

SUBJECT: David E. Hanlon
(Telephonic Contact)

On this date I telephonically contact Mr. Hanlon, a former Office of Security employee, to advise him that there was a possibility that a staff member of the Senate Select Committee would be contacting him regarding a matter under investigation by the Senate Committee. Specifically, I advised Mr. Hanlon that the subject matter related to the Agency involvement in monitoring dissident activity as it related to Agency interest.

I advised Mr. Hanlon that we have been fully cooperating with the Senate Select Committee and have furnished them considerable amounts of information concerning Project RESISTANCE. In this regard, obviously his name has surfaced. I advised Mr. Hanlon that if he had any concerns regarding his legal rights then I would suggest that he contact Mr. George Clarke with the Office of General Counsel. I further advised Mr. Hanlon that in the event that he was interested in counsel then the Agency would pursue the possibility of providing him with free legal assistance.

Mr. Hanlon indicated that he felt he was bound by the Secrecy Agreement he signed with the Agency and he could not cooperate with the Senate Select Committee unless he was released from this agreement. I indicated that the DCI has released employees and former employees from the Secrecy Agreement under certain guidelines. I discussed these guidelines with Mr. Hanlon. He advised that he would be glad to cooperate with the Senate Select Committee, and he appreciated the telephone call.

SUBJECT : Senate Select Committee Request
(Hayes International, Inc., Birmingham,
Alabama)

1. Reference is made to Review Staff memorandum 75/3569 dated 2 December 1975 regarding the above firm.

2. Office of Security files reflect that on 10 December 1965 Secret clearances on three officials of Hayes International Corporation were requested in connection with classified contracts with TSD. There is no additional information regarding Hayes International for the period 1960-61, 1963, 1968, or any other period except 1965.

3. Office of Security files reflect the following information regarding Hayes Corporation connections with the four American pilots and crewman who were killed during the Bay of Pigs invasion:

a. Riley W. Shamburger, Jr., was a test pilot for Hayes Aircraft Corporation and a major in the Alabama Air National Guard.

b. Wade C. Gray was previously employed as a radio operator with Hayes and also a former member of the Alabama Air National Guard. He was unemployed at the time he was recruited.

c. Thomas Willard Ray was previously employed as an inspector at Hayes and a former member of the Alabama Air National Guard. He was reportedly just returning from a military duty tour at the time he was recruited.

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d. Leo P. Baker was previously a Hayes employee and was operating a pizza establishment at the time he was recruited.

4. It appears that the above individuals were of interest because of their experience and expertise on the B-26 bomber gained through membership, or former membership, in the Alabama Air National Guard. There is no indication that their employment at Hayes was connected in any way with their recruitment.

5. There is no record in Office of Security files of any connection between Bechtel Corporation or Bechtel-McCone Corporation and Hayes International Corporation.

SUBJECT : Paul Hellmuth

1. Subject, a managing partner of Hale and Orr, Boston, Massachusetts, was the president of Anderson Security Consultants, Inc. (ASCI), an Office of Security proprietary which has been liquidated. He has been so identified in the press except that the company was cited as a CIA front.

2. During a telephonic briefing on 25 September 1975 and a personal briefing on 26 September 1975, Mr. Hellmuth was advised that the records of ASCI and other companies and foundations (which were identified to him) in which he was involved would be made available to the Senate Select Committee in response to a specific request. During the meeting, Mr. Hellmuth stated that he was a Boston University Trustee and has learned that the new general editor of the Boston University News, name unknown, had worked with news columnist Jack Anderson, and he anticipates seeing an article in the Boston University News soon. This article will probably state that he, a University Trustee, and his law firm of Hale and Orr are connected with CIA and CIA's influence through him extends to the campus. He also mentioned that his partner, James St. Clair, will be accused in the article of being CIA and CIA's influence through St. Clair extends into the White House.

1. SUBJ A MANAGING PARTNER OF HALE AND DORR, 28 STATE STREET, BOSTON, MA, TELE: 742-9100. WAS THE PRESIDENT OF ANDERSON SECURITY CONSULTANTS, AN OFFICE OF SECURITY PROPRIETARY WHICH HAS BEEN LIQUIDATED. ON 25 SEPT 75, MICHAEL SHORTLEY TELEPHONICALLY ADVISED HIM THAT THE SENATE SELECT COMMITTEE HAD SUBPOENAED RECORDS WHICH INCLUDE THOSE RELATING TO ANDERSON SECURITY CONSULTANTS. HE WAS ALSO TOLD THAT THESE RECORDS WILL BE REVIEWED BY THE SENATE STAFF IN THE AGENCY'S HDQS BLDG. LASTLY, HE WAS TOLD THAT AN AGENCY REP WILL CONTACT HIM WITH FURTHER DETAILS.

