U.S. citizen, born 1901. Arrived in Shanghai from the States in spring 1926. He became a coworker of the Newspaper "Abend Newigkeiten". In 1927 he went to Peking as representative of the periodical "Chinese Courier". The owner of this periodical was at that time FRANCIS I.A. He was arrested by Marshall Tschan Tso and for plotting against the government in Peking, and sent for trial to Tientsin. Suddenly in April 1927 his case was adjourned. Barton returned to Shanghai and was made representative of "National News Agenca". This position he held until August 23rd, 1927, when he returned to America. There is evidence that he was an agent of the IIIrd International, and that he had during 1927 close contact with the Sovjet Consulate in Tientsin.

End of 1931 Barton came back to Sh'ai and got a job with the Newspaper "China Press". May 5th 1933% he went to Canton In Canton he was until his departure for America, corresponding with W. R O V. E R

gr- U.S. citizen, Jew, born in 1910. Arrived in Tokio from San Francisco June 8th 1933. August 21.1933 he was deported from Japan by the Japanese police, as undesirable alien and came to Shanghai. The Japanese police found several letters in his posession, in Tokio, showing that he was a member of the communist party and had come to the Far East in connection with the planned "Anti War Congress", which was supposed to take place in Shanghai, in September 1933. It has been furthermore established that during his stay in Japan, he was in contact with several well known Japanese and foreign Radicals. He furthermore was in close contact with the Sovjet Consulate in Tokio. His present where about are unknown.

In 1933 he moved to Shanghai, where he was a great friend of the Director of "TASS" W. 20 ROYER. He was also a great friend of M.A. ROWW, who was in leading position, connected with the Sovjet information office. At the same time Bartels was working for a member of the Chinese Customs by name of D.F. IOBASTOFF, who himself was a sovjet agent. He also worked for the Sovjet military attache L. F. P. I. N. He also was the editor of the anti-japanese magazine "Far East Lagazine". In 1940 Bartels went to Tokio. According to present reliable reports, he is working there for the Komintern.

10.) BEHGER, Harry

Agent for IIIrd international-He became first notorious due to his contact with FOT FROENIX (Eugen) WOISCH, agent for the same organisation. Wolsch left Shanghai on Oct.9th. 1934 for Trieste. He had come to Shanghaiin 1932, together with Mrs. Berger. Berger was in 1934 approximately 45 - 50 years old. According to a Reuter cable, which was published in Shanghai on January 8th 1935, Earry Berser was the leader of the communist movement in South America. On January 6th 1935, Berger was arrested by the police in Rio de Janeiro, for his communist activities.

He as well as his wife MAKIA HE R G E R admitted communist activities, and were thereupon both deported fromBrasil. Berger is also known to have directed for some time the communist work in India and also in China.

YERENTSEV

ERENZEFF (deirenzeff) Sergej Nikolajewitsch. - came to Shanghai from Moscow in 1926 as representative of the IIIrd International for the Far East. He played a very important role in the so called "movement of the Pacific" Hankow in 1927. He was at that time secretary of BORODIN . August 8th 1927, Werenzeff came from Hankow to Sharshai and handed over the business of the commercial association of the Pacific to the Cech citizen DIAMANT. Both were good linguists, and in order to cover up their activities, they were attached to the newspaper"New Shanghai life". Beeing an official agent of the Komintern, he was forced to leave Shanghai, when the Sovjet consulate had to clos in 1927.

12.) WOLSCH. John Fred

British subject, born 1893. Profession: Organiser of commerce. Member of the australian labor party. Was a member of the "commercial conference" in Wladivostok on Aug. 15th 1929. Wosch visited Shanghai together with F. ROELS and P.G. HANNET.

