There is no OS subject file on the BROWN Foundation but a reference of file contains a manorandum dated 30 January 1967 to the Deputy Director, Plans

from Chief, Central Cover Group concerning the threat of exposure of Agency operations and concludes that the BROWN Foundation of Houston, Texas was one of the most vulnerable to exposure because public records reflect direct ties from Agency funding instruments identified by Congressman PANNAH in 1964 to legitimate foundations and Agency projects they have sponsored.

VISION FURD - #69000-573

The VERION Fund (HENUDITED) was created by the Agency in June 1958 as an outensibly private philophropic foundation legally incorporated under the laws of end with an office in the District of Columbia. It is used as a cover and funding eschanism for Porject DTLAMPREY. The objective of this project is the development of organizational and individual assets capable of strengthening the unity of non-Communist teachers and their organizations throughout the world. These objectives are carried out through the active support by the Agency of the incornational programs of the National Education Association (PELLYTHIN) and the World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Profession (INLACEPOD) with which MEA is affiliated. In March 1967 because of exposure of the Vernon Fund in news media, the Board members were contacted advised as follows:

Each Vernon Fund board member is being advised that he will receive a copy of the MMA and WCOTT letters regarding press allegations; he will acknowledge his membership on the Vernon Fund board if confronted with the fact; he will acknowledge that the Vernon Fund has supported WCOTT and that it made a few small grants to NEA; he will decline any further comment on the origin or operation of the Vernon Fund, on sources of Vernon Fund money, on whether the Vernon Fund received money from the Agency, or any other aspect of the Fund; he will be informed that the Vernon Fund records are not evaluable to the public, about of subposency he will be asked to return any files or papers relating to the Vernon Fund; he will be told that Dr. CARR (Hilliam George CARR) has not yet had to identify any board members but will probably have to; he will not comment on the creation of the Vernon Fund and how initial contacts were made.

DICK, Albert Risks, III - (C178333 (Vernon Fund Board Member)

Albert Blake DICK, III, President, A. B. DICK Company, Chicago, Illinois, was granted a Covert Security Approval for his witting use in connection with the funding of Project TPFOUNART.

CARR, William George - \$410038-B and \$116982

William G. CARR was granted a Covert Security Clearance on 22 April 1955 for unvitting use under Project DIPILLAR and on 21 November 1967 has received a Covert Security Approval to permit his use under Project DILAMPREY in his position as Secretary-General of the World Confederation of Organizations in the Teaching Profession.

REA. Bryce, Jr. - \$149438

Bryos REA, Ir., attorney for the Vernon Fund, was granted a Covert Feoretty Clearance for his one on a cleared attorneys' panel on

15 Hovember 1956 and on 19 September 1953 he received another covert security Clearance to permit his use as a Leacas Cut-Out in the producement of demestic cafebouses.

Vorid Confideration of Organizations of the Teaching Professions (Funded by the Verson Fund)

In April 1967 a discussion was held between an Asserty representative and Jain Thirpson and Ray Minks of the Mcorp (World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Fromassion) concerning future funding for Mcorp. Because of publicity concerning the funding of Mcorp by the Vernon Fund Wcorp leadership premised its membership that no further Vernon Fund money would be accepted until the status of the Vernon Fund was clarified. John Mcorpson felt that the best minutes would be a one-time only infusion of money by starile check into the Mcorp bank account to be backstopped by a letter from the attorney for the Vernon Fund, Bryce REA, who would attribute the money to members of the Vernon Fund, Bryce REA, who would attribute provide Mcorp with sufficient funds to cover expenses until other sources occuld be found.

In May 1967 John THOMPSON of the WCOTP described to an Agency representative an interview he had with Mike MacMANUS of TIME magazine on large 1967 who manted to discuss the effects of newspaper publicity on wCOTP operations. MacMANUS was especially interested in any economics forced on WCOTP and a request for proof of the value of WCOTP operations to individual teachers. THOMPSON felt that MacMANUS did not succeed in gaining sufficient additional information from the interview to servent writing his projected exticle.

BYKE Reymond Joseph - (160091

Regioned Joseph EWIKE was granted a Covert Security Approval on 18 July 1977 for use an a virting employee of Project HTVILACES and on 19 May 1962 he received a Covert Security Approval for his use by Project JELACREOD as Coordinator for African Activities in Machineton, D. C. EMIKE in administrative officer of the World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Profession.

