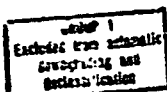
1. It is requested that the contract, as amended for Raymond H. GERENDE, Contract Agent, be further amended as follows.

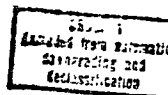

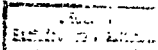

GERENDE was recruited in March 1955, just prior to his graduation from the Mexico City College. He was trained as a member of a surveillance team, and was also used as an investigator to collect operational data on persons and organizations of interest to the Station. He quickly demonstrated a capacity for leadership and at one time was leader of the team.

He was also used as a basehouse keeper in an audio operation and processor of tapes. He excelled in this type of work because of his bilingual Spanish/English facility, and, more importantly, due to his diversified experience in clandestine operations which permitted him to spot operational leads.

Since 1958 his primary use has been as main cutout/principal agent to a group of photographic basehouses targeted against the Soviet Embassy, and one mobile photographic truck. He processes the raw photographic take and services the majority of the accommodation addresses used by the Station. He has contributed significantly to the AMROD operation

He performs all his tasks in a professional manner. He is well suited to intelligence work, and plans to make KUBARK his career. The Station depends heavily on him because of his knowledge of Mexico, and his mobility as a Mexican. He works full time for KUBARK; cover company requires very little time.

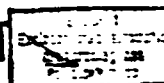

<p>1. Station Mexico City fully agrees with Headquarters evaluation of Subject as a "valuable long term asset with stay behind potential." In order to place the matter of the 2,100 pesos in the appropriate frame of reference it is felt that a few background points should be noted.</p> <p>In January 1956 the LIMPTY/LILYRIC basehouse was set up and placed in operation in a site which provided visual coverage of the LIMERICK installation. A deposit of three months rent was made per terms of the rental contract at that time (2,100 pesos.) In April 1961 the building in which LIMPTY/LILYRIC is located was sold by the owner. Normally the rental deposit would have been transferred to the new owner as part of the sale transaction. However, approximately three months after the transfer of the property to the new owner, the rental deposit was returned to the basehouse operator, LIMPTY-15. The deposit was then returned to GERENDE. GERENDE did not inform the then LIMPTY case officer nor the present case officer of the return of the LIMPTY/LILYRIC deposit. This 2,100 pesos continued to be carried on the Station books as an outstanding operational advance charged to GERENDE. GERENDE used part of this 2,100 pesos to make loans to two sub-agents (LIMPTY-6 and LIMPTY-9.) It is probably that he also used some of this on occasion for his own purposes.</p> <p>On 16 October 1963 GERENDE returned the 2,100 pesos to the case officer and the Station has adjusted its books to reflect the return of this money. GERENDE noted at the time of the return that he had this money intact but did not know how to go about returning it so long after having received it. This is the same as he stated at the time of the LCFLUTTER interview. GERENDE was obviously impressed with his inability to "beat" the LCFLUTTER. He was sincerely remorseful when talking to the case officer</p>

about the incident and has twice stated that nothing of this nature would happen again. With the reality of future LCFLUTTER tests set firmly in GERENDE's mind, it is believed that he will not attempt any such action again.

As to what can be done of a positive nature (other than periodic re-LCFLUTTER) to prevent recurrence it must be noted that GERENDE kept apart the 2,100 pesos which were really still charged to him and the Station had no way of knowing that the money had been returned to him by the basehousekeeper. Only when the close down of the LILY/ LILYRIC basehouse would be effected would the Station expect to have the rental deposit returned. Until such time the deposit would remain charged to GERENDE. The only way to completely safeguard against this type of action would be for the case officer to meet directly with the basehouse keepers, thereby eliminating GERENDE from the operation and causing unacceptable security risks. It is believed that periodic LCFLUTTER of GERENDE is the best insurance against a similar occurrence in the future.

As to GERENDE's regular operational revolving fund, irregularities have never been discovered in his handling of these funds. Cash counts are conducted by the case officer to control the unspent portion of the revolving fund by comparison with accountings (receipts) GERENDE takes every two weeks. GERENDE's revolving fund is kept at the minimum amount consistent with efficient conduct of the operation for which GERENDE is responsible.

The "other false claims" GERENDE admitted making involved occasional use of his QP vehicle for personal driving while entering all receipts for gas on his KUEARK accountings. Station does not consider this a major problem. If GERENDE used his QP car for only operational employment any hostile surveillance of him would be relatively easy (i.e., surveilling only when he is using his QP vehicle) and it is believed that latitude must be allowed in this area for indigenous agents.

2. In the area of GERENDE's morale and his statement that he "is not being utilized to his full potential" the Station is as fully concerned as Headquarters. It should be noted however, that GERENDE has never written the report setting forth what he thinks he can do and when prodded on this has stated that he had been thinking about what additional work he could assume and that he "just does not know". The reason he gives is he does not know what else is being done in the operations area other than that to which he is already exposed. Additional operational work is assigned to GERENDE when this can be done securely and taking into account compartmentation of operations. An example of this was his introduction to the AMROD operation. Station is reluctant to expose GERENDE to additional operations only for the purpose of "improving his morale" since he already has considerable knowledge of many Station past and going operations. The Station appreciates Headquarters comments on the results of GERENDE's LCFLUTTER and will make every effort to determine the best possible utilization of GERENDE in the future.

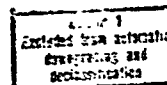

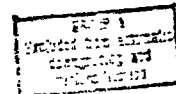

2. For ordinary P&S work, the difference between long and short wave lamps is very minor and the long wave UV lamp should prove adequate for the needs of Raymond H. GEREDE. Should a special need arise demanding the use of a short wave UV lamp by GEREDE, it will be supplied by KURIOT.

3. Disclosure of the existence, advantages, or uses of short wave UV lamps, or in any way making available such lamps to other than KUBARK personnel requires prior Headquarters approval. A copy of Instruction No. 20-2 containing the basic KURIOT policy governing the use of short wave UV lamps is herewith enclosed for your guidance.

4. Short wave UV lamps embody a definite health hazard and should be used with caution. Short wave UV rays quickly cause sunburn, to which the eyes are particularly susceptible, and should not be used without wearing protective goggles. Ordinary eye glasses cut out most of the harmful rays, but even persons wearing glasses may receive harmful eye burns from UV rays entering at the sides of the glasses. Short wave UV lamps also produce small quantities of ozone so that the lamp should be used in a well ventilated room, which, of course, must also be darkened. For the above reasons, it is advisable to use only a long wave UV lamp whenever possible.

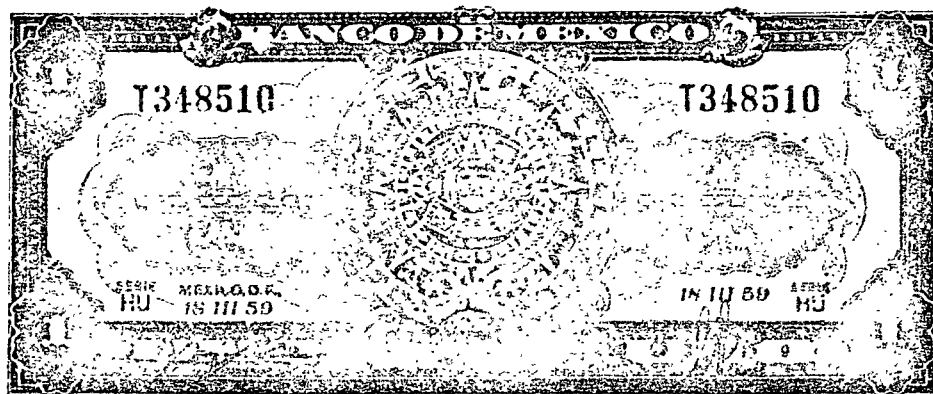

GERENDE is most appreciative for the raise in salary and is delighted with the new Terminal Payment clause.</p> <p>2. The Station interprets the Terminal Payment clause to mean any termination by the Government or acceptance of GERENDE's resignation in the "best interests of the Government." Examples in connection with the "best interests of the Government" interpretation would involve GERENDE's resignation for health reasons or other logical personal reasons such as a change of residence to some geographical area where his services could not be utilized by KUBARK. Assuming that no security problems are involved in making such a payment, the Station also interprets the clause to be applicable for payment to GERENDE's estate in the event of his death while in the employ of KUBARK.</p> <p>3. The Station understands clearly why the clause was not written as originally requested and concurs in Headquarters reasoning. Certainly, the Station would not want to give GERENDE a terminal payment, and he has been so informed, if he elects to resign just to receive some extra money or to pursue some other career. In checking this out, we find that we have no copy or notification of the amendment dated 1 September 1957 increasing his salary from \$3600 to \$4080. CPD is rewriting the contract without using a compensation figure for the amount to be deleted.

Also inform them that they are to execute and retain the original copy of this new contract amendment. It may be well to point out that Subject's termination clause stipulates that he will receive this benefit only if we terminate the contract.

