## At Cheverly, Maryland:

On 17 May 1961, a live address was established for Cladys
O. DAMBHINT at (5611 Jason Street), Cheverly) Maryland, through the
cooperation of Dr. Edward A) and (Anne B. SALLOCH) householder at
that address.

On the sees date, Mrs. (BALLOCM) her daughter, (Patricia) and son, (George, were briefed to the effect that they should accept any cables, latters, telegress or telephone calls for Mrs. DAMBRUMT. In the event any inquiries were received concerning Mrs. DAMBRUMT. They were to advise that Mrs. DAMBRUMT was residing with them but that she was not available at the moment. They were to determine who was calling and the purpose of the call. If the call was from the cable or telegraph office, Mrs. (SALLOCM) or (Patricia) was to call back later as Mrs. DAMBRUMT and receive the message and request delivery of the written cable or telegram. In the event the inquiry was from any other source, they were to contact the Reporting Agent inestimately.

The ease individuals were further briefed, in general, as to why Mrs. DANEAUM was supposedly residing with them and why she was superting some form of committation. They were informed that Mrs. MANEAUM was the mother of Eustace H. DANEAUM, who was being held a prisoner by a foreign government. The mother has sent a cable to her som asking how he is, whether he needs anything, inquiring if there is smything she can do for him, and asking him to please committate with her. She is now awaiting and expecting some form of reply from him.

On the following day, 18 May 1961, Dr. SALLOH) was contacted. The above information had been related to him by Mrs. SALLOOM) at the request of the Reporting Agent. O Dr. (SALLOOM) was requested to notify the Cheverly and the Mysttsville Post Offices that Mrs. INFORMATIVE was residing at his home and any mail received for her should be delivered to his address.

On 22 May 1961, Dr. (SALLOCK) was again contacted and be advised that he had personally called the Postmistress at the (Cheverly) Post Office regarding delivery of Mrs. IMPERIOR'S wail and had requested

hor, in turn, to notify the Hyattsville) Post Office.

Dr. (SALICON) is a well-known (Manhington dentist). He maintained an office at (810 "H" Street, N.E) for a number of years until he of was drafted into military service. He served in the Army as a (dentist) and woom his release, as a Lieutenant Colonel, he re-opened (his private practice with an office at (1835 "I" Street, N.W.) For a number of years he was on the (Staff of Georgetown University as )08 ca instructor of (antistry in) the (Georgetown Dental School) He has resided in (Chayerly) Maryland for at least the past twenty years, previously at 2816 Inurel Avenue and currently at (561100 Issee Street). His daughter, (Patricia) is attending Maryland University. His son, (George) is attending (St. John's) College Nigh Subsol.

Daily contact was maintained with Dr. (SALLOM) on 22, 23 and 24 May 1961. As of the latter date, no occarmication had as yet been received for Mrs. DAMARDET.

On 18 May 1961, a Western Union Telegram was sent to Enstace DARBINIAT, Reclusorio Macional, Musva Gerona, Isla de Pinos, Cuba. A copy of this telegram is attached as Exhibit #1.
