 Support of Madrid Station Objectives by Edward G. TICHBORN (P)
## RESERENCE:

OSMA 23, 350 Dated 11 January 1968

1. Per Mr. Long's request, the undersigned on 30 January 1968 discussed with Edward G. TICHBORN (P) possible support of Madrid Station objectives as raised in ref. It was confirmed that:
a. WUSALINE/Iberia can be úsed as an information collection mechanism in cases where information requirements can be couched in plausible economic and commercial terme for contractual surveys.
b. TICHBORN can assess and develop selected Spanish contacts of Madrid Station who may be visiting New Yotk and who desire introductions in US commercial circles.
c. TICHBORN can develop Spaniards in New York as maybe of operational interest to the Madrid Station. TICHBORN has not made an effort to develop Spaniards in New York butis willing and able to do so for any designated as operational targets. If desired, TICHBORN thinks he can meet the Spanish Ambassador to the U.S. through a friend
d. TICHBORN feels that he could wite an article concerning leading Spanish industrialists and bankers for publishing in a prominent publication, such as "Life International." TICHBORN believes that he has excellent bonafides for such a task because he previously published in "Life International" a four-page spread on birth control in Latin Anerica. This article was favorably reviewed. TICHBORN suggested a related article on the pupulation explosion in Europe and its effect on business as a possible topic for interviewing leading Spanish businessmen. TICHBORN,

as a result of journalistic collaboration with Katherine Anne Porter, is represented in Nep York by a top literary agent, Monica MCCal. TICHBORN thinks that it mould take him two to three weeks in Spain intervieving top Spanish industrialists and bankers. He would send letters in advance to the se targets liforming them of his proposed itinerary, the purpose of hie trip, and enclosing coples of his previous articles with favorable reviewer comments. He could be essentially a free lance, journalist or have a business purpose as well. In the latter connection, it is of interest that following TICHBORN's trip to Spain, WUBRINY/I sent a geologist to WUSALINE/Iberia to look into acquisition of silver properties in Spain. This purely commezcial development appears to be a direct result of TICHBORN's trip and thus enhances TICHBORN's commercial bonafides.

2. It is understood that E/IB/S has a copy of TICHBORN's report Efor dispatch to the Madrid Station per ref.
3. Personnel concerned with Project WUBRNNY will be glad to work with $E / I B / S$ in any follow-up to the possibilities noted above.

1. I have a request which eons to me to be right up the alley of your friend, WUBRINY/1. I would hope, therefore, that he will try to do us a fairly rapid and yet analytic job.
2. The request is for as accurate information as possible on the following questions:
a. What or who, or both, represent the most significant power elements in the economic or commercial field in Spain today? Wherever possible, even la the cases where potent companies have been named, specific Individuals having the positions of authority should be identified. In addition, whereever possible, relationships between these individuals and American inter este whether a company or another individual should be specified.
b. What American interests, corporate or personal, have major investments or holdings in Spain? What are the nature of their Investments or holdings and who are the individuals basically responsible?
c. To the extent possible, provide the sane answers as requested above for Portugal. Since Spain le of greater Interest, this question should only be answered to the extent posilible without too great en expenditure of dine. If on the other hand It is felt that good answers can be provided wi th regard to Portugal given extra die, I would suggest that tho Spanish answers bo. submitted as soon ae possible and the Portuguese information given at a later date.
3. I world appreciate it if you could let mo know as soon as posBible WUBRINY/I's reaction to the above requests - can he get tho answers; will they be in considerable detail and how long does ho think that ft w $I 4$ take?

SURJPCT: Debriefing of Edward G. Pchborn (P) upon Return from EL Salvador

REFFRRACE: Memo For the Record, Plans for Debriefing of Edward G. Tichborn ( P ) in Washington," dated 8 March 1961

1. Edward $G$ TIchborn $(P)$ arrived in Washington from California on 12 march and vas debriefed on 13 and 14 March 1961. The debriefing vas held in Subject's room at the stater Hotel and was tape recorded. Those participating in this debriefing were Messes. Paul Parton and Brenton Burns of HiD and the undersigned. Tichborn (P) related the contacts he had mede, the 1 impressions of the locel pol1t1cel scene, his own asaesament of the situation, personal contents on the economy and government obtained from "shaming" among the Local lover classes, etc. Tlchbora (P) also pointed out areas In which we could make B positive contribution and gave a number of over -ali recommendations concerning the political and eccoonic fields.
2. The WHD representatives were very favorably Lopressed Fth Tlehborn ( $P$ ) personally and with his activities while in E1 Salvador on the related TDY mission.
3. The American Ambassador to E 1 salvador had met 7 chbora ( $P$ ) while there and was sufficiently lapnessed with him that he sent a telegram to Mr. Thames Mani of the Departient suggesting that the

