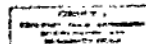

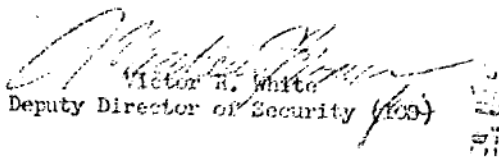

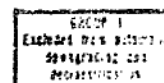

Antonio SOTO has been employed periodically by Eagle Incorporated, a steamship company, since 1961. He has been utilized as a warehouse checker. SUBJECT has left his employment to accept short time flying jobs. He left Eagle Incorporated in March 1965 to accept one of these flying jobs. Four developed references favorable regarding habits, morals, reputation, and loyalty to the United States. No credit or police record in the name of SUBJECT or his spouse.

EMPLOYMENT:

At Miami, Florida

(Eagle Incorporated)

On 22 June 1965 Sam KRATISH, secretary-treasurer, 800 N. E. 2nd Avenue, was interviewed regarding Antonio SOTO. The informant stated that "Tony" has been employed by the firm periodically since 1961. SUBJECT has been utilized as a warehouse checker for the steamship company. He unloaded cargo coming to and from the United States. He was an excellent employee, and although he has left on several occasions, he is always eligible for rehiring. The informant stated that SUBJECT is also a pilot and formerly flew in the Cuban Air Force. He has had several part time or temporary flying jobs which offer him good pay. When these jobs arise the firm allows SUBJECT to leave without jeopardizing his standing with the company. SUBJECT left in March 1965 to accept another one of these flying jobs. The informant stated that he did not know where these jobs were located, but believed that they are usually out of the United States.

REFERENCES:

At Miami, Florida

On 22 June 1965 Sam KRATISH, previously identified, was interviewed regarding SUBJECT as a developed reference. The informant stated that he considers "Tony" SOTO to be a reputable and honest individual. He has been associated with him on a professional basis since 1961 and his associations have all been satisfactory. SUBJECT is an excellent worker and is completely honest. The informant stated that he has often left SUBJECT alone with valuable cargo, and that there has never been any dispute over SUBJECT's trustworthiness or integrity. SUBJECT is a Cuban exile who left Cuba because of the CASTRO regime. SUBJECT has never espoused any political ideologies while he has worked at the firm, but the informant stated that he is aware of the fact that the SUBJECT is anti-CASTRO and that he is favorably disposed towards the United States form of

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government. The informant stated that he knew nothing that he considered to be unfavorable regarding SUBJECT's character.

On 22 June 1965 J. C. WILDER, supervisor, Eagle Incorporated, 800 N. E. 2nd Avenue, was interviewed regarding SUBJECT as a developed reference. The informant stated that he has been acquainted with SUBJECT since 1961 on a professional basis. SUBJECT has been a warehouse checker periodically since 1961. His main line of work is flying, and he was formerly a pilot in the Cuban Air Force. However, after CASTRO took over the island SUBJECT fled and has worked at several different locations flying on a part time basis. When SUBJECT does not have a job flying, he always comes to the company, and because of his good work habits he is always hired. The informant stated that SUBJECT left the company in March 1965 to take a job flying at some unknown location. The informant stated that he has found SUBJECT to be pleasant, completely reliable, and a man of integrity. There is no question of his morality or sobriety, and the informant believed that SUBJECT was loyal to the United States.

On 22 June 1965 Carlos MARTINEZ, export manager, Eagle Incorporated, 800 N. E. 2nd Avenue, was interviewed regarding SUBJECT as a developed reference. The informant stated that he has been acquainted with SUBJECT since 1961 on a professional basis. During that time he has never noted anything of an unfavorable nature regarding SUBJECT's character, morality or sobriety. He is a hard working and conscientious individual and is diligent and reliable. He last worked for the company for approximately six months in 1964 and 1965 and left in March 1965 to take a flying job at some unknown location. The informant stated that he has never heard anything to indicate that SUBJECT had any Communistic tendencies whatsoever, and he believed that SUBJECT was favorably disposed towards the United States.

At Hialeah, Florida

On 22 June 1965 Mrs. Marie RODRIGUEZ, 1260 West 60th Terrace, was interviewed regarding SUBJECT as a developed reference. The informant stated that SUBJECT

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and his family resided next door to her for two years from 1962 to 1964. She found SUBJECT to be happily married and stated that he was a decent and clean living person. He was formerly a pilot in Cuba, but had to flee Cuba because of the CASTRO regime. The informant believed that SUBJECT was favorably disposed towards the United States government. She added that she could offer no criticism of his personal conduct, morality or sobriety. She added that all of her associations with SUBJECT have been satisfactory.