13.) WEITEMEIER, Irina, Emma, Ida, German citizen, Jewess, born 1907. Nember of the society of friends of the U.S.S.R.as well as the "Schutz committe Nullans". She came to Shanghai in October 1930 and opened a branch of the "Zeitgeist. bookstore where communist literature was sold. This store was allegedly closed in 1933, due to financial difficulties. (January 1933). After that she got a private job. During her residence in Berlin, she had married one YU-Shap-Kuo, who was studying in Berlin; and who was a member of the IIIrd international, according to german police records. In the years of 1926/27 she was a student at the Moscow so called Sun Yat Sen University, where she studied: The principals of the revolutionary movement in Asia"

German citizen, born 1897, dentist member of communist party. He arrived in Shanghai from Barseilles on October 12th 1934. In December 1934 he opened in Shanghai the "First dental clinic" together with Dr. W. Dubowsky on Av. Joffre. In the end of 1935 he however liquidated his conjections with his clinic. He left Shanghai in January 1936. Wlosch was the leader of the K.P.D. (German communist party) in Germany, from 1927 to 1933. His wife is Ernathlosch also known as F. A. L.F. P. B. E. R. G.

15.) GLASS, Cecil Frank british subject, born 1901, member of the communist r -- party and agent of the Ilird. International. Profession: yournalist. Glass came in May 1931 from Durban, South Africa to Shanghai. In June 1931 he took together with Harold, ISAKSON, american communist and editor in Shanghai of the "China Forum", a trip up the Yangtse River. In September he became a member of the "Committe for the protection of NULANS". In November 1931 he became Shanghai representative of the "Anglo Asiatic Telegraph Agency"-"ANGASTA, whose headquarters are in Harrin.

16.) DIAMANT, M.

also known as DIANANTI. According to reports, he is a Cech Anarchist. He took over the business of the "Commercial association of the Facific" from S.N. Werenzeffin 1927 when the latter left Hankow for Shanghai, in August 1927. Diamant is married to the daughter of SALOMON BURACK, who was a sovjet agent in 1929. Burack has been working in Shanghai for various local firms.

17.) DOLSEN, G. N.

also known as N.von Dolsen. He came to Shanghai from Peking in 1926. He came via Siberia to Peking. He wa was in Shanghai in close contact with the Nulans clan and disappeared from Shanghai after the Mulans arrest.

18.) DRISEN, Isidor

some of his allases in Shanghai are: 4. I .. STUART. Eduard LENNEDA, G.W. WILLS and James WOLLAS He was Tiving in Shanghal in June 1931 as agent for the Far Eastern Association, as also for the Far Eastern buro of the Komintern. He as well as one Mar-What it a UNDSCHUS lived at that time as:Mr.&Mrs.

N. A. I. Stuart They were the editors of the "Pan Paciric worker" at that time the official publication of the "Far Eastern Association" in the english lan guage.

19.) DOENITZ (DOENTZ)

Prominent agent of the IIIrd International. Came to Shan hai from Germany via Siberia on August 2nd. 1931. Posed as a merchant. Left Shanghai on December 26th. 1931 and returned via Dairen to Berlin.

20.) EVANGELISTA, Chrisanta

Phillippino. Prominent member of the commercial association of the Pacific, an active communist. Was in Shanghai in 1928 on his way to Moscow. During his return trip from Moscow he stayed over in Shanghai from June 7th to June 15th 1929.

21.) YORK, Rosa

british subject. It has been presumed that she is a courier for the Komintern. She arrived in Shanghai from Trieste on March 3rd. 1935. She returned from Shanghai to Trieste May 28th 1935. Jewess.

22.) ISAAKS, Harold Robert

american citizen, Jew, born 1910. Came to Shanghai from Manila in December 1930, and joined the
staff of the Shanghai Evening Post & Mercury.
A few weeks later he changed over to the "China
Press", where he remained until May 1931. In
June 1931 he took together with the Sovjet agent
Frank GLASS a trip up the Yangtse River. After
his return to Shanghai, he lived together with
Glass. In September 1931 Isaaks became very frien
dly with Agnes SMEDLEY and also became a member
of the "Committee for the protection of Nulans".
After that Isaaks became the editor of the "China Forum". He furthermore worked in the "TASS"
agency. He furthermore married in 1932 wellknown
and notorious Viola ROBINSON, who was an active
member of the communist party in Germany. The
present whereabouts of Isaaks is unknown.

