SUBJECT has been under investigation by this office since March 1946 and it has been reasonably well established that SUBJECT was or is connected with a Soviet Espionege Ring operating in AUGSEURG (149/137). Present investigation is sized at consolidating the results of all previous investigations together with all new information available.

  - (1) On 13 March 1946 SUBJECT was arrested by this office in connection with the Binko Stoop Operation and imprisoned in the augusting City Juli for interrogation. August olaimed that his father, a Russian, had taken up residence in RIGA, latvie, prior to 1914 where he married Matella, nee DELLS. SUBJECT claimed to have been born in RIGA where he had lived until the occupation of Latvia by Rossian troops in 1940. In October 1942 SUBJECT joined the "Latvian Corps" fighting the Cormons under the supervision of the Soviet Army. Be was sent to OCS in SARAIJK near MO300% and upon completion of the course was appointed first lightenent in the "Latvien Corps". SUBJECT was appointed commander of the End Infantry Co., 771st Rifle kegt. In November 1945 he was promoted to the rank of captain and made CO of the let Rifle Bn., 771st Bifle Rogt., of the time deployed at YITEBLE. Shortly thereefter UHJECT was promoted to major and was appointed assistent Regimental Commander in charge of the 3-3 and 3-4 sections. On 80 March 1944 MINJACT was taken prisonor by Garman troops in REVAL, Estonie, and, since he had been wounded, he was sent to a PM hospital in DVINGK, Latvia. On 15 July 1944 SURJECT claimed to have been released from the PM Camp because of the intervention of his mother and his uncle who allogedly was a professor of geology in some Latvian university. AUBJECT then took up residence in his mother's opertment in RIGs. On 24 september 1944 SUBJECT was sent by the Germans to Danilo, erriving there is December 1944. From there he was goved on to ROSANHAIM near Billin (N53/275), where he stayed three (3) weeks in a camp for everyted persons. In February 1945 he was trensferred to a PX camp in \$CER. GOR where he was attached to a labor commande. On 14 April 1948 BUSJECT was transferred to FUESEN (MAS/DES).

Bavaria, where he worked four (4) days until the occupation of this town by American troops. From 18 May 1945 until 18 June 1945 SUBJECT lived in a DF camp in GARMISCH (M48/D58) from where he was transferred to the Wochfeld DF Camp in AUDDEURG. Since he feared repatriation to his native country, DUBJECT found himself a private spartment at Oberlanderstrasse 132 where he allegedly lived until 14 September 1945. Again to escape repatriation SUBJECT moved to another apartment in FFRENCE (quarter of AUGSEURG), Elsaesserstrasse 6, where he lived until his errest by this office in March 1946.

(2) On 16 July 1948 the British Intelligence Division in a letter to Group Hendquerters NUCON reported that reliable sources (unspecified) had informed them that JARDSEGS had been a captain in the Boviet New and that during the war he had worked for the MVD.

OURISCT was also believed to have been a member of "Operation Reppelin" (AN: 5D Intelligence Organization operating in CaR 1944 to 1945 exploying predesinately Russian agents) as a Soviet agent, and is considered by the RIB as one of their most able counter intelligence agents.

(3) On 15 February 1967 OUNGER was interrogated at the 7707 MIS Center and stated as follows:

20 Jul 14° Born on an estate near Ryagan (southerst of Moscow) as illegitimate son of Foreman on the estate. \*(According to the old Russian calendar; the modern date would be 2 August 1914)

1917 Moved with his mother to her home village in district of Insar (Merdevsk Autonomous SER). His father left for Moscow and has not been heard of since then. Lived on farm of grandfather and went to village school.

1929-1932 Went to Inser secondary school.

1932 Went to Muraenak where he had friends, but his drunken disorderliness compelled him to return home.

Noviz-Jan35 Entered a trade school for rope weaving, but as he did not belong to the Communist Party he was unable to continue there.

Feb 33 Merried Anna Ketsapava

Sep 33 Accepted teaching position at primary school in village of Kolemasov.

1935 Separated from his first wife; married Merie Baranova.

Feb 35 Lost his job because of drunkenness and remained out of work for rest of year.

