

1. During the period under review, financial support to the AMSPELL organization has been reduced significantly. As reported in references, the primary reason for the reduction was the inconsistencies of many AMSPELL activities with current WOFACT directives.
2. Cooperation between AMSPELL and the Station has been maintained through AMHINT-2, the principal agent of the AMSPELL operation. Although no longer being carried on a salaried basis, AMHINT-2 has continued to be responsive to Station guidance.
3. AMSPELL has continued its correspondence with various student groups and leaders throughout the free world, and especially in Latin America. AMSPELL has contacted various international student groups requesting passage money so that its delegates could be afforded the opportunity to attend upcoming international student conferences.
4. A campaign was launched to call attention to the plight of Pedro Luis BOITEL, a Cuban student leader who was unjustly imprisoned on the Isle of Pines by the CASTRO regime. A report/denunciation of the imprisonment of BOITEL was prepared and sent to AMSPELL's principal contacts in the Latin American student field seeking support for AMSPELL's demand that BOITEL be released.

B. PRODUCTION**1. AMSPELL bi-monthly magazine (copy being forwarded under separate cover)**

a. AMSPELL efforts during recent months have been mainly concentrated on the preparation of its new bi-monthly magazine. 8,000 copies of the magazine's first edition which was published in May 1966 were distributed as follows:

- (1) 3,000 copies sent to Latin America
- (2) 1,100 copies distributed by AMSPELL delegations
- (3) 3,000 copies distributed among Cubans in the United States
- (4) 100 copies were sent to AMSPELL contacts and student movements in Europe, Africa, Asia, Canada, etc.
- (5) Members of the AMSPELL organization also received copies in which the AMSPELL internal bulletin was inserted. Each member was asked to promote the sale of subscriptions and advertising space as well as to seek persons who would collaborate with the magazine staff by contributing their talents.
- (6) The remainder was distributed among the various embassies, official representations of governments and organizations, both in the United States and abroad, as well as among Cuban exile journalists and organizations.

2. AMSPELL Cuban mailing

Since March 1966, 1,000 envelopes containing AMSPELL propaganda have been mailed to Cuba on a monthly basis. This propaganda is directed particularly at students who support the regime (copies of the propaganda are being forwarded under separate cover).

3. Press

The majority of AMSPELL press releases have been in connection with the mistreatment of political prisoners by the Castro regime. Other releases concerned the aforementioned BOITEL campaign and a tribute to Cuban martyrs who gave their lives fighting against the BATISTA dictatorship in 1957. (Copies of the press releases are being forwarded under separate cover.)

C. FINANCIAL


1. Final payment of AMSPELL salaries and termination bonuses was made in February in line with the Station's reduction of financial support to AMSPELL. Under the present arrangement JMWAVE support is limited to \$1,600 monthly, this includes the \$200 monthly financial support payment to AMHINT-1's family, office overhead, and support for printing/distributing the bi-monthly publication.

2. The following amounts were expended by the Station in support of AMSPELL activities during the second half of FY 66:

Operational expenses	\$ 9,929.74
Salaries and termination bonuses	6,200.00
Total expenditures	\$16,129.74

D. FUTURE PLANS

It is anticipated that AMSPELL efforts in the near future will be directed at the upcoming CLAE meeting which is scheduled to be held in Havana 29 July to 9 August 1966.

A. OPERATIONAL

1. General

During the period under review AMSPELL continued operations aimed at the student/youth target. AMSPELL sent a circular letter to students and youth in Cuba in an effort to establish a "dialogue" between these young people and AMSPELL. Other AMSPELL activities during this period are contained below.

2. Printed Propaganda.

a. Monthly AMSPELL Bulletin:

b. The regular bulletin highlighted the following themes: The need for solidarity in the struggle for liberty for Cuban political prisoners; the new trend in Polish communism and its criticism toward the system; the attitude of Soviet students toward totalitarianism and the failure of Castro's plan to indoctrinate Cuban students. The December bulletin carried a special Christmas message. (Copies of the bulletin are being sent for Headquarters information under separate cover.)

