Concerning this contact. Facto related that the subject had a long talk with Afonso Arinos, Chief of the Brazilian Delegation to the United Nations General Assembly in Now York last week and learned that Arines is afraid that "ill will" night result from the efforts made by the Central American mations to influence Branil's position on Cuba at the Foreign Ministers Conference.

Facio mentioned that the Central American Foreign Hinistors recently not but, that nothing was resolved at this meeting. Facto is of the opinion that the most that can be hoped for is a declaration of the recognition of the right of Cubana to rebel against the oppressive regime of Castro and the obligation of the Central American mations to support this rewalt. Facio indicated that the subject expressed concern that there does not seem to be any one definite person in Costa Rica and other Contral American countries concerned with handling the Cuban problem. This makes it impossible for the different Cuban exile groups to band together under one leader as each potential leader has influential friends in other countries. Jacio agreed and stated that there are so many different groups it is almost impossible to soloct one chief without alienating all the others.

Facio stated that the subject had beard about the formation of an advisory group to the Agency for International Development consisting of former presidents of Central American countries. The subject is concerned that Cube may be left out in view of the present Cuban regime. N

Facio feels that at today's (October 2, 1932) session of the Foreign Ministers Conference, Gustessis will probably ask for a meeting of consultation on the Cuben problem as provided for by the Rio Fact of 1947. This action is probably the most that can be hoped for in the present atmosphere. Facio further feels that any economic sanctions suggested would be opposed by Newles and Chile since they have commercial thes with Gubs.
