Ray Judge Names Panel on Publicity **Ban Effectiveness**

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) panel of eight lawyers has been named by Criminal Court Judge W. Preston Battle to study "possible violation" of his court order on publicity in the James Earl Ray case.

Battle, who will try Ray on a charge of murdering Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., would not say what prompted his naming the committee yesterday.

He acted a day after Arthur J. Hanes of Birmingham, Ala., Ray's chief defense attorney, held a news conference to say Ray is the victim of a Communist plot. Hanes also charged Saturday that his client's rights being violated by an around-the-clock television security watch.

Battle said the committee of lawyers met yesterday and could have a report as early as today.