Obtained job in "Marmanribe" trust: denounced his Oat 40 hose for emboraling funds.

ave 41 Transferred to outskirts of Europak.

Arrested by MEVD, accused of enteraling 8,000 rubles. 28 Cep 41 and of shirking military service; Jakuschow glaims that this was result of his elteroation with former boss. Received ton reers of hard labor and was sent to labor camp.

Freed upon request to go to the front and joined 57th 6 005 42 Rifle Regt.

> wounded in hand and admitted to hospital in Sayansk. where he was, in spits of his protests (?), accidentally registered as first lieutenent.

Assigned to 175th Reserve Rest. in Kurak. For not preventing a brawl between other officers, he was denoted to private and given three months in a penal battalion.

Sent to front, made platoon leader and ordered to take a certain height. Wounded and captured by the Germans. he was taken to verious hospitals, first to Orcha and then to Borisov, where the ROA was recruiting sen for its rengs.

"Almost entirely without his consent" Jekushev and three of his fellow captives were transferred to an AGA unit. They were given German uniforms, but with different shoulder natches.

After first having been taken to Minsk, he was sosigned to work in Riga. Did clerical work in an intelligence unit in connection with documents, under a mon called (fau) Delle, probably providing German agents sent behind the Russian lines with the messacry doormento.


Went into Obergamergan and got in tough with US authorities, who sent him to a RP camp in Cormisch.

(4) At the time of Sweep Operation BINGO one Eduard REIGH-ARDY, GUNIECT's former landlord, residing at 162 Oberlaenderstrasse. AUGSBUAG, was interrogated and stated that while JACUSBUA, lived in his house he (SUBJECT) had told his that he was to be entrusted with an important mission from MOCCOV in connection with Communist activities in Germany. REICHARDY, who was a local Communist functionary, further stated that at that time he had frequently seen SUBJECT in Ressian Army uniform with the rank insignia and that JAEUSEON on one secation had shown him credentials identifying SUDJECT as major in the Red Army. The report further mentioned that JAZUARUF is said to have had a large radio set in his room at 168 Oberlaanderstrasse to which he listened regularly every night, and a mechanic who was once called in to repair it had stated that it contained an illegal type of mater (No Zvol)

(5): During the asme interrogation SUBJECT admitted having had in his possession MKYD oredentials which however he claimed were forged. A list, compiled in MassanBad, C.R on 83 Merch 1945 and containing the newes of members of the debrascht working for the Hauptest fuer Propaganda, i.e. the intelligence agency of the Vissoy Army. has been found and SUBJECT figures on this list under number 51 ca major of the SD. His own explanation, when focad with this evidence, that in the turnoil at the time be did not know on what list his name




had been entered, is highly unconvincing. The following identity decrements were found on JUBIECT's person at this time. A certificate made by German authorities in ALDIEG deted 19 Japuary 1945 stating that all his personal papers were lost in an air raid; an AEG registration certificate deted AUGIEUEC 25 July 1945; an identity card from an AUGIEUEC DF Camp dated 19 Navember 1945; a certificate of registration with the AUGIEUEC labor of fice dated 5 Japuary 1946. (C-3)