<p>1. Raymond H. GERENDE was initially employed by the Station on 18 March 1955 under provisions of an oral agreement. Effective 1 October 1955 GERENDE was placed under a written contract, prepared by Headquarters, with an annual salary of \$3,600.00. On 1 September 1957 his contract was amended to increase his salary to \$4,080.00 per annum, which is the salary he is presently receiving. It is requested that a new two year contract be prepared, to be effective 1 July 1959, providing an increase in salary to \$4,560.00 per annum and including a termination clause which will give GERENDE a termination payment of one month's salary, calculated at the prevailing rate of compensation at the time of termination, for each full year of his KUBARK employment. All other provisions of GERENDE's initial contract should remain in force. (The increase in salary to \$4,560.00 per annum is already covered by the LIEMPTY Project.)</p> <p>2. As pointed out in the attachment to HMMA-11368, 22 October 1958, paragraph three of MEXI-2836, 25 November 1958, and in the LIEMPTY Field Project Outline, GERENDE is a highly valued full-time Station asset who carries a significant work load and who has a great deal of responsibility. He is the LIEMPTY Principal Agent who handles the LIMITED, LILYRIC and LICALLA base houses, the LIENTRAP operation, the outside photographic processing and translation service and all the agents participating in these activities. He performs his duties in a conscientious and professional manner and his already excellent abilities are showing continued improvement.</p> <p>3. Paragraph eight of HMMA-12095, 4 February 1959, indicated that the Station was considering amending GERENDE's contract to provide for some type of retirement benefits. Although it is recognized that indigenous agents are not usually granted such contract provisions, the Station believes that GERENDE should have monetary incentive, in addition to his ideology, to make a long career with KUBARK. Accordingly, the Station recommends that GERENDE's new contract provide for a termination settlement of one month's salary for each full year that he has worked for KUBARK. In other words, should GERENDE's career with KUBARK last for 24 years and his yearly salary at the end of this period is \$3,000.00, then he, or his heirs, would receive a lump sum payment of \$16,000.00. After considering different types of insurance plans, an escrow account and several other ideas, the Station considers the above proposal to come closest to meeting the criteria of control, production incentive and creation of the desire to make KUBARK a career. GERENDE's contract to provide him with a termination settlement of one month's salary for each full year that he works for KUBARK and to raise his salary effective July 1959 from \$4,080 to \$4,560.00 per year. The Station believes that this benefit will provide GERENDE with the necessary incentive to make KUBARK a career and at the same time will give the Station an additional element of control.

He has a responsible full time job as the LIEMPTI Principal Agent who handles the LIMITED, LITRAC and LICALLA base houses, the LIENTRAP operation, the outside photographic processing and translation service and all the agents participating in these activities. He performs his duties in a conscientious and professional manner and his already excellent abilities are showing continued improvement.

3. Money was already allocated in the LIEMPTI Project approval for the salary increase. With the effective date of 18 March 1955, for the termination clause, GERENDE will already have accrued \$1,520 (his salary is \$4,560 per year) if he should resign today. The LIEMPTI Project, as approved, has sufficient funds to cover this cost if it is necessary to obligate this amount during the present Project year. Therefore, no additional funds are requested.

1. During the period covered by this report, a new Case Officer, Quincey H. GUSLER, assumed operational direction of several LIFTITY assets (Oliver C. SCANTLING, Raymond H. GERLAGE, LIMITED, LICALLA, LIENTRAP and several support agents). The LIJERSEY surveillance team and the LILYRIC Base. The Station has continued to run SCANTLING, primarily, to follow up LILYRIC leads obtained from LIFLA and the photographic bases; however, no positive results have been realized from his prodigious efforts except the collection of a considerable amount of operational information. GERLAGE performed his principal past reconnaissance for the photographic bases. LIENTRAP, LIJERSEY and until 10 December 1958 handled the LIFEAT/ECMORNING and LIFEAT/WHEN calls operation. The LIJERSEY surveillance team has been used sparingly for prison reconnaissance and routine case surveillance; however, a principal agent, Albert D. CLACKETT, is currently being trained to Headquarters to assume the full-time chronicler, control, tracking and development of the LIJERSEY team. The report, LIFTITY, covering all the assets discussed in this report was submitted to Headquarters on 3 October 1958 with requested project year approval period from 1 December 1958 through 30 November 1959. An operational security review of Raymond H. GERLAGE's activities was forwarded to Headquarters as an attachment to DISMA-11363, 22 October 1958.

ACCOUNT OF DEVELOPMENTS - OLIVER C. SCANTLING SEGMENT

2. Agent Information - Oliver C. SCANTLING has continued to perform his assigned tasks in an outstanding manner. SCANTLING's potent, common sense, education, ideology and native ability for the pursuit of clandestine activities make him one of the most valuable support assets available to the Mexico City Station. The fact that SCANTLING has full time overt occupation as Chief Engineer and Production Manager for a local manufacturing company adds to his long-range potential as a KUBARK agent. On two occasions during the past six months SCANTLING has indicated to his Case Officer that he would like to resign from his overt position and devote full time to his KUBARK operational duties; however, the Case Officer has discouraged him from doing this on the basis that he has more long-range potential when his cover occupation is legitimate. Of course, SCANTLING would be more realistic if he could work full time for the Station, but not sufficiently so to warrant his resignation from his overt job (his monthly salary in his overt job is in excess of \$10,000 U. S.). The only legitimate indication that SCANTLING has evidenced to his present Case Officer is his occasional delay in preparing written reports of investigations and other pertinent receiving reports for the file. However, this indication gradually is being overcome and it is expected that SCANTLING's reports will continue to be factual, comprehensive and soon will be promptly submitted.

3. Security Developments - SCANTLING is consistently under a considerable amount of exposure and pressure when following up LILYRIC leads obtained from LIFLA and the photographic bases. There is always of the nature when being such pertinent leads. SCANTLING frequently is directed to make spy checks on individuals performing services for the LILYRIC targets after routine, and sometimes only cursory, investigation. Therefore, the possibility always exists of his involvement in an undesirable security incident. This occurs early

in a calculated risk which puts SCANTLING and the States near take if prosecution of the primary target is achieved, whether voluntarily or by a recruitment in place. SCANTLING's credit that he has not yet become involved in an incident where he has been killed has compromised him and/or alerted the target of KLAS RK's many previous efforts against them. The closer SCANTLING has come to being compromised and to being identified as a LEEBARK agent stems directly from the LEEBARK involvement from the fall of June 1956. The call he made by the surveillance team was made by SCANTLING in his true name at the time that he was leader of the team. SCANTLING's position, however, has been uncovered which points to SCANTLING as a target of investigation by a local police service. SCANTLING and the team have been identified and will continue to watch closely for any sign of local police and other agencies involved in his activities.

A. Operational Success and Effectiveness - Partially discussed below are some of the ways operational activities in which SCANTLING participated during the period covered by this report:

A. Juan CASTRO (201-) - SCANTLING continued seeing CASTRO through November 1958 following the last time plans of meeting the original LEEBARK / LEEBARK operative through CASTRO. As late as September 1958 possibilities were raised, or reported as facts, that CASTRO would employ his work in the country LEEBARK office and that it might be possible to recruit LEEBARK. This CASTRO, through SCANTLING, was the principal source of this information. Further was also confirmed by LEEBARK. For July, August and September 1958, SCANTLING had approximately eight meetings with CASTRO. In late September 1958 LEEBARK indicated that the LEEBARK target was being recruited under the supervision of one of their regular local employees, Ramon VERA (201-20941). In complete cover of the work CASTRO was supposed to find and that other contacts were being made around the target area which CASTRO would normally be expected to do had he still been in the employ of the target. Thus, LEEBARK and LEEBARK confirmed that the LEEBARK target had been recruited to CASTRO - he was not seen visiting the target installation nor did the target people attempt to get in touch with him. In view of this, SCANTLING was instructed to cease all contact with CASTRO as of 1 November 1958.

B. Pablo VERA (201-) - During the period covered by this report SCANTLING had two interviews with VERA. SCANTLING's most recent report was forwarded to Headquarters as an attachment to KLASA-11143, 1 November 1958. Unfortunately the Mission has identified VERA as the technician who serviced LEEBARK radio set here. SCANTLING will continue his development of VERA (please see KLASA-11711, 19 December 1958).

C. Carlos VERALES (201-) - SCANTLING's activities in connection with the LEEBARK / LEEBARK contacts were summarized in KLASA-11197, 20 October 1958, and past two correspondence.

D. INGERITA GABELON - This is the first time that made the great visit for the LEEBARK installation. SCANTLING made two visits to this man's workshop and succeeded in obtaining enough information to make an

accurate drawing of the type door installed at LIME ROCK. This drawing was forwarded to Headquarters via RMAA-11926, 21 January 1959.

E. Casing Report on West German Embassy - During June, July and August 1958, SCANTLING prepared a detailed casing report on the new West German Embassy. SCANTLING's employment ability enabled him to prepare accurate drawings and sketches from a minimum of data. Also, his personality and proper time management permit him to view the inside of such a building, with an appropriate cover story, and retain minute details which later he converts to paper and images as well as a comprehensive floor plan and important construction data.

F. LIME ROCK Construction - SCANTLING's long association with the target from the casing standpoint provides the Station with an unparalleled source of information about LIME ROCK construction plans, modifications and progress for same. All of the LIME ROCK casing reports are filed in Headquarters for the project of SCANTLING's unique ability and knowledge. SCANTLING keeps Station Officers abreast of LIME ROCK construction have been of benefit to the Station during this reporting period and they will continue to be of worthwhile importance.

G. Routine Investigations and Surveillance - Although the Station has several assets capable of performing investigations and surveillance, SCANTLING is utilized in situations requiring the utmost discretion and effectiveness. His activities in this connection are not restricted to the target; suffice it to state that he has contributed materially to the Station's collection of information through his investigative efforts. SCANTLING's interview of Fritz F. Schmitt (KIA-4549) of LOMAY-TOWNL interest is an example of SCANTLING's use in investigations (see RMAA-11749, 17 December 1958).

H. ESQUIRE-15 - SCANTLING served as the contact with ESQUIRE-15 during the latter's December 1958 trip to Mexico City. In this connection SCANTLING is a support asset which is trustworthy and dependable. SCANTLING never displays much curiosity in operations such as the ESQUIRE-15 case; he accepts the information source of information given and performs his duties in a professional and efficient manner.