2. ACCORDINGLY, THE SAC OR ASAC, BFO, SHOULD TELEPHONE HIM, REFER TO M.J. SHORTLEY'S CALL OF 25 SEPT AND SET UP APPT TO VISIT HIM FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING ADDITIONAL DETAILS.

3. AT THE MEETING, SAC OR ASAC SHOULD ADVISE HIM THAT IN VIEW OF THE SUBPOENA, WE HAD NO CHOICE BUT TO PERMIT REVIEW AT THE HDQS BLDG OF ALL ANDERSON RECORDS INCLUDING THOSE RELATING TO HIM. IN ADDITION, THE SENATE STAFF WILL REVIEW OUR FILES ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE INDEPENDENCE FOUNDATION AND THE J. FREDERICK BROWN FOUNDATION CONSISTING OF MEMORANDA FOR THE RECORD OF MEETINGS WITH MR. 1. Subject, who is 62 years old, has been associated with the Agency and predecessor organization since 1944. She is married to William Joseph Hood, OS# 23 479, who was Chief of Operations with CI Staff, Grade GS-17, at the time of his retirement from the Agency on 31 December 1974.

2. The Subject was of past security concern to the Agency because her brother, Daniel Boone Dodson was security disapproved in February 1946 because of information on his in-laws. Daniel's wife was Judith Ware Dodson, the daughter of Harold M. Ware and Clarissa Smith Ware, both deceased, who were one-time members of the Communist Party. Judith Ware Dodson is the stepdaughter of John J. Abt and Jessica Smith Ware Abt, both of whom were prominent in Communist Party activities. Judith Ware Dodson is the granddaughter of the late Ella Reeve ("Mother") Bloor, who was one of the leading members of the Communist Party, U. S. A.

3. The information regarding Subject's brother was resolved in Subject's favor by polygraph in 1948 and was reaffirmed by polygraph in 1955.

4. Subject's employment is as follows:

a. May 1944 -- Security approved for employment with OSS.

b. Resigned in February 1951 to accompany her husband to Vienna, Austria.

c. October 1951 -- Security approved as a Staff Employee with assignment in Vienna.

d. Went on leave without pay for three months in mid-1955.

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e. Resigned in September 1957 to accompany her husband to Munich, Germany. Subject was approved in 1957 for contract employment in Germany.

f. 27 November 1962 -- Was approved for conversion from Contract to Staff Employee status as a GS-14 Operations Officer, SR Division.

g. 11 February 1965 -- Converted to Contract Type A status for use in Bern, Switzerland.

h. 31 October 1968 -- Retired in the field.

i. 7 March 1972 -- Security approved as a Contract Type A Independent Contractor on Project MHVICAR.

j. 21 November 1973 -- Security approved for Contract Type I employment to prepare a history of the Swiss Station.

k. 30 October 1974 -- Approved through Top Secret with access to Headquarters building for a six-month period to do a sensitive case analysis for the Chief, Counterintelligence.

l. 30 April 1975 -- The clearance to do the sensitive case analysis for the Chief, Counterintelligence, was extended for six more months.

5. The Subject was favorably investigated for Office of Security employment in 1944. A reinvestigation of Subject was ordered by "Helms" in 1946 because of information on Subject's brother. This investigation was favorable and Mr. Helms determined that Subject's security approval would remain in effect.

6. Subject was personally interviewed by Colonel Edwards and Mr. Bannerman on 16 November 1948 relative to the degree of her association with her in-laws. There was no indication that Subject was closely associated with the in-laws or that Subject had been adversely influenced by their liberal or leftist tendencies. Her statements regarding the in-laws were verified by polygraph examination on 16 November 1948 with favorable results.

7. A favorable background investigation of Subject was completed in 1949. An extensive polygraph of Subject was conducted on 7 October 1955, and Subject's association with her brother and his in-laws was satisfactorily resolved to the Office of Security's satisfaction. Attached as Tab A is a copy of the 7 October 1955 polygraph of Subject.

8. Subject's husband was last reinvestigated in July 1969. This reinvestigation included neighborhood coverage, however, none of the neighbors appeared to know Subject's husband. National Agency Checks only were completed on Subject in April 1969.

9. In connection with Subject's current use by Counter-intelligence, an up-to-date Personal History Statement was requested for Subject. An up-to-date PHS dated 16 May 1975 has been received and consideration is being given to bringing Subject's investigation up-to-date.

IDENTIFYING DATA

Subject of this report is a forty-two year old married woman who has been on duty with this Agency since its inception and is currently a GS-13 assigned to EE/A.

