CONTACT REPORT

SUBJECT: Recentact of Cliveric A. TORRY Vassilo. (201-283204)

- 1. At 1730 bours, & June 64, the undersigned was advised at his residence that a Mr. TUMEU (Subject) had called the security number given him (351-6161) and left the message that he would like to talk again with Paul Stroud (the undersigned) anytime after 1800 bours, & June.
- 2. Upon arriving at TONEU's spartment (Apt. 303, 1028 Wahler Place SE, High Point Apartment House, Rashington, D. C.), 1830 hours, 8 June, TONEU indicated to his two daughters he would like to have some privacy and they and his wife, Caridad, left the apartment.
- 3. TORING apologized for not having received the name "de VARONA" as that of Ans Gloria de VARONA. He reiterated that, while in hiding to escape capture by the Cuban Government subsequent to his infiltration, he knew only the first names of the persons with whom he came is contact, but then added he knew Ann Gloria de VARONA, in whose house he was hiding, because she was the sister of Carlos de VARONA, one of his infiltration team members. (This Carlos de VARONA may be identical with one Carlos Hannal de VARONA Segura, 201-289985; or one Carlos Arturo WARONA Arjona, 201-283205.)
- 4. On several occarious, according to TOMES, he was meated at the table in Ann's bouse with several other people. One of these individuals, known to TOMES only as "COCO," was described as the secretary to Jose LLARGEA Gobel. There was not, however, any discussions in which TOMES recalls LLANGEA or his political appeatables having been discussed. According to TOMES's recollection it was "COCO" who was associated with LLANGEA, and he was not avere of any relationship between Ann and LLANGEA. Although TOMES had no information as to what finally happened to Carlos de VAROMA, his infiltration team mate, he suggested that if Carlos or Ann were available they may be able to identify "COCC" and provide data on his accessability for content.

TORKU affirmed Osiel was previously with MKMUTO Gutierrer in the becond Front of Recembray. Osiel was under asylum in the Brazilian kmbssay (sic, Argentine Embassy?), when Tomku grained political asylum. When Osiel finally received his safe conduct from the Embassy, he went to Puerto Rico and, TOMEU postulates that Osiel is now again with MEMOTO in either the United States or Puerto Rico.

- 6. Two shap shots (to be returned) were provided by TOMIU of himself and six other individuals who were in asylum at the same time. He identified these, in the photograph in which Monsignor Eduardo BOZA Masvidal is seated, as, from left to right: Manuel VILLAMANAN, Oliverio TOMEU, Mile DIAZ (believed to be in US), Public RUIZ (US), Jorge Del VALLE (Mex?), and Omiel GONZALEZ (US or Puerto Rico?).
- 7. Up a completing the debriefing, Stroud and TOMEU "emchanged small talk" for a while until TOMEU finally stated that he still wished there was something more he could do to help free Cube, and asked "What do you think I should do?" Stroud replied that no person could really make that type of decision for another individual, and countered by asking TOMEU what alternatives he had in mind, other than remaining in the US Army as a career military officer.
- TONEY replied that, of course, he was once an agriculturalist, but that there were few job opportunities in which be could apply his past experience. His sister had also asked him if he felt he and his family would want to live with her in Spain or Mexico, but he didn't think too much of this idea. He then stated that he had been asked by Manuel ARTIME to take a job as an instructor. Without indicating any association of even awareness of ARTINE's activities, or of ARTINE's contact with TOMEU (as indicated in TOMEU's 201), TOMEU was asked what he thought of ARTINE's proposition. TOKET stated that he would no longer follow any man as an individual or as a leader, because a man's ideals, outlook, and objectives change with time. For example, the people of Cuba followed Fidel because of the ideals he advocated. When Fidel took over, his accomplishments gradually became quire different from the ideals he had espoused. TOMEU continued by saying he would "no longer follow a man. One could only trust his ideals or an organization which followed those ideals, since a good organization would be less likely of being controlled by a single man." When saked for an example of the type of organization he had in mind, TOMBU replied he was most favorably inclined towards the ideals and goals of the JURE. (The JURE or JEC is an organization created by Manolo RAY Rivero around a nucleus of former 26 July Novement leaders. See memo and attachment dated 23 July 1963 from John Sugh Crimmins, Coordinator of Cuban Affairs, ARA, Department of State in TOMEU's 201-283206.) Espiedes iron automali.

It should, perhaps, be noted here that is an informal exchange with Mrs. Donald WEBSTER, TOMEU's supervisor at the Defense Language Institute, Associat Raval Assoc, 4 June 64, Mrs. VEBSTER volunteered the information that "all of the other 'Brigade students here' have told me they think very highly of TOMEU, and that he is a very brave man, because he and his family were very wealthy in Cuba and he gave it all up to go into exile and fight the Castro Regime."
