## HANGRANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Briefing of Mr. Maurice Oldfield, MI-6, by WR/4, Clark Simmons

- 1. In view of the request of Mr. Maurice Oldfield, MI-6 representative, for identifies and further particulars regarding the Bodert Morton Geddes case a secting was held on 2 May 1961 with WH/4/CI, Clark Simpore, with Mr. Cleveland C. Cran and John G. Hoberts of WB/6 also present.
  - 2. At the outset Br. Oldfield provided the following information:
- a. Appert Morton Gedden is a British subject born in Lina, Peru, on 7 April 1932. He holds British passport No. C-34880, issued at Managua on 14 June 1956. He was not registered at the British Consulate in Hawana and was regarded as being American or Canadian.
- B. Two employees of the British Embassy, Havana, has visited Goddes in the Havana jail (silitary G-2 section) on Sunday evening, 30 April 1961, and had a 15-sinute conversation with Geddes alone under encountainess which they felt were not monitored. Geddes stated to them: (1) On 19 April he was arrested by the militis (in civilian clothes) at his hotel; (2) He had been interrogated three times and gave the impression that he had not disclosed anything of importance; (3) He was accessed of being a CIA agent and told that he could be shot because of the existence of civil mar; (4) During the third interrogation Geddes was shown that them have a message in Spanish signed by Geddes which was sent allegedly by him by radio-transmitter anking that CIA mend arms to Cuba.
- c. The British Embassy in Bavana learned on Saturday, \$9 April 1961, that Godden had regularly toon "picked up" at the Eavana airport on his trips to and from Miami. (Mr. Oldfield was not certain what exact interpretation could be given to the term "picked up").
- 3. After relating the above, Mr. Oldfield stated that his corvice is interested in chtaining an estimate of the sort of story the Cubans might use against Goddes or in provocation against the British Rebassy, perhaps to prove that the British Rebassy had been in collusion with the C. S. He referred to the following specific questions which he had submitted earlier on 2 May and which were relayed by WE/8 to WA/4; E. Hopking for answers to be given in the afternoon session by Clark Simmons:

- a a. What was the identity of the agent invide Cuba who gave GEDDES the message he brought to the CIA contact in Missi on il march 1961;
- b. What was the identity--or case or names---used by the CIA case officer in Miani;
  - o. Was Goddes given any means of clarcestine radio-transmission;
    - d. What were the isatructions gives to GEDDES by his case officer.
  - 4. Br. Signous replies as follows:
- a. The only means of consuntation given to Geddee, besides his open code phone contact with his wife in Born Raton, was a very simple Swaystem. Geddee was not given any means for clantestice radio-transmission.
- b. Simmons then read and related the following chromology of Godden' activities from WH/4 files:
- Il Harch: Gadden came to Minat on the night of Il March and made contact with Cabbage/4, a Coban in Minat who was it contact with the CIA office. Godden had a sensage from Cabbage/1 a CIA contact inside Cuba. C-4 put Gadden in contact with a CIA came officer in Minat on 12 Harch. Gadden claimed to be an active newber of the United Hevelucionaria, a restriance group inside Cuba of which C-1 was a marcer. At the cates Gadden maid the Cuban Havy has a plan to attack all pro-Camtro facilities and then flee Cuba on or about 22 march. Cadden did not ask for any money. He activation was not known. The case officer instructions to Gadden sere related solely to Gadden report that the Cuban Havy would defect. Gadden returned to Havana.
- 16 March: Goddon departed for Havaga.
- 20 Earch: We beard indirectly Geddes had photed his wife and indicated that the individual (C-D with when he had been collaborating in United Bevolutionaria was in trouble. The fact behind this was that one of our agouts (sender of the UB) isside. Cuba had against instructions visited his wife in Cuba. As a result a UR met of reven persons was acrested including C-1. Besides C-1, sense of the others of this net kness of Geddam' activities.
- 21 March: Gedden returned to Minai.
- 26 March: Godden came to Havana. He was given a simple 58 system.

  Beginning about 28 Sarch we had reason to sustent Godden as a possible provocatour since the defection had not come off and possibility of keeping the defection of the Navy ascret in itself was implausible.
- 27 Earth: Goddes sent a SV message to mini regarding the possible Cuban Raval Cofection.
- 28 Earch: Through open ecce telecon with wife said defection of flavy set for 2 to 4 April.
- 39 March: Ceddes called wife on telephone.

l April: Godden sent on SH message which was hand-carried to Midal by a courier. Godden also had a telecom with his wife on this day.

2 April: Coddes said in talecon to wife that faval conspirators would meet on 3 April and Geddes sould give so on 5 April a final date for the defection.

d April: Coddes indicated in telecon to wife that the Baval defection would take place "any day" now.

7 April: We received a massage from Goddon Selivered by a third party (courser) that the Havy plans to defect on 5 or 7 April. Goddon returned to Biami and maid the date was now met for 8 or 9 April.

10 April: Coddos returned to Marana.

11 April: Gadden telephoned his wife that the defection could take place on 13 or 14 April.

16 April: Gaddes in telecon with wife reported that the defection would be on 17 or 18 April.

- each the following comments:
- (1) The CIA agent isoids (C-1) vouched for Saddes but we here is Beadquartors do not know to that extent C-10x1 proted into the background of Godies and his contacts. We here did advise Hismi got to take any setion until we had obtained Britiss concerrance but by that time Gaddes had already returned to Havata. He reiterated that Gaddes was a walk-is and was gover treated as an agent.
- (3) Goddan and his forement regarding the defection of the Caban Bary work suspect from the outset. He claimed to be a British citizen but was already performing for the E.B.
- (3) To Er. Oldfield's question so to wester Goddes had any access to a T/T max, Sissous replied that to his knowledge Goddes cally had phose contact with his wife, SV and use of courier.
- (4) We arms deliveries were involved in the contact with Gaddes.
- (5) Simmons said he would look into whom Gestes could cortamizate or put the finger on.
- (6) To Er. Oldfield's question reported request for identities of C-4. C-1, the Hinal case officer, and the net that was arrested on 16 Barob, Simsons replied that only the DCI has the authority to release such information.
- (T) The Miami case officer mover enved inside Caba.

- 5. After Mr. Oldfield had put a number of questions to Bismons the latter asked Oldfield whether Golden in possibly a British agent which Oldfield emphatically answered in the negative.
- 6. Er. Olffield said that he would now soud off a communication to his sarvice fadicating that Geddes night be a proper a provocatour. However, he asked that he bo provided with the following:
  - B. CIA approciation of the United Revolutionaria;
- b. Identities of C-1, C-4 and members of the net with whom C-1 was arrested on March 18 (Note: Simpons acknowledged that besides C-1 conceivably several other newbors of this net might have known of Godden and him activities.)
  - . Ideatities of the couriers who had contact with Coulee
- d. The identity of the CIA case officer -- the case or names and by him in contacts with Gedden;
- e. Chronological summary of the visits of Geddos to Missi and Paturns to Havass; sise a list of the nature of his communications to Hissia (by telecos, courier, etc.) and communications sent to him in Bavana.