OB indices were negative on the CABOT Foundation. (DEE Thomas D. CABOT)

American Friends of the Middle East O #310.377 and \$69300

American Friends of the Middle East (Project Middles) was created in May 1951 with the purpose of employing aggressive propagands to promote

the friendship of peoples of the Near and Hiddle Rast toward the United States and to combat Communica. It was incorporated as a voluntary, hon-profit membership corporation under the laws of New York State. Docothy Thispion, columnst, was selected as Chairman. In carly 1967 Affic received a good deal of newspaper publicity concerning the Agency affiliation including articles in the Soviet press. This and USES INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS. Syria was the only country in which Affic is active that raised the question of the organization's continue d existence in the light of ellegations of Agency financial supports although, there were rosolings in Iraq.

Bra Jeointo Fund

There is no 03 subject file on the Ean Jacinto Fund. The attached memorandum deted 30 January 1967 from Chief, Contral Cover Oroup to Doputy Director, Flans - "Threat of Exposure of Agency Operations" - stated that RAMPARTS has expressed intense interest in the Ean Jacinto Fund, and its sources of income in particular, because it funds 5 HEEPITCHE activities (youth efficies).

N. D. ANDERSON Foundation

There is no OS subject file on the M. D. ANDERSON Foundation but OS indices reflect a file on the M. D. ANDERSON Rospital and Tumor Institute.

A study program to determine the effects in diverse Biological Systems resulting from exposure to high intensity coherent redistion was contracted with the Mi.D. Anderson Respital and Tunor Institute, University of Texas, Houston, Texas in October 1963 but as of 16 April 1964 there was a hold order against going alread with the contract because of a question as to why the Agency should bear the whole cost of the contract which was to be for inter-departmental was. In May 1967 a note in the file indicated that M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tunor Institute will be empayed in classified work for the Agency. There was no record of a clearance issued.

WATCHALL FOUNDATION

Cover Group to Deputy Director, Plant - "Threat of Exposure of Agency Operations". The MARSHALL Foundation of Houston, Taxes is considered one of the most valuerable to exposure.

A "New York Times" erticle for 25 Pebruary 1967 disclosed that the MARSHALL Foundation of Houston, Texas channeled funds from the Agency to the School of Industrial and Labor Relations at Cornell University from 1961 to 1961.

BROWN Coorge Rulus - #94214

Centre Rules DROWN, Executive Vice President of BROWN and ROOT, Inc., Houston, Texas, was granted a Covert Security Clearance on 23 October 1953 for use as a covert associate in the United States on Project LPCOIN. On 82 April 1965 he was granted a Provisional Covert Recurity Approval to possible centact and assessment of BROWN in connection with his possible use in serving on the Board of Directors for a proprietary being set up to support staff employees working in Udorn, Theiland Isos and a Covert Security Approval for this use was issued on 16 June 1965. These clearances were cancelled 2 June 1967 as BROWN was not used.

BROWN . Herman - \$95239

Herron EROWN, President and Director of EROWN and ROWN, Inc., Houston, Texas, Texas and President and Trustes of the EROWN Foundation, Houston, Texas, was granted a Covert Security Approval on 3 December 1953 for use as a Covert Associate in the U.S. under Project IPCOIN. This clearance was cancelled 15 February 1966.

SHIVERS. Allen - \$173051

Covernor Allen SHIVERS of Toxas was on the Mivisory Board of FACTS FORM NEWS in September 1955. He was listed as a trustee of the American Good Government Society in April 1965.

Alian SHIVERS, Governor of Tuxau, was a signer of a statement appearing in the NEW YORK THES for 20 October 1949 spondored by the Iron Curtain Refugee Compaign of the International Rescue Committee. The IRC was described as basically good, humanitarien organization but many individuals of questionable loyalty have been associated with it.

A NEW YORK TIMES clipping for 12 Vebruary 1954 stated that Allan ENLYRES, Ovvernor of Texas, said he planned to ask his legislature to make membership in the Communist Forty a death penalty offense. He was quoted as saying "In politics we often speak of bipertisan issues. I can think of nothing that abould be more bipertisan than catching a Communist. There can be no valid issue between Americans over Communists. Americans are either pro-Communist or anti-Communist."

No clearance was requested or issued for ESIVERS. His file contains reference certs only.

CAROT. Thomas D., Jr. - #430900

Thomas D. CABOT, Ir. was approved for contact use on 17 August
1961. At the time he was Vice President and Director of International Relations
Texas Butadiane and Chemical Corporation. He was residing in Lausanne,
Switzerland. Contact interest was for briefing him on Agency interests
in economic and political developments in various European countries;
chemical industrial development, etc. He was the subject of a favorable
background investigation in 1952.

