RECOMMENDATION (X)(u)

It is recommended that contacts with this potential informant be discontinued. [REDACTED] is former NY [5844] PSI. He was originally developed for direction as a potential double agent against the Cuban Intelligence Service (CIS), inasmuch as [he is a lifelong friend] of former Cuban Mission to the United Nations (CMUN) counsellor MIGUEL ALFONSO MARTINEZ. ALFONSO, however, returned to Cuba "for vacation", during December, 1965, and remained there. During the past two years, [REDACTED] has unsuccessfully attempted to prompt CIS interest through a Bureau approved letter to JOSE MANUEL GALARDY ALARCON, former CMUN 3rd Secretary, and an unknown CIS officer, through a Bureau approved personal visit to the CMUN. Most recently, source directed a Bureau approved letter to MIGUEL ALFONSO, above, in Cuba, seeking the assistance of ALFONSO in securing the exit from Cuba of source's mother-in-law. This communication was channelled through the CMUN and it was hoped that an attempt to recruit [REDACTED] would thereafter be made by the CIS. This letter was mailed in January, 1969, but no reply has been received from ALFONSO, now has any attempt been made by the CIS to contact [REDACTED]. During the intervening period, [REDACTED] has attempted, without success, to become involved in Miami area militant anti-CASTRO activities. He is currently seeking evening employment to supplement his income as a Colgate-Palmolive salesman, and it is felt that continuing contacts are not warranted in this matter. [REDACTED] has advised that should he be contacted by the

CIS he would immediately advise the Miami Office

Informant has furnished information concerning a Cuban exile who recently arrived in the United States from Ecuador, where he has lived since fleeing Cuba in approximately 1961. According to source, this individual, who had a medium level position in the CASTRO government prior to his departure from Cuba, remains pro-CASTRO. The Miami Office is investigating this allegation. Source has furnished no other information concerning specific individuals. (S)(u)
