l. During the civil disorders of 6 and 7 April 1968 in Washington, D. C. following the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., an employee of this Agency heard on his car radio messages directed to Stokely Carmichael. The employee does not remember the station of which the program was broadcast; however, he identified it as a local "rock and roll" station which was located in the 1400-1600 range on the AM dial.

2. An acquaintance of this employee also mentioned hearing during this period messages such as "Stokely Carmichael, please call your headquarters"; regular radio programs were interupted to broadcast these messages.
