1. In response to referenced request, an original typewritton. letter and envelope addressed to the American Embassy, Suxahola, were manipud in order to determine the origin of the letter and the nationality of the writer.

2. The following conclusions were drawn concerning the letter and anvelops:

a. The typewriter in question is equipped with an obsolete style of German-mile type which, according to our references, was fitted on a number of typewriters made in Germany during the 1920s and early 1930s. The possible makes would be Stoower, Torredo, Mercodes, Rheinstall, Urania, Orga, Fortuna, Costinental, Kappel, Groma, Triumph, Norz and possibly same others. Of these makes, the Torpedo, Hercedes, Rhoimmetall and Triumph were probably the. 2 1 most widely distributed.

b. The moting in quantion is equipped with a black and red Sitton. The keyleard is very probably Suddich, as shown by two strike-overs: unleut-u for symbol and "z" for "a". These characters are solacent on the stanlard Swedish keyboard, but not on the German. The unlast-a was not used in the street address, "Strendvagen" (where the dot: should have been tlaced over the second "a"). This might be either a simple oversight or an attempt while to conceal the writer's familiarity with the correct spolling.

c. The paper of the letter is of the international standard See. Sec. (DIN) size "A4" which is almost universally used in System. The Linen-textured stationery soons to be rather comen in Sucien. The two smaller pieces of blank paper match the letter paper with respect to width, thickness, color, texture and lock-turkigh, and vere probably cut from another sheet of the same type. The envelope ratches specimens of Swedish envelopes taken from DE/5-Postal. Intelligence files.

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d. The letter was posted from the Stockholm Ean post office,
which is located in the central railway terminal in Stockholm.
All mail deposited in street shill beset in this area or in the post
office would be processed inrough this station.

e. The cancellation cachet on the envelope is identical in all respects (format, postmark, number style and length of killer bars) to exemplore available in our office.

f. The postary is correct for Sudich internal mail and the postage stamp is comment issue.

g. A possible irregularity is the time leg between the interval date of the letter, the date of the postmark and the date of receipt in the American Enhancy. The total time from the interval date of the letter to the time of receipt is eight days, the time between the date of posting and the date of receipt is more than three days. This transit time of more than three days for intra-city mail appears irregular when compared with the overage transit time of cally twothree days for arrival between Stockholm and the United States.

3. The text of the letter warrants some connents because a number of peculiarities were noted - asile from pare spelling or typing errors which seem to indicate a Swelich writer. Me following words represent either Swedish spelling or-modification:-freerv", "etablished", "murded", "Krustjev". Other examples of Swedish (paramer and systax would be: "must" (as post tense), "in Soutet" (Swedish form but not spelling), "he was spy" (without indefinite article), "FBT, USA" (without definite article), "should" (rather than "would"), 'outsmuggled"...(Swedish participle form), and "whole the world" (pare Swedish form).

4. Another significant detail is the name given, "Ryo Lisng Yuan". "Ryo" is not a standard spelling in any known Reconstration system used for Chinese. "R" is seen in the new Chinese Communist national system, but never in combination with "yo". "Ryo" is a Japaneze spelling. In the name given it is not known whether the Chinese or Western presentation is used, in other words, whether "Ryo" or "Yuan" is meant to be the surname. Among Chinese syllables which could be represented by the Japaneze "Ryo" are Liso, Liang and Ling. (r these Lung (TC:703) and Liang (M:2733) are used as surname. In either case, "Ryo" is nardly a same by which a real Chinese workh identify himself.

5. In summary, and based on the above information, it is concluded that the letter was transmitted via normal Buddish postal charmols. The letter is probably a "crank letter", most likely written by a Suede, using a Sudish-keyboard typewriter and Swedish stationery.

SUBJECT: Technical Analysis of Letter and Envelope

1. Attached is a letter mailed to the American Embassy in Stockholm purportedly from an officer in the Chinese Communist Embassy in Stockholm. Also included is the envelope and a plain folded sheet of paper which presumably was used to enfold the letter within the envelope. Please perform a technical analysis of these attachments to determine whatever can be determined concerning the origin of the paper, envelope, typewriter, and ink used. If you have any capability for comparing this letter with other correspondence originating with the Chinese Communist Embassy in Stockholm, we would like your opinics on whether or not the stationery, typewriter, and envelope are of the type normally used by that Embassy.

Because of the sensational nature of the contents of the letter and the necessity for our checking out such allegations as quickly and thoroughly as possible, it is requested that this technical analysis be undertaken on a priority basis and that the undersigned by notified by phone as soon as any conclusions are reached.

3. Please acknowledge the receipt of the attached letter and ensure that its whereabouts, when in your custody, is a matter of record. We prefer that the letter and envelope be kept as intact.as.possible.while undergoing technical analysis.

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"Oswald" Letter to US Embassy, Stockholm.

R^wgarding the language in the Subject letter, which isn't standard English, it is difficult to say that it reflects any particular foreign (non-English) background. "Outsmuggled" is Germanic, and "Sowiet" may be Germanic or Slavic, and both may tend to be suggestive. However, a Chinese who has studies several European languages may easily mix the idioms or spellings of any of them in an effort at English composition.

A more significant detail is the name given, Ryo Liang Yüan. "Ryo" is not a scandard spelling in any known romanization system used for Chinese. "R" is seen in the new Chinese Communist national system, but never in combination with "yo". "Ryo" is a Japanese spelling.

In the name given it is not known whether the Chinese or western presentation is used, or, in other words, whether "Ryo" or "YUan" is meant to be the surname. Among Chinese syllables which could be represented by the Japanese "Ryo" are Liao, Liang and Lung. Of these Lung (TC: 7893) and Liang (TC: 2733) are used as surnames. In either case, "Ryo" is hardly a name by which a real Chinese would identify himself.


The unit which keeps record of Chinese Communist diplomatic and official personnel abroad will very probably be able to determine whether there is an actual person in the Chinese Communist Embassy in Stockholm with whom the name given in the letter can be connected. The US Embassy will have means of learning whether that person was in Stockholm at the time of the letter writing, and whether he has subsequently been removed.