23.) KENNIG, Rudolf Herrmann

German citizen, born 1908. Came to Shanghai from Dairen on March 31. 1933. He posed as a merchant. In May 1934 he opened an office Import & Export He left Shanghai October 23rd. 1934 via Dairen for Berlin. He is strongly suspected of beeing an agent of the Komintern.

24.) EFRANG, Serge Norbert

also known as DUPONT, alias DUKRO. Came to Sh'a from Peking July 1926. together with the secreta tary DOLSEN. He remained in Shanghai until Sept. 1926. He left then for Peking, where he was manage for the publication "Volkstribune" peoples tribu July 1930 intelligence came that he was in contact with a communist agent in Marseilles, sending literature and propaganda material to India and Colombo. Also that he was very anxious to return to China? (The original text of the report i not clear who wants to return to China). After hi arrival in Sh'ai he registered asc. E. Lefrango. Left Sh'ai Feb. 27th 1931 for France.

also known as Miss ALIS, alias Katherine Harrison, U.S. citizen, Wife of the Fuerst Browder and also known as George Morris, the secretary of the "Commercial Association of the Pacific Ocean". She left Shanghai for Dairen on January 25th. 1929 on her way to Siberia.

U.S. citizen, Jew, born 1902. Came to Shanghai from America on Oct. 17th 1934. His wife according to reports is the sister of W. MOLOTOW. He opened in Shanghai a Radio shop. This was to cover up his assignement to establish long wave Radio Stations as liaison between the various Branches of the chinese communist party. Minster left for Peking on May 3rd 1935. He was in contact with Joseph W.A.L.D.E.N. (Mr. X.), who was arrested in Shangh hal on May 5th 1935.

NAUMAN, Victor Franz Australian citizen, born 1897. Medical Doctor.

Came to Shanghai end of October 1927. End of 1931

Dr. Nauman was in contact with the Komintern agent
Oswald DOENITZ, who was in Shanghai in connection

with the reorganisation of the "Far Eastern Agenes
cy of the Komintern." The predecessor of Doenitz

was A. Ruega, who had been arrested. The present
whereabouts of Dr. Nauman are unknown.

british subject, born 1892. Was a member and representative of the "Australian Commercial Association". He was the british delegate for the Conference of the Association of the Pacific in Aladivostok, on August 15th 1929.

alias N. NULANS, alias VANDERKREILEN, alias NARCEL MOTTE, alias Samuel RERSENS, alias Alfred JULIEN, alias Alfred JULIEN, alias Alock, alias Eduard BRIDGES, alias Donat BULANGER, alias S. ALISON, alias BERGMAN, alias Q. M.A. BEUNET, was arrested for communist activities in Shanghai on June 15th 1931, by the S. M.P. August 12th 1931 he was handed over to the Chinese authorities. 2 days later he was sent to Nanking for trial. Found guilty he drew a sent tonce of many years in prison. He had come to Shanghai in March 1930 from Europe via Siberia and Tientsin. Duting the first half of 1931, Rueg was the secretary of the association of the Pacific in Shanghai. Right at the beginning of the Japan China conflict in September 1937 he was liberated by the Chungking government. The last time Rueg visited Shanghai in November 1939. His present where abouts is unknown. According to some reports he was in 1940 in Chungking and in 1941 in the Philippines.

aliss N. NULANS, arias VANDERKRUSSEN, alias Marcel MOTTE, alias A.ROCK, alias Sophia HERBET, alias for LORENTO, alias BEURET. She lived in Shanghai in June 1931 as wife of the secretary of the commercial association of the Pacific, and was likewise engaged in work for this organisation. She had come to Shanghai from Belgium via Siberia in July 1930. June 15th 1931 she was together with her husband arrested by S.M.P. for communist activity. She was handed over to chinese authorities for trial.

alias Rosenfeldt, was connected with A. Rueg. Jew. American citizen, born in New York 1895. Came beginning of 1930 from America, via Siberia to Shai. After the arrest of Rueg he also left Shai on June 18th 1931, for Berlin.