I. LIMPITY-3 - SCANTLING has been the administrative liaison connected with L/3. LIMPITY-3 provides operational direction to L/3. During this reporting period, the Station had hopes of SCANTLING taking over the operational supervision of L/3's activities. However, after a four-month trial period with both SCANTLING and KILLGO meeting with L/3, it was decided that it would be desirable for KILLGO to continue handling L/3. L/3's unusual personality and intellect indicated that he could best be directed by a SPINME officer. Therefore, SCANTLING no longer handles KILLGO's and L/3's operational matters, although he does continue to handle L/3's administrative problems.

J. Raymond H. GERSHBERG's Duties - During GERSHBERG's absence from

Mexico City in December 1958 and January 1959. It was considered appropriate for SCANTLING to handle LIMITED, LICALLA and LIENTRAP. Although this procedure follows some correspondence principles, it was the only manner in which the Station could maintain continuity with the these operations it used before. SCANTLING has known the agent involved with LIMITED, LICALLA and LIENTRAP for several years. In fact, he was in charge of the agent in charge of these three operations.

5. Operational Methods Evolved During the Period - The VIDALES operation in so far as it (1) serves to illustrate the Station's necessity for thorough intelligence and discussion with the agent making an approach to a target. This can be fully be described as a new operational method, but it does serve to illustrate the evolution of some that should be followed. The information for LIMITED TV operation wherein SCANTLING must secure the knowledge of the target's holding in order for SCANTLING and the Station the opportunity to prepare a home play for SCANTLING's recruitment pitch. The operation demonstrates proper as by LIMITED and the many being created by SCANTLING and the Station should increase the working strength on SCANTLING's cold approach. (See ISMAA-11365, 12 October 1958, and ISMAW-7003, 21 November 1958, for additional details on this subject).

6. Personal Views, and other conclusions can be made about any Station's support operations - where technical and photographic operations are possible, the ability of the information obtained to assist or considerably by means of, operations and intelligence gathering reports. SCANTLING, as previously mentioned, is an excellent asset for this type of support.

6. Adaptation - SCANTLING's contract expires on 15 February 1959. As of that date SCANTLING will have received an annual salary of \$3,600.00 U. S. for two years. The Station plans to raise his annual compensation to \$4,000.00 U. S. for other significant administrative problems exist.

7. Outlook for Future Development - Station plans call for the continued utilization of SCANTLING in the same manner as he is presently being used. The Station will keep SCANTLING as an independent asset and, if it is loyal, render the impression to make him a principal agent in charge of numerous sub-agents. It is believed that SCANTLING is the type of support asset that can be worked for in the Station for many years to come and that every effort should be made to protect his security and value to KLASA XX.

ACCOUNT OF DEVELOPMENTS - RAYMOND H. GERENDE'S ACCOUNT

8. Agent Information - Aside from the agent information given in ISMAA-11365, 22 October 1958, the only significant development was GERENDE's December 1958 marriage to a U. S. educated girl of Dutch descent. The \$300.00 U. S. for the purchase of two plane tickets as a wedding gift to GERENDE was assigned to pay GERENDE with the fact that KLASA XX thinks highly of him as an individual and that KLASA XX has a great interest in his intelligence career. GERENDE is at the age and stage in life where he is beginning to wonder just what the future holds for him. In the near future, the Station will propose a salary raise for GERENDE.

and request a new contract that provides for some type of retirement benefits - perhaps similar to the Civil Service Retirement program for KLMARK employees.

9. Security Developments - Again, the information on this subject was covered adequately in DISPATCH. GERRARD was relieved of his LIFEAT/ADMINC and LIFEAT/CHIEF duties (dates on 10 December 1962). This, of course, was in line with recommendations contained in KAPOA-1145 and represents a critical security lapse or event. GERRARD was told the LIFEAT/ADMINC was being transferred because it had not been productive of enough of official information and that LIFEAT/CHIEF duties was being transferred because the group part of the target program had moved closer. This was true where the Orbes are concerned. (Additional security improvements will be made with Steve R. CLACKETT assuming the office and duties of GERRARD of responsibility for the LIFEAT/ADMINC group.)

10. Operational Success and Efficiencies - Briefly reviewed below are the reports of operational activity for which GERRARD managed during the period covered by this report:

A. LIMITED - This base functioned smoothly, sanely and efficiently during the period July through December 1962. The base operator, LIFEAT V/6, demonstrated his usual competence and devotion to duty. In addition to the primary objective of making photographs of individuals of interest, L/6 also prepared detailed daily logs on the arrivals and departures of all target personnel. Weekly reports of work are submitted to the LIFEAT/CHIEF (noted in the previous report) three one-page summary sheets of Marston working at LIFEAT V/6 in an effort to identify them by name and home address, and provide SCANTLING with information on LIFEAT V/6 construction. During this six-month period, LIFEAT V/6 took approximately 100 photographs from the LIFEAT base.

B. LELYAC - This base is operated by LIFEAT V/13 and 14, with LIFEAT V/12 serving as a liaison between the base and GERRARD. LIFEAT V/14 does most of the photography and reporting for the base since LIFEAT V/13 has a regular job and is not on the premises during regular daytime working hours. L/14 works approximately six hours (0600-1200) each day to photograph and the remaining time is spent preparing reports. The base personnel compile individual logs on each target personality including their arrivals and departures from the LIFEAT base (noted in the previous report). These reports are filed in the appropriate Section 201 file and are available to the staff officers in analyzing a target personality's pattern of daily activity. LELYAC also prepared a weekly report on our base activities at the Club and reports the license plate numbers of all vehicles charging or picking up individuals at LIFEAT V/6. (Note: These license plate numbers are then checked out through LIFEAT V/6 (noted in the previous report) for the cases in which and address - in case of an accident or in an operational interest.) During GERRARD's recent absence from Mexico City, GERRARD met directly with LIFEAT V/12. During this period approximately 12,000 photographs were taken from the LELYAC base.

C. LICALLA - While LELYAC and LIMITED are combat bases for photographing individuals entering and leaving the LIFEAT base (noted in the previous report), the LICALLA base is the staff's best source of photographs of LIFEAT V/6.

activity. LICALLA is an element that photographs can be made of target personnel in the yards area of LONE ROCK. LIENPTY/9 is the base operator for LICALLA and in the Station's opinion performs his job in an excellent manner. As reported in HIRMA-11104, LIENPTY/9 is the brother of former LIENPTY/27 (the later LIENPTY surveillance team member arrested in Jan-1953). No recommendations, or indications of any topgrading cases, have resulted in this monthly review period. This, incidentally, is the major security problem faced by L/9 during this reporting period. L/9 and his family even will have to vacate the LICALLA base for the period of time required to complete it. The Station is sure that L/9 can be sure that his current capacity over the LICALLA base and the three adjoining houses and every effort is being made to prevent this action from L/9. (See HIRMA-12002, 23 January 1953, for a more detailed explanation.) Of course, during the remainder of LICALLA there will not be any LICALLA reporting or photographs. In addition to taking approximately 2,500 photographs during this six-month period, the LICALLA base also played a major role in LONE ROCK garden activities. These reports include which LONE ROCK employees are seen together with day, which vehicles of former employees are accustomed to using, construction activity and other matters which appear of significance to L/9.

D. LIENRAP - LIENRAP continues to be a worthwhile Station asset. Approximately 1,400 clandestine photographs have been made of numerous targets during this reporting period and LIENRAP type activities will not usually remain one of the Station's best surveillance assets. As explained in the report from just October, forwarded to Headquarters on 8 October 1953, the Station is of the opinion that the LIENRAP vehicle should be replaced as soon as possible. Shortly after months have elapsed without receiving Headquarters authority to replace the vehicle. The necessary action to even move assets now then at the time of the request, LIENPTYs 13 and 14 do an excellent job as LIENRAP operations.

E. LYERBY - This operation can be characterized as somewhat dormant for the July - December 1953 period. Because of GERRARD's other important activities, he did not have the time to train and work with the surveillance team. Also, the Station considered that it would be increasingly security just a bit too far to have GERRARD engaged in surveillance at the same time that he was handling the photographic base houses and performing monitoring duties for LIFEAT/BOHANNING and LIFEAT/Cohen & Wilson. The expected arrival of Stuart D. CLARKENT in April and his relieving GERRARD of LIFEAT with certain the Station to take, within a year, as of the time with the surveillance team. At present, LIENPTYs 15, 16 and 17 compose the LYERBY team.

F. LIFEAT - Until 10 December 1953 GERRARD served as member in the base house consisting LIFEAT/BOHANNING and LIFEAT/Cohen & Wilson. In addition to living in the base house, GERRARD also trained that the majority of the BOHANNING and Cohen & Wilson tapes. He performed these jobs satisfactorily even though his efficiency was hampered by numerous other duties. Relieving GERRARD of his LIFEAT duties enables him to devote more time to his other operations with a corresponding increase in the security of all his activities.

C. LIEBFTY/4 and 5 - LIEBFTY/4 does a truly professional job of developing and printing the black and white photographs. His significant developments consisted in relation to L/4 except that OHLER met directly with him during the December 1953 period that GRENDE was away from Mexico City. LIEBFTY/5, L/4's wife, continued doing similar translations in a very competent manner.

11. Additional situation - Other than the fact that LIEBFTY and the above-mentioned portions of the LIEBFTY projects were considered into this new project, LIEBFTY, there is nothing of significance to report to the Department.

12. Continued Air Force Development - Although not necessary to be repeated by the Department, as in those recommendations made above, a summary of the Air Force's outlook on the future of the LIEBFTY CHARGE Segment is believed to be appropriate. Since the arrival of CLACKETT in April, GRENDE will be free to devote all time to photographic black and white operations. GRENDE can do a lot to professionalize these operations by preparing written communications procedures, by thoroughly reviewing black and white operations on their methods of operation, by preparing detailed monthly reviews on each hour run by supervising the trial of new photographic equipment. GRENDE will continue to be used as a technical consultant in connection with the operations and to perform other services for the Division which will not impede the security of his primary regular activities. It is planned that CLACKETT will put some time into the LIEBFTY surveillance team and that the Division will soon have another first class investigative group to support other Division operations.