On 22 June 1965 Mrs. Mary DIENER, 1280 West 60th Terrace, was interviewed regarding SUBJECT as a developed reference. The informant stated that she lived next door to SUBJECT and his family for two years and found them to be good neighbors. They were Cuban refugees who fled Cuba because of the CASTRO regime. SUBJECT was a pilot in Cuba, but could not find work flying here in the United States. As a consequence he worked for a firm on the docks in downtown Miami. SUBJECT's reputation in the community was good, and the informant believed that he was a respectable gentleman. She stated that she believed SUBJECT was appreciative of being able to live in the United States, and she never heard him criticize our form of government.

On 10 June 1965 records of the Credit Bureau of Miami were reviewed in the names of SUBJECT and his spouse and no record was found.

File at Immigration and Naturalization Service, Miami, Florida shows that one Antonio SOTO (Vazquez), who was born 20 August 1934 in Cuba, arrived in the United States at Daytona Beach, Florida on 1 January 1959 and he departed from the United States at Miami, Florida for the Dominican Republic on 20 June 1959. He again arrived in the United States at San Juan, P. R. on 18 August 1959, using name and passport of one Orlando Pedro RODRIGUEZ (Alvarez), which he explained by saying he could not get visa in own name due to service in Cuban Air Force during BATISTA regime. His foreign departure from Miami, Florida to Guatemala was verified 28 September 1959. Father of SUBJECT said to be in jail in Cuba in 1959 for participating in attempted invasion of Cuba. SUBJECT arrived in the United States at Miami, Florida 11 January 1961; his foreign departure from Miami, Florida was verified 25 February 1961 and he again arrived in the United States at Miami, Florida 24 May 1961. The records in the District Office, Immigration and Naturalization Service, 51 S. W. First Avenue, which were checked on 19 and 24 May 1965, were found to contain file # A-11 263 189 pertaining to one Antonio SOTO (Vazquez), AKA, Orlando Pedro RODRIGUEZ (Alvarez), who arrived in the United States at Daytona Beach, Florida on 1 January 1959 in a Cuban Army airplane. He was said to have been born on 20 August 1934 at Havana, Cuba; to be the son of Antonio SOTO (Rodriguez) and Julia Rosa VAZQUEZ (Acosta) and to have resided in January-February 1959 at 1409 South Ridgewood Avenue and at 129 North Halifax Avenue, both Daytona Beach, Florida. In February 1959, his address was given as 35 N. E. 38th Street, Miami, Florida and his foreign departure from Miami, Florida to the Dominican Republic was verified on 20 June 1959.

SOTO again arrived in the United States at San Juan, Puerto Rico on 18 August 1959, at which time he presented Cuban passport #02642 in the name of Orlando Pedro RODRIGUEZ (Alvarez). Upon interrogation under oath by Immigration and Naturalization Service at Miami, Florida on 18 September 1959, SOTO admitted his identity as Antonio SOTO (Vazquez); stated that he could not get a visa in his own name in Cuba because he had been in the BATISTA government as a Captain in the Cuban Air Force and that he would refuse to tell how he obtained the passport in the name of Orlando Pedro RODRIGUEZ (Alvarez). He said that he came to the United States to try to help his father who was then in jail in Cuba. He identified his wife as Dolores Inocenta BOCERRA (Garcia) and gave their address as 6711 N. W. 2nd Court, Miami, Florida. He was represented, for immigration purposes, by Attorney Ralph H. AGUILERA, 608 Dupont Plaza Center, Miami, Florida. A notation in the file in August 1959 set forth that SUBJECT's father, Col. Antonio SOTO, "was the man who had recently piloted the invasion plane from Dominican Republic to Trinidad, Cuba", was shot in the fighting and was in a prison hospital in Cuba. The foreign departure of SUBJECT from Miami, Florida to Guatemala was verified on 28 September 1959, after he had been ordered deported by the Immigration and Naturalization Service for fraudulent entry. In December 1959, his address

was given as 6th Avenue #1221, 8th Piso, P. O. Box 918, Guatemala City, Guatemala.

