

A source furnished the following information to a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on February 19, 1968:

This source advised that he and his wife were in San Juan, Puerto Rico from December 2 - 15, 1967. He stated that the lasters of the last week of his trip, around December 13, 1967, he was sitting in the lobby of the Holiday Inn, half asleep and overheard a conversation, in English, between two Negro couples.

This source advised that it appeared that the couples had prearranged plans to meet at the Holiday Inn, possibly to eat, and source does not believe that they were registered, as he did not see them before or after.

The source said that from the conversation, at least one couple appeared to be from California, as they were commenting and comparing Governor Reagan to the former Governor Brown.

Source could recall no descriptive information concerning one of the couples, but he stated that the man who did most of the talking was approximately 6'3" to 6'4" in height, and had on a black hat that flopped down on one side. The woman with him was extremely well dressed, short and heavy set.

The Negro man doing the talking stated a Negro, supposedly an associate of Martin Luther King, Jr., and formerly an open advocate of violence, was to "hit" King during the Washington March this spring, so as to place the blame on a white man in the march. By "Hit", the source took this as to kill King. This incident was to be used to incite full scale rioting.