SUBJECT: Wedding Gift for Raymond H. GIEREND (ps),
Contract Agent

1. It is requested that the Mexico City Station be authorized to give Raymond H. GIEREND (ps), as a wedding gift, two airplane tourist class tickets from Mexico City to San Francisco and Washington D.C. and return to Mexico City. Although this trip may appear to be a generous and unusual wedding gift, the Station considers it is more than justified in view of GIEREND's outstanding performance of his duties for the Station and his future value as a principal agent. GIEREND has been working for the Station since February 1955.

2. The Station estimates that the cost of the plane tickets will be \$600.00. The LIFE TICK Project, which covers GIEREND, can absorb this added expense.

REFERENCE(S)

1. The subject paper is attached. It is believed that Headquarters will have a clearer picture of what GERENDE is doing at the present time together with several informative facts concerning the security of GERENDE's operations. Also included in this paper are several recommendations which the Station proposes to implement through Project LIEMPTY. Obviously, some of the recommendations are goals to work for and, because of a lack of personnel and other valid reasons, cannot be immediately adopted.

2. The attached paper should be read in conjunction with the new LIEMPTY field project outline, which was recently forwarded to Headquarters. Please note, however, that the old agent cryptonyms are used in this paper.

3. The attachment has been read and approved by Matthew S. DINGLEY, who recruited this excellent agent (GERENDE) and was his Case Officer until GERENDE was recently assigned to Quinton N. Ousler.

4. GERENDE is one of the most valuable assets of this Station. This review is considered to be a worthwhile exercise; but under the present operational pace and with present assets, security compartmentation, which is desirable, cannot be achieved. The main security precaution (viz getting GERENDE out of Mexico City and well hidden in case of an emergency) will constantly be kept in mind.

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OPERATIONAL SECURITY REVIEW OF
RAYMOND H. GERENDE'S
OPERATIONS AND ACTIVITIES

1. SITUATION

As a result of the June 1958 LIPSTICK flap, it was decided by the Chief of Station on 30 June 1958 that Quinton N. OUSLER would assume direct contact with several of Matthew S. DINGLEY's agents, one of whom was Raymond H. GERENDE. After being introduced to GERENDE by DINGLEY on 1 July 1958, OUSLER assumed contact responsibilities with GERENDE on 2 July 1958. On 18 July 1958, the Chief of Station decided that OUSLER should be assigned permanent responsibility for the management and handling of GERENDE and GERENDE's operations.

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this operational security review is threefold:

- a. To identify possible security problems and conditions;
- b. To establish a framework for recommendations which will result in the Station's submission of a new support project (LIEMPTY) with Raymond H. GERENDE as a principal agent; and
- c. To acquaint the new case officer with the operational problems and agent personnel with which he should have a comprehensive knowledge and detailed understanding.

3. PRINCIPAL AGENT - Raymond H. GERENDE

a. Background - GERENDE has been employed by KUBARK since 18 March 1955, which was just prior to his graduation from the Mexico City College. He is now only 24 years of age, but in the Station's opinion, is a mature, experienced and dedicated KUBARK contract agent. During the three and one-half years that he has been working for the Mexico City Station, GERENDE has participated in a varied assortment of support and intelligence operations. Initially, he was trained and used by Matthew S. DINGLEY as a member of the LIPSTICK surveillance team. In addition, to surveillance work, he was used as an investigator to collect operational data on persons and organizations of interest to the Station. He quickly demonstrated a capacity for leadership and at one time was the leader of the LIPSTICK team. He has been used as a LIFEAT Base House operator

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and processor of tapes; he has excelled in this type of work because of his bi-lingual Spanish/English facility and, more importantly, due to his diversified experience in clandestine operations which permits him to spot operational leads much more readily than the average LIFEAT monitor.

b. Duties - GERENDE is currently serving as the principal agent in charge of LIMITED, LICALIA, LIPSTICK Photo Truck, LIJERSEY Surveillance Team and LILYRIC. In addition, he monitors and processes the EGMORNING and Cuban Exiles LIFEAT taps. He also supervises the photographic processing of LIPSTICK-38 (his brother-in-law) and the translation work of LIPSTICK-40 (his sister). He maintains contact with and provides administrative support to LIMITATIONS 5 and 6, LICOOL-7 Base operators. Quite obviously GERENDE's many duties overlap the bounds of several Station operations, namely LIPSTICK, LIJERSEY, LIFEAT, LICOOL and several activities which are not listed under formal projects such as EGMORNING. It is recognized by the Station that it is not advisable to have one principal agent connected with as many operations as is GERENDE. However, the present scarcity of both staff and contract agents of the principal agent type necessitate such efficiency measures. Every effort is being made to compartment the various segments of GERENDE's operations and to decrease, and to eliminate where possible, all lateral communications between agents.

c. Security Problems - The most serious security situation surrounding GERENDE and his many activities is the fact that LIPSTICKS 12 and 30 (two of the LIPSTICK Team members arrested in the June 1958 flap) know GERENDE by true name, and knew that he also worked for KUBARK. In fact, LIPSTICK-30 is a close personal friend of GERENDE's and was originally recommended for KUBARK employment by GERENDE. The operational security hypothesis that can be constructed from these existing acquaintances are too numerous to list in this brief review; suffice to say that should GERENDE be arrested by one of the local police agencies, most of the remaining support assets would be destroyed or so seriously compromised that the Station would indeed be foolish to continue using them. It is appropriate to state here, however, that neither GERENDE nor the Station believes that GERENDE has yet been named or otherwise identified as a result of the LIPSTICK flap. It is granted though that any future questions by one of the local police agencies to the compromised LIPSTICKERS represents a continuing type of danger for GERENDE. Based on the duties which GERENDE is currently performing, the readers of this review can well imagine what the consequences to several operations

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would be if GERENDE were arrested by one of the local police agencies and interrogated in detail. Also, the Station must forever be aware that the local police agencies are certainly capable, for only a few dollars, of selling information concerning KUBARK to the Soviets and/or Satellites.

d. Recommendations - It would be unwise to consider terminating GERENDE since he is a highly competent agent and since his termination would not eliminate the fact that he knows a great deal about the Station's support operations. He has been reminded several times, and the Case Officer will continue to remind him, that his tradecraft professionalism must improve and stay ahead of the increasing sophistication of the local police agencies and opposition services operating in Mexico.

It is the opinion of the Station that GERENDE should continue to be used in about the same manner that he is presently being used. It would be advisable, however, to separate him from the two LIFEAT functions he is currently handling, EGMORNING and the Cuban Exile taps. This is suggested not only because of the possible future security ramifications, but also because GERENDE does not have time to run properly his support mechanism and to monitor taps seven days a week.

To provide for a situation whereby one of the local police agencies becomes aware of GERENDE's illegal activities and assuming that either GERENDE or the Station learns of this before the local police agency can take positive action, it is imperative that a warning system of communications be established to facilitate GERENDE's removal from Mexico. Arrangements such as those used for Wilfred O. CLOWER could be set up or local arrangements could be made with ODUNIT or ODOATH for a more expeditious exit from Mexico. The Case Officer will develop this plan in detail.

4. OPERATIONS

a. Limited

(1) Target - Stationary photographic surveillance of persons entering and leaving the LIMERICK installation.

(2) Personnel - LIPSTICK-14 is the agent in charge of the LIMITED Base. According to GERENDE, LIPSTICK-14 is conscientious, security minded, speaks no English, and on occasion is a bit over confident. He performs his operational duties competently and with discretion. In addition to his photographic duties, he is also used occasionally as a one-man

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foot surveillance to follow individuals leaving the LIMERICK installation, LIPSTICK-14 receives a monthly salary of \$1,800.00 (MN) and free rent and utilities at the LIMITED Base. His wife (LIPSTICK-27) and son (LIPSTICK-28) live with him at the LIMITED Base.

LIPSTICK-28 until 15 July 1958 assisted his father with photographic work at the LIMITED Base. However, on the above date he decided to resign from his LIMITED job and, strange as it may seem, to devote full time to working on a chicken farm. LIPSTICK-28 made this decision on his own and against the wishes of his father. He will continue to live at the LIMITED Base and it is believed that no security problems will result, since any security difficulties could adversely affect his mother and father. Although LIPSTICK-28 has been terminated and a termination report forwarded to Headquarters, it is suggested that we maintain his operational approval since he continues to live in the LIMITED Base.

(3) Communications - At the present time GERENDE meets with LIPSTICK-14 three times a week at contact points away from the Base. They have seven separate contact points which are used for their meetings. Usually the place of contact is pre-arranged at the previous meeting; however, a rapid means of communication exists whereby GERENDE telephones LIPSTICK-14 and through a pre-arranged open code, utilizing insurance policy numbers, sets the time and place of contact. LIPSTICK-14's overt occupation is that of an insurance salesman and adjuster; consequently, there is a cover basis for such a telephonic conversation. A reserve system of communication with LIPSTICK-14 has not yet been arranged. GERENDE has been instructed to do this as soon as possible, thereby giving the Station a means to contact LIPSTICK-14 directly should the need ever arise.

(4) Security - Excluding KUBARK staff personnel, the LIMITED Base is known to LIPSTICKS-2, 14, 27 and 28 and to Oliver G. SCANTLING and Raymond H. GERENDE and possibly to LIPSTICK-12 (GERENDE's opinion). Since LIPSTICK-14 has known LIMEWATER (LIFEAT Project) for many years and since LIMEWATER is LIPSTICK-2's brother, it is important to recognize that the desirable degree of compartmentation between LIPSTICK/LIMITED and LIFEAT probably does not exist. Although LIMEWATER must be aware of LIPSTICK-14's and 2's PEPRIME employment, it has not been possible to ascertain the extent of LIMEWATER's knowledge about their specific activities, and vice versa. LIPSTICK-14

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worked with James O. AYCALL (LIMESTONE) during WW-II; however, he claims that the only members of AYCALL's family that he ever met was AYCALL's "alleged wife." Since she saw him only one time many years ago, LIPSTICK-14 does not believe that she would recognize him now.

