1. Subject was received from SAC on 3 September 1962 and taken to a safe site where he was debriefed for interrogation. The purpose of the debriefing was to ascertain the subject's activities in Cuba and determining if he had any relationship with the G-2 or any other security organization.

2. During the course of the debriefing the subject appeared to be willing to cooperate and there were no indications of an attempt of deception. However, it is believed that the subject is a sharp operator, an opportunist and an individual who lives by his wits. He is very verbose, loud and attempts to hold the floor at all times.

3. Orellana claims that he had no relationship with the Cuban G-2, that he knew Fausto VALDÉS, Chief of the G-2, and Manuel PIÑEIRO, Deputy Chief of the G-2, but that he never conducted any business with them. He stated that he knew many G-2 agents by sight but never knew their names. He is of the opinion that all members of the G-2 are Communists and individuals of very low caliber.

4. Subject was granted asylum in the Uruguayan Embassy on 06/08 April 1962, which was obtained through the assistance of **Fernando** **GODÍNEZ**, leader of the **Cadetes Union**, who knew the **Uruguayan Ambassador**. According to Subject he had to seek asylum in the Uruguayan Embassy because he was in danger of being picked up by the Cuban Security Services. He claims that in May 1961 he was engaged in the transportation of material and personnel from Havana to the "Segundo Frente" in the Cocuyay Mountains, in the Province of Santa Clara. At that time he was cooperating with **Captain (Pm) SALAS**, **Lito BALVASIDA**, **Benito Gutiérrez**, **Eduardo PARALETA**. According to Subject, an individual named **Manolo** was arrested in March 1962 and during the course of his interrogation

by the Security Service, "Monito" database, which includes the subject. In view of all evidence it is best that the subject remain at large.

b. SUBJECT admitted that during the last days he engaged in negotiations for the purchase of arms and combat uniforms. That during the month of September, 1961, when he was in Los Angeles, California where he traveled under the name of Purchasing Agent for John F. CIAV, he saw the subject of Los Angeles. He said that he did not purchase the arms from CIAV but that he did make arrangements for the weapons. Elements to confirm these arms from CIAV. It is believed that the subject may have engaged in other criminal activities which he did not mention. This deduction is based on the information he provided in the attached Personal History, detailing regarding his travel and the short term jobs he held in the past.

c. Subject also admitted that he was arrested on 26 April 1961 by the DSI because of his connection with a group engaged in the purchase and sale of arms, among them the subject. According to subject he was a member of anti-Cuban group who was engaged in the purchase of arms abroad, which he endeavored to take out of the country. One of RAMOS' associates, Vicente Benito MIREL Hernandez and Luis Rodriguez Vargas, were arrested by the Security Services. Allegedly, MIREL and RODRIGUEZ informed the Security Services that the subject knew the whereabouts of RAMOS. Subject was arrested and asked to provide the address of RAMOS. Subject stated that he knew RAMOS and after being held for four days he was held out by MIREL and RODRIGUEZ, who were released a few days before the release of Subject.

d. Subject denies any association with the Communist Party, C-2 or any other Security Service. He states that he hates Communism and is willing to do anything in his power to combat Communism and liberate Cuba. Subject has an interest in USSR interest and was returned to DSI for classification. The USSR does not contemplate any future contact with the

b. Aurelio SILVA - Possibly identified with Aurelio SILVA, former member of Cuban National Police, ~~RECORDED 1961~~; 19-June 1961.

c. Domingo MENDOZA - Possibly identified with Domingo MENDOZA mentioned in HUL-63284, 18 September 1961.

d. General Genovevo PELLIZ Davera - Possibly identical with Genovevo PELLIZ Davera, one-time chief of staff of the Cuban Army. See HNA-5580, 20 October 1959.

There are no identifiable traces on all other individuals mentioned in this dispatch.
