Miami immediately advise results of interview of Miami PCI Michael McLaney, particularly whether he is related to William Julius McLaney. In view of Michael McLaney's reported interest in 6/15/63 plan to bomb Cuba, he might well have a connection with this case and may have influenced William McLaney to cooperate in captioned matter.

Miami also immediately interview Antonio Soto, Evelio Alpizar, Miguel Alvarez, Sam Benton and Jose de Jesus Basulto Leon who have been mentioned in previous Miami communications as possibly being involved in this matter, as well as any other suspects developed through investigation. Miami also interview Gonzalo Herrera, former Cuban airlines pilot and other logical former Cuban pilots who may have been approached to pilot planes in this matter. If not already done, all suspects connected with the June 15 1963, attempt to bomb Cuba, which was handled by Customs, should be interviewed.