CABOT. Thomas Dudley - 487904

Thomas Dudley CANOT was granted a Covert Security Approval for use under Project IPCOIN. On 26 June 1959 he was insued a Covert Security Approval for use with Project UNGLANT. He was to serve as the President or Chairman of an American Committee whose objective was to foster Franco-American relations at the management level. CABOT had been approved for contact use in 1950 and received a clearance for use on the Executive Committee of M.I.T. in April 1954. A continuation of this clearance was granted on 29 October 1958.

MITH. VIII 100 A. - \$76555

William A. SMITH was granted an Operational Clearance on 22 August 1972 for use an an agent in Latin American under connected, cover. On 14 January 1955 a Covert Security Charance was issued to Milly to permit his use as a Covert Associate in the United States under Project ITFURNIL. At the time he had a member of tuniness interests in Houston, Texas, 1. 2., William A. Smith Construction Company, Houston, Texas; Texas Eastern Transmission Corporation, Citizens State Bank of Houston, etc.

FORTHAM, Gus

JAVORSKI Leon - \$160199

Lean JAMAREKI was granted a Covert Security Approval on 31 March 1958 in order that he could be made witting of Agency interest in the M. D. AMBERICA Foundation. His file contains a newspaper olipping from the HACHINATOS STAR for 3 December 1963 which concerns his appointment as special coursel for a Texas State Court of Inquiry into the assessination of Frankent Milmedy. He had schieved prominence when he was prosecutor at the improburg was Trials. The article also stated that in 1960 JAMOREKI successfully represented Lyndon B. JOHNECH in a court challenge of Mr. JOHNECH's right to have his name appear on the general election belief in Texas both as a condicate for Vice-President and for reelection to the U. S. Benate. Another item in U. S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT for 7 July 1964 reported that Ecuston lawyer, Leon JAMOREKI, who is close to Lyndon JUMINEK was being considered for the job of Attorney General.

FREENAN, John Honry - \$157181

John Henry FREIMAN was granted a Covert Security Approval on 28
June 1957 to permit the utilization of his services under Project LFCOIN.
At the time he was a partner in the large and leading law firm of FULLPRICAT, CROOKER, FREIMAN, BATES and JAWORSKI at Houston, Taxas and was a trustee of the M. D. ANDERSON Medical Foundation.

COCKURLL, Ernest Deshiell, Jr. - \$91571 and \$8409051-A

Ernest Deshiell COCKRELL, Jr. was approved for contest use(CAUFICN) on 10 June 1953 and was granted a Covert Security Clearance on 4 August 1953 for use in the U. S. under Project QENCHAM. At the time he was President of two oil companies in Houston, Texas; Oil Production Maintenance, Inc. and Production Maintenance Company.

MARSHALL. Douglas B. - \$173597

Douglas B. MARSHALL was granted a Covert Security Approval on 28 November 1958 in order that he could be made witting of Agency interest in the CULLEN Foundation. MARDHALL was vice President of the Quintons Petroleum Corporation of Houston, Texas which is the holding company owned by the Rugh Hoy CULLEN femily. MARSHALL's wife, Margaret Cullen MARSHALL, is a daughter of Eugh Roy CULLEN.

HOBBY. Overs Culp - #361001 and \$241189

Overta Culp ROBSY was granted a continuing lisison clearance on 7 April 1953 when she was Director of the Federal Security Agency. A Covert Security Approval was issued 18 July 1961 to permit her use under Project LPCCRSET to sid in funding arrangements through the HOBEY Foundation of Houston, Texas of which she is President. On 26 October 1965 a Provisional Security Approval was granted to permit contact, assessment and briefing of Mrs. HOBEY as President of the HOBEY Foundation in connection with her possible utilization on an advisory committee of a broadcasting activity, University of the Air, directed at the students and intellectuals of Cubs. A Covert Security Approval was issued 31 March 1966 primarily to use the prestige of her name and position as cover for WE/Cubs activities and it was not expected that Mrs. NOREY would take an active day by day role in the activities.

HOBBY, Villiam Pettus, Jr. - \$1,25337 and \$275074

Oveta Culp HOBBY's son, William Fettue HOBBY, Jr., born 19 January 1932 at Houston, Texas, was security approved for contact use on 23 May 1960. At the time he was Associate Editor of the HOUSTON POST, Houston, Texas. On 29 June 1962 he was granted a Covert Security Approval to permit his witting use under Project CAWAGTAIL which was to be supported by the

HOBB! Foundation. On 22 October 1965 a PCSA was issued to HOBBY for the same use in WH/Cuba activities as that outlined for his mother. This Provisional clearance was firmed into a Covert Security Approval on 4 February 1966 for the same use.