- (6) On 17 May 1946 5/A Ludwig OFFERENIM of this office questioned from REICHARD at her home 162 Oberlanderstrasse. From REICHARD stated that SUDJECT frequently wore a Russian uniform while residing at that address and had shown her his decorations and sajor's rank insignia. The same report also mentions that SUDJECT's wife Anna had served as interpreter for the Soviet Repetriction Missian (AR: Lecontion unspecified). One Shara SCHAFORSTONE, mistress of JAMUSCHOK's closest associate, Mikolai WATLOR, stated to source "A-86" (AM: unidentifiable at this time) that JAMUSCHOK told her that he had worked for three (3) years in the "Counter Espionage Service." (No Eval)
- (7) In May 1946 SUBJECT told "A-ES", who posed as a coprisoner, that he would pretend to be anti-Communistic during interrogation. SUBJECT further admitted that he was in contact with several "supreme leaders of the undercover organization" (AN: unspecified), and that SUBJECT was well informed as to the constitution and manner of work of the CIC as he had been engaged in the same work for the Seviet Union.
- (8) On 21 May 1946 an unnessed Russian anjor appeared at the AUGSBURG Public Safety Office requesting SUBJECT's release from oustedy for purposes of repatriction. This request was decied by Lt. (fau) MoDCNALD, FSO. (A-S) The following day 3/A GASTOM of this office was handed a letter at the G-E's office 9th Divisional Readquarters, dated 10 May 1946 requesting SUBJECT's release for repatriction to Russian as SUBJECT was being charged with membership in the ROA (Russian Army of Liberation). The letter was signed by a Lt. Col. (fau) GAVRISCY, Senior Repatriction Officer, of 3rd US Army Headquarters. (A-1)
- (9) In August 1946 on unspecified source reports that one of AURISCT's agents is one Nikolai Balenac a Vincoradov, who during the war allegedly was sent by the RIS to the Us hone of Germany, where he found residence in the OBERANGERGAD DF Camp. Further listed as SUBJECT's agents were Boris Levis, Viadimir BUDDESO and one (four Law) Viadimir Course unnamed, F-6)
- (10) On 3 January 1948 Jakushow was arrested by the 15th CID Detnomment AUGORU-C on a charge of having MFCs in his possession. During interrogation he stated that he was born in RIGA, Latvia 20 July 1914 and was a major in the Aussian Army until 1945. (4-1)

(11) A TIR source reported that in August 1947 JAKUSHOR was the leader of a Soviet agent group in AUCOUS and that one mikalei WAYLOR was his deputy. Other members of the group were (fnu) Yalling Hay, Origori Postyakin, Merko Adela, (fnu) Maliyako, (fnu) Chuyalay, Grigori Bokhus, (fnu) MOVALEY, and (fnu) Leiba. One (fnu) Philadchikov of Hoshfeld DP Camp allegedly told source that AUDJECT, in the summer of 1945, appeared at Hochfeld in the uniform of a Amesian major, identified himself as a member of the MVD, and demanded billets. PRIEASCHIROY took CUMMECT to the Buergermeister of MAUDETETTES, who billeted SUBTROY in a private apartment. SUBJECT then allegedly collected names of DFS until he was arrested by CIC. One (fou) thuy Lav told the same source that in February 1948 he was told by a captain of the Soviet Mission in Min-ICH that he could regain the good graces of the Soviet Union by contacting damu. How at Judenbergatrasse 12, AUCSBULG, and following his inwhen CHUValler eppeared at BUBIECT's house DUBJECT was in jeil and JUBIECT's wife Anna referred big to WAYLOR. WAILOR then gave CHUVALLY the mission of penetrating ex-Col. (fnu) ZMITANOV's organization which allegedly was working against the Soviet Union in MUNICE. Source (not CHIVALEY) then succeeded in gaining WAYLOR's confidence and in tar 1948 WATLOR gave source a number of definite Ests (enumerated therein the original report). Warack also told source that SUBJECT would be relessed from jail on the 87 July 1948 and that on 28 July there would be a meeting at which source would be introduced to JAEUSIUS who would again take over the leadership of the group. (18) On 7 October 1948 MCCM Intelligence Division reported that JAKUSEDS received orders from Cal. (fou) SERASCENTROW. Objet of SM in ANSBACH (MBO/TOB), and that WATLOR accod as courier between non-ASCENIKOW and SUBJECT. As unnessed source was also reportedly introduced to one wasili PKI LIPOWITCH through SUBJECT's agency. FELLIPOWITCH also is attached to the Boviet Repatriation Mission is BMBBACH and allegedly gave source a set of Mals. (No Eval given, source unidentifiable. This report, however, probably originated from TIB).

(15) The TIB source reported that IUBINUT is in close contest with the SHM in ANSHARD, which entrusted him, JAKVAHOW, with the organization and operation of an intelligence net in AUGUEUNG. Source claimed to have penetrated this presization April 1948 and on UDIECT's recommendation applied for intelligence work with the SEM ANDRACH in writing, including an autobiography. Later he noticed that he was being investigated by Chico who accidentally admitted checking into source's LE ponte thigh ASS Eleveral months later source received a letter telling the See deposit to AN BACH where he went on 21 September 1948. 

