- Mr. reaction was mixed. in Miami they tried to look for business and stayed off the phone. There were calls in by Jorgel and by Cole (?). That phone contained speculative suggestions language of personal level. in general all talk of phone.

- The Cuban reaction was of significant interest only in the case of house Calderon.

- The case as specific ref. in messages to Miami or any other place that relates the details under investigation or being passed to Cuban retention for alleged participation or knowledge of such. Castro involvement or direct action in the preceding summer & fall. The source person obvious - the one and lone perpetrator could not be easily identified with either the Cubans or the Soviets.

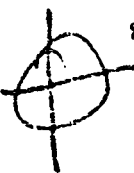
