- 1. Wilson BROWN, whose present address is the Hotel lel Frado, EXICO CITY, is a mative bern American, an ex-U. S. army administrative officer who has been involved in the purchase and sale of arms and aircraft in the Caribbean area for the past two years.
- wilson Brown first case to IEXIC) on the 19th February, 1940, and stayed at the GE EVI 19THL at various times until 4th May, 1948, when the management requested him to leave as to had or atod several unpleasant incidents in the hotel. Over the same period of months ENDAM and Julio LOFEZ Masegoza were seen together frequently, and in January, 1950, Baskin was observed in contact with both LDFEZ Masegoza and Jose Horaciex CORLEGUES.

In April, 1950, information from a contact of a friendly source confirmed that Wilson BROWN was working with verious groups of Mexican officials and other persons in efforts to obtain arms in the Undilly STATES and other countries for importante Haxico and for later re-emport. In one particular case, it was assertained that Brigadler General Antonio CANDELAS Rodrigues was in the market for 50,00 rounds of 50 calibre machine gun ammunition on behalf of the Dominican Government who were finding it difficult to buy this ammunition in the Undill STATES for their ewn accounts. The friendly source's contact stated BROWN was involved in this transaction and added that BROWN would act as a go-between. At the end of March, 1050, wilson BROWN informed Colonel George CHAMPING, Air Attache of the U.S. Embassy, that he had been approached by the Mexican G-veriment and asked to join the Mexican Secret Service. Other sources have rejerted that this was nothing more than a rancouver on the part of CADEMAS R. and BROWN to cover exchanges of money in payment for service readered in connection with the sale of arms.

18. On the 12th April, 1950, BROWN was observed to be in contact with a Francis W. MADI S, an American cittien, said to be a former Tilot officer in the "Flying Tigers' who is reported to have been involved in the Imparah Supply ring, which operated in the UNITED STATES and MEXICO between larch and August, 1.48.

19. As previously noted, Wilson BROWN obtained employment in the full of 1949 as Mexican representative of the LRAWL SMIPHING CMFAMY, 52 Broadway, and it was believed that the company was unaware of BROWN'S past. However, it is reliably reported that Robert ARAWL is fully aware of BROWN'S past and is himself involved in the arms traffic. Several sources reported that Robert DRAWL and Laria AMAGN de BROWN, Costa Rican, alleged wife of BROWN, were lovers for a considerable time.
