1. Mr. Kanes of WE/6 informed me this morning that the Agency had not yet had their discussion with British Liaison concerning LICCOKY.

2. I was unable to reach Er. Kanes of Er. Ginnsburg, but I talked by phone with Mrg. then of says and informed him, that although we had previously appro ed passing to the British the statement that LICOOKY was an indirect contact of our on Guatemalan exile activities, we woul like to have that changed. Itseld Fr. there to pass the following.

"LICONIY has been used as a sub-source by our Station, however, she has been considered unreliable and is not a good security risk. Therefore we do not recommend her for operational use.". If possible, if the British do not raise the subject, it would better to drop the whole thing.