37.) ROBINSON, Viola

38.) SMEDLEY, Agnes

American, born 1910. Came to Shanghai August 26th 1932. Was well known as communist and fellow traveler (American Suffragist). Was in Shanghai closely connected with Sovjet circles, and was a member of the "WOKS" Organisation.

alias Berd, alias FETROKOIS, American, born 1892. Kember of the following organisations: Friends of the U.S.S.R. Protection committe for NULANS, Hindustan Association, All Chinese labor Federation, China league for Civil rights. Came to Shanghai from Berlin, as correspondent for the "Frankfurter Zeitung", in May 1929. Works for the Western Division of the IIIrd.Int ernational. Supplied in Shanghai the money for the local indian communists, which fact was definitly prooven by the S.M.P. Her main job was to supervise the local communist labor Organisation She herself got her orders directly from Komintern headquarters in Moscow. From 1927 to 1929, the time she came to Shanghai, she was working at various places in China, connected with the shinese red Army. She wrote a book about her works The Red Army in China. This book was written in english, in 1935 it was published in Moscow in russian translation. At present Agnes Smedley is in America. From Shanghai she traveled to Moscow, where she resided for several years with her friend, a lady, who is the editor of the Moscow News, in english.

N 39.) SORDSCH, Richard Dr.

German citizen, born 1897, Journalist, came to Shanghai from Marseilles January 10th 1930, together with another German by the name of WEINGER-TAM. He has been reported as beeing also a member of the commercial association of the Pacific. During December 1931, Sordsch was in contact with Oswald DOENITZ, who at that time also lived in Shanghai and who is a well known and prominent agent of the Komintern. Beginning of January 1933. Dr Sordsch left Shanghai and went to North China.

MP.
40.) STONN, Lucy

American, was living in Shanghai, In connection with communist activities she visited Germany during 1931 and returned then again to Shanghai. September 14th 1932 she married in Shanghai one HAROLD, ROBERT ISAAK, editor of the communist Journal "China Forum". Later on she was teaching at the "DAH CHUNG? highschool in Shanghai.

41.) UNDSCHUS, Margarita

alias Mrs. Stuart, alias Mrs. Najo. She arrived in Shanghai during the first half of 1931
and called herself Mrs. Stuart. Under this name
she lived together with one Isidor DRISEN, who
called himself Mr. Stuart. He was an agent of the
Komintern as well as a member of the association
of the Pacific. It has been established that she
was his secretary, and helped him to edit the

local communist Journal Pan Pacific Worker . Margarita Undschus left Shanghai on July 4th 1931 for Genova via Suez, after the arrest of A. RUEG. She was according to reports destined for Berlin.

42.) HARDI, George

alias George HEL (HOEL). Frominent british communist. Member of the association of the Pacific According to records he attended in Shanghai the Pan Pacific Conference, which was held in chinese territory. During the time of February 1928 and Lay 3rd. 1928 he travelled together with other association members (with the exception of Fuerst Browder) to Moscow. The purpose of this trip was to report to the ISPOL-KOH" of the HIIrd International.

43.) HASKEL, W.A.

American. This man moved into the flat vacated by Fuerst Browder. Was August 1928 secretary of the commercial ass. of the Pacific. (Browder was). Browder left Shanghai on Dec.1st 1928, and after his departure his former flat was visited almost daily by a woman calling herself Mrs. Browder, also Mrs. Morris, also Kathrine HARRISON. Haskel left Shanghai March 23rd.1929 and sailed for Vancouver, Bratish Columbia

44.) HASKEL, W.A. Mrs.

alias Marianne EMERSON, lived with the above person. This man was appointed in 1928 by "ISPOLKOM" of the IIIRD International as senior advisor to the Chinese communist party. Ers. Baskel also left Sh'ai on March 23rd 1929, for Vancouver British Columbia.

