Disperination of Air Travel Information

1. For several months now CIA has been disseminating in Vashington to all of the normal recipients of telegraphic disseminations, reports received by telegram from Hexico City containing the passenger lists of Cubana flights between Hexico City and Havana. This information is simultaneously made available to CIA stations in the countries concerned and to our Panasa Station for dissemination to CINCO.

2. The question has been ruised within CIA as to enother the widespread disconnation of this information in Frahington in TRCS form is really necessary. I would appreciate it if you would furnish copies of this mesorundus to each member of the Committee with the request that they determine the need for these lists within their respective agencies and be prepared to discuss this problem at our next meeting.
