York hoodlum. In view of the confidential nature of this information, it is not being reflected in the report.

New York has been requested to advise if any additional information is developed reflecting a contact between VITO GENOVESE. This information is not to be disseminated.