Neither GERENDE nor LIPSTICK-14 are aware that KUBARK owns the LIMITED Base House. The extent of their knowledge is that LIMOUSINE is the owner and we simply rent from him.

(5) Recommendations - It is recommended that GERENDE continue to meet with LIPSTICK-14 and to supervise his operation. In this connection, GERENDE has been instructed to reorganize his existing communications arrangements with LIPSTICK-14 to include a new regular system, a rapid non-scheduled system and a reserve system. Also, GERENDE is to review with LIPSTICK-14 their cover reasons for meeting and knowing each other and to be prepared to use this cover story should they ever be apprehended together.

LIPSTICK-14 was instructed on 8 August 1958 to cease all social and business contact with LIPSTICK-2. Oliver G. SCANTLING, who has previously handled LIPSTICK-14 and sees him occasionally even now, has been directed to cease all contact with the LIMITED Base and LIPSTICK-14 except when approved by the Case Officer. (NOTE: It is necessary at times for SCANTLING to debrief LIPSTICK-14 for LIMESA leads).

b. LILYRIC

(1) Target - Stationary photographic surveillance of persons entering and leaving the LIMERICK installations.

(2) Personnel - LIJERSEY-5 is personnel manager of a Mexican affiliate of a large PBPRIME company. In addition to serving as a spotter for potential surveillance team members, he also serves as the cutout for the LILYRIC Base. GERENDE manages and directs the LILYRIC Base through LIJERSEY-5. LIJERSEY-5 maintains direct contact with LIJERSEY-2, the Base House operator, and his wife, LIJERSEY-12, who does most of the photographic work. LIJERSEY-5 is a PBPRIME citizen. He is paid a monthly salary of \$1,000.00 (MN).

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LJERSEY-2 is the LILYRIC Base operator. He is a Captain in the Mexican Army Reserve and is also employed by Colgate-Palmolive Peet Company as an industrial engineer. He receives a monthly salary of \$1,000.00 (MN) and he and his wife live rent and utilities free in the LILYRIC Base.

LJERSEY-12 is the wife of LJERSEY-2. She does most of the photographic and reporting work at the LILYRIC Base and has proven herself to be a capable and worthwhile asset. It has been necessary for her to become proficient in the LILYRIC work since her husband works at his regular job during the day. She receives a monthly salary of \$800.00 (MN).

(3) Communications - GERENDE contacts LJERSEY-5 twice weekly at prearranged contact points during the late afternoon hours. LJERSEY-5 contacts LJERSEY-2 two to three times weekly at prearranged car contact points and receives the "take" from the LILYRIC Base. On occasion GERENDE has contacted LJERSEY-2 directly, but this procedure is used only when LJERSEY-5 is out of town or otherwise not available. GERENDE does not know LJERSEY-12 or vice versa. No reserve system of communications exists whereby a Station officer could contact LJERSEY-2 directly should the need arise; however, GERENDE has been instructed to set up such a system of communications. The same will be done with LJERSEY-5, although he is known to several Station officers and little difficulty would be experienced in contacting him directly.

(4) Security - The security of the LILYRIC Base appears, at least on paper, to be in better shape than the Limited or LICALLA Bases. Insofar as the Case Officer has been able to determine, the only indigenous agents aware of the LILYRIC Base are GERENDE, LJERSEYS 2, 5 and 12, and LIPSTICKS 38 and 40, and all of these individuals have a close connection with the operation of the Base. The only tie-in the LILYRIC Base has with the LIPSTICK operations is through GERENDE.

(5) Recommendations - GERENDE has been instructed to change his meeting plans with LJERSEY-5 and to review the communications set-up between LJERSEY-5 and LJERSEY-2 (L-5 and L-2 are long-time friends and, consequently, the cover problem is minimized). A staggered schedule of coverage of the LIMERICK target between LILYRIC and LIMITED was initiated on 18 August 1958. Although the operators of these two bases are unaware of the existence of the other, a suitable cover story has been worked out to satisfy any

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curiosity that LIPSTICK-14 and LIJERSEYS-2 and 12 may have. This procedure is believed desirable due to the confining nature of the photographic tasks and the lack of additional personnel to assist at each of the bases. Also, this staggered schedule of coverage should reduce some of the duplication presently coming in from the two bases.

c. LICALLA

(1) Target - Stationary photographic surveillance of persons and activities in the garden area of the LIMERICK installation.

(2) Personnel - LIPSTICK-39, his wife and three small children live at the LICALLA Base. He is an accountant for a local bus line and works at his cover job in the evenings. LIPSTICK-39 does an excellent and conscientious job of photographic coverage at the LICALLA Base. In addition to the photos he takes, he writes a narrative description of the events which take place in the target's garden area. He receives a monthly salary of \$2,000.00 (MN) and free rent at the LICALLA Base.

(3) Communications - GERENDE meets LIPSTICK-39 twice weekly, usually on Tuesdays and Thursdays. They have four contact points, one of which is selected at each meeting for use for the next meeting. In the event that contact is not established, GERENDE has the initiative in contacting LIPSTICK-39 by phoning him at the bus line office during the evenings. Then, by prearranged open code, a meeting site and time are agreed on. Since Oliver G. SCANTLING is also acquainted with LIPSTICK-39, it would be possible to contact him through SCANTLING should something happen to GERENDE. However, to facilitate proper and secure communications procedures, GERENDE has been directed to establish a reserve system of communications with LIPSTICK-39, using the customary oral and physical bonafides.

(4) Security - The most serious security problem concerning LICALLA is the fact that LIPSTICK-39 is the brother of LIPSTICK-47 (the first agent arrested by the local police agency during the recent LIPSTICKflap). Although it is generally believed by Station officers that LIPSTICK-39's name was not mentioned by LIPSTICK-47 nor that any indication was given concerning LIPSTICK-39's job, it must be understood that should the local police agency decide later to interrogate LIPSTICK-47, the probability exists of compromising LIPSTICK-39 and LICALLA. The Station sees no way to overcome this possibility.

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It is important to note here that LICALLA occupies one of the four LIMUST properties. While it is believed that LIPSTICK-39 does not know that KUBARK owns the Base or has anything to do with the other three houses, it is entirely conceivable that should one of the local police agencies or the LIMERICK personnel become aware of LICALLA activities, they could very easily arrive at some logical conclusions about all of the LIMUST property. This would be detrimental, if not fatal, to our aims. However, another Station viewpoint on this same problem is that if compromised, LICALLA would divert suspicion from, rather than to, LIMUST. Should one of the local police agencies begin an investigation which might involve LIMUST and LICALLA, then LICALLA could be sacrificed to protect the LIMUST Base. These possibilities become somewhat theoretical and perhaps impractical due to the lack of predictability of the local police agencies, but nevertheless must be weighed one against the other.

In view of the apparent importance of the LIMESA/LIMUST operation a lot of thought and discussion have transpired at the Station about continuing the LICALLA operation in its present location or suspending it for the immediate future and attempting to find another suitable location away from the LIMUST property. A sound argument can be made for terminating the base since such an alternative might have the effect of limiting any knowledge LIPSTICK-39 may have about the LIMESA/LIMUST installation. However, the termination of a productive base such as LICALLA would require an explanation to LIPSTICK-39 which could not help but leave him a bit suspicious. For Headquarters information, the local rental laws are such that LIPSTICK-39 would not be able to comprehend why we did not insist on him maintaining "squatters rights" (as stated previously, LIPSTICK-39 apparently does not know that we own LICALLA or even have an interest in any of the other LIMUST properties which can easily be done in Mexico. Therefore, any attempt to terminate LICALLA might cause more of a security problem with LIPSTICK-39 than permitting LICALLA to operate as it is now. Another possibility would be terminating LIPSTICK-39 and putting another agent in the present LICALLA Base. If this measure were followed, it would not eliminate the fact that LIPSTICK-39, even if terminated, would still know of the existence of the present LICALLA Base. Still another possibility would be to terminate LIPSTICK-39 and the LICALLA Base; however, since LICALLA and the other LIMUST properties are ostensibly owned by one man, LIMOUSINE, suspicions and investigations could still lead to LIMUST.

(5) Recommendations - The Station is inclined not to "rock the

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boat" at this stage of the game and suggests that we maintain LICALLA at its present location and with its present operator, LIPSTICK-39. One alternative appears to be about as good as another in this case, and it is an acknowledged fact that LICALLA, at its present location, is a worthwhile and productive asset. Headquarters ideas and comments on the LICALLA Base would be appreciated.

At the present time it is planned to move LIPSTICK-39 and family to a furnished apartment when the time comes to remodel the LICALLA Base. After completion of the remodeling, LIPSTICK-39 and family will return to the present LICALLA Base.

d. PHOTO TRUCK

- (1) Target - Investigative asset used for taking surreptitious photographs of persons, places and things that are from time to time of interest to the Station and Headquarters.
- (2) Personnel - LIPSTICK-2, as indicated by the low numerical designation of his cryptonym, has been employed by KUBARK for several years. At the present time LIPSTICK-2 is responsible for the day-to-day operation of the photographic surveillance truck. He is also used occasionally to spot and rent operational apartments. In the past, LIPSTICK-2 has served as team leader of a low level surveillance team (which was compromised and subsequently disbanded), as a LIFEAT line inspector (when he was not busy with the photo truck), and as a static surveillance man (i.e., used as an outside sentry during the March 1958 entry of the LIMUST Base by KUTUBE/D, KURIOT and KUCLUB technicians. (NOTE: LIPSTICK-2 was assigned the task of watching the entire area during the day for any unusual activity on the part of target personnel. He was not told that he was to watch a specific house. He was dismissed from his static surveillance before dusk and the Headquarters technicians did not enter LIMUST until after 2030 hours.) LIPSTICK-2 is the brother of LIMEWATER (LIFEAT Project) and LIPSTICK-34 (LIPSTICK Surveillance team member) is LIPSTICK-2's wife's nephew. LIPSTICK-2's cover is buying and selling cars; however, about the only business he has in this connection is when he buys and sells cars for KUBARK. His cover is quite weak. He receives a monthly salary of \$3,200.00 (MN) plus \$600.00 (MN) per month for the use of his personal car.