45.) HERMON, Alexander Victor

British subject, agent of the Komintern. He succeeded POL EUGEN WOLSCH as agent for the local Komintern office. Hermon is an electrical engineer by profession, was born in London in 1900. He arrived in Shanghai from Venezia on January 26th 1935. July 7th 1935 he left Shanghai for Marseilles.

46.) NHOWARD, Harry Pakstone 6.5.362 DI

alias IWAN KOSIOFF, alias Frank GODWIN.U.S. citizen of russian descent. Born 1893. Journalist. He is a well known communist and suspected of beeing an agent of the Komintern. From 1917 to 1922 he lived in Japan, where for some time he worked for the office of the "Japan Chronicle". For his communist activi-1.17. 0095 1/4, ties he was deported from Japan in July 1922 and thus came to Shanghai. During the following years he was connected with several newspapers, lost his positions however, due to his communist activities. Upon recommendation of the well known french Anarchist and Radical Jaques REKIUES he was accepted into the staff of the "Klangwan labor college". He left Shanghal in 1929 for Mukden, and became a professor of foreign languages, at the Mukden University. In 1930 he was a postal clerk in Tientsin. In 1932 he returne to Shanghal, and was working for Mr. Powel at the "China Weekly Review, a anti Jap & pro Sovjet Journal Allthough he was as late as 1940 still in Sh'ai his present whereabouts are unknown.

47.) HANNET, Percy George

Subject: CHINA; Shanshai - All-Slav and Minority Group Organizations, Soviet-Oriented, in.

BRIEF: Set forth below is a brief history of the all-Slav Union in Changhai, its connection with ether minority groups, and the domination of both by Soviet leaders, The leaders of the rollowing actively pro-Soviet nationality groups are identified: Czechoslovakian, Polish, Yugeslav, Ukrainian, Byelorussian, Rumanian, Italian, Greek, French, Portugese, Finn, Norwegian, Spanish, German and (perhaps) American.

Recent reports from this office have attempted to outline various activities of the Soviet agitation/propaganda organization in China, as directed by TASS Shanghai. The All-Slav and minority group organizations in Shanghai which are Soviet oriented are a possibly important part of the agitation/propaganda effort, and a preliminary report on them follows.

2. Some years before the Pacific War an 'Allied Federation of Representatives of Countries Occupied by the AXIS' (approximately) was organized in Shanshai under the chair-manship of John ALEXANDER, a British Press Attache. Its general purpose was to propagate against Axis activities and, in China, especially against Japan's it was simultaneously an intelligence organization. The Fearl harbor attack made it impossible for the Federation to continuo in its present character; the <u>Soviets</u> in Shanghai saw an excellent opportunity to the <u>rover the creatization</u>, both as afterpragandaired in and an intelligence service. The Soviets, in addition to the fact that they were not at war with Japan, had the advantage of a sly editorial line in the Russian press (within and without the USSR) to the effect that Japaness world takes were not incompatible. effect that Japanese, soviet aims were not incompatible, and the Japanese, being if not pleased at least lulled, did not interfere with the fermation of various Slav groups in Shanghai. These groups were later unified in an All-Slav Center, located in the Soviet Club on Avenue Foch; the Slav groups maintained connections and a common program with the non-Slav minority groups. The Slav groups public pronouncements were to the effect that the Slavs wished to strengthen their relations with all 'freedom-loving' countries, this union having as its ultimate goal a world union in which each of such 'freedom-loving' countries would be free to conduct its affairs as it chose and be strong enough to protect that freedom; it turned out, however, that the All-Slav Union was not merely Soviet-doninated but Soviet-directed, and any group which strung along uncritically with the 'friendship with the USSR'line