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latter might find it very profitable to contact richbory ( $)$ and discuss the Salvadoran situation with him (bee EALY 3630, Th 16568, dated 10 March 61). As a result, Tichborn (P) vas apprised upon his arrival that if he did meet vita ma. Mann that he should not conceal the fact that he had sone to 31 Salvador on behalf of CIA. (In the meantime, Mr. Mann vas being informed of this relationship by wit in order to avoid any possible embaressing situations.) Tichborn ( $P$ ) was anxious to talk with Mr. Mann and Mr. Paxton vas attempting to set up an appointment with him. However, Mr. Mann was occupied on other matters and Mi. Paxton therefore suggested to Mr. Devise that be might, meet with Fichborn ( $p$ ). A meeting was suggested by Mr Divine for 2:30 Thursday the 16th, but Tichborn (P) stated that since he had an appointment at the White House at 3 pul that $1 t$ would not be possible. Mr. Paxton asked Tlichborn (P) to call Mr. Divine on this and that maybe they could work out another time. No more was heard from Tlchborn (P) by Mr. Paxton or by CA/PAG. We had, however, talked with Tichborm (P) Wednesday morning when he called for Mr. Paxton's number and I asked him if we could be of any more assistance and be replied in the negative.
4. Administratively, Tichborn's (p) salary ( $\$ 1,000$ ) vas paid him in cain as he requested on 14 March. Expense money for his transportation to, and his stay in, E1 Salvador were advanced to him by the station and the related accounting was taken care of there. The only funds which are now due Tlebbora (P) are his expenses while in washington for the debriefing. Ie stated that be would forvera his hotel bill, airplane tickets; and other receipts upon his return to california. He vas. cautioned to mail the true name receipts (plane tickets, hotel bills, etc.) In one envelope and his accounting sheet, signed In pseudonym, in a separate one.
5. Who is transcribing the tapes of THchborn's (p) debriefing and we will receive a copy thereof when completed.

He aloo suggested that be pelt it yould be userul if he vere debriefed by the Interested partles at Beadquarters.
2. C/PAG and I agreed that this woula be the most useful penner for obtaining all of the detalls of hla ectivitfes vhile in El Saivador, es well ea povidiag an opportunity for wh oflcers to pose any questlcus they might have. ( Ee left for Bl salvador on 22 February and Returned to the U. S. on 5 march). Tichborn ( $P$ ) salad be would Ply out on Bunday and cell me first thing Monday morning, 13 March; he 111 be staying at the Statler Hotel. I told him I voila meat him there and bring acme "ritendi" along. Con this subject, Mr. Holman Gala he felt Mr. Herbert, DC/WiD, might want to attend the debriefing.
5. During the time that Tlehbora (P) is in Washington, he rill also sign the amendment to his contact and the outstanding financial matters will be taken care of.

1. In early Jsouary ve had suggested to th/Salvador that they migt rina the services of a political consultant of value in their area. Tire Division checked this out with tie Station who ecreed thst it ves an idee yorth looking tnto and esked for additional details. This finformation was forrarded to the fleld and in repit, the station requested that we send the individual concernet to EI Saluador to assess the political situation and to give them any related assistance possible.
2. As a consequence, AT. Davis contacted Edverd O. THehborn (P) by telerhone and told him of our laterest. Due to the station' $B$ request which ve vanted to flil promptly, ana also to Thchborn's (P) personal schedule (and the possibility that he might receive an appointant (thin the Adidinistration In the near future) we vanted to get his to Salvador as soon as possible. After consuiltatica Fth Tichown (P) and with the Desk, it was decided that he voull leave california on 23 February and arrite in Salvador the folloriag soraing.
3. In infs telephone conversation, Mr. Davls vas forced to rely on the syster of "double talking" for the purpose of securlty; bovever, the possibility thit his services might be required had

