D. CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES

On March 19, 1958, DAVE OSTICCO, who is the subject of a current anti-racketeering investigation in the Philadelphia Office, was interviewed by SA FREDERICK T. HOULIHAN and he advised that he went to the home of JOSEPH FAREARA in Apalachin, N.Y., on November 14, 1957, accompanied by ANGELO SCIANDRA.

Confidential Informant T-8 advised SA FRANK W. MULDERIG on March 28, 1958, that he is convinced the purpose of the meeting on November 14, 1957, at the home of JOSEPH FAREARA was to take control of the women's garment industry. He said that LEONARD FLANDINO, who is a partner of ANGELO SCIANDRA in the S & B Machine Company, which is located in the plant owned by ANGELO SCIANDRA in Pittston, Pa., told him that that was the purpose of the meeting and further that on other occasions he heard NICK ALAIMO and SAMMY DI FELLA, associates of RUSSELL PUFALINO, discussing the purpose of the meeting and they too in their conversation said that was the purpose of the meeting.

T-8 said that the only one who told him directly the purpose of the meeting was LEONARD FLANDINO but on three other occasions he overheard conversations between ALAIMO and DI FELLA indicating the above was the purpose of the meeting.

The meeting was to include jobbers, manufacturers, truckers, and others who would have only a financial interest in the industry. The meeting was for the purpose of deciding what preparation or what interest or what phase of the operation each would have when they took control of the industry. He said they intend eventually to put pressure on buyers to force them to buy garments from their group.

T-8 said that SCIANDRA and his associates in the Pittston area intended to completely dominate the area from