TOW SHEVSKY, who is the lender of the enti-Soviet Polish group in Shanghai), NOWELECKI/NOVILITSKI, and GOGUL are known to have been active pro-Soviet workers in the Polish colony, inducing Shanghai Polos to become Soviet or New Polish citizens; however, GOGUL departed Shanghai for Warsaw in December '46. Of the YUGOSLAV, TSIVITANICH is believed CIVITANIA to have been a Yugoslav representative to the All-Slav Union in Shanghai last year. Of the URAINIAN, KLIMENKO is believed to have been a Ukrainian representative to the All-Slav Union year. Of the BYELORUSSIAN, both KADYSH and URBACH have been carried as the Byelorussian representatives to the All-Slav Union. Of the RULLINIAN, STEFAHESKO and GUPERSHTEIN were reported a year ago as working together to form a Soviet-Rumanian Friendship Society and a Rumanian Communist cell. DENTICCI has been carried for some time as the leader of the ITALIAN Communist group. Unspecified reports have given the YANNOULATOS brothers as leaders in the pro-Soviet GREEK group. Of the FRENCH, this is the second time within a month that sources have given GROSBOIS as a leader of the pro-Soviet faction; for some reason sources did not mention Paul PREMET and M. SHIKIS. Of the PORTUGESE, POGREDETSKY-MENEZES was previously known as PROGESETSKY pretending to be a Portugese; sources say that he is half Portugese. Of the FINN, Highmar FRUNDT is personally known to this office; as of a year ago, he was afraid for his life if the Soviets were to get hold of him; possibly things have changed. None of the NORWEGIAN or SPANISH leaders can be identified. The GERMAN cannot be identified as such, and the status of the AMERICAN group is somewhat special; SNOW for instance, takes the most charitable view possible of Soviet activities, and Miss STRONG is a longtime vociferous fellow-traveller, but, as sources say, there is not genuine AMERICAN group in Shanghai or elsewhere in China working patently for Soviet interests. HAROLD ROBERT ISAACS is about 35 years of ago. He attended Columbia:
University, and received the degree of A.B. there in 1930. He is the son of
an orthogox Jewish merchant, who is very wealthy, and who has always supported
HAROLD, even though he did not approve of the radical views that HAROLD expressed
in the 1930's.

MARDID word to China immediately after graduation from Columbia, partly, atleast, out of a desire to see strange parts of the world and to experience "adventure." HAROLD became a convert to Trotalyism, partly, at least, under GLASS's inclusive.

He felt that "suffering humanity" required a "revolution" to set things straight.

Communism was too organized, and HAROLD was a complete individualist, and reacted

strongly against the organizational set-up of Communism, and so espaused Trotalyism!)

HANDIO ROBERT ISLACS, cortimed

HARGLE ISAACS had been an enthusiastic member of the China League for Civil Rights, and in the atmosphere of turmoil, after the killing of YANG, when all Leftists were under attack by the Kucmintang, Bubble became the editor and publisher of the China Forum, a menuzing that published a number of controversial stricks. The magazine was protected by the fact that the editor was an American, and therefore had extraterritorial rights. Yet the papazine was regarded as a "thorn in the flesh" by Mr. CUNNINGAN, who was at that time American Consul-General in Shanghai. There were various controversies — the printing shop was broken up by Kuomintang strong-arm them; the walls were refused to the megazine; but he continued publication for some time, and analytical the copies out to the subscribers.

ISLACS is a very mart ann indeed. He knows a lot about China, and he knows a lot about people in general. Moreover, he is a great deal "amother" and more diplomatic now then he was ten years ago.