- on the grounds that he had willfully and knowingly falsified documents and had willfully given false information in matters of official concern. This arrest was predicated on the Visa application SUBJECT had submitted. During interrogation of SUBJECT conducted at this office on 30 and 31 August 1949, SUBJECT edulated having been a member of the German schrmacht in COM during the early menths of 1945 in the rank of major. Detailed questioning on this point procluded any misunderstanding of SUBJECT's statements in this regard. (A-1) SUBJECT's admission of membership in the Schrmacht had been confirmed through previous reports and could be substantiated through the testimony of two (2) withouse (see below) who saw SUBJECT in the uniform of a German major in MASSICHED in March and April of 1945.
- 5. Investigation had developed that CUBJECT in his application for properties of the states filed in Mey 1949 and in his application for emigration, which he filed in July 1949, had failed to list his rehrmacht service and had, because of this emission, obtained DP status and eligibility for emigration. On I deptember 1949 JUBJECT was transferred to the custody of EICOG and resained in investigative custody until 3 November 1949. IRO officials, in particular Miss Amy MeDEMOTT, Chief of IRC Area 5 Control Center, were informed by this office of SUBJECT's Webrascht background and as a result deprived him of his DP status. (A-1) Miss MeDEMOTT then questioned JUBJECT at her office and SUBJECT denied to her ever having been a member of the Webrascht or to ever have made a statement to that effect. (B-2) SUBJECT at present has been released on bail and is awaiting the completion of trial on charges of document felsification and willful concealment of information of official concean. (A-1)





As improbable as it may appear on the surface, this egent believes that SUBJECT actually was in the rank of major in the SD, as research conducted by this egent developed information to the effect that particularly in Operation Seppolin of the GD, the Germans did make it a practice of hand picking likely Aussians from PV enclosures, Cat-Arbeiter camps, etc., for use as agents and that they in some cases were given high army ranks, although the pay scale was considerably less than that of regular German Army officers.
- (3) SUBJECT presumably them worked for the 3D as a Russian agent personnel for deployment behind Russian lines. In addition to that this agent believes that SUBJECT was also estive in the intelligence section dealing with the falsification of documents and identity papers. At the same



time it appears more than probable that SUBJECT was setually working as a double agent with the mission of penetrating CIS and possibly the ROA.

- 4) After the capitulation, SUBJECT appears to have had no trouble in establishing his pro-Allied sympathies to pertinent authorities and for a short time were the uniform of a Red Army major apparently with proper authorization. Immediately after capitulation SUBJECT also appeared to have rother evert contact with members of Russian aissions in this area until sudenly in approximately July 1945 SUBJECT makes every attempt of dississociating himself from official Russian contacts. It appears probable that at this time SUBJECT received his orders from MCCCC to go under cover and establish an applanage not in the AUGSEURS eres. This not appears to have been directed from AUSECH. As primary missions of this not can be considered the sathering of information concerning anti-moviet DV leaders, American military information and possibly forceful repairing tion of Russians wanted by the Soviet Union.
- (5) Unovaluated information indicated that towards the end of 1908 JUBICT was dismissed by his superiors in MUBACH presumably for lock of scivity, indisoration, drunkenness, and embessionent of MIS Tunds. So information has come to light indicating that JAKUSHUM has been engaged in any way in intelligence activity after December 1948. At present his finances appear to be extremely low, which would tend to confirm this supposition.
- (6) In this agent's opinion, however, SUBJECT is still an extremely dangerous man and the possibility that he is at present being used as sleeper agent cannot be dismissed. This agent will try to effect a conviction on the charges mentioned above and on that basis will explore all evanues leading to SUBJECT's expulsion from the US Zone of Cormany
- c. Recommendations: In view of the fact that Faul Dalls appears to be the only men known to this office who can give an accurate account of JANUSHUS's activity in 1946 to 1946, this agent recommends that a copy of this report be forwarded to the partinent fall office in LOS LEGALES, Colifornia for interrogation of Dalls. In view of Dalls's letter to SUBJACT, an quoted above, Dalls can hardly demy having had contact with SUBJACT. It is requested that a report of the FMI interrogation of Dalls be forwarded to this office. It is further recommended that all efforts be made to expel SUBJACT from the US cane of Censery.
