King Suspect Is Escapee From Prison

A Missouri State Penitentiary escapee named James Earl Ray was identified by the FBI vesterday as the man masquerading as Eric Starvo Galt, sought throughout the Nation in connection with the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The announcement, made here by Attorney General

Ramsey Clark, marked the*: first time in the two weeks since Dr. King's death in Memphis that the FBI disclosed a positive identification of a suspect.

Ray, 40, escaped last April 23 from the Missouri State Penitentiary in Jefferson City. Mo, where he was in his: seventh year of a 20-year armed-robbery sentence.

FBI director J. Edgar Hoover said agents linked the case to Ray through latent fingerprints, Hoover's formal announcement did not say where the prints were found, but several prints were known to: have been taken by the FBI in], the rooming house from which the assassin shot Dr. King as the civil rights header atood on a motel balcony.
