- 1. On 9 Mar 71 we received a long distance call, presurably from Powder Springs, Coordia, from subject, who is an old and uncovery contact of this office dating from 1959. Merbell has been involved in a variety of scrapes, the latest of which concerned an abortive invasion of Haiti which John Greany was very such concerned about a year or so ago.
- 2. Merbell stated that the Department of Defense had just revoked his security clearance on grounds of Werbell's "Frivolous behavior" in the Maitian caper. Merbell stated that he intended to "Fight it to the Suprese Court", as he had always kept us and other elecents of the US Government informed concerning development in the Maitian matter.
- 3. Werbell asked if there was anything that we could do for him in the way of interceding for him with the DOD, and we informed him bluntly and in no uncertain terms that he was strictly on his own, and we could do nothing for him. He then asked if it would be worthwhile to subjects bart Convoles. We informed him that it was up to his attorney to take such recommendations.
- 4. Werbell seemed to get the message, and then offered to keep us savised regarding an alleged forthcoming attempt on Haiti which is being spensored by Rolando Pasferrer, even though Hasferrer is currently incorrected in a federal prison. He told Herbell that if he withed to pass any information along we would accept it but under no circumstances should be attempt to elicit any information on our behalf. He agreed that he would operate on this basis and said he wight be in touch with us again.
- 5. In view of Werbell's record we felt that this latest contact phould be a ratter of record and that CGC should be informed of developments.

I. I was advised by the Justice Department on 23 February that Werbel has been indicted and the trial is scheduled to begin on 29 March in Miami. Florida. The charges relate to importing and distributing quantities of marijuana. With Werbel's propensity to raise his past affiliations with the Agency, we can anticipate problems during this trial. An additional problem is presented because Werbel is defended by Edwin Marger who was the defense attorney for John Hawk in the B-26 case in Buffalo, New York in 1966. It was Edwin Marger who subposenced the CIA General Counsel as a defense witness.

- 2. The Justice Department has received information that a person either currently or formerly affiliated with the CIA has been participating in Werbel's meetings with his attorney. It would be appreciated if all addressees could review their holdings on Werbel and determine if there is any validity to any recent contacts with him. I would urge that instructions be sent to Miami that no, repeat no, contact with Werbel take place between now and the beginning of the trial.
- 3. It would be helpful if each addressee could prepare a summary of the various contacts Werbel has had with CIA in the past. Please check to see if you have any information on a Colonel Bayard who was killed in Atlanta, Georgia during the summer of 1975. Dayard, reportedly an associate of Werbel's, had previous contacts with the Agency. It would be appreciated if your responses could be received by close of business 2 March.

- 1. A review of DCD records indicates that Mitchell I. Werbell LII was an occasional contact and source of this Division from 24 July 1959, when he first initiated the contact, until March 1971. Werbell did provide unsolicited information which was reported by DCD in seven foreign intelligence information reports. 

We told Werbell that if he wished to page any information along we would accept it but under no circumstances should he attempt to elicit any information on our behalf. 



Now this sounds like something right out of cheap fiction; however, it is a fact. I have met Mike Oliver. And there are about six wealthy individuals, one of whom I think lives in the Bahamas, I believe two are in England, one of them I think is Lord Bellhaven who is a member of Parliament. He has been over to the farm recently and in Washington a few weeks ago with them. About three wealthy Americans, all older fellows with many millions. Now this thing came up once before about eight years ago when they bought a boat and Oliver went out into the Pacific and laid claim to the coral reef in the Samoan Islands I think it was and planted a flag on it and established the free soverign state of Menerva. - 2. Werbell stated that the Department of Referse had just revoked his security clearance on grounds of Werbell's "frivolous behavior" in the Maitian caper. Werbell stated that he intended to "fight it to the Supreme Court", as he had always kept us and other elements of the US Government informed concerning developments in the Maitian matter.
- 3. Werbell asked if there was anything that we could do for him in the way of interceding for him with the BOD, and we informed him bluntly and in no uncertain terms that he was strictly on his own, and we could do nothing for him. He then asked if it would be worthwhile to subpects Bart Gonzales. We informed him that it was up to his attorney to make such recommendations.
- 4. Merbell seemed to get the sessage, and then offered to keep us advised regarding an alleged forthcoming attempt on Haiti which is being sponsored by Rolando Manfarrer, even though Masferrer is currently incorrerated in a federal prison. We told Worbell that if he wished to pass any information clong we would accept it but under no circumstances should be attempt to elicit any information on our behalf. He agreed that he would operate on this basic and said he sight be in touch with us again.
- 5. In view of Werbell's record we felt that this latest contact should be a matter of record and that OCC should be informed of developments.