PROCEDURE

Subject was afforded a security interview by this examiner using the detection of deception technique on 5 October 1955 between the hours of 10:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. The case was in the nature of an Overseas Returnee. The test was divided into two (2) phases; Phase I consisted of questions pertaining to Communism and Foreign Intelligence; Phase II contained questions regarding falsification of Personal History Statement, security indiscretions and vulnerability to blackmail.

SYNOPSIS

Information regarding Subject's association with her brother and his wife, Judith Ware DODSON, and also information in regard to Subject's associates while in Reed College.

DETAILS (NOTEWORTHY INFORMATION)

1. During the prepolygraph interview, Subject's background and her association with her brother and his wife was discussed. Subject was asked if there was anything she wished to report to Mr. Bannerman concerning her brother and his wife since she returned from overseas. Subject stated that the following information may be of interest to Mr. Bannerman.
2. Since the return of Subject from her Austrian post she has seen her brother and his wife at their residence in Sparkill, New York for a period of about six hours after disembarkation. Subject stated that during this short visit nothing but purely personal family matters were discussed.
3. Subject said that during the course of conversation she gathered that her brother and his wife had visited John ABT (NR-IRB)

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and his wife, Jessica Smith ABT (NR-IRB), last summer in Connecticut where ABT owns a home. Subject also said that she gathered that ABT was having financial difficulties. (The wife of Subject's brother, Judith Ware DODSON (NR-IRB), is the step-daughter of John ABT and Jessica Smith Ware ABT.)

4. Subject stated further that when she visited her sister, Mrs. FISHER, who lives in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, she asked her if their brother and his wife were seeing much of John ABT and his wife. Subject's sister told her that she was under the impression that ABT and his wife were purposely not seeing much of Subject's brother because they did not want Subject's brother to have any difficulties at Columbia University because of association with them.

5. Subject also stated that she thinks she has convinced her brother and his wife that she has resigned from CIA and is now working for Army S-3 in Vienna which was Subject's cover. She added that she does not know how long this story will hold up. Subject also stated that she has found out that "Mother" Ella Reeves BLOOR died recently.

6. While discussing Subject's stay at Reed College, both as a student and a member of the faculty, Subject stated that there were some individuals there that had definite left-wing tendencies. Subject said that she naturally does not recall all the names of these individuals since she was not that closely associated with them. However, Subject did recall several names, specifically, a Paula SMITH (NR-IRB) and a Lloyd REYNOLDS (NR-IRB).

7. Subject recalled Paula SMITH because they were both students and studied in the library together in preparation for a thesis. According to Subject, Paula SMITH had left-wing tendencies and probably became a member of the Communist Party after marriage. Subject does not recall the last name of Paula SMITH's husband but said his first name was Tommy. Subject also stated that Tommy may have been a card bearing Communist while he was at Reed College. Subject added that her only association with Paula SMITH and her husband Tommy was on a student basis and that she has had no contact with them since 1941.

8. In regard to Lloyd REYNOLDS, Subject said that he was a member of the Reed faculty approximately during the period of 1931-1941 and may still be at Reed College. Subject knew Mr. REYNOLDS only casually by virtue of her connection with the faculty at Reed College. She stated that it was rumored at Reed College that REYNOLDS was active in the Spanish Civil War activities. She said that as she looks back on it now in retrospect, REYNOLDS was definitely involved in some Communist Front activities on the campus of Reed College. Subject stated that in regard to herself she has never knowingly

belonged to any Communist organizations nor has she ever knowingly participated in any type of Communist activities.

9. During the polygraph testing, in addition to routine questions, the following specific questions were asked.

17(B). Other than you mentioned, do you know of anyone participating in Communist activity at Reed College?
Answer: No.

18(A). Did you participate in any Communist activity at Reed College?
Answer: No.

19(B). Are you now sympathetic to Soviet Communism?
Answer: No.

20. Other than you mentioned, are you now personally acquainted with anyone whom you believe to be sympathetic to Communism?
Answer: No.

20(A). Other than you mentioned, have you ever had close association with anyone sympathetic to Communism?
Answer: No.

20(B). Do you now have any association with anyone sympathetic to Communism?
Answer: No.

21(A). Are you withholding from me anyone you believe to be sympathetic to Communism?
Answer: No.

10. Subject's charts reflected no significant responses indicative of deception in regard to the above specific questions. Based on Subject's polygraph charts it is the opinion of the examiner that Subject has been substantially truthful in answering all questions asked during polygraph testing.

11. Subject was very cooperative during the interview and displayed a willingness to cooperate in every way. She never showed any animosity or annoyance and answered all questions asked of her in a straightforward and sincere manner completely devoid of any hesitation or avoidance of the issue at hand.