aready been mentioned to Til chborn ( $P$ ) when he res in Washington on persopal matturs in January (see Ref. B). Mr. Davis also attempted to second guess Mehborn's ( $P$ ) reellinge on this assigunent when arrangins the detalis with wib. The fact that he milght receive ap apointiment vas the major lactor under. consideration, especialiy in the aense that first, we did not vant to expose Tlchborn ( $P$ ) as a KUBARK agent and secondiy; ve did not want In any way to present Tichborn (P) with any problems in relation to his possible appointment.
4. Mr. Davis told Tichborn ( $P$ ) in guarden language which was apparentiy well understood by him that the cos ("our senion partner") and the Anbessalor ("the senior partner of our cousin (Irm) would be vitting as to his KMBARK connections and that undoubtedly JUEGGPLAFIP (an Amerlcan cut-cut and contact of the Station) and the latter's brother-In-lav JUVAl-1 (a Salvadoran businessman ana Station contact with wham be vould be vorkjng) rould also be wtting. However, as agreed with WH, the locals other than JUVAi- 1 woula be unvitting as to his kJBARK coanections. Tlchborn (P) was informed that he would be "visiting" Salvador and his old frlezdi उUEGGPANI and this cover stony was to be cited to the local salvadorans.
5. Mr. Davis especially polnted out to richborn ( $F$ ) that since HI felt be should talk vith the Ambassadior, we vanted hir to be aware of this in the event that this possibility arose at the Station's request. Mr. Davis added that of course ve vould not yant the Ambassador to take umbrage, etc. at Thchborn's (P) visit or activities and that we had been assured by sconeone (Pavi Paxton) who thows Ambassador Aurat VIlliame, that the latter coula be counted upon for his cooperation and discretion. Itchborn ( $P$ ) then asked specificaliy whether he Vouila deflittely talk with the Ambassador and Mr. Davis informed him that this would depend upon the Station's Judgment. (WH had informed us that this uas a possibillty aince Williams lis nev to his post and the station is tryang to work closely with him from the beginning; WH felt that if williams later learned that Tichborn (P) bed been in the area vithout his knoviedge; he might take offense.) In this event, the Station was advised to request the Ambascador to use our channels for any cocmunications to the Department conceraing tichborn (P).

6. Wh had also told us that they pight have to infore the Departmeat of Tichborn's (P) trip to EI Salvedor and then declied thet tris vould not be neceseary, Bovever, on 23 Febiuary, a final decision ves made thet this vould have
 did acree to this but requested that this inforpstion be in general terms only and that Ichbora' $\mathrm{B}(\mathrm{P})$ vame not be given. WH agreed that it could be done In this way. Wh also stated that this information wlil be passed to Mr. Devine and would be Hilited to hifm and Mr. Main.
7. Tichborn's (P) Instructions were that he would be met at the alrpart if possible by Jueccpland (niose true name and description vere provided); if he did not appear, Tlchoorn (P) uss to go to the Intercontinental Hotel and walt there to be contacted by efther JucGapIaNP
or the cos, Ben stott.s. Upon meeting Stchbora (P) JUEGGPIANY, as a recognition signal, would day "I am a friend of Horace".
8. Tichborn ( $P$ ) esked if some expense money could be provided hin 10 EI Salvador and he was assured that this Woula be arranged. Since time (and the airlines strike) did not permit his coming to Washington for a detalled briefIng on the political situation in Salvador and on his specific mission, these matters plus the funds for expenses will be handled by the Station.
9. Tuo cables vere sent to the fleld concerniag the subject of T1chborn's (P) errival in E1 Salvador (DIR 26346, OUT 76088 and DIR 26522, OUF 76527). These cables spelled out Tichborn's (P) cover, the need for spectal discretion on the part of those indiriauals tho are sitting of his rejationship With KUBARK, the meettng or contact arrangementa, the fact that detafled briefings by the Station movild be necessary since it hed not been possible to undertnke this at Headquarters, his peeudonym and approval for the Station's providing him with certain fundas.
10. In sumary, PAC's interest vas to arrange for mchborn's (P) arrival in Salvador as soon as posaible and at the same time to

SUBJECT: Edward G. Tichbora (P)-Hernia

1. On 1 Pebruary Edivard G. Mchborn advised me that fn 1 inting his bes out of a taxi on his return trip from Cuba, he suddeniy felt a pain in the eroin and was afrald thet he had a hernia.
2. On the way to the alrport he asked me if thore vould be any Chance of the Government plekins up his medical expenses in the event that he actually had a hernla which required any aubetantial treatment. I told him at that tine thit I dia not know what the coveriment's position would be, but that I would check lato the matter and let lim know.
3. On 2 February, $I$ contacted Mr. Vernon Turner, SSA/Dos, end explained the circumetances to hin. At that time, I aino pointed out that as far as the provisions of his contract vare concerned, it was stated that he was not an employec of the U. S. Govermment and vhile It did not make specific reference to medical payments ville he vas working for us, it dit not specifleaily preclude guch payments. Mr. Turner oplned that although the contract stated bo ves not an emploje of the U. S. foverment, in actual fact during the period ho was dolis our bidiing, he ves. I went on further to explain to Mr. Turner that in all probability we will call on Mchborn to do Iuture services for us and that whlle he vas beling paid, it vea doubtful that this reimburgement from us equaled what be vould nate in his regular lav practice. Mr. Murner stated that there were a nuber of vays that we could alleviate his situation should it become necessary.