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LIPSTICK-24 does not know GERENDE and, presumably, knows only LIPSTICK-2, with whom he works on the photo truck. His cover is as a salesman of electrical appliances; however, he does not pursue his cover job to the desirable extent. LIPSTICK-24 was recruited by LIPSTICK-2 about one year ago and is currently receiving a salary of \$1,000.00 (MN) per month. Since he has now worked a year for the Station, and performed satisfactorily, his salary should be raised to \$1,200.00 (MN) per month (LIEMPTV will provide for this increase).

(3) Communications - GERENDE meets LIPSTICK-2 two to three times a week. These meetings are arranged by phone and take place at previously selected contact points which can be referred to in telephonic conversations by innocent sounding code names. LIPSTICK-2 also knows GERENDE's true name, where he lives, and his phone number. In the past he has had occasion to telephone GERENDE at the latter's home. LIPSTICK-2 knows DINGLEY, and could, in an emergency situation, contact DINGLEY. However, GERENDE has been instructed to arrange a complete communications plan with LIPSTICK-2, including a reserve means of contact. For security reasons, GERENDE has been instructed to inform LIPSTICK-2 that his only contact is with GERENDE and that in the future he is not to contact anyone else in the organization without GERENDE's permission. Also, that should contact with GERENDE be disrupted, he is to await for the higher echelon to establish contact with him (all agents under GERENDE are being so instructed). This is particularly important in the case of LIPSTICK-2, since he has by-passed GERENDE in two or three instances in the past.

(4) Security - Probably the most serious security situation involving the photo truck, LIPSTICK-2 and LIPSTICK-24 is the basic knowledge of the LIPSTICK surveillance team that such an asset exists, even to the point that one of the team members (LIPSTICK-34) is the listed owner of the photo truck. The personal knowledge of LIPSTICK-2 about the LIFEAT operation also represents a security hazard of the first class. For example, if LIPSTICK-2 were compromised and arrested as a result of his activities, there is a possibility that he could compromise his brother, LIMEWATER, the LIMITED Base and LIPSTICK-14, GERENDE and our interest in the highly sensitive LIMESA/LIMUST operation. (NOTE: According to the LIFEAT Case Officer and the former LIPSTICK Case Officer, both LIMEWATER and LIPSTICK-2 have been reminded on several occasions during the past few years that they were not to discuss any aspect of their operations with each other. Also, LIPSTICK-2, to the best of the Station's

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knowledge, does not know the location of any of the LIFEAT Base houses).

A new truck should be purchased as soon as possible to replace the present truck. The new truck should be purchased in an assumed name and vehicle papers should list an untraceable address. LIPSTICK-2 has already been informed that he is to have no contact with LIPSTICK-14 or any other operational personnel he may know except, of course, LIPSTICK-24, with whom he works, and GERENDE, who supervises his activities. In addition to the above, the Station should begin thinking about a replacement agent for LIPSTICK-2 and every effort should be made to set up an independent and compartmented photo truck operation. This would permit the eventual termination of LIPSTICK-2, after we have given him several months to reduce his knowledge of current operations.

d. LJERSEY

(1) Target - Foot surveillance and investigative support of other Station operations.

(2) Personnel - LJERSEY-4 is of a low social class and lives with his mother in a slum area of Mexico City. He is the sole support for his mother and several younger brothers and sisters. He is described by GERENDE as having a lot of ambition and a strong desire to improve his standard of living and position in life. The Station has found him to be a good observer and, consequently, adequate for static surveillance work. Although he now has his drivers license, he is not a capable driver and probably will never develop into one. GERENDE has been encouraging LJERSEY-4 to obtain employment as a salesman to supplement his KUBARK income of \$1,000.00 (MN) and to establish himself in a cover job. However, LJERSEY-4 has not yet obtained such employment. It is the Station's opinion that LJERSEY-4 is definitely an asset of limited value and will never develop into the high-calibre surveillance asset which the Station really needs.

LJERSEY-8's situation is about the same as LJERSEY-4's. He lives with his family and is currently taking highschool courses (LJERSEY-4 is doing the same). He is not an imaginative talker and has difficulty making up cover stories and spur-of-the-moment excuses and explanations - the vital qualifications for a good surveillance man. He is the best driver of the three LJERSEY

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team members and with more practice will probably develop into a capable and dependable driver. LIJERSEY-8 has recently shown a commendable amount of initiative where his cover situation is concerned. He has obtained a job as a commission salesman for UNDERWOOD typewriters and, according to GERENDE, is making a substantial amount of "pin" money. However, as in the case of LIJERSEY-4, LIJERSEY-8 is at best an asset of only limited value. LIJERSEY-8 also receives a salary of \$1,000.00 (MN) per month.

LIJERSEY-13 does not know LIJERSEYS-4 and 8 and vice versa. LIJERSEY-13 is better dressed than the other two team members and can pass as a better educated and more socially flexible individual. He speaks fairly good English. He performs pretext investigation assignments with facility and imagination and is adept at making up cover stories. In brief, he makes a good impression on the people he interviews. He is not a good driver and is too nervous to develop into one. His salary is \$1,000.00 (MN) per month.

(3) Communications - GERENDE has daily contact arrangements with the three LIJERSEYS. Prearranged meeting places are used on designated days of each week and the LIJERSEYS are instructed to go to each meeting. They have standing instructions to continue going to their meeting sites for two weeks; if they have not been contacted during that period of time, they can discontinue their communications plan and await contact by GERENDE or another appropriately selected agent at their respective homes. None of the LIJERSEYS have home telephones; hence, it is impossible to arrange any type of communications using this means. GERENDE is currently in the process of setting up new and more complete communications arrangements with the three LIJERSEYS.

(4) Security - Insofar as knowledge of other operations, personnel and assets is concerned, the LIJERSEYS appear to have the best security of any of the operations handled by GERENDE. New communications plans with the LIJERSEYS will do much toward increasing security and ability to meet contingencies. GERENDE will be instructed to give refresher training to all three LIJERSEYS in operational security, cover and communications. The major danger existing with the LIJERSEY team, and with any surveillance team, is the possibility of compromise and arrest by one of the local police agencies. Should this happen, GERENDE and his other operations would be placed in considerable danger.

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For this reason, it is not advisable to have GERENDE connected with a surveillance team and also contacting and directing the sensitive photo base houses. Therefore, until such time as a suitable asset can be developed or acquired to take over the LIJERSEY team, their actual surveillance assignments will be kept at the minimum.

(5) Recommendations - It is suggested that the LIJERSEY framework be used for the recruitment of at least three competent and higher class local nationals for use on surveillance assignments. After the recruitment of such individuals, it may be suggested that LIJERSEYS-4 and 8 be terminated. LIJERSEY-13 should remain as an independent investigative asset to conduct "credit" and other type of inquiries which he can do without help from other agents. LIJERSEY-3 has already been asked to spot prospective candidates of a higher social standing for use on a new surveillance team; however, even under optimum conditions, one and a half years will be required to get such a team functioning. In order to recruit the type of team member that will be most worthwhile to the Station, we must plan to pay a minimum starting salary of \$1,600.00 (MN) per month. The cost of living in Mexico is continually on the rise and where \$1,000.00 (MN) was a good salary one to two years ago, it really is not adequate today.

1.

LIFEAT

(1) Target - Conversations coming from two telephone taps, BGMORNING and Cuban exiles.

(2) Personnel - GERENDE lives in the apartment where these two lines are maintained. He personally processes the take from the lines and passes it to OUSLER for Station dissemination to Robert B. RIGGS (BGMORNING) and Calude K. Shyrook (Cubans). GERENDE, in accordance with LIFEAT procedures, is supposed to remain in this apartment seven days a week. However, this is impossible due to his other operational assignments and activities.

(3) Communications - GERENDE meets daily with OUSLER to pass the LIFEAT "take" and to discuss other operational matters.

(4) Security - It is not a good security practice to have a LIFEAT monitor working on anything except LIFEAT. Other duties, which GERENDE certainly has, limit one's capability for maintaining the required security alertness for telephone

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repairmen and others who might accidentally discover one of our LIFEAT taps. Also, should GERENDE be compromised through any of his other operations, it is conceivable that the EGMORNING and Cuban Exiles LIFEAT taps would be discovered by one of the local police agencies.

(5) Recommendations - It is suggested that a replacement be found as soon as possible to relieve GERENDE of his present LIFEAT duties.

8. LICCOL-7

(1) Target - A planned technical installation against a person of interest to the Station and to Headquarters.

(2) Persomnel - LIMITATION-5 and his wife, LIMITATION-6, are the LICCOL-7 Base House operators. LIMITATION-5 has been with KUBARK for several years. He was at one time the LIAXIOM Base House operator. He presently works for the DuPont Company. He dresses well, speaks some English and could be described as belonging to the rising middle class of Mexicans. His wife can do photographic work and has had previous experience with KUBARK in the dispatching of car surveillances by radio. LIMITATIONS-5 and 6 are not participating in any active work pending the installation of LICCOL-7 in their apartment. LIMITATION-5 receives a monthly salary of \$300.00 (MN) and LIMITATION-6 receives \$400.00 (MN) monthly.