SUBJECT: Appearance Before the Senate Select Committee

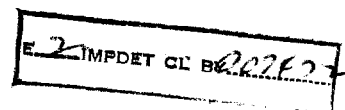
1. On 29 September 1975, I appeared before Mr. Eric (Erik) Richards of the Senate Select Committee and a Court Stenographer to give sworn testimony.

1. Attached is a memorandum for the record (Tab A) dated 25 September 1975, prepared by Mr. Ervan Kuhnke, Jr., of the Office of Security concerning interviews of Mr. Kuhnke and Mrs. Mabel Hoover, also of the Office of Security, by members of the Senate Select Committee Staff on 25 September 1975. The topic of the interviews included the nature of name checks conducted by CIA at the National Security Agency.

2. In reference to the statement in paragraph four by Mrs. Hoover that she had conducted name checks at the National Security Agency on Mr. George C. Wallace, Governor of Alabama, and Mr. Ramsey Clark, former Attorney General, attached (Tab B) is a 26 September 1975 memorandum containing the results of a check of Office of Security indices regarding both individuals. The check disclosed no information that the Office of Security had initiated a National Security Agency check or ever received the results of a National Security Agency check on either individual.

SUBJECT: Senate Select Committee

1. This will record some observations concerning the interview of the undersigned and Mrs. Mabel Hoover by Mr. Eric Richard of the Senate Select Committee Staff from 1000 hours to 1130 hours on this date at the Dirksen Building.

2. Mr. Richard indicated that he had been interviewing NSA employees, and he ascertained that CIA had, for years, direct access to NSA files; and, therefore, he desired to question Mrs. Hoover concerning her use of NSA files.

3. Mr. Richard concentrated on our conducting name checks of American citizens at NSA. In this connection, he asked direct questions of Mrs. Hoover if she recalled checking on such individuals as Frank Church, Otis Pike, Stokley Carmichael, Ramsey Clark, George Wallace, George McGovern, Richard Nixon, and a number of civil rights leaders including Dr. Spock, Cora Weiss, Whitney Young, and Henry Sloan Coffin.

4. Mrs. Hoover advised that she did name checks on Clark and Wallace, and that she did not recall when she conducted these checks but that it was during the time that Ramsey Clark was Attorney General and George Wallace was Governor of Alabama. In response to questions, she advised that she did not know why these checks were conducted. Mr. Richard then asked me if I knew why these checks were conducted. I answered that I did not, but that there was a possibility that these gentlemen may have been a candidate for special briefing; similar to the one he had received when he was given access to codeword information.

5. Mrs. Hoover stated that she did not recall ever receiving a request for checks on Senator Frank Church or Congressman Pike or any other Congressmen or Senators.

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6. In response to direct questioning, Mrs. Hoover stated that she does recall conducting checks on Carmichael. She stated that she did not know why such checks were requested and did not remember when they were made. Mr. Richard asked me if I knew why they were conducted, and I informed him that I did not know that such checks were conducted. Mr. Richard then asked me why we would conduct checks on such individuals, because Carmichael certainly would not have been an applicant with CIA. I advised Mr. Richard that we may have conducted such checks because his name may have come up in connection with an investigation of some foreigner of interest in an operational capacity or to corroborate reports or allegations that he may have had some connection with a foreigner that was of interest to this Agency.

7. Mr. Richard asked Mrs. Hoover if she had ever checked the NSA files on certain civil rights and other American organizations. He identified a number of them and in/case, with one exception, Mrs. Hoover did not recall making any checks. Included in these organizations were such groups as Women Strike for Peace, and several Vietnam anti-war organizations, etc. Mrs. Hoover stated that she recalled checking on CORE, inasmuch as she received a request indicating that a person was alleged to have been a member of CORE and was asked if she could confirm that information in NSA files.

8. Mr. Richard was advised by the undersigned that it was our policy not to conduct extensive checks of Americans at NSA because of the limited information that NSA had on Americans. At this point, both Mrs. Hoover and the undersigned were asked if we conducted checks on Americans for Operation CHAOS; we both responded that we did not, to the best of our knowledge. We were then asked if we received requests for checks from either Mr. Angleton or Richard Ober. We both replied that we did not recall having received any direct request from either of these two gentlemen. I was then asked if I had any dealings with either of these two gentlemen at any time. I responded that I had, in connection with the previous assignment, received requests for security clearances over the signature of Mr. Richard Ober; Mr. Richard did not pursue the question further.