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4. De conclusion reached betreen me and fr. Nurner ves that I should point out to Flchborn that Ge vere under no obllgetion to recompense hib tor his injury, horever, that ypon the completion of treatment is he vould subinit a clatn, ve shoula be glod to revier. it symathetically.
5. I pessed the fist of the above on to IHchborn on 3 February.

SUBJECT: Utilization of for Nominal Cover

1. This memorandum contains a recommendation for your approval in paragraph six.
2. Santo Domingo Station has requested that Edward G. TICHBORN, an American Contract Agent of Mexican extraction Who is presently assigned to Mexico Station, be temporarily assigned to the Dominican Republic to assist Santo Domingo In the period itumediately preceding the June presidential election. Mexico Station and TICHBORN have agreed to this assignment and it is proposed that TICHBORN so to Santo Domingo in the immediate future to read in on the operations and then return to Santo Domingo on approximately 1 May to carry out whatever operational duties Santa Domingo Station may assign him. It is presumed that he would return to Mexico City shortly after 1 June 1966.
3. TICHBORN, 46 , is bilingual and has a wide range of business and social contacts throughout Latin America. Following graduation from Harvard Law School in 1948, TICBBORN became affiliated with a law iris in Los Angeles which represented many Latin American corporations with California business connections. In the mid-1950's he became active in California state polities and served in various capacities in Democratic Party state and national organizations. He particupated actively in the California gubernatorial campaign of James Roosevelt, the senatorial campaign of Helen Gahagan Douglas and both the 1952 and 1956 Stevenson campaigns for President. He has been President of the Southern California Young Democrats, a member of the California Democratic State Central Committee, a member of the Host Committee for the 1956 Democratic National Convention and a member of the Board of Directors of the National Democratic Minority Conference. In 1960 he served as Los Angeles coordinator of the Kennedy Movement for Americans of Mexican Extraction which, it is reported, contributed substantially to the success of the Kennedy campaign in Southern California. His only try for elective office wan in 1953 when he was defeated in his bid for the position of California Secretary of State.

4. In late 1959 , TICHBORN was hired by the ARency as

In 1961 he became a
rui-time contract agent and was assigned to Mexico City, under personal cover, to establish a degree of security and mobility which would permit him to travei readily on third country political action assignments. Since the beginning of his relationship with the Agency, he has participated in Agency sponsored operations in

At present, he is engaged full-time in managing a Mexico Station funded left wing intellectual publication, Dialogos, His cover in Mexico now is nominal and he attributes his presence and interests primarily to his activities in the legal field for his former Los Angeles law firm employer. He devotes most of his time to his posttion as editor of Dialogos.
5. TICHBORN has contributed stories, arcicles and Interviews to United States and Latin American publications. His major accomplishment in this field has been the publication of an interview with Catherine Anne Porter in a recent issue of Harpers magazine. TICUBORN suggests that he might be able to arrange viable cover for his temporary assignment in the Dominican Repubile by writing to and querying their interest in his preparation of an article concerning the Domirican Republic political situation and the forthcoming election. There is no reason to believe that would turn down such a proposal and, in fact, it is belleved they would welcome it.
6. Recomendation: The Western Hemisphere Division recommends that approval be given for TICHBORN's approach to to advise them of his planned trip to the Dominican Republic and request of the $\qquad$ an expression of interest in an articic on the present situation in the Dominfan Republic. This will be done specifically as a cover for his travel to Santo Domingo. I did exactly that. I flew over to the south sod then vent on, smelling around. I used three methodsz (1) street interview. shoo

It Is Interosting at first ajnce you see 80 many tacoums, roons and art galleries, but it gets borling and I was getting sick and tired of thi ese and was about ready to go home, whan I ran lnto a situation that really interests me - politice. Here 18 something that 18 arter your onm hest, thie local al tustione $I$ becere Goddsmiat curloug. Here was the ópportunity to tour this country and to put m trip on a profit basia by preparing articies on what has happened there, whist might happan in the future and so forth. I made It loglcal enough. at first I trimmed it pretty well with a lot of stuff about how I love these people (and that is true too). My experience uth them has been protty much 11 mited to studenta. My expertence with them has nlways been vonderful and I love theme They were fine youns men and vomen, Istill find then to be interesting youns men and women and that I have a natural afflaity for them. They 11 ked that, I said elso that I had a yympthy for their mon, thair problans and their traditiona.