Mitch WerBell: Gunsmith to the 'Right' Sie

Not surprisingly, WerBell has often. been called an operative of the Central Intelligence Agency, a charge that angers him only when it is leveled too vehemently. It is not that he has anything against the CIA. He just doesn't, he says, happen to be one of its boys, His-paramilltary work, which consists of advising and sometimes directly assisting foreign governments, is done in the employ of what he calls can independent group. of well-intentioned, patriotic Amerirant." The Birch Society? The Minviemen? A bunch of far-right Texas millionaires? WerBell won't say, other than to insist that it is not the CIA.

It hardly matters, for according to WerBell, it is all in the service not only of freedom and anti-communism but of the U.S. government; he does not supply or advise or fight for regimes not bearing the State Department-seal of approval. A heavy percentage of his merchandise goes directly to the U.S. government, which distributes it to its own forces that need silent or exotle wrapons. The halance is sold to friendly governments, either directly or through the good offices of the "independent group," He says he does not sell to individuals, not even if they're certified anticommunists.

WerBell-takes pains to point out that; he is no ordinary arms broker. That is, he is not one of those shadowy figures who sell weapons to both sides at exorbitant prices or who take possession of contraband slipments on the high seas, "We've always adhered to a basic policy: There is only one friend of the United States in a given area, and we deal only with that friend."

What does WerBell peddle? A range of firearms from machine guns to desk-sized cannons, from the meanestlooking weapons to innocent looking swapper sticks that fire a builet or even a small rocket; an array of techmiques - "systems," he calls them that will help an American soldier or a foreign army hold off insurgent forces, and occasionally, his personal services.

Compulsive Warrior

PITCH WERBELL sounds comtalks about firearms, and death, and with reason lie has been in the militory hardware business for years, and he has either heard or produced-or both-the thunking watermelon-sound many times - in Latin America and Sombeast Asia, in the U.S. armed. forces and as a paramilitary "adviser." He is a compulsive warrior, an armed crusader fighting against, "ungodly communism.

WerBell is not alone in this occupation, but he practices it in a unique manner. Must soldiers of fortune are nothing else, and they live from one little war to the next, brawling and booging their way through a tough and Sinancially unrewarding life.

WerBell, by contrast, is a businessman who dabbles in military adventure only when and as far as it suits tim. Il combat didn't titillate him, be wouldn't partake of it. His business is supplying weapons, not using them in anger? He specializes in the weapons and techniques of counterinsurgency, which may be roughly defined as the forceful suppression of coups d etat, rebellions and the like.

Corporate Setup

THE HEADQUARTERS for ha. work, the former Dobbs estate, is on Highway 360 just outside of Powder Springs in a remote section of Cobb County, Actually, corporate headquarters is in Washington, in a firm called Environmental Industries. Inc .- a neat cuphemism for a company dedicated to killing people. Environmental Industries, WerBell says, is hankrolled by some of the East's most prominent investment houses; he is its director of international operations, He is also president of a subsidiary called Military Armaments Co., Inc., and because he is in Powder Springs, Military Armaments is there, too. (Behind Environmental Industries, Wer-Bell says, is "a third shadow of which Ell, is a subsidiary -another tantalizing hint of the CIA.)