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9. Mr. Richard asked Mrs. Hoover if she knew what Project MINUET (phonetic) was and if she had ever had anything to do with that project; Mrs. Hoover replied in the negative. Rather than let Mr. Richard ask me that question, I then asked Mr. Richard what Project MINUET was, and he informed me that it was an NSA classified project. In this same vein, Mr. Richard asked Mrs. Hoover if she had access to or had ever contributed to the NSA Watch List. She replied that on one occasion she had access to such a list.

10. Mr. Richard informed me that he was also aware of the fact that NSA offered some of their file holdings on American citizens to the Agency, and that we did not accept them. Mr. Richard asked why we did not accept these files on Americans; Mrs. Hoover responded that she did not think that the Agency had space for them. I responded that that was the reason given but that the main reason was that we did not think that the files offered to us were of any value to us because the information was old, was fragmentary in nature, and frequently was not properly sourced; and, therefore, was of little value from an investigative standpoint.

11. In conclusion, Mr. Richard asked if we ever disseminated information obtained from NSA; we both informed him that we did not, that it was strictly against Agency policy to do so. At this point, Mr. Richard asked who else had access to NSA files. I objected to this question, inasmuch as I thought that it was not proper for us to reply, and Mr. Richard withdrew same after Mrs. Hoover responded that she was only aware that the Air Force had a representative at NSA.

12. It is believed that the foregoing covers the significant areas of interest covered by the interview.



1. Reference is made to your verbal request to the Chief, Security Analysis Group, that a search of the Office of Security indices be conducted to determine if National Security Agency (NSA) checks were ever conducted on the above subjects.

2. A search of the Office of Security indices failed to disclose any subject file in the name of George C. Wallace, present Governor of Alabama.

3. The Office of Security does maintain a subject file relating to Ramsey Clark (SF#449 197), the former U.S. Attorney General. Cited file does not contain any indication that the Office of Security had conducted an NSA check on Mr. Clark. The file reflects that Mr. Clark, by virtue of his position as Assistant Attorney General, was approved for liaison with the Agency through "Top Secret" in March 1961. In 1966 when Mr. Clark became the U.S. Attorney General, he was also cleared for "SI, TKH, and Byeman Special." In connection with Mr. Clark's special clearances, the Office of Security did review the file maintained on Mr. Clark in the White House. There are no indications, however, that the Office of Security had conducted an investigation concerning Mr. Clark, and his file consists primarily of newspaper and/or magazine articles.




Dear Walt:

A press aide to former Senator Eugene McCarthy has written the Select Committee concerning an alleged plot to assassinate the Senator in 1968. According to information provided the Select Committee, a man named James Hudson of San Marcos, Texas, who claimed to be an agent of the CIA attempted to recruit a George Edward Langston in June, 1968, to participate in this plot. Langston, now deceased, claimed Hudson said the CIA was backing the plot.

Al Senia of the "New Times," a weekly newspaper published in Tempe, Arizona wrote in the October 22, 1975 issue that he contacted a CIA spokesman who refused to comment on the story and refused to confirm or deny the claim of Hudson's link to the Agency. While the Agency's response to Mr. Senia is understandable, we feel it necessary to check on Mr. Hudson's status in order to prepare a response to Senator McCarthy's office.

Please advise us whether the Agency possesses any information about any link between a James Hudson of San Marcos and the Agency.

1. Reference is made to your request of 16 March 1976 for information concerning the Agency's relationships with the Howard R. Hughes organizations. It is understood that this information is to be used in preparing a briefing for the DCI.

2. The files of this Office reflect that various companies connected with the Howard R. Hughes organizations have been used by this Agency over the past 25 years. The best summary concerning these connections is contained in a draft summary previously prepared by your Office on 25 March 1975. A copy of this summary is enclosed for your convenience. The various components of the Agency mentioned in the draft summary would have the most accurate information concerning the details of these uses of the Hughes organizations.

3. With reference to page four of the draft summary, it should be noted that the Office of Security is currently using Hughes Aircraft Corporation as a covert funding channel for MHBOUND/3. To date \$536,000 have been funded through Hughes Aircraft Corporation, with a remaining balance of \$20,000. This balance will be withdrawn prior to 30 June 1976, since MHBOUND/3 will have been dissolved by that date.

The Central Intelligence Agency has established and maintained a wide range of contacts and relationships with enterprises and persons associated with Howard R. Hughes over a period of more than 25 years. Various Hughes enterprises, in particular the Hughes Aircraft Company, have been awarded numerous commercial contracts for external analysis support and for research, design, and development of specific projects or equipment; Hughes enterprises have cooperated with the Agency in the placement of several Agency officers in cover positions overseas; one Hughes company currently serves as a covert funding channel for an Agency proprietary office; and many employees of Hughes enterprises have cooperated with the Agency's Domestic Collection Division (and its predecessor organizations) by providing intelligence on foreign economic, technical, and political matters, and on foreign personalities of interest to CIA. In addition, Hughes companies -- like many other U. S. industrial installations -- are frequently visited by CIA analysts for general orientation and for updating on the state of the art in the company's specialty.