Agnes impulse, whice stird, alies Mrs. Petroikos, an American citizen born on February 23, 1892 of Jagood, Micsouri, U.S.A. Member of the Hindustan Association of Berlin and of the Berlin Indian Revolutionary Lociety. Author of several novols in English and German, one of which "Daughter of the Earth" published by C.McCann in New-York during 1927 in believed to be a coloured version of her own life. Ar ived in Shanghai during May 1929 from Berlin having travelled vin Moscow, Harbin, Mukdon, Tiontoin and Peking, Journeying on Passport No.1266 issued on Juni 29, 1928 by the United States Consulate at Berlin.

By profession Agnes (modley is a correspondent of the "Prenkfurter Leitung" the official organ of the Cormen Democratic Ferty.

She is in the service of the Leatern Brench of the Central Committee of the Communist International and undertakes the propagating of communist doctrines and activities throughout the Orient. The receives orders direct from the Central Committee of the Communist International in Moseow and has no direct connection with local Soviet communists, in order to computage her activities.

Her object duties comprise the organising of sorkers and the establishing of communist organisations enough the workers. The nature of her work is similar to that of Houlans, and it is probable that she knew the coretary of the P.P.T.U.S.

She speaks inglish, French and German well and is in possession of two passorts - German and American.

Following her strivel in Shanghai, she resided at 85 Avenue Dubail, a hussian boarding house, sharing a room with one Cortrude Binder, an American citizen. The first attracted attention locally during February 1933, when certain correspondence from her pen rublished in the "Frankfurter Leitung" regarding alleged pipontia

gigantic preparations taken by the Changhai Municipal Council on August 1, 1929 for the suppression of communica disturbences, merited reproduction in the Coviet newspaper "Investia" (\$00000) on December 8, 1929, and was again reproduced in the local journal "Shanghai aris" on February 11, 1930.

In addition to acting as correspondent to:the "Frankfurter .eitung" Lie (medley also contributes articles to the "China zoekley Review" a Changhai publication under the management of one Edgar Chow. An article written by Agmes Smedley entitled "Chile-lipine Sketches" was published in the June (1930) issue of the "New Masses". The ir also believed to be the suther of an article entitled "London Bohind the Homeman Chiang Kai Chek", which appeared in the "Red Flag" (Lote Fahne) dated Berlin, September 0, 1931.

She else finds time to devote attention to the political situation in India, favouring the anti-British party in that country. She is also known to be in touch with local Indian seditionists and on several occasions has edited anti-British propagands on behalf of the changled Branch of the Indian Youth League, an Indian fevolutionary organisation, occupying premises situated at 841 Feoshing load, thapel.

On May 15, 1930 Miss haddey left changest for Many and lefer proceeded to Centon. again taking u her residence at 70 Poute de Oroushy, Dhe left Changhai once again on June 16, 1931 for Canton, where it is reported she visite the Canton Authorities, returning to Changhai on July 5.

On Detober 14, 1931 she resoved from 72 Houte de Groveky to Apertment 102, I. . . 8. Apertments, 1882 Avenue Joffre.

During the latter part of 1931 it was ascertained that Agnes.

London requestly visited at their place of residence, Harold R.

London and C. Frank Class, two notorious local redicals.

During the same period, due to action on the part of the Chinese Covernment Postal Censor, it came to our knowledge that wise incedley was at various times in receipt of communist and anti-imperialist literature, some of which was posted locally whilst some was mailed from as far away as Berlin.

On March 10, 1952 she again removed, this time to apartment 504, I.E.S. Apartments, 1552 Avenue Joffre, where she still resides, and where she is known to receive chinese and a few foreign visitors, some of whom are in the habit of steying all night in the apartment in cuestion. It is believed that these visits are made in order that meetings may be held in connection with the All Chine Labour Federation (Union syndicals Pan Chinoise, of which Agnes Smedley is said to be a preminent member.

The Chinese who visit her are mainly of the atudent type, both mole and female, whilst it has been ascertained for certain that one of her foreign visitors is Ligar Chow, the manager of the "Chine tookly levies".