(3) Communications - A complete communications plan does not exist between GERENDE and LIMITATION-5. At the present time it is only necessary for GERENDE to see LIMITATION-5 on pay day and when Harvey C. MULFORD desires to visit the apartment for technical surveys and other work. Therefore, GERENDE and LIMITATION-5 utilize an open code telephonic means of getting together. So far, this has worked quite well, but it will be necessary later to set up a more sophisticated communications system.

(4) Security - The operational aspects of LICCOL-7 are under the jurisdiction of Matthew S. DINGLEY; therefore, the author of this report is not familiar with the security ramifications, if any, surrounding this technical installation and the agents operating it.

(5) Recommendations - None.

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h. MISCELLANEOUS

Also on the payroll as worthwhile assets are GERENDE's brother-in-law, LIPSTICK-38, and his sister, LIPSTICK-40. GERENDE and LIPSTICK-38 process and print all the LIMITED, LILYRIC, LICALLA and truck photos. LIPSTICK-40 does non-sensitive translation work for the Station. Both LIPSTICKS-38 and 40 are handled by GERENDE. They do not have contact with other agents or with station officers. LIPSTICK-38 receives a monthly salary of \$1,000.00 (MN). LIPSTICK-40 receives the equivalent or \$1.75 U. S. in pesos per hour for her work.

Although it is not advisable from the security point of view to have any indigenous agent aware of all three of our LIMERICK photographic bases and the photo truck, the load on the Station photographer several months ago resulted in just such a solution to the problem. Previously, GERENDE and LIPSTICK-38 had processed only the photographs from LIMITED, LILYRIC and the truck.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendations have been included in several sections of this paper. These same recommendations, excepting those which have already been carried out or are in the process of implementation, are listed below in a composite form to facilitate the readers' overall comprehension.

- a. Continue the reorganization of communication arrangements with all agents.
- b. Relieve GERENDE of his LIPEAT duties (BGMORNING and Cuban Exiles taps) as soon as possible.
- c. Continue to use GERENDE for the time being as the principal agent in charge of LIMITED, LILYRIC, LICALLA, the Photo Truck, LIJERSEY, LIMITATIONS-5 and 6, and LIPSTICKS 38 and 40.
- d. Arrange a warning system of communications for removing GERENDE to PBPRIME should he be compromised to one of the local police agencies.
- e. Purchase a new photo truck for use by LIPSTICKS 2 and 24.
- f. Begin planning for a compartmented photo truck operation which will later permit termination of LIPSTICK-2.
- g. Spot and recruit at least three indigenous agents from the middle class social level to form the nucleus of a new LIJERSEY

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surveillance team.

h. Eventually separate GERENDE from either LIJERSEY surveillance team duties or the three photographic base houses, preferably the former. The two types of activities are not compatible with each other and should not be handled by the same principal agent.

i. Implied, but not specifically stated elsewhere in this paper, is the suggestion that GERENDE be given a "cooling off" and training period of two to three months in PBPRIME. Of course, this will not be possible until other assets are developed to take over GERENDE's present duties. After his return from PBPRIME, GERENDE could be used to develop new support assets which would be completely compartmented from all of his previous operations, personnel and activities.

6. CONCLUSIONS

It would take several weeks of uninterrupted study of files to write a really comprehensive security review of GERENDE's operations and activities. However, based on the facts contained in this paper, it is the Station's opinion that GERENDE probably is not now known to the local police agencies as a KUBARK or PBPRIME agent. It is believed that GERENDE could be identified by the local police agencies at any time they choose to interrogate LIPSTICKS-12 and 30 in detail or when one of the other agent assets formerly or currently associated with GERENDE is compromised. Furthermore, if GERENDE is arrested, he could compromise most of the Station's support assets, plus the BGMORNING and Cuban Exiles portions of LIFEAT.

Given several months time, the slow process of compartmentation can be introduced into GERENDE's operations. Such compartmentation, however, will never reach the truly desirable point, but some improvement over the existing situation can be made. If GERENDE can emerge basically unscathed from the current incidents, then KUBARK will have an extremely valuable long-range support asset.

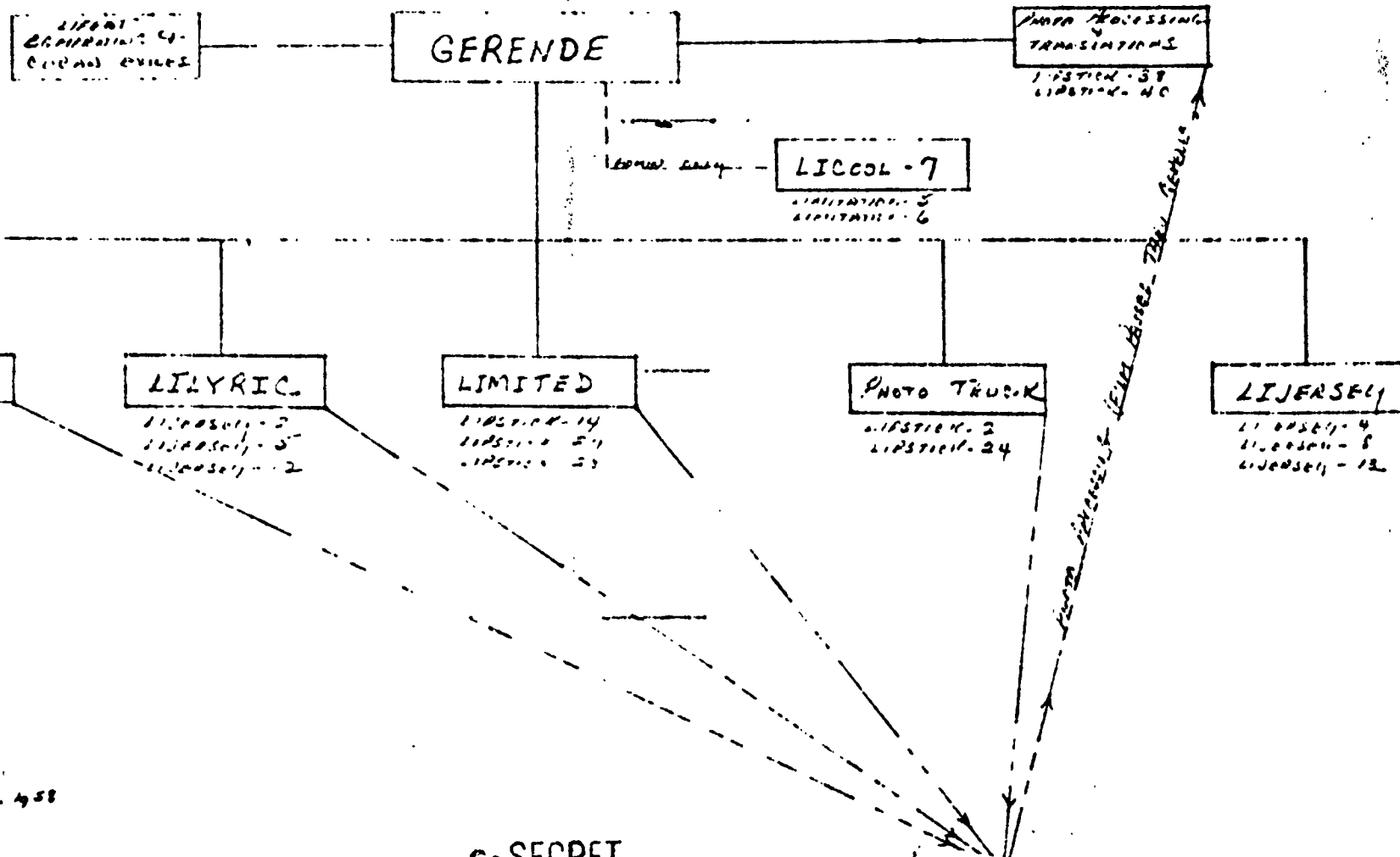

1. Reference is made to the arrest of LIPSTICK-47, the subsequent arrests of LIPSTICK-12 and 30, their interrogation by the Mexican Secret Service and their eventual release from prison. Reference truly portrayed the incident with the following exceptions:	
a. None of the arrested men was tortured.	
b. LIPSTICK-45 was never arrested.	
c. Only LIPSTICK-12, 30 and 47 were arrested.	
d. LIPSTICK-29 was not taken from his home by force. In fact he was never arrested.	
2. While under detention the arrested men told the story as it appears in Attachment A which was written by LIPSTICK-30. It is not believed that the men told anything more truthful.	
a. The substance of the story was told to Station Mexico identically by three (3) separate and uncorroborated sources, i.e. from the arrested men, from the attorney, Paul F. CARLSON, and from the Counselor of Canadian Embassy, Sidney WILKINSON.	
b. Each operation mentioned in Attachment A, which was susceptible to a check by the Secret Service, was investigated by them. However, no operation not mentioned in Attachment A was investigated by the Secret Service.	
c. LIPSTICK-47, who had only been with the team about one and a half months and who did most of the talking, did not know any information other than that in Attachment A.	
d. LIPSTICK-12 and 30, who knew considerably more about our operations, are both men of sterner stuff than LIPSTICK-47 and have keener minds.	
e. The "ring of truth" that Attachment A has. It is not believed that the Secret Service is sufficiently sophisticated to accept such a believable story.	
f. The combined opinion of every Case Officer who has known LIPSTICK-12 and 30 that they did not reveal any information other than that contained in Attachment A.	
g. On 10 July 1958 LIPSTICK-12 and 30 were examined by Martin F. REMALEY on LCPATTER. REMALEY was satisfied that the results of this examination completely exonerated LIPSTICK-12 and 30 from any cooperation with the Mexican Police. The results of these tests are attached as Attachment B.	
3. In order to assess what possible damage might have been done to Station Mexico's operations if the arrested men had told the Secret Service everything they knew, there follows a list of those operations known to the arrested men:	
a. LIPSTICK-47 did not know anything more than he told the Secret Service as outlined in Attachment A.	
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b. LIPSTICK-12:

- (1) He was recruited by LIPSTICK and knows that he works for Station Mexico but does not know in what capacity LIPSTICK is employed.
- (2) He knows that LIPSTICK, LIPSTICK-3 and LIPSTICK-6 work for Station Mexico but does not know in what capacities they work.
- (3) He knows the true names of Thomas G. LIPSTICK, Edward P. SECHEN, Matthew S. DINGLEY, Oliver O. SCANTLEB, Wilfred O. CLOVER, Raymond S. GERSHBERG, Harvey P. DEGENHOLTZ, Boyd I. ROBINSON and Clyde K. SERTACK.
- (4) He knows all of the details of the FURAC 9 and 2222 operations.
- (5) He participated in the raid on Alfredo Guerra Borges' apartment.
- (6) He knows of LIPSTICK Car #3 (photo truck).
- (7) He knows all of the present LIPSTICK surveillance team and LIPSTICK-2 and it who used to be with the team.
- (8) Through surveillance, he knows of the following operations:

c. LIPSTICK-30:

- (1) He was recruited by Raymond S. GERSHBERG. He knows that GERSHBERG works for Station Mexico but does not know in what capacity.
- (2) He knows the true names of Thomas G. LIPSTICK, Edward P. SECHEN, Matthew S. DINGLEY, Wilfred O. CLOVER, Oliver O. SCANTLEB, and Harvey P. DEGENHOLTZ.
- (3) He participated in the raid on the apartment of Alfredo Guerra Borges.
- (4) He knows of the LIPSTICK #4 vehicle (photo truck).

(5) He knows all of the present LIPSTICK team and LIPSTICK-12 and 14.

(6) Through surveillance, he has learned of all the operations as listed in the case of LIPSTICK-E.

4. At the present time the LIPSTICK team is inoperative. The team members are working at their various cover jobs and writing a critique on the surveillance techniques they used which caused these three to be arrested.

Matthew S. DINGLEY has stopped all sensitive contacts and turned them over to Quinton K. OUSLER as a precautionary measure should DINGLEY be under surveillance. DINGLEY continues to see LIPSTICK-30 who now administers the team, and DINGLEY also continues to be the case officer for LIPSTICK.

LIPSTICK-47 has been fired and the LIPSTICK offices have been vacated and the furniture stored in a public warehouse. With the excellent cooperation of Nogales and Monterrey Bases, Wilfred O. GIBBS was smuggled out of Mexico.

5. Future planning for the LIPSTICK team will depend upon the results of operational tests and additional defensive reassessment based upon the actions of the team and the results obtained. General Miguel MELINAR Simandi, Chief of the Mexican Secret Service, has agreed to protect the team fully and assume responsibility for their actions for the sum of \$240.00 U.S. per month. MELINAR has also promised to issue the team credentials from the Secret Service, or some other official investigative group, after the presidential inauguration in November of 1958. The future of the LIPSTICK team will depend upon the following factors:

- It is not believed that the Secret Service demanded, nor even suggested, that the team report future activities to the Secret Service. (Test leads, susceptible of checking, will be given to the LIPSTICK team to determine if they are being reported to the Secret Service).
- Degree of access to Secret Service files given to the LIPSTICK team.
- Effectiveness of General MELINAR's protection.

7. Station Mexico recommends that the LIPSTICK team be allowed to continue operations for a period of three months at which time a reassessment will be made based upon the evidence accumulated over that period of time. The reassessment will be concerned mainly with whether or not the team is really under the control of the Secret Service and the degree of success of their "penetration" of the Secret Service.

SUBJECT: Raymond H. GERENDE

REFERENCE: HMM-A-11368

1. This dispatch represents the type of operational reporting we need. I think any answer to the Station should lead off with an expression of appreciation for a good job. Maybe it will encourage them to write more of this type.

2. GERENDE is very exposed and should be taken off some of his jobs at once. Specifically, my ideas are as follows:

3. Re para. 3 a, agent is very capable and should be retained if secure means can be found. Getting rid of him would not solve the problem. As long as he is in Mexico he is vulnerable. Some thought should be given to how he would be supported in the event of arrest. Personally, I believe the Station would do better to sacrifice a case officer than permit things to drag on to the point where GERENDE might tell all to the police.

Recommendations:

a. GERENDE be briefed so as to be ever ready with an innocuous story to tell the police in the event of arrest.

b. GERENDE be told to contact one of already blown Station officers like HAZLETT in the event of arrest and that the Station officer be ready to appear personally at police station to free GERENDE. If the case officer named for this duty and GERENDE both know the innocuous cover story, there should be little problem. I have done it myself. A good cover story is "looking for draft dodgers" or some such tale which does not have implications of working against Mexican citizens.

c. That if not allowed to communicate directly GERENDE should tell the senior officer present at police station that he works on (cover story) for HAZLETT and insists HAZLETT be sent for.

d. That a second blown case officer's name be given as an alternate for HAZLETT, who is often out of town and unavailable.

e. That GERENDE be taken off LIFEAT at once and all suspicious audio equipment be removed from his home or offices. At present, LIFEAT is the only illegal activity being engaged in by GERENDE; if he is made merely in connection with his physical surveillance activities he is not likely to be hurt by the Mexicans.

f. Concur preparations should be made to hide out GERENDE if it is known he is to be arrested.

4. Re para. 4 a, GERENDE's participation in LIMITED is O. K. I believe no law is being broken. However, LIMITED is probably blown to the Soviets. Here is the more real danger. Station should find out who is the registered owner of the phone at LIMITED. Prior to leaving Mexico I noted to MAHONEY it was still held in the name of LIMESTONE-3 (now fired and hence a possible threat).

5. Re para. 4 b: This is the same situation as LIMITED but not so likely blown to the Soviets. There is no reason why GERENDE should not continue this work.

6. Re para. 4 c, LICALLA is a very special problem and should be taken up at once with Headquarters elements working on LIMESA/LIMUST. I thought LICALLA had been cancelled out when LIMESA began to shape up. I consider it a danger to LIMESA. Has LICALLA produced anything of value? I think we could vacate this in such a way that the agents in LICALLA would have no cause to be suspicious. (Put an obvious tail on the agent, scare him off, etc. This would throw off the Mexican police, too, in the event they are already wise to LICALLA through LIPSTICK 47. We could pretend to believe the Soviets ran the tail and the game is up.)

Recommendation: Get rid of LICALLA unless very productive. Better do this before the remodeling begins.

7. Re para 4 d, photo truck. LIPSTICK-2 does know of the locations of some of the basehouses on LIFEAT since he was a line inspector.

Recommendations:

a. New compartmented truck should be set up. Don't use false names and addresses. It could result in great harm.

b. LIPSTICK-2 be sent off to some small town as "resident agent" for general work and to get him out of the area.

8. Re para. 4 e. I have no particular thoughts on LIVERSEY but think it consistent for GERENDE to handle it.

9. Re para. 4 f: GERENDE should be taken off LIFEAT at once, even if it means losing lines. As of March this year the Station had enough agent personnel to handle bases for 24 lines. They should be able to fill the gap even though LIMESTONE-3 and his tribe were fired. Only 12 lines are now being handled (latest report). The way GERENDE is handling his LIFEAT work seems to be breaking all the rules we set up in seven years of experience.

10. Re para. 4 g, LICCOL-7. I see no harm in GERENDE's handling the operational aspect of this case. But through LIMITATION-5 the police could get back to LIMITATION and the main LIVERSEY tap, that is, if they were able to make GERENDE talk before we could save him. The danger to LIMITATION was not brought out in the Station's survey.

11. In re para. 5, recommendations -

- a. Approve.
- b. Get him off LIFEAT right now.
- c. Concur, but liquidate LICALLA.
- d. This needs some discussion. What do we do with GERENDE in the U. S.?
- e. Concur.
- f. Concur with reservation noted above.
- g. O. K.
- h. I don't see why he can't handle all these jobs since they are physical surveillances.
- i. Not a bad idea.

12. Final observations:

- a. What is GERENDE's cover?
- b. We must be sure he is not overworked. Sloppy work has resulted from people being overworked.

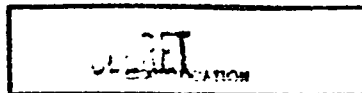

C. Raymond H. GIBSON, a contract agent, was cover provided by LIPSTICK and is responsible for LIPSTICK office number 2. GIBSON supervises the work of LIPSTICK-12 who processes the film from LIPSTICK, LIPSTICK, and LIPSTICK benches. GIBSON directs the activities of the LIPSTICK surveillance team (a separate project discussed in LIPSTICK-0151). GIBSON is also responsible for the activities of the fixed surveillance benchwork, LIPSTICK.

(1) LIPSTICK is a second story apartment which affords a view into the right angle of the main gate of the LIPSTICK installation at an angle which photographs from the top of the house downward. The equipment is the same as that used in LIPSTICK and LIPSTICK and the film is processed in the same way. LIPSTICK-12 lives in this apartment and is responsible for the photographic and physical surveillance. His reports supplement but do not duplicate those submitted by the LIPSTICK benchwork. The photographs from LIPSTICK are superior in quality to those obtained from either LIPSTICK or LIPSTICK. LIPSTICK-12 is an efficient stenographer and good photographer. Also, this base offers a better position from which to take photographs.

(2) GIBSON's contacts in private investigative agencies are used to check leads from other operations. During June and July 1957 GIBSON received training at Headquarters and both he and the Case Officer feel this training has been most beneficial.