Antonio SOTO (Vazquez) again arrived in the United States at Miami, Florida on 11 January 1961. He reported that he had Social Security #265-64-6892; that he had a brother-in-law, Fidel RODRIGUEZ, 440 S. W. 5th Avenue, Miami, Florida and that he (SOTO) intended to reside at 5703 North Miami Avenue, Miami, Florida. His foreign departure was verified at Miami, Florida on 25 February 1961 and he again arrived in the United States at Miami, Florida on 24 May 1961. In August 1961, his address was 143 N. W. 39th Street, Miami, Florida.

On 18 October 1963, SUBJECT was granted a Re-Entry Permit by the Immigration and Naturalization Service so that he could travel to the Republic of the Congo as an employee of Caribbean Aeromarine Company, P. O. Box 755, Miami, 48, Florida. He again arrived in the United States at New York, N. Y. on 4 May 1964 and in September 1964, his address was listed as 1270 West 60th Terrace, Hialeah, Florida.

In September 1964, the Immigration and Naturalization Service was advised by the U. S. Department of State, Washington, D. C. that SUBJECT had applied to the American Consulate, Toronto, Canada for an immigrant visa. The U. S. Department of State was advised by the Immigration and Naturalization Service on 1 October 1964 that SUBJECT appeared "to still be excludable".

Additional information concerning SUBJECT is said to possibly be contained in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The above records were also found to contain file # A-12 542 006 pertaining to one Dolores Inocenta BECERRA, who arrived in the United States at Miami, Florida on 15 October 1960 and who may be identical with the wife of SUBJECT. This person was said to have been born on 28 December 1939 at Havana, Cuba; to be married to one Antonio SOTO, 5703 North Miami Avenue, Miami, Florida and to have a brother, Sergio BECERRA, 147 N. W. 38th Street, Miami, Florida.

A-11 821 502 pertaining to one Julia Rosa VAZQUEZ (Acosta), AKA, Edelma Marina SANCHEZ (Izquierdo), who may be identical with the mother of SUBJECT. This person was said to have been born on 16 April 1909 in Matanzas Province, Cuba; to have arrived in the United States at San Juan, Puerto Rico on 18 August 1959 with a Cuban passport issued to one Edelma Marina SANCHEZ (Izquierdo) and that she admitted this passport to be false insofar as she was concerned. In September 1959, her address was 65 N. W. 60th Street, Miami, Florida and her foreign departure from Miami, Florida for Cuba was verified on 2 October 1959. On 11 June 1965, observation revealed that the dwelling at 129 North Halifax Avenue, reportedly the residence of Antonio SOTO (VAZQUEZ) in early 1959, is presently vacant. The building contains a nameplate in the name of St. Demetrios Greek Orthodox Parish.

On 11 June 1965, Mrs. Clayton HARSBER, developed informant at 120 North Halifax Avenue, advised that the dwelling at 129 North Halifax Avenue was owned for many years by former Cuban General BATISTA. During the period in question, BATISTA, family friends, and staff, totaling approximately thirty people, occupied the dwelling. Many individuals of Cuban extraction came and went during the late 1950s, and Mrs. HARSBER stated that neither she nor other present residents of this area would have any knowledge of the SUBJECT. The Cubans kept to themselves and never mingled with the local citizenry.

Mrs. HARSBER added that BATISTA sold the property about a year ago to a church group, but the building is presently unoccupied.

On 11 June 1965, observations in the 1400 block of South Ridgewood Avenue revealed that there is no 1409 South Ridgewood. A Mrs. SHAROG, owner of the Parkway Motel at 1369; and Edward SUMMERS, Humble Oil Station, 1480 South Ridgewood Avenue, both stated that there has never been a 1409 South Ridgewood Avenue. The informants advised that several motels in the area have all undergone several ownership changes over the past five or six years, and the informants know of no one in the area who would be in a position to recall the SUBJECT.

On 14 June 1965, files of Headquarters, Office of Special Investigations, United States Air Force, were reviewed in the name of Antonio SOTO (VAZQUEZ), born 20 August 1934 at Marianas, Habana, Cuba, and reflected that OSI conducted a lie detector examination (File #72-90) on SUBJECT on 21 May 1963.

During the course of this examination, the SUBJECT reacted to basic questions concerning homosexuality, and as a result of this reaction, a re-examination was conducted during the morning of 12 June 1963 at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. The initial examination was predicated in that SUBJECT was a former member of 2500th Cuban Brigade and was being processed for consideration for appointment as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Air Force.