Topics discussed on the program included: The war in Viet Nam; commentaries supporting work of student groups throughout the world in combating communism; news of student and youth activities in Cuba and Latin America; world news reports; and a special Christmas message in December.

4. Press Releases

Diario las Americas: a. Tighter control over university councils in Cuba.

b. Activities of Cuban agents in Mexico.

c. The large number of relatives of high Cuban officials reported among refugees.

Bohemia Libre: a. Reports on the exodus.

b. Comments on Che Guevara's disappearance and his wife's condition.

AMHIM: a. AMSPELL comments on a Miami Herald article concerning statements by Cuban students regarding the incompatibility between Christianity and Communism.

b. Cuban agents reportedly responsible for demonstrations against Secretary of State Dean Rusk and Senator Robert Kennedy while on tours in Latin America.

c. Analysis of anti-Christian policies in Cuban universities.



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

C. FUTURE ACTIVITIES

A. OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES

1. General

During the period under review, AMHINT/2 visited Caracas and turned in a report on the university situation in that country which was submitted in Reference. In addition to the normal propaganda activities, the AMSPELL group waged a campaign for the release of political prisoners and has intensified this campaign since the announcement of the "open door" policy on 28 September 1965.

2. Propaganda Production (samples forwarded under separate cover)

a. 4,800 copies of the bulletin were mailed into PBRUMEN each month. Over 6,000 copies of the international edition were sent monthly to addressees in Latin America and Western Europe. Among the main issues treated in the bulletins were: internal problems of PBRUMEN communism as a result of Ben Bella's overthrow; communist atrocities in Viet Nam; testimony of Alberto Muller on the secret executions in Communist PBRUMEN; the comments of Identity A with respect to the PBRUMEN situation, the exodus and Che Guevara's disappearance.

b. Miscellaneous press clippings and press releases are also forwarded under separate cover. Included is an article by AMHINT/2 on the student discontent in PBRUMEN which appeared in Identity B. Other articles and press releases were used by Identities B, C and D and by AMHIM.

AMSPELL continued its weekly radio programs and in addition prepared tapes for distribution to numerous Latin American radio stations. One such tape featured statements made by Alberto MULLER before his imprisonment. Local Spanish language stations also used AMSPELL tapes.

In September, AMBARB/54 and two other members of AMSPELL resigned to seek other employment. The Station would appreciate current information regarding KULAMP's interest and possible employment of AMBARB/54 (per DIR 40-14). He is an intelligent and capable individual and is currently investigating job possibilities in ZRMETAL with several international agencies.



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



In connection with the prisoners' campaign (paragraph 5(a) below), 10,000 copies of the Prisoners' Message were printed; attachment No. 6; 5,000 copies of a letter to Chilean President Eduardo Frei, attachment No. 7; 5,000 circular letters to Latin American Identity A organizations, attachment No. 8; and 5,000 copies of a circular letter to AMSPELL Delegates, attachment No. 9.

3. Radio Propaganda

AMSPELL continued its regular radio operations consisting of a 15-minute program Tuesdays through Saturdays on AMTHIGH, and a 15-minute program broadcast every Monday over WMIE and several Latin American stations.

4. Press Releases

Miscellaneous press releases are included as attachment No. 10, under separate cover.

5. Other Activities.

a. The prisoners' campaign got off to a slow start. The Identity B meeting in March, which was supposed to have been the kick-off of the campaign, did not produce the expected results. Identity C was on a Latin American tour and was unable to attend, and Identity D, who had promised to push the prisoners' cause at the meeting, limited himself to pleas for Cuban Identity E prisoners. The letter written to Chilean President Eduardo Frei (attachment No. 7) by AMSPELL members imprisoned on the Isle of Pines was forwarded to the AMSPELL delegation in Santiago for delivery to the President. The Chilean elections, followed by the earthquake complicated this plan and the delivery of the letter was delayed. (See paragraph 2-d above for information re propaganda printed by AMSPELL in connection with the campaign.)

