CONTINUATION OF MIKE'S INFORMATIONAL REPORTS, 12 SEP 62

ACTION REQUIRED: None; FYI

1. Subject was received from SAC on 3 September 1962 and taken to a safe site where he was debriefed for ten hours. The purpose of the debriefing was to ascertain the subject's activities in Cuba and determining if he had any relationships with the KGB or any other Security organization.

2. During the course of the debriefing the subject appeared to be willing to cooperate and there were no indications of an attempt at deception. However, it is felt that the subject is a sharp operator, an opportunist and an individual motivated by his wife. He is very verbose, loud and attempts to hold the floor at all times.

3. ORELLANA claims that he had no relationship with the Cuban C-2, that he knew Fausto VALDÉS, Chief of the C-2, and Manuel FLORIO, Deputy Chief of the C-2, but that he never conducted any business with them. He stated that he knew many C-2 agents by sight but never knew their names. He is of the opinion that all members of the C-2 are Communists and individuals of very low caliber.

4. Subject was granted asylum in the Uruguayan Embassy on 06/08 April 1962, which was obtained through the efforts of Fernando ESPARQUIEZ, leader of the Cossatours Union. He knew the Uruguayan Ambassador. According to Subject he had to seek asylum in the Uruguayan Embassy because he was in danger of being picked up by the Cuban Security Services. He claims that in November 1961 he was engaged in the transportation of material and personnel from Havana to the "Segundo Frente" in the Escambray Mountains, in the Province of Santa Clara. At that time he was contacted by Captain (Rnu) SALAS like BALASIDA, "enito," or "el Político," [redacted] 06 CUTIEREZ "Meryn," like ITURRIAGA, Captain (Rnu) [redacted] or [redacted] MIRALETA. According to Subject, an individual named [redacted] was arrested in March 1962 and during the course of his interrogation (continued).

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by the Security Service, "Fidelito" denied ever having been involved in the subject. In view of all available information, it was felt that he was not a reliable informant at this time.

b. ROQUELLA admitted that during the last three months he engaged in negotiations for the purchase of arms and equipment for the Cuban revolutionaries. That during the month of September, 1961, he was in Los Angeles, California where he traveled under the name of purchasing agent from a John "Pete" RAMOS. He said he had no contacts in Los Angeles. He said that he did not purchase the arms from RAMOS but that he did make arrangements for the purchase of certain elements to come from RAMOS. It is believed that the subject may have engaged in other transactions in California which he did not mention. This deduction is based on the information he provided in the attached Personal History statement concerning his travel and the short, temporary jobs he held in the state.

c. Subject also admitted that he was arrested on 26 April 1961 by the DSI because of his connection with a group engaged in the purchase and sale of arms, supplies to the Cuban rebels. According to Subject he was a member of the Anti-Revolutionary Party who was engaged in the purchase of arms, supplies, which he endeavored to take out of the country. Two of RAMOS' associates, Vicente Benito "MIGUEL" Hernandez and Luis Rodriguez Vargas, were arrested by the Security Services. Allegedly, RAMOS and RODRIGUEZ informed the Security Services that the Subject knew the whereabouts of RAMOS. Subject was held and was asked to provide the address of RAMOS. Subject stated that he knew RAMOS and after being held for four days he was turned out by MIGUEL and RODRIGUEZ, who were released a few days before the release of Subject.

d. Subject denies any association with the Communist Party, CP or any other Security Service. He claims to be a leftist Communist and is willing to do anything in his power to combat fascism and liberate Cuba. Subject has an interest in CUBAN interest and was returned to DSI for classification. The SUBJECT does not contemplate any future contact.

e. JMWAVE traces reflect the following information on some of the individuals mentioned in this dispatch:

a. Eloy GUTIERREZ - Possibly identified with Eloy GUTIERREZ, Subject of RUL-263349; ~~RECORDED 21 JULY 1961~~; 22 August 1961; ~~RECORDED 1 SEPTEMBER 1961~~; and ~~RECORDED 20 NOVEMBER 1961~~.

b. Aurelio SILVA - Possibly identified with Aurelio SILVA, former member of Cuban National Police. See RUL-1877, 19 June 1961.

c. Domingo MEDINA - Possibly identified with Domingo MEDINA mentioned in RUL-63284, 26 September 1961.

d. General Genovevo PELLIZ Dávila - Possibly identical with Genovevo PELLIZ Dávila, one-time chief of staff of the Cuban Army. See RUL-5540, 26 October 1959.

There are no identifiable traces on all other individuals mentioned in this dispatch.
