from Chief, Central Cover Group concerning the threat of exposure of Agency operations and concludes that the BROWN Foundation of Houston, Texas was one of the most vulnerable to exposure because public records reflect direct ties from Agency funding instruments identified by Congressman PANNAN in 1964 to legitimate foundations and Agency projects they have sponsored.

TISSING FUND - #69000-573

The VERGON Fund (HENUDISED) was created by the Agency in June 1958 as an optensibly private philosthropic foundation legally incorporated under the laws of end with an office in the District of Columbia. It is used as a cover end funding mechanism for Porject DTLAMPREY. The objective of this project is the development of organizational and individual assets capable of strengthening the unity of non-Communist teachers and their organizations throughout the world. These objectives are carried out through the active support by the Agency of the international programs of the Hational Education Association (PELETTERS) and the World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Profession (JELACEPOD) with which MEA is affiliated. In March 1967 because of exposure of the Verson Fund in news media, the Board members were controted advised as follows:

Each Vernon Fund board member is being mavised that he will receive a copy of the RMA and WCOTP letters regarding press allegations; he will acknowledge his membership on the Vernon Fund board if confronted with the fact; he will acknowledge that the Vernon Fund has supported WCOTP and that it made a few small grants to REA; he will decline may further comment on the origin or operation of the Vernon Fund, on sources of Vernon Fund maney, on whether the Vernon Fund received money from the Agency, or any other aspect of the Fund; he will be informed that the Vernon Fund records are not available to the public, short of subposes) he will be asked to return any files or papers relating to the Vernon Fund; he will be told that Dr. CARR (William George CARR) has not yet had to identify any board members but will probably have to; he will not comment on the creation of the Vernon Fund and how initial contacts were made.

Albert Blake DICK, III, President, A. B. DICK Company, Chicago, Illinois, was greated a Covert Equality Approval for his witting use in connection with the funding of Pooject TPFOUNARY.

CARR, William George - \$410038-B and \$116332

William G. CARR was granted a Covert Security Clearance on 22 April 1995 for unvitting use under Project PIPILLAR and on 21 November 1967 has received a Covert Security Approval to permit his use under Project DILAMPREY in his position as Secretary-General of the World Confederation of Organizations in the Teaching Profession.

REA. Bryce. Jr. - 1249438

Bryos REA, Jr., sttorier for the Vernon Fund, was granted a Covert Becurity Clearance for his use on a cleared attorneys' panel on

15 Hovember 1956 and on 19 September 1953 he received another covert security Clearence to permit his use as a leases Cut-Out in the procurement of domestic cafebourses.

Vorid Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Professions (Funded by the Verson Fund)

In April 1967 a discussion was held between an Agency representative and Jim THOMPSON and Ray MUKE of the WCOTP (World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Fromassion) concerning future funding for WCOTP. Because of publicity concerning the funding of WCOTP by the Vernes Fund, WCOTP leadership presided its membership that no further Vernes Fund money would be accepted until the status of the Vernes Fund was clarified. John THOMPSON felt that the best solution would be a one-time only infusion of money by starile check into the WCOTP bank account to be backstopped by a letter from the attorney for the Vernes Fund, Bryce MEA, who would attribute the money to members of the Vernes Fund Board who ancaymously wished to provide MCOTP with sufficient funds to cover expenses until other sources occuld be found.

In May 1967 John THEFFON of the WCOTP described to se Amency representative an interview he had with Nike MacHANUS of TIME magazine on 1 May 1967 who wanted to discuss the effects of newspaper publicity on WCOTP operations. MacMANUS was aspecially interested in any economies forced on WCOTP and a request for proof of the value of WCOTP operations to individual teachers. THOMPSON felt that MacMANUS did not succeed in gaining sufficient additional information from the interview to warrant writing his projected exticle.

SUAL, Reymond Joseph - 1160091

Reymond Joseph ENTRE was granted a Covert Decurity Approval on 18 July 1977 for use as a virting employee of Project HTVILACES and on 19 May 1962 he received a Covert Security Approval for his use by Project JELACEFOD as Coordinator for African Activities in Washington, D. C. SMANE is administrative officer of the World Confederation of Organizations of the Teaching Profession.

American Triands of the Hiddle Daut O #341377 and \$69300

American Friends of the Middle East (Project MITIMER) was created in May 1951 with the purpose of employing aggressive propagation to promote

the friendship of peoples of the Mear and Middle Rast toward the United States and to combat Communism. It was incorporated as a voluntary, hon-profit membership corporation under the laws of New York State. Dotothy THISPOW, columnist, was selected as Chairman. In early 1967 AFME received a good deal of newspaper publicity concerning its Approx affiliation including articles in the Soviet press. These and USES INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS. Syria was the only country in which AFME is active that raised the question of the organization's continue & existence in the light of allegations of Agency Financial apport; although, there were resolings in Iraq.