b. In connection with the 13 March anniversary of the assault on the Cuban Presidential Palace, AMSPELL issued a press release (attachment No. 10), all publications contained appropriate editorials and, in addition to full coverage on the regular AMSPELL radio programs, additional radio coverage was obtained on JMWAVE and AMTHIGH with a special interview. The AMSPELL publication re the anniversary is attached under separate cover, No. 11.

c. The AMSPELL delegation in Mexico participated in the tribute to Venezuelan workers (CTV) organized by the Cubans residing in Mexico City. (See attachment No. 10 for pertinent press releases.) Activities of other AMSPELL Delegations including publications and press releases are included under attachment No. 12.







Page two of the AMSPELL December bulletin carried a full-page spread with photographs, attributing the Congo atrocities to Communist intervention. Approximately 3,000 copies of the Spanish-language edition were sent to Latin America and Spain in December. Approximately 2,000 copies each of the English and French language editions are being sent overseas (Europe, Asia, and Africa) during January. (Attachment No. 1, under separate cover.) The French edition was not available as this dispatch was being written but will be mailed 15 January.

2. The pony edition of the AMSPELL newspaper for December carried a brief story with photographs concerning the death of missionary Paul Carlson. Approximately 5,000 copies were mailed into Cuba at the end of December and early January. (Attachment No. 2, under separate cover.) In addition to the printed propaganda AMSPELL also carried appropriate news bulletins regarding the Congo atrocities on its 10-minutes' AMTHIGH program, with editorial comment attacking Communist exploitation of the Congolese.



LA SITUACION UNIVERSITARIA

Antes del Comunismo

- 1.- Habian 8 Universidades en Cuba.
- 2.- En 1959 habian más de 30,000 estudiantes Universitarios en las 8 Universidades.
- 3.- La Constitución de 1940 estipulaba que el 1% del Presupuesto Nacional sería entregado a la Universidad de La Habana.
- 4.- La Carta Magna Cubana garantizaba la autonomía Universitaria lo que hacia que la enseñanza superior en Cuba no estuviera sometida a ningún gobierno.
- 5.- En nuestras Universidades existía el ejercicio libre de las ideas, no coartándose ningún pensamiento.
- 6.- Los estudiantes Universitarios elegían cada año sus representantes estudiantiles en libres elecciones, asistiendo los dirigentes a Congresos Internacionales de Juventudes en representación de los jóvenes cubanos.
- 7.- Las Universidades como centro máximo de la Democracia servían de medio idóneo para plantear las mejoras que el pueblo cubano pedía.
- 8.- Era requisito para el ingreso en las Universidades el tener 17 años de edad y haber cursado el Bachillerato (enseñanza de estudio) o aprobar severos exámenes de ingreso.
- 9.- El 90% del profesorado Universitario actuante en junio de 1959, ha marchado al exilio o ha renunciado a sus cátedras por no querer aceptar al comunismo o no quererse doblegar a su doctrina.
- 10.- Cientos de estudiantes Universitarios guardan prisión en las cárceles comunistas, por el solo delito de amar la libertad. Las listas de militares cubanos asesinados ante los pelotones de fusilamiento o muertos por sus gestos de rebeldía han aumentado con los nombres de estudiantes universitarios como, Juanín Pereira, Virgilio Campaneria, Julio A. Yebra, Tapia Ruano, Portoríto Ramírez, y tantos otros que han sabido morir antes que claudicar frente al comunismo.

