Dear Mr. Lesar:

This is our final response to your Freedom of Information Act request for records concerning the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. We searched for all records in existence as of and through 3 August 1981.

Enclosed, Tab A, are segregable portions of documents numbered 1 through 9. Deletions were made under exemption (b)(3) in all cases. Exemption (b)(6) also applies to document 1, and exemption (b)(1) applies to documents 2 and 3. The Federal Bureau of Investigation has deleted portions of document 1 under exemption (b)(7)(D). We also located two documents, memoranda dated 19 and 21 November 1971. They are currently and properly classified. Sanitization is not feasible, and they must be withheld in their entirety under exemptions (b)(1) and (b)(3). The CIA officials responsible for these determinations are Louis J. Dube, Information Review Officer, Directorate of Operations, and Robert J. Leonard, Information Review Officer, Office of Security. An explanation of the exemptions is enclosed at Tab B.

You have the right to appeal the above decisions by addressing your appeal to the CIA Information Review Committee, in my care. Should you decide to do this, please explain the basis of your appeal.

During our searches we located United States Government material that was not originated by the CIA. This material appears to be relevant to your request and has been referred to its originating agency for review and direct response to you. We are also enclosing copies of open source material located during our searches.

Search fees incurred in processing your request were \$13. Copying costs, \$10 cents per page are \$3. You may send your check to me in the amount of \$16, made payable to the Treasurer of the United States. Please refer to our reference number F81-0449 to ensure credit to your account.

We apologize for the length of time it has taken us to complete the processing of your request, but we have been inundated by a large number of requests over the past several years. Under the circumstances, we have done our best to be fair to all of our requesters. Thus, we established some years ago the policy of first-received, first-answered. Thank you for your patience and consideration while we were processing your request.
