THE FOLLOWING RELATED INFORMATION WAS SUBSEQUENTLY PROVIDED BY AN OFFICIAL OF A JAPANESE SECURITY SERVICE: ON 11 NOVEMBER 1967, > THE DAY OF THE BAIKAL 'S DEPARTURE FROM JAPAN, JAPANESE POLICE CONT DUCTING A SURVEILLANCE OPERATION PHOTOGRAPHED CARGO BEING LOADED ON THE BAIKAL. IN THREE OF THESE PHOTO GRAPHS. CLEARLY VISIBLE ALONG THE RAIL IN THE BACKGROUND, ARE THE SAME TWO PERSONS SHOWN ABROARD THE BALKAL IN AN "ASAHI GRAPH" PHOTO GRAPH PUBLISHED IN JAPAN ON 4 DECEMBER AND IDENTIFIED BY "ASAHIGRAPH" AS TWO OF THE DESERTERS FROM THE USS INTREPID. THE POLICE PHOTOGRAPHS WERE FORWARDED THROUGH JAPANESE GOVERNMENT CHANNELS TO THE JAPANESE FOREIGN MINISTRY BY A POLICE OFFICAL WITH THE ORAL COMMENT THAT THIS WAS CONSIDERED EVIDENCE THAT THE DESERTERS LEFT JAPAN ON THE BAIKAL. THE POLICE DID NOT INFORM THE FOREIGN MINISTRY THAT THE PHOTO GRAPHS HAD BEEN TAKEN IN A SURVEILLANCE OPERATION. BUT MERELY THAT THEY "HAD COME INTO THE HANDS OF THE POLICE."

3. THE ABOVE INFORMATION IS BEING PASSED TO THE U.S. EMBASSY IN TOKYO.