Military: Armaments may well be a unique American enterprise. Nobody else, WerBell says, is in the business of designing special purpose weapons on such a scale. A good deal of its designing and manufacturing is done under federal licensel Silencers, for example, are outlawed by the National. Firearms Act, along with sawed-off shotguns, submachine guns and other vestiges of Probibition era gangland L'ATA'

To manufacture his suppressors, Wei Rell must pay a special tax of \$500 a year, collected by the Treasury Department. Ellsworth Bunker, then U.S. ambassador to the Organization of American States, became highly exercised over Werliell's activities and his hawkish views on the conflict (WerBell opposed a cessation of hostilities and establishment of a coalition government). Punker considered trying to toss WerBell out of the country, but nothing came of it. WerBell's "independent group"-CIA, Texas millionaires or whatever-saw to that,

WerBell was already active in the anti-Castro movement, and he brought to it a sense of dash and discipline that the ragtag, bickering bunch of Cuban exiles had seldom seen. Perhaps his major anti-Castro exploit was a speedbost foray into Camarinea, on Cuba's southern coast. The mission was to drop a swimmer, apparently a spy, offshore, and to pick up the family of an exile leader. - 3. It is believed that US Government agencies have infiltrated the movement and the leaders fear that all weapons and equipment would be confiscated if plans for the invasion proceeded.

One of the DC-3's would carry Colonel Rene Leon, Masferrer, and Father Jean Fatiste Georges.
- The M/V Hudson is to be used to carry part of the weapons. The Masferrer group is well armed sixt has plenty of weapons. They have three tons of C-3 dynamite, and also have some C-2 and C-4.
- 5. The Henrietta II will carry photographers.
- 6. In spite of the above I believe that the "invasion" is a farce and is falling apart. Masferrer is merely trying to cover up for the funds he has received for the invasion. It is believed that Masferrer's life will be in danger if he does not make some ostensible effort.

- On 28 Oct 66 I make with Rolando Masferrer Rojan, a Cuban exile, and he told me that he has organized a military force of approximately 250 men to invade Haiti. The invacion force consists of Cuban and Haitian exiles residing in the US, the Bahamas, and the Dominican Republic. The invacion will probably be launched from the Dominican Republic cometime between 5 and 13 November and the target is Port-au-Prince. The invasion force will strike in the early hours of the morning selected. It is well armed, and will have air cover; the presidential palace will be bombed.
- Masferrer stated that Digene L. Moximilien, Baitlan Consul in Miami, Florida, is aware of the invacion, but he has no knowledge of the invacion date. Maximilien is prescutly in Haiti informing President Divalier that the invasion can be prevented by paying off \$200,000 to Masferrer. Maximilian will return to the US on 3 November and he has agreed with Masterrer that if Divalter agrees to the pay-off, Maximillion will receive \$50,000 and Masterrer \$150,000.
- Masforrer told me that the invasion will take place in any event and the \$150,000, if received, would be used to further apport the invasion.
- Masferrer stated that he met within the past 10 days with neveral dissident Haitian army officers and he had received their support. The Haitian army officers told Masferrer that they would revolt as soon as inforzed that the invasion had commerced. They do not knew that the target will be Port-ou-Prince: they believe that it will be in the cap Haitien area.
- Masferrer stated that he was confident that the invasion will succeed, and if successful, Pather Josu Raptiste Georges would be appointed provisional president. Macferrer stated that Colonel Rono Leon, Battian exile, vill participate in the invasion.

