 Attempt to Recruit Cuban Nationals for Military Service

1. On 12 March 1962, the undersigned was contacted by Captain Welter F. Buxley, Provost Marshal, Camp Larcy Johnson, New Orleans, Louisians, with the Collocing report:

A Private First Class Jeparo A. Nuser, a Cuban national serving with the 169th Transportation Company, 3500 Transportation Battalion (Terminal), Camp Larry Johnson, reported to his commanding officer that he had heard of an attempt by some Faderal agency to recruit Cuban personnel for Airborne and Special Forces training, and that he desired to transfer to such an organization.

2. When contacted by a mamber of this office on 13 March 1962, incley arranged for an interview of Nunes, who reported substantially the fallowings

On 11 March 1962, Munes was told by a friend, Rasgo Marysnes, a civilian Cuban refugee residing at 1002 Milan Street, New Orleans, that Martenez and five other civilian Cuban refugees of the New Orleans area were contacted by representatives of a Federal amenoy in an attempt to enlist them for military training. Egruenes believed that the meeting with the representatives of the Pederal agency was arranged by Mrs. Albert Cempirita, an official of the Cuban Center, a relief and recreation organisation for Cuban refugees, at 2526 Beyon/ Boad, New Orleans. Other persons who/attended the meeting were Carlos Fringder. Parkshester Apartmente, 1936 Paris Ayemus, New Orleans; Inn Cupco, whose address is unknown to Martenes; and three officer Cuben refugees whose identities are not known to Martenes. Arresto Rodrizies, a US citizen of Cuben birth who is director of the Derlits School of Languages, 1209 St. Charles Avenue, New Orleans, accompunled the Cuman refugees to the moeting as an interpreter. On approximately March 1962, the group traveled to an area of New Orleans near the Industrial anal which darkness believed to rescable an even comp. There the group was not y two men yearing divilian clothes who verbally identified themselves as a optain uni a rejor of the Louisiana National Ocard. Before the termination of the meeting, the group was joined by another person who was introduced as a colonel of the Louisiana National Duard. These individuals attempted to exlist embers of the Guban group for service in the National Guard with a six-conth topining period in the active Army, during which time they would receive special lorges and airborne training at Fort Braye, North Carolina. Martenes is not . Went in the use of the English language; therefore, he does not recall the names of the persons with whom the group met. Martenes believes that Arnesto Redrigues and Mrs. Albert Cerniglia would know their names. During the discussion of training which would be given the men, the possibility of an invasion attempt of Cuba was mentioned. One member of the Cuban group asked if Cuban nationals serving in the US army would be authorized to take part in office by any to invade or overthrow the gresent Other government. Armente Rodrigues, who attended the moeting with the Curan group, is influential in the affairs of the Cuban refugees of this area and is a member of the Cuban Lephcratic Retolationary Front, an organization with respicanters in Richard Florida.
