SUBJECT:

House Select Committee on Assassinations Nosenko Hearings

- 1. (C) Action Requested: That you drop in at the House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA) evening hearing Monday, 19 June 1978, in Room 1A07, at 6:45 p.m., to informally greet Chairman Louis Stokes (D., Ohio) and other Members.
- 2. (C) <u>Background</u>: The HSCA will hold three evening executive session hearings at Headquarters (19 June, 20 June and 22 June) to take testimony from Nosenko to determine:
  - a. Nosenko's knowledge of Oswald; and
  - b. Nosenko's credibility.
- 3. (C) We will provide the Committee and staff with transportation to Headquarters. The hearing begins at 7:00 p.m. A light snack will be offered in Room 1A07 between 6:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

The hearing is unique:

- a. This is the first Congressional hearing ever held at CIA.
- b. The Committee has bent its own rules by not publishing the required hearing notice for security purposes.
- c. This is the first time for Nosenko before a Congressional Committee.
- 4. (C) Nosenko's wife, Ruby, has just undergone surgery, a benign tumor was removed. He and Ruby are very close, and she will drive to Washington with him. He, thus, has many concerns on his mind. You might mention this situation to Chairman Stokes with the hint that the Chairman, in his opening remarks, might wish to say something appropriate.