San Jecinto Pund

There is no 08 subject file on the Sen Jacinto Fund. The attached memorendum deted 30 January 1967 from Chief, Central Cover Group to Doputy Director, Plans - "Threst of Exposure of Agency Operations" - stated that RAMPARTS has expressed intense interest in the Sen Jacinto Fund, and its sources of income in particular, because it funds 5 HEEPITCHE sectivities (youth efficies).

M. D. ANDERSON Foundation

There is no OS subject file on the M. D. ANDERSON Foundation but OS indices reflect a file on the M. D. ANDERSON Hospital and Tumor Institute.

A study program to determine the effects in diverse Biological Systems resulting from exposure to high intensity coherent radiation was contracted with the M.D. ANDERSON Hospital and Tomor Institute, University of Texas, Houston, Texas in October 1963 but as of 16 April 1964 there was a hold order against going chead with the contract because of a question as to sky the Agency should bear the whole cost of the contract which was to be for inter-departmental was. Ges attached memorandum dated 30 January 1967 from Chief, Central Cover Group to Deputy Director, Plans - "Throat of Exposure of Agency Operations". The MARSHALL Foundation of Bouston, Taxas is considered one of the most valuerable to exposure.

A "New York Times" erticle for 25 Pebruary 1967 disclosed that the MARSHALL Poundation of Houston, Texas channeled funds from the Agency to the School of Industrial and Labor Relations at Cornell University from 1961.

Coorga Ruius DROMN, Executive Vice President of BROMN and ROOT, Inc., Rouston, Texas, was granted a Covert Security Clearance on 23 October 1953 for use as a covert associate in the United States on Project LPCOIN. On 22 April 1965 he was granted a Provisional Covert Recurity Approval to possible contact and assessment of BROWN in connection with his possible use in serving on the Board of Directors for a proprietary being set up to support staff employees working in Vicen, Theiland lace and a Covert Security Approval for this use was issued on 18 June 1965. These clearances were concelled 2 June 1967 as BROWN was not used.

RECOURT BOTHER - \$95239

Herren EROW, President and Director of EROWN and ROOT, Inc., Houston, Texas and President and Trustee of the EROWN Foundation, Houston, Texas, was granted a Covert Security Approval on 3 December 1953 for use as a Covert Associate in the U. B. under Project LPCOIN. This clearance was con-

SALIVERS . Allen - #373051

Governor Allan SHIVERS of Toxus was on the Advisory Board of FACTS FORM NEWS in September 1955. He was listed as a trusted of the American Good Government Society in April 1965.

Allen EHIVERS, Covernor of Texas, was a signer of a statement appearing in the NEW YORK TIMES for 20 October 1949 appeared by the Iron Curtain Refugee Compsign of the International Rescue Committee. The IRC was described as basically good, humanitaries organization but many individuals of questionable loyalty have been associated with 11.

A NEW YORK TIMES clipping for 12 February 1954 stated that Alian ENTYPES, Covernor of Teres, said he planned to ask his Legislature to make membership in the Communist Forty a death penalty offense. He was quoted as paying "In politics se often speak of bipertisan issues. I can think of nothing that should be more bipartisan than catching a Communist. There can be no valid issue between Americans over Communists. Americans are either pro-Communist or anti-Communist."

At the time he was a partner in the large and leading law firm of FULBRIGHT, CROOKER, FREMAN, BATES and JAHORSKI at Houston, Taxas and was a trustee of the M. D. ARDERSCH Medical Foundation.

COCKREIL, Procest Deshiell, Jr. - \$91571 and \$8409051-A

Ernest Deshiell COCKRELL, Jr. was approved for contest use (CAUTION) on 10 June 1953 and was granted a Covert Security Clearance on 4 August 1953 for use in the U. S. under Project CRIMUNANT. At the time he was President of two oil companies in Houston, Texas; Oil Production Maintenance, Inc. and Production Maintenance Company.

MARSHALL. Douglas B. - \$173597

Douglas B. MARSHALL was greated a Covert Security Approval on 28
November 1958 in order that he could be made witting of Agency interest
in the CULLEN Foundation. MARSHALL was vice President of the Quintana
Petroleum Corporation of Houston, Texas which is the holding company owned
by the Rugh Roy CULLEN femily. MARSHALL's wife, Nargaret Cullen MARSHALL,
is a daughter of Sugh Roy CULLEN.

HOBBY. Overts Culp - #344001 and \$241189

Overta Culp Hobby was granted a centinuing lielson clearance on 7 April 1953 when she was Director of the Federal Security Agency. A Covert Security Approval was issued 10 July 1961 to permit her use under Project IPCCRSET to sid in funding arrangements through the Hobby Foundation of Houston, Texas of which she is President. On 26 Catober 1965 a Provisional Security Approval was granted to permit contact, assessment and briefing of Mrs. Hobby as President of the Hobby Foundation in connection with her possible utilization on an advisory committee of a broadcasting activity, University of the Air, directed at the students and intellectuals of Cubs. A Covert Security Approval was issued 31 March 1966 primarily to use the prestige of her name and position as cover for WI/Cubs activities and it was not expected that Mrs. NORM would take an active day by day role in the activities.