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Commercial Contracts

Certain of Hughes' enterprises have had contract arrangements with CIA since about 1950. The Hughes Aircraft Corporation, for example, has averaged over a million dollars per year in business dealings with the Agency since at least 1953. During the period 1970-1975, Hughes Aircraft was awarded some 53 contracts concerned with external analysis support and with research, design and development. Some of the tasks have included analysis of Soviet Air Defense Systems; studies on microwave transistors, radar signatures, and laser communications; updating a collection site; designing a telemetry analysis display system; and a few other sensitive projects. At present 19 of the 53 contracts are active; work on the other 34 has been completed. The 53 contracts represent a total of some 8.06 million dollars.

CIA also has or has had contractual arrangements with several other Hughes enterprises, such as the Hughes Tool Company (now the Summa Corporation), Hughes Research Laboratories, Hughes International, and subsidiaries or branches of these entities. Contracts have been placed with these companies largely on the basis of competitive bidding; in some instances Hughes company bids have been rejected and contracts placed with other companies.

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Placement of Agency officers in cover positions

Hughes enterprises have cooperated with the Agency in placing a number of CIA officers under cover in overseas locations. (How many, precisely?)

Cover Funding

Since 1967, Hughes Aircraft Corporation has served as a covert funding channel for MHBOUND/3, a proprietary entity of CIA's Office of Security. OS made arrangements for MHBOUND/3 with a number of private companies, including Hughes A/C. The companies contracted for "security services" and paid the Agency proprietary on a monthly basis. The Agency reimbursed them on a quarterly basis for those payments.

4
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DCD Contracts

The Domestic Collection Division (and its predecessor organizations) has had close and continuing relationships with Hughes Tool Company (now Summa Corporation) and the Hughes Aircraft Company since 1948. Both companies have been completely cooperative, and they have supplied a wealth of information over the years. Since 1948, DCD has contacted over 250 individuals in the HAC Corporation and about 100 in Hughes Tool Company.

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Other

Hughes enterprises now employ or have in the past employed at least three former CIA employees. Dr. Albert D. Wheelon, now a Vice President of the Hughes Aircraft Corporation, served from 4 June 1962 until 5 August 1963 as the Assistant Director for Scientific Intelligence, then an office within the Directorate of Intelligence. While in this position he also served as Chairman of the Guided Missiles and Astronautics Intelligence Committee of the U. S. Intelligence Board. From 5 August 1963 until 23 September 1966, Dr. Wheelon was Deputy Director for Science and Technology. Upon leaving the Agency in 1966 he became a Vice President for Engineering of Hughes Aircraft. Since that time he has become Senior Group Executive in charge of Hughes work in the space field. Prior to coming to the Agency Dr. Wheelon had not been associated with Hughes Aircraft. After joining Hughes, he continued with the Agency as a consultant for several years; his association during that period was limited and the consultant relationship has been terminated.

Mr. Peter Maheu and his wife were at one time CIA employees. Mr. Maheu's father, Robert A. Maheu, was associated with Hughes until 1971. Robert Maheu was also a long-time contact of this Agency (see separate report on Robert A. Maheu Associates). Peter Maheu left the Agency in 1964. Peter Maheu currently works for his father.

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In addition, the External Employment Affairs Branch, Retirement Affairs Division, Office of Personnel, has on occasion put retired or retiring CIA employees in contact with Hughes enterprises for possible employment after retirement from CIA. This activity is entirely separate from the placing of CIA officers in cover positions. It is limited to setting up contact between the company and the employee immediately before or after retirement; the rest is up to the individual and the company involved.

CIA has from time to time hired certain Hughes employees as consultants.

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Agency Records on Hughes Enterprises and Personnel

CIA maintains records on its associations with Hughes enterprises and personnel for routine administrative and records purposes. These include records of contracts awarded, security files on personnel associated with the contracts, contact records of the Domestic Collection Division, and records of any other contacts or proposed contacts. Such records are entirely routine; they are the same kinds of records that the Agency maintains on any company or individual with which it has associations.

Robert R. Mullen & Co.

The Agency's association with Hughes enterprises is in no way connected with the relationship which existed between Hughes enterprises and Robert R. Mullen and Company. Mr. Robert F. Bennett had been associated with Hughes enterprises prior to his joining Mullen and Company. No Agency business with Hughes enterprises was channeled through Mullen and Company, although the Agency had a separate and on-going relationship with Mullen and Company.

