1. G-2 reported that on 7 May 1950 a B-26 type boncer arrived in David, Panana, from Brownsville, Texas, due to a low gosoline supply. The plane, was headed for Tocumen Airport in Panana City, and carried as a crew the following according to G-2:

Frank O'GFL, U.S. Citizen, Pilot
O. MARTINEZ, U.S. Citizen, Co-Pilot
Steve MUREAY, U.S. Citizen, Mechanic
Mauricio CaSTRU, Fanananian, Passenger

Mauricio Casino, remandam, John Lincil, Civil Aeronautics technicism at Tocumen Airport was instrumental in getting a spare tire to them,

2. Nr. LECT savised this office that he had not Stove NURRAY in Havana in April 1950 in company with a fellow mazed 203HLO, who claimed to have some connection with the Secret Police, in-Vexico of Elac described NURRAY has an adventurer who had been in the Philippines and the Far East and whom he suspected of gold smurgling activities. 5. On 16 June 1950 the following information was received (from Civil Intelligence Section, Panama Canal, regarding this matter:

"It has been reported that Very frequently a B-26 simpleme (NSS46N - a Martin Manauder) makes trips between Tocument and David, R.r.. It is piloted by Steve MURRAY, and at least two other Americans ride on the plane, which is the sometimes met at Tocumen Airport by either Tito, Harmodito or Toni ARIAS. On landing at the airport it goes directly to a hangar, and allegadly the only ones who visit it are the ARIAS brothers, PASTOR Ponce, Chief of the Airport, and one (fnu) LIMARES, Chief of Customs at Tocumen.

Informant stated that it was believed at first that the plane was engaged in arms contraband, but later it appeared more legical to assume that it was involved in another type of sauggling, possibly drugs.

Nirgilio RANTEZ, then Chief of the Control Tower, is said to have stated that the plane comes and poses without being registered at the airport under orders of POZIE, Airport Manager; that the plane lands without signalfing

Firsteant adds that the above plane laided at Tocumen from David on 11 May at 5:45 pers, on 12 May at 6:51 pers, on 14 May at 6:29 pers, and on 16 May at 9:25 acm.

The above information was allegedly given to President iRIAS by the Kinister of deverment and Justice, and he apparently showed little interest in the subject, morely stating that the matter should be investigated to see what there is to it.

Upon receipt of this information it appeared that Tirrilio REWIREZ might have been the source, since he was fired from his post at Tocumen Airport and was discrimined about it. It was ascertained that the information contained in the (above) paragraph, in which RAWIREZ is mentioned, was reported by RAWIREZ but the other information care from other Civil Intelligence sources.

4. On 6 July Mr. Like advised that the show-plane and Steve NURRAY had returned to Ferral and that the Minister of Government had ordered that the plane by dissentled and searched, but he could not ascertain the basis for the searched like talked to the Kanager of the Airport, Exfael PASTOR Ponce, and with Toni Allis, Director Governal of Civil Aeronautics, and a nophew of President Arias, who indicated that they were aware of the Kinister of Government's order but did not know what was behird it. 5. On 8 July 1950 Kr. NURRAY called at the Embassy to obtain assistance in securing the release of his plans. Briefly he stated that he had departed from Mexico City via Nanagua and arrived at Tocumen at 7:50 p.m. 6 July. His passport reflected the following:

He stated that he was in the export-import business and that he dealt in gold. He said that he had come to Fanora to see a man by the name of SAS, a gold dealer from Buones Aires, about gold shipments.

6. On 8 July, Kinister of Government Alfredo Allian reported the matter to the U.S. Ambassador stating that prior to arriving in range the plane had been signaled, that all was not well at the airport and that the crew had jettisomed corgo prior to arrival. (A check with the Air Force authorities does not confirm that any such message was sent and Kullin denies that anything was jettisomed. He insisted that he was coming to Panama to discuss the gold business but that he had no cargo.) The Kinister also advised the Ambassador that PANTOR Ponce had been fired as Read of the airport.

7. In a conversation with PLSTCR Ponce and FURRAL on the night of 8 July LINCH was advised that PLETOR Ponce had, in fact, been fired and that he was determined to bump off Toni ARIAS. Both FURRAL and PLETCR Ponce claimed that Toni ARIAS was behind it all but that PLETCR Ponce was the fall cuy.

6. The Mexican/referred to, Cristohal MATINE, and the Mexican Zorillo, are believed to be identical. Sas has toen identified as formardered, a gold dealer, who operates in Busines Aircs and Montevides. Civil Intelligence Section has advised that Sas mastrojing with Toni ARISS and that Cashad departed from Panama hautily. CIS also advised that President ARISS at first had given orders for the/dismissal of both his methow, Toni ARIS, and PASTER Ponce, but it was later agreed that Toni ARISS would not be fired to avoid a public scandle involving the President's family.

9. The present status of the matter is that the plane has been searched with negative results, that the plane is still being held by the Panamanian authorities and that MURRY and others are endeavoring by every means possible to secure the release of the plane. The head of the Dormen Airport, PISTOR Pence, has been dismissed and Toni ARIAS, the President's nerhow, will probably be allowed to withdraw from his position gracefully.
