Federal Judge ruled that
James Earl Ray filed suit in

the wrong court in his efforts to vold contracts with two of his former attorneys and an author who plans to write his life story.

In dismissing the case, U.S. District Judge William E. Miller said the suit should have been filed in the Memphis District of the Tennessee Federal court, rather in the Middle District.

Ray contends that famed Texas trial lawyer Percy Foreman, Attorney Arthur, J. Hanes Sr. of Birmingham, and author William Brad-ford Huie pressured him into pleading guilty to the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. so that his story would not become a matter of public record. In that way, Ray contends, Huie would have had exclusive story rights, and the attorneys would have been paid through the proceeds of the writings.