1. This memorandum is for information in response to your inquiry concerning the issuance of alias driver's licenses to former Agency staff employee Mr. E. Howard Hunt.

2. A review of Mr. Hunt's Security file fails to reflect any information which would indicate he had been furnished alias documentation subsequent to his retirement from this Agency in April 1970.

3. Mr. Hunt's file reflects that while employed by the Central Intelligence Agency he utilized two (2) aliases. These were: "Hugh W. Newstead" which was assigned for use with a Post Office Box on 9 December 1949, cancelled 12 November 1953, reactivated 4 March 1954 and retired/cancelled on 30 April 1970. The second alias "Edward J. Hamilton" was assigned 20 September 1960 and retired/cancelled 30 April 1970.


4. The file contained several memoranda which reflected the results of checks made of both Office of Technical Service and Office of Security records relative to the issuance of alias documentation to Mr. Hunt. The OTS records apparently indicated that alias documents, type not identified, were issued to one "Hamilton" on two occasions during the period 1957-1964. The memoranda further indicated that information had been developed from Security records which reflected that Mr. Hunt was to have been issued a non-backstopped Massachusetts Driver's License with a Providence, Rhode Island address, together with a Social Security Card and insurance policy, also non-backstopped. When or whether these

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documents were actually issued Mr. Hunt is unknown.
A memorandum, dated 26 January 1970, reflects that Mr. Hunt
was furnished a backstopped District of Columbia Driver's
License in 1960 in the name of Edward J. Hamilton.

1. Reference is made to Review Staff memorandum 76-0217/a dated 13 February 1976 which contains a request from the Senate Select Committee concerning the use of chemical agents against HYSAGE. The files of the Office of Security have been reviewed and disclosed the following information:

HYSAGE has been of operational interest to DDO/Latin America Division and DDO/Counterintelligence Staff since December 1963. There is nothing in Office of Security files which would indicate that chemical agents were used against HYSAGE at any time.

2. For your information, HYSAGE is also known in the Office of Security under the cryptonym of PARAGON. In May 1971 PARAGON reported that a plot existed to assassinate the then Director of Central Intelligence, Mr. Richard Helms. At the request of Mr. Richard Ober of the Counterintelligence Staff, the Office of Security conducted an extensive investigation in 1971 and 1972 concerning this allegation. This investigation included polygraph examinations of PARAGON in September 1971 and October 1972, but as stated above no chemical agents were used at any time. The investigation and polygraph examinations resulted in the conclusion that PARAGON's allegations were largely fabrications and the case was considered closed. The Office of Security has had no further involvement with PARAGON since that time.

SUBJECT : Access to Information in Files of Inspector General

1. There has been some problem in controlling the files in my office. We intend to provide a reference service with the files developed in our office in the course of the investigations, and have gone to considerable time and expense to organize and index them for ready retrieval on request. On occasion persons not known by or identified to OIG personnel have sought information from the files. Some persons who have become familiar with the files have felt free to go into them directly as though they were their own, and to withdraw and hold them. These experiences make it necessary to establish rules for access to information in the files and for their physical control.

2. Our staff has been instructed to provide information only to members of the Review Staff, and personnel assigned to the offices of the DDS&T, DDO, General Counsel, Legislative Counsel and Security who are known to be working on the investigation. No files are to be released on loan without explicit permission of me or my deputy.

3. It would be appreciated if those assigned to this work are advised of these controls. It would assist us if we had lists of those who might have occasion to levy requests on us for information in the files.

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This disclosure occurred between CIA and IRS between November 1957 and April 1972. There is no evidence that any of these disclosures were made based upon written authorization. Written authorization has been required by regulation during all relevant periods.

The requests for the information were made in two categories of cases:

A. The counter-intelligence type investigations where evidence indicates that individuals associated with the Agency might have been recruited by a foreign intelligence service and where it becomes necessary to determine the amount and/or source of any income the individual might be receiving.

B. Those cases where an individual occupying a position of trust and responsibility within the Agency was suspected of misusing the trust to his own financial or personal advantage.

These criteria were contained in a memorandum dated June 17, 1975 from Charles W. Kane, Director of Security, CIA, to the IRS.

There is no documentation in IRS files that the CIA gave the specific reason for their requests at the time the requests were made, since any such requests were apparently oral.

In most of these requests, there is no documentation as to any discussions which may have transpired between any specific IRS employee and the CIA. These requests were apparently made through a liaison relationship which existed between the IRS and CIA.

One former IRS employee does recall transmitting information to the CIA but does not recall if he had specific authorization to do so.