Con el Comunismo

- 1.- Hay tres Universidades.
- 2.- Actualmente no llegan a 20,000 los estudiantes Universitarios.
- 3.- Abolida la Constitución del 40 y según el Presupuesto Nacional del Gobierno Comunista, la Universidad de la Habana ha recibido una rebaja de un 75% de sus entradas.
- 4.- El gobierno comunista, pisoteó la Autonomía Universitaria, alegando que las Universidades deben marchar junto a la Revolución Roja, sitiando los intereses del régimen.
- 5.- El régimen dictatorial de Fidel Castro impuso el marxismo-leninismo, como asignatura obligatoria en todas las carreras y proscriptió la enseñanza de cualquier ideología contraria al comunismo.
- 6.- Desde octubre de 1959, no se han celebrado elecciones Estudiantiles, ya que la única vez que quisieron legalizar la representación universitaria, los comunistas celebraron una llamada Asamblea General, donde por "aclamación" se aligió la Nueva Directiva que después de 3 años sigue rigiendo, salvo contados casos.
- 7.- Actualmente las Universidades son organismos serviles al Gobierno comunista, controlados directamente por funcionarios de la Dictadura Roja.
- 8.- No hay requisitos de edad ni tampoco de haber cursado estudios secundarios. Dándose el caso que jóvenes de 14 años de edad realicen estudios universitarios sin estudios previos actualmente.
- 9.- No es requisito actualmente ser graduado universitario para ejercer de profesor en las Universidades comunistas de Cuba. Alumnos que han aprobado asignaturas del primer año y que cursan el segundo, son profesores de sus compañeros que inician sus estudios ese año, y así en la misma proporción los alumnos del 3er. curso con profesores del 2do. y los del 4to. el 3ro. etc.
- 10.- Mientras los verdaderos estudiantes dejan de estudiar en Cuba, guardan prisión, marchan al exilio o realizan la lucha contra el comunismo, el gobierno Rojo utiliza jóvenes que sin preparación previa asisten a las aulas universitarias con el solo propósito de servir de títeres a los comunistas en el Tablado Internacional.

Noticiero ESTUDIANTIL

CIEN ESTUDIANTES PANAMEÑOS A MOSCÚ - Según César Brugiatto, estudiante en la Universidad Patricio Lumumba de Moscú y dirigente de la Asociación de Estudiantes Panameños en la capital moscovita, treinta jóvenes de Panamá estudian actualmente allí; su número se elevará muy pronto al cienario. Los becados panameños se dirigen a Moscú vía México, La Habana y Praga.

EN EL FUTURO: UNION DE ESTUDIANTES UNIVERSITARIOS CENTROAMERICANOS - Dirigentes estudiantiles de las universidades de Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador y Panamá se hallan laborando - local y colectivamente - en pro del propósito de fundar una Unión de Estudiantes Universitarios Centroamericanos. La idea no es nueva, pero ahora gana fuerza y es probable que se convierta en realidad antes de que transcurran muchos meses.

EL PROGRAMA DE COOPERACION POPULAR, MOTIVO DE DISCORDIA EN PERÚ - Los partidos de oposición convienen en la utilidad del programa de Cooperación Popular - asistencia técnica para proyectos comunales - auspiciado por el presidente Belaunde e impulsado por los estudiantes en gran parte, pero se oponen a su centralización de control en las manos personales de aquél. La coalición opositora - encabezada por el APRA - reclama que Cooperación Popular sea "municipalizada" o sea que cada municipio reciba los fondos pertinentes y los utilice localmente como estime conveniente. "Así se evitará la infiltración de comunistas en el programa", alega el APRA.

PARA VISITAR ALEMANIA OCCIDENTAL, UN REQUISITO: NO SER JOVEN - Alemania del Este permite que sus ciudadanos de avanzada edad visiten a familiares en Alemania Occidental, pero no deja que los jóvenes den ese viaje. Excusa alegada: "Es más fácil que allá tomen represalias con los jóvenes y no con los viejos". Y agrega el periódico *Neues Deutschland* de Alemania Oriental, como quien pone un parche: "Nadie debe pensar que nuestro gobierno no tiene confianza en la juventud..."

UN "NUEVO CAMINO" PARA LA UNIVERSIDAD CATÓLICA DE CHILE - En conclave reciente, los estudiantes de la Universidad Católica analizaron "la necesidad de adaptar sus estudios y la Universidad a las exigencias sociales del mundo de hoy". Punto aprobado, entre otros: que la Universidad actúe "con mayor independencia frente a la jerarquía eclesiástica", imprimiéndole a ese centro de altos estudios "el espíritu renovador de la Iglesia de Juan XXIII y de Pablo VI, contenido en el actual Concilio Ecuménico.

