In July, 1949, a source who is considered reliable advised, "Last February and March a Soviet agent called Chapiro' whose real name is Sokoline-Chapiro and who lives at 7 Rue St. Legar, Geneva, Switzerland was successful in having two young women employed by the United Nations as teletypists. It has been ascertained beyond doubt that both of these women are Soviet agents. They are working at present with the United Nations in the United States at Lake Success. 16 (The source of this information has been recontacted on several occasions in an effort to secure more complete data. He was last contacted in February, 1955, at which time he advised he was not now and will not in the future be in a position to furnish any additional information. KIt was assumed that the women were employed by the UN in Geneva at the time they were recruited and were later transferred to the United States. The only female who 100 FILED fitted into this category during the pertinent period was Renee Noireau now Mrs. Michel Parisot De La Valette. (S) Investigation has railed to establish that either of the subjects has engaged in pro-Soviet or pro-Communist activities." They have, on the contrary, been described as strongly anti-Communist in thought and speech. investigations would be to interview the subjects. However, in view of the lack of a sound allegation on which to base an interview and the fact that the subjects are the employees, the Bureau does not desire the subjects to be interviewed.

Unless you have information which would dictate otherwise, you are authorized to place these cases in a closed status.

NOTE: Confidential Bureau source Pat O'Brien furnished the data concerning the two alleged Soviet female agents at the UN. At the has not been possible to identify these individuals due to the lack of more complete data. Pat O'Brien advised liaison that he is now "out of business." It does not appear that any clarification will be forthcoming from the original source. The cases against the subjects are based on conjecture and it therefore does not appear desirable to continue these investigations. Pat O'Brien was contacted in connection with the information furnished by him in March, 1950, and on 3-3-55.