Prior to re-examination, SUBJECT made an initial statement, the substance of which is as follows:

SUBJECT indicated he resided at 859 Second Avenue, 474, Santa Fe Beach, Santa, Cuba, from 1948 to 1959. He entered the Cuban Air Force as an Aviation Cadet in March 1953 and in August 1953, he began aviation training, which continued until August 1954. In August 1954, he was sent to the United States where he attended pilot training school until August 1955, at which time he graduated and was given a commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Cuban Air Force. During these periods of time, at various unrecalled intervals, SUBJECT stated he would return to his home at Santa Fe Beach. His homosexual acts at Santa Fe Beach occurred during 1949. This homosexual activity consisted of not more than five acts of anal sodomy. SUBJECT stated that he was the active or male partner in these acts. The passive partner was another Cuban boy who lived nearby. SUBJECT could not recall the name of the passive participant. During 1960, while at Managua, Nicaragua, as a Counter-Revolutionist preparing for invasion of Cuba, he became acquainted with a Cuban Catholic priest who was also a revolutionist. SUBJECT further stated that while attending a theatre, this priest made homosexual advances toward SUBJECT, which culminated in the SUBJECT being masturbated by the priest. Approximately one week later, after his

group arrived in Costa Rica, the SUBJECT performed an act of anal sodomy upon the person of the priest. The SUBJECT declined to disclose the identity of the priest; however, he stated that if it was determined that the disclosure of the name was essential for a prerequisite to his acceptance into the United States Air Force, he would make such a disclosure.

A lie detector examination, consisting of three parts, was given SUBJECT by a representative of the Office of Special Investigations on 12 June 1963. The second test was in the nature of a control test to determine whether or not the examinee was physically and mentally capable of giving a specific reaction. The results indicated that the examinee was capable of giving a valid reaction. Test number one and test number three consisted of relevant, irrelevant and guilt complex type questions, co-mingled in such a manner as to give the SUBJECT relief between relevant questions. The following are the relevant questions asked during the examination, and the answers as given by the SUBJECT:

TEST #1

Question A:

Prior to 1961, did you engage in homosexual acts?

Answer:

Yes.

Question B:

Since your homosexual acts during 1960 in Costa Rica, have you engaged in any other homosexual acts?

Answer:

No.

Question C:

Since you have been at Maxwell Air Force Base, have you engaged in homosexual acts?

Answer:

No.

Question D:

Have you ever engaged in oral copulation, either as active or passive partner?

Answer:

No.

Question A:	Prior to 1961, did you engage in homosexual acts?
Answer:	Yes.
Question B:	Since your homosexual acts during 1960 in Costa Rica, have you engaged in any other homosexual acts?

After a careful analysis of the charts pertaining to this examination, the examiner gave the opinion that the SUBJECT was untruthful in his answers Questions B and C, Test #1, and Questions B, C, D and E, Test #2, and that SUBJECT was truthful in answers to Questions A and B, Test #1, and to Question A, Test #2.

Subsequent to the examination, the SUBJECT was re-interrogated concerning his reactions during the above tests. The SUBJECT maintained that he was truthful in his answers. The SUBJECT executed a sworn,

signed statement setting forth the information disclosed during the pre-test interrogation, and this information is given in substance above.

OGE Headquarter's files contain a letter dated 14 June 1963, which is a report of the Record of Action of the Military Personnel Security Committee in the case of SUBJECT. The body of this letter is given in the following two paragraphs:

- "1. Pursuant to paragraph 9, Air Force Regulation 35-62, the Military Personnel Security Committee reviewed all available records relating to the above member of the 2506th Cuban Brigade. Due to the following factors, it is concluded that appointment of the individual is not clearly consistent with the interests of national security:

SUBJECT admitted homosexual activity to age twenty-six, and additional acts thereafter indicated by result of polygraph examination.

- "2. Accordingly, it is recommended that the individual be rejected for military service with the United States Air Force because of questionable moral character."

OGE Headquarter's Investigative Files contain no further pertinent information relating to SUBJECT.

Unless otherwise noted below Subject is not obligated to any Cuban exile group.

Subject has been essentially truthful in regard to his personal history and he does not feel he is liable to blackmail for any reason. Subject has never been involved in the use or sale of narcotics.

DETAILS

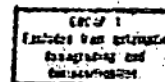
Subject is being recruited for use with WITBUSH. He has served there before. Like all of the men in the group who have been in the Iden D, Subject assumes that the operation is sponsored by KUBARK.

Subject joined AMWORLD but was never called to go to the training camps.

In connection with blackmail, Subject mentioned that his father is in jail in Cuba. To date no attempts have been made by the Castro government to put any pressure on Subject.

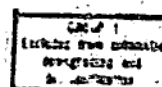