OUR OPINION

As another year draws to its end, we find before a world new in many aspects but sadly stagnant if not actually retrogressive in some of life's most vital facets. Humanity is a year older but is it not still engaged in a relentless search for the true meaning of its being?

December is a thoughtful month in the lives of men. It is the hour of retrospect, of questioning, of reorganization and projection into the future. Above all, December is a yearly reminder of an idea and a way of life for men. A new and revolutionary order born twenty centuries ago, comes vigorously to the forefront for in the long months of toil we have not forgotten the cause and the goal of our existence.

THE EVENTS IN THE CONGO

A PROOF OF WHAT COMMUNISM IS



Recent happenings in the Congo have rocked the civilized world, leaving in their wake a deep preoccupation in the hearts of all who believed in even the most basic principles of humanity and who see in these acts a vengeful boast of cruelty against the most elemental principles of kindness and respect.

Those who struggle for freedom have always found in us the sympathy and understanding that only those who know full well that this struggle entails can give. We find, however, that in the case of the utterly misnamed "Congolese Troops of Liberation" we must (along with all civilized men) denounce this new and bloody contribution of international communism to the oppression and suppression of all peoples.

This movement has been, as others have been before, thoroughly infiltrated by communists; and in this, as in other cases, the true goal of destruction and death sought by the International can clearly be seen.

The hearts of youth throughout the world have echoed in sympathy the cries, the tears, and the pain of Africa's birth. The growth of the Black Continent into a continent of republics is a symbol of the inconstable right of this Continent to a great destiny.

That is why the sincere struggles for freedom of African nations have met with our support as with that of all freedom-loving peoples.

It is this love of true freedom that necessarily places us in a position of adversity towards this movement. The happenings in the Congo find their motivation not in a zealous search for justice and liberty but in the international policies Moscow and Peking seek to enforce in Africa by any and all means.

In the deaths, the rapes, the insults have grieved and enraged them now must the attitude of the nations of the Communist Bloc and of those who, consciously or not, serve their interest rattle.



Without the slightest trace of scruple these nations have hurtled themselves into acrimonious abuse of the nations which took part in the rescue mission, whose only purpose was the humanitarian one of saving the lives of non-belligerents.

The attitude of these nations and the "student demonstrations" staged in communist countries to show approval of the Congolese rebels clearly show the direction they would have the Congo's liberation take. Where the Congolese struggle might have been a war of liberation, it has become instead a senseless war run by mercenaries and abetted by the Communist Powers.



When faced with the crimes in the Congo one Soviet official glibly dismissed the violence by stating that the rescuing nations had been warned it would happen if rescue was attempted.


We would ask this question of civilized men: By what Code of war can the slaughter of non-belligerents because of attempts to rescue them be justified? Since when has it been found permissible for an army to do its own ugly will in regards to old men, to missionaries, to women, and to children? Has racism suddenly found a moral justification?

Mass murder and rape can only find justification in those whose creed is hatred and whose aim is to divide.

Fortunately the Communists have not won this battle. Africa will have freedom, and it will not have the maulled, caged communist version of it. Those responsible for so much ugly violence in the Congo do not represent the spirit of the Congolese people and have received the condemnation of Africa and of the whole world.

Africa feels ashamed of what has happened, but this act will help her understand she has to face an enemy as dangerous, or more so, than colonialism.

The criminal actions of communism in the Congo have only one answer and the Africans themselves will give it: ITS REPUDIATION.



UNIVERSITIES STATUS

Before Communism.