In my contaotu throushout the area I maintained the same atory. I was luck to hit on the right formula lo the beginaing and found that it worked. with very few variations, I stuck to the ment thems.

Very often I would fall into a gocd lnterviev, For exsmple, I was looidng for a small bust nessman uth a factory. I asked a men where to find him and was led to a leuryer's office. Thia was a very fortunate andatake, a couple of times they turned out to wy adventage. This lavpar turned orst to bo a fella who wee very well informed and uho had proviously been 10 politics. He was ale close to the Rosan Catholic hiersichy. And he gave an interviau which sumarized the lnformod opinion that I hed rum 1nto in that aras. (He also took me to the univarsity and introduced we to the prlest who was the head of the schcol., Ihere I had a chance to intervi ew atudenta who ghowed an unvillingnese to adnit that they dont $t$ underatand and don't know; thet paid off for me.) He characterized the typical intervieu I got from the typlcal informed porsan. In thene interrieus I tried to be objective and find out, rather than inspire ansivers.

Very frequentiy, I would run lnto sooo persan who had a bright boy golng Into prep school wanting to go to colloge. - suggested that be tight apply for collect and for 1 bcholarship. I sald that I wasn't an afficial and didn't hoow the ansuers, or protend to, but I ereated the 1mpresal an that there was a poseibility of applyine for echelarahips to tho sohools, or even to the D. S. Governnent. (I actucily do 1atend to find out about these things and follow it thrauch since they vore very helpsil to and I as very erateful.) There wa some truth to wat I sadd to thom and I vacott bakide up atories out of wole eloth. There was a beale for ovorgthiay I anid to thon although thore adghe havo boon aceo axageratioa. Howovar, in tho sain, I could toll tho atorg with grat cunal otency for

## basically it is a rairly truthrul stary.

I vent to major cities along the way. orf to the adde I vent up to a sanctuary nearby since everyone sald that if ynu didn't go up you veren't a tourist and since I vanted ovarything to look on the level, I made the visit. I stoprad at evary IIlace, If I could speak Engilah there I would, If not, I used this young follow whi oh was sometimes eatisfactory. But you see, somotimes the fillaser or the shopkeeper could speak Enolish, or some lid cculd and vould trenslate and thay vere puch more faithruit to the meaning. The driver got to thinking that he koow what angvers $I$ vanted and that rulned his usafuiness. I kept saying that $I$ wantad to know whet they were saying, not what I would Itke to have tham bay; that how can I wite a good story if I don't koon the truth. He got to the point where he was trying to figure cut what inas after end was goting to give me the right answers. Hence I banded hin right in the beginning. But I ran Into some tids about 13 or 14 yesrs old and used them as interproters; they vere gocd. I sav at least a dozen or more of the newspaper publishers and correspondents, two of the eiftars of two different Conmuni et newspapers, and I talked with four or flve of the comennist leaders. I also talked: to abcut five of the secondary people inas political party and one of the more impartant people In the latter. I talked to the Town Chadrman (riyor) in about haif a dozen toms. I also talked hth a local oficial and to bonc othor old-timers who are not active now, but w 11 be 10 the compalgn. I feel that es a result of ny survey $I$ can give a fairiy authoritative opinion on what the situation 13, why and what the future 1s. I am confldent that my rasctions are sownd and that my conc)usicns wil be accurato.

Question: Did you experience any ontrols; anyune seking your name, otc. in the airpartt answars only in the hotele, or when I entered and laft the ccuntry. At the hotels you make a full police report. When the others whom I engeged in convarsation (and told them whit I was trying to learn) asked where I ws going next, I would aak them what they auggested how far it is, what wes a good hotel, otc. Keerling in Fand that I yas a tourist, I vent out of wy way to find and oos things and I vent to many places which I folt were ridiculous. (Subject tajks hero etout personal experiencos in ticiols, plumbing, ate.)

In dining rocigs I vould find some excuse to esy पdo you sjoak kagliobp" and upually some che did. Could you explatn eomethine to mia - hov is this preparedi te don't have it in the U. S., ete. F Fretty soco we vere sitting together, ordering a drint and lovarlably the ownor of the hotal vould come and sit uith us and tell me he vowld wite a note to a particular nevspaper editon, oto. as e recalt, I found that about half of the tive I vas directed to people. I never folt that I vas suspeot, orcopt oy Abericans, and I think they thought that I vas checling up on them since they trled. to avold we.
