During the period from September 1963, when he matriculated at Hofstra University, Farmingdale, New York, until June 1970, when he graduated, my son, Eric H. Aronson, led the student demonstrations against the war in Viet Nam. He informed me, at that time, that he had, on three occasions, been subjected to interview and interrogation by agents of your agency.