- 1.- There were 8 universities in Cuba.
- 2.- In 1959 there were more than 30,000 students in the 8 universities.
- 3.- The Constitution of 1940 stipulated that 1% of the national budget would go to the University of Havana.
- 4.- The Great Charter of Cuba guaranteed autonomy to the Universities, freeing them from interference by the government.
- 5.- There was a free and open exchange of ideas in the classrooms.
- 6.- Every year the students elected their own representatives in free elections.
- 7.- The universities served as spokesmen for the wishes of the Cuban people.
- 8.- To enter the Universities it was necessary to be 17 years of age and to have graduated from a secondary school or to have taken rigorous tests to prove knowledge equivalent to a secondary school education.
- 9.- Ninety percent of the University professorate is in exile or has retire, unwilling to have communist doctrines imposed upon it.
- 10.- Hundreds of university students are held in communist prisons, only because of their love for liberty. The lists of cuban martyrs, murdered by firing squads or killed by its rebellion, had been increased by the names of Cuban universities students such as; Juanin Pereira, Virgilio Campanario, Julio A. Yebra, Tapia Ruano, Porfirio Ramirez, and so many others that had preferred to die than to submit to communism.

With Communism

- 1.- There are three universities.
- 2.- There are no more than 20,000 university students presently.
- 3.- The Constitution of 1940 has been abolished and the Communist regime has cut by 75% the funds destined for the University of Havana.
- 4.- The regime subjects the Universities requiring them to follow its dictates in all matters.
- 5.- Marxism Leninism is a required subject for all students and all other ideologies are forbidden.
- 6.- There have been no election since September 1959. At one point when an effort was made to have them held, the Communists arranged a so called "general assembly" where by, "popular acclaim", those who have since held control, were "elected".
- 7.- Today, they are servile instruments of the regime.
- 8.- No requisites concerning age or previous education are set. There have been cases of fourteen-year old with little previous education studying at the universities.
- 9.- It is no longer a requisite to be a college graduate in order to be able to teach at the university. Second year students teach freshmen, third year students teach second year ones, etc...
- 10.- While real students left their classes, are held in prison, went to exile or fight communism, the Red Government uses uneducated young people as university students, with the only purpose to serve communist International Scene.

STUDENT NEWS SHEET

GUATEMALA UNIVERSITY STUDENTS START A "LITERACY DRIVE". The Association of University Students of Guatemala has pledged itself to undertake an alphabetization campaign on a national scale. It is expected that a good number of students from the two universities in the country will cooperate in this effort to teach the illiterate.

CHILE: The Federation of Students of the Catholic University (FEUC) held its Sixth Ordinary Convention of Students from September 30th. to October 3rd. Among the topics discussed were: "The Idea of a University", "the nature and the Problems of Today's University", "The Development and actual Position of Latin American Universities". These discussions culminated in a series of proposals which open the way for a effective, modern University Reform. The basic documentation has been condensed in book form under the title, "The University, Our Task" this book, edited by the Federation, is unique in its kind in Latin America.

ONE HUNDRED PANAMANIAN STUDENTS TO MOSCOW: According to Cesar Brugiatto, a student at Moscow's Patrice Lumumba University and President of the Association of Panamanian Students in that capital, there are thirty young men from Panama studying there but the number will soon be raised to one hundred. These students go to Moscow by way Mexico, Havana, Prague.

IN PROSPECT: AN UNION OF CENTRAL AMERICAN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS: Student leaders from the Universities of Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador and Panama are working - both locally and collectively - on plans to establish an Union of Central American University Students. Although the idea is not a new one it seems to have found a particularly favorable atmosphere at this time and it is highly probable that it will be carried out to completion.

THE PROGRAM OF POPULAR COOPERATION: A SOURCE OF DISCORD IN PERU. The opposition parties in Peru, while accepting as necessary the Popular Cooperation Program - technical assistance for communal projects promulgated by President Belaunde and backed in a major part by the students, are opposed to the centralization of its control entirely into the hands of the President.

The opposition coalition - headed by the APRA - asks that the Program be "municipalized" that is that each locality receive the necessary funds and administer them as it deems convenient. The APRA alleges that this would prevent communist infiltration to the program.

