SUBJECT

: Conversation between President Loggs Mateos of Mexico and Kr. Vinston Scott, Chief of Station, Mexico

REFERENCE

: MEXI 5698 (IN-49514), dated 8 June 60

- 1. This memorandum contains a suchestion, in Paragraph 3, for the consideration of the DCI.
- 2. On the night of 7 June, President Lopes Mateos requested Mr. Ecott to inform "his good friend, President Elsenhover," of the following:
 - A. That the President is a friend of the United States, "not only because of necessity but of genuine desire and ideology".
 - B. That the invitation to President Dorticos of Cuba was extended two weeks efter it was indicated that Porticos was going to Maxico "on his own", through the Ferrican Ambassador in Cuba.
 - C. That be will not invite Fidel Castro to Maxico even though Cuban Ambassador Jose Antonio Portucado told President Lopez Mateos that Darticos will request an invitation for Castro.
- 3. President Lopes Hateon also asked that President Eisenbower be informed that he is delighted that a decision has now been made to get rid of Castro. The DCI may vish to inform the President of the above.
 - h. President Lopes Nateos was indirectly informed of CIA intentions in regard to Castro through a conversation between Mr. Scott and Jose Lorenzo Cossio, Advisor to the Mexican President, who informed Mr. Scott that President Lopes Nateos would not invite Castro to Visit Mexico, even though Portices is soind to ask him to do so. Mr. Scott suggested that if the Mexican President helped CIA to schieve the overthrow of Castro, he would not have to deal with the problem of inviting Castro to Mexico.