Response to Call-in to Agency Meadquarters/Initial Contact (Telephone) with John Daniel Williamson, Carrollton, Georgia

- 1. On Jemiery 1975 Albert S. Coleman of the Washington Field Office called be to pass on information that he had just been given by Dala Zeimer, DCA Leadquarters, reperting a call/received by the Agency duty officer on her Year's Eve from one John unnied Williamson of Carrollton, Georgia, Williamson identified thousalf as a Methodist minister and gave him address as Kouta \$2, 70% 3046, Carrollton, Georgia, Thomas (404) 954-0443.
- 2. In his call to Archey Headquargers, Williamson said that he had a friend who had information on the impedding overthrow of a foreign poverment. The information regarded illegal shipment of area from the US to the foreign country. Williamson said that his friend had wanted to try to soil the information to the foreign country concerned but that when the friend told Williamson about it Williamson prevailed on him to let him (Williamson) bring it to the attraction of the proper government signey, resulting in his call to our handquarters on New Year's Eve. Williamson asked that someone from the Agency by put in contact with him.
- 3. On the afternoon of 7 January 1975, after verifying through the phone operator that Williamson was listed in the Carrollton area (has actually lives at knowlede, Georgia, on Frue Road, but the Recovilla phones are handled under the Carrollton exchange), we called his number. We were informed by a young male voice, apparently his son, that Williamson was indeed a Kethodier minister, but that he tought school every day curing the week in the high school at Franklin, Georgia, accept on Schurdays when he worked all day of a hardware store at Rockmark, Georgia. We were told that he proached on Sunday normings. We were not told what he does on Sunday afternoons. Since he was not to be at home buttl after 5 Pd., we called him from our own home that some evening.
- 4. Williamson seemed to be expecting our call although we had not identified surselves during the cariter call. He gave us assentially the same information furnished during his New Year's Eve call. He said that the friend about whom he called is à 'former parishioner and lives in the Carrollton area." He preferred not to provide us with the friend's name and advices. The information, however—that which we were able to accertain—sounded on the up-and-up, as far as Mr. Williamson's part in it was concerned, for he accessed to be a sincere and well intentioned individual. When we tried to at least learn the name of the foreign country involved, Williamson said that his friend would not give him that \(\frac{1}{2} \).

- 5. We did learn that the friend whom Williamson described as a business consultant. "a kind of a high-finance can involved in setting up corporations," who often travels shroad, and been approached by someone locally, i.e., in the Carroliton-heat Atlanta area (Carroliton is about 40 miles went of Atlanta). The friend was Arid to be "a good friend, a reliable man, a college graduate, an established man in the consumity. According to Williamson, the friend was approached because of the nature of his work to perform some sort of tank for the group, and he knew that something was accord. The friend then learned all he could about the placed operation and eventually talked with Williamson about it. The friend told Williamson that the gun-running operation had been going on for about a year.
- "the people involved in this thing won't peritate to kill him (the friend) and he knows that he's going to have to leave this part of the country warm it comes to light." Williamson told us: I feel like I've got this man's life in my hands and I don't want to do anything to icopardize his life, because I know him and his family and all. Williamson suggested that we meet his friend at the Cope and Sword Notel restaurant on I-20, near Six Flags over Georgis, went of Atlanta, and he said that the two of them had already tailed of this as a good meeting place. We told Williamson that we would be glad to cost with his friend but first we would like for his friend to give us a call so that we may talk with him. We gove our office phone number to Williamson. As of the writing of this memorandum, we have had so each.
- 7. From the information that Williamson provided, e.g., location of people involved, an attempt to neut with an Agency representative (to possibly got un involved merely by association), we believe that much of the substance of the matter could be the same as that which was reported from this office to OSS as related by Stephen Van Cleave regarding mitch Werbell, et al. (See ATL-39-74, 20 February 1974, Rasums of Contacts with Stephen Van Cleave; ATL-53-74, 9 April 1974, Stephen Van Cleave.) Mitch Werbell's operation, which has been described locally as a "machine-gun factory," is located at Powder Springs, Georgia, about ten miles north of the I-20 Caps and Sword Motel. At any rate, Mr. Williamson's friend has been given the opportunity to contact us—and we are awaiting his call.