TO VISIT EAST GERMANY, ONE PREREQUISIT: AGE. In East Germany elderly people are allowed to visit their relatives in West Germany but young people are not permitted to make the trip. The excuse given by the government: "It is more likely that repressive measures will be taken in the West against the young". Then it adds, somewhat in the manner of a patch: "No one must think we do not trust our youth . . ."

A "NEW ROAD" FOR THE CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF CHILE
In a recent meeting, the students of the Catholic University analyzed "the necessity of adapting their studies and the University to the social demands of today's world".
Among the decisions approved: that the University act "with greater independence with regard to the ecclesiastical hierarchy" upon impressing that institution "the renovation spirit of the Church of John XXIII and Paul VI contained in the present Ecumenical Council".

Men who have attained a true understanding of the reason for their existence cannot be satisfied with mere subsistence. Their lives find meaning only in service. Service to God and to man. These words embody, to a large extent, the greatness of those men whom history has claimed for itself and whom humanity holds in admiration for the fruitful results of their endeavors. Their eagerness to serve led to achieve for their fellows new horizons of material comfort, of intellectual satisfaction, of spiritual attainment. These same words are perhaps also the only ones which could make youths throughout the world visualize the profound meaning of the sacrifice of hundreds of Cuban Students and in particular of Juanin Pereira Varela.

His life contemplated no ideal but to serve. To serve God, to serve his Land, to serve his countrymen by giving them an opportunity to live in a free and just land. His life from the moment the establishment of a dictatorial government in Cuba became an unquestionable reality, was dedicated to battle and to toil. From the ranks of the D.R.E., he struggled against the evil that had reduced to angry impotence the longings for permanent peace and freedom in the hearts of our people. He fought the enemy that impeded the establishment of a Christian system and drowned the joy in the hearts of his countrymen. He toiled to ascertain that in the future that system, that joy, and that justice could exist.

His would not be the joy however of seeing his labors bear fruit. It was his lot to die and by his death achieve what his hands could not.

His blood would reawaken in his countrymen the fervor of patriotism and he would stand as an example to the "Continent of Hopes" which more and more demands to be a continent of human realizations.

That was the life of Juanin Pereira. It was brought to an end by militiamen's bullets given by the Soviet Union to strike down all who oppose the empire they seek to establish. But the bullet that struck him down on that October day of 1961 brought forth. A seed that now quietly germinates in every corner of his land, that cries out to the world that Cuba does not give up, does not submit, does not die. Inspite of some faithless sons, of foreign troops that tramp through our land, of opportunistic Western governments, the seed watered by Juanin Pereira's blood will bear fruit, it now grows and the land that holds it vibrates with its growth and the skies above it echo more loudly each day:



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



A. OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES**1. General.**

AMSPELL has so far survived the internal crisis brought about by the collapse of its military activity noted in the previous progress report. However, AMSPELL is still faced with a severe financial problem resulting from the termination of the military activity. AMHINT-2 states that AMSPELL has \$12,000.00 in short-term loans which must be met shortly, and \$20,000.00 in loans being paid off at the rate of \$1,300.00 per month. AMHINT-2 is trying to sell the AMSPELL boats in order to liquidate these debts. So far he has had little success. AMHINT-2 has said that he does not intend to give up the idea of active participation in the liberation of Cuba but that AMSPELL will not conduct new military operations in the future without ODYOKE assistance and concurrence. According to AMHINT-2 lack of funds and intelligence information together with pressure by ODYOKE on Dominican authorities frustrated the AMSPELL military operation, and he has no intention of going through a similar disastrous experience again.

2. Propaganda.

b. 4,800 copies of the pony AMSPELL newspaper were mailed into Cuba (Attachment No. 2, under separate cover.) Both the pony and regular editions stress the conflict between the old-guard and the "new-guard" communists, the boycott declared by the Venezuelan trade unions, the confession of failure made by Castro in his speech at the University of Havana, and an analysis of the situation at the Cuban universities before and after Castro.

c. 2,900 copies of the December issue of the Spanish-language edition of the AMSPELL bulletin were mailed to Latin American recipients (Attachment No. 3, under separate cover.) Of particular interest is the article on page 2 which discusses the recent Congo atrocities.

d. 1,925 copies each of the November issue of the French and English editions of the AMSPELL bulletin were mailed to overseas areas. (Attachment No. 4, under separate cover.)

3. Radio Propaganda.

AMSPELL continued its regular radio operations consisting of a 10-minute program daily except Sunday on ANTHIGH, and a 10-minute program broadcast every Monday over NMIE and several Latin America stations. Representative themes were: Congo atrocities inspired by Communists, Venezuelan student support of the Cuban cause; Argentine trade union support of world boycott against Red Cuba; economic crisis in Cuba; factional struggle of the Cuban regime; desperate measures undertaken by the regime to prevent a disaster in the sugar industry; statement of a Venezuelan student regarding the training in Cuba of 1,500 Latin American youth in terrorist activities; more on the Congolese situation; transportation in Castro's Cuba; factional struggle in the Cuban regime; Che Guevara's speech in the United Nations creates tense situation between Cuba and the USSR; and Blas Roca working for the downfall of Castro.

4. Press Releases.

Miscellaneous press releases are included as Attachment No. 5 under separate cover.

5. Other Activities.

a. WAVE 5843 dated 8 December 1964 forwarded a candidate for an AMSPELL position in the Dominican Republic.

b. AMSPELL requested that AMBARB-58 be sent to Ecuador to replace AMBARB-28 who was resigning. (WAVE 5842 dated 8 December 1964) The Quito station replied that AMBARB-28 functions had been taken over by ECPLY-2, and that AMBARB-58's services were not required (QUIT 6805 dated 11 December 1964).

c. Attachment No. 6 is a copy of an English-language bulletin produced by AMSPELL without direct KUBARK support which is sent to recipients in the U. S. Pressure will be brought to bear on AMHINT-2 to drop this publication entirely on the grounds that it is not the purpose of AMSPELL to propagandize U. S. citizens.

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C. FUTURE PLANS

1. 10,000 pamphlets on AMHINT-1 will be distributed to Latin America and Cuba during January. AMSPELL is planning a hemisphere-wide campaign in an attempt to obtain the release of AMHINT-1 from prison. This campaign will probably not achieve its stated aim but should result in considerable publicity on the nature of the Castro regime.
2. AMSPELL is preparing a draft leaflet illustrating the internal and international failures of the Castro regime during 1964. It is planned to mail this leaflet to Cuba and Latin America.
3. The AMSPELL newspaper both in its pony and regular edition has greatly improved in the past few months. Nevertheless, the large edition will be cut to 10,000 copies a month as this is considered a more realistic figure for distribution.

The main themes of the issue were the Ninth World Festival of Youth in Algeria, the Dominican crisis, and the conversion of Cuban universities into centers of communist indoctrination by the Castro regime. 

A. OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES**1. General.**

During the month of April AMSPELL carried on its normal propaganda activities. AMSPELL was also busy adjusting to the new reduced budget which went into effect on 1 April. AMSPELL moved to less expensive office space in April and dropped 10 people from the AMSPELL payroll. AMTHIGH broadcasts were reduced to one broadcast a week, and the large AMSPELL newspaper was eliminated. The prisoners campaign began to gain momentum in April but the crisis in the Dominican Republic made it very difficult to obtain publicity or maintain sustained interest in the campaign.

2. Propaganda Production.

a. 4,800 copies of the small AMSPELL newspaper were mailed to Cuba. This issue was dedicated mainly to the situation of prisoners in Cuba. (Attachment No. 1, under separate cover.)

b. The AMSPELL international bulletin was mailed to its normal recipients during April. The Spanish edition was produced in 2,900 copies (Attachment No. 2, under separate cover.) The English and French editions were produced in 1,925 copies each (Attachment Nos. 3 and 4, under separate cover.)

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