In one case, that of Mr. Victor Marchetti, he has given his permission to publicly release the information furnished by the IRS to the CIA. This information, obtained in April 1972 through the CIA's request for information from Marchetti's individual tax return for the years 1964 through 1971, is contained in a memorandum supplied by the CIA which was written contemporaneously to their receipt of such tax information.

Because the investigation of these disclosures is still under investigation by IRS Inspection, the committee and IRS have agreed to restrict the publication of the results of the investigation in detail and to withhold names in the interest of the privacy of the persons who were the subjects of the request.

Pursuant to our conversations on 13 June 1975, the following information is provided in regard to those instances where the Central Intelligence Agency's Office of Security has obtained federal tax information from the Internal Revenue Service.

Attached hereto as Tabs A through K are copies of the pertinent portions of Office of Security investigative reports and/or memoranda, which pertain to each of those instances where IRS information has been obtained. However, it should be noted that in many of these cases the information contained in these reports is quite limited and does not reflect the extent to which the IRS tax records had been made available.

Further, there is a discrepancy in the number of cases where the Agency has received federal tax information concerning an individual or firm as indicated in the report prepared by the Presidential Commission to Investigate the Central Intelligence Agency. Due to a typographical error on a summary chart provided by the Agency to the Presidential Commission, which numerically listed the entire spectrum of cases of "Alleged Illegal Domestic Activities," two cases were listed on the chart as "IRS reviews," when in fact they should have been listed under the "mail covers" section of that chart. As a result, there are actually only fourteen (14) instances, as opposed to the sixteen (16) reported by the Presidential Commission. In addition, the fourteen IRS reviews occurred

during the Office of Security's investigation of only nine (9) cases, which in some instances had involved the investigation of more than one individual.

All of the cases where the Office of Security has received information from the IRS are considered extremely sensitive, and in all such cases prior approval to initiate contact with IRS officials had been received from senior Agency officials. At no time has an Office of Security employee been allowed to independently seek to obtain IRS information without prior Headquarters approval. In general, cases where the Agency has deemed it necessary to obtain IRS tax information can be divided into two categories:

a. The counterintelligence type of investigation, where evidence indicates that an individual associated with the Agency might have been recruited by a foreign intelligence service and where it becomes necessary to determine the amounts and/or source of any income the individual might be receiving.

b. Those cases where an individual occupying a position of trust and responsibility with the Agency was suspected of misusing the trust to his own financial or personal advantage.

With specific reference to your request that the identity of the Office of Security's contacts within IRS be furnished, the following consists of all available information concerning those IRS officials with whom Office of Security employees were in contact. Further, where the identity of the IRS official cannot be determined, the identity of the Office of Security employee who reviewed the IRS records is provided where known.

Tab A - BLUM, Robert I.

Information relating to Robert I. Blum's tax records for the years 1953 through 1958 was obtained by representatives of the Office of Security's San Francisco Field Office on 18 December 1959 and 5 January 1960. As indicated in Tab A, the IRS official who provided the information is identified.

Mr. Robert Leonard, the then Acting Chief of the Regional Inspector's Office, Internal Revenue Service, San Francisco, California.

Tab B - CORSO, Philip James

Very limited information relating to Philip James Corso's federal tax records for the years 1969 and 1970 appears to have been obtained circa July 1971. As indicated in Tab B, the Office of Security files contain very little information concerning the review of Mr. Corso's tax records and do not identify the IRS official who provided the tax information. Although not specifically indicated in Tab B, it would appear from the Office of Security file relating to Mr. Corso that the Office of Security employee who obtained the information was Mr. Ralph O. True, who formerly served as the Chief, Special Activities Division. Mr. True is now retired and last resided at 7816 Falstaff Road, McLean, Virginia 22101.

Tab C - CUBERO, Clifford Arcadio

Information concerning the federal tax records of Clifford Arcadio Cubero, including that of his parents, for the tax year 1968 was obtained by the Office of Security's San Francisco Field Office circa 12-19 August 1969. The Cubero file does not reflect the identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information nor does it specify whether the tax information was obtained through the San Francisco, California, or Honolulu, Hawaii, Internal Revenue Service offices. The Office of Security employee who appears to have reviewed the tax information is Franklin R. Geraty, a current Agency employee who is assigned to the San Francisco Field Office. Since Mr. Geraty is a current Office of Security employee who is under cover, any contact with him should be coordinated with this Office.

Tab D - BUTTS, Roger Crawford

Information concerning Roger Crawford Butts' federal tax records for the "calendar" year 1956 appears to have been obtained circa November 1957. The file pertaining to Mr. Butts

does not reflect the identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information nor can the identity of the Office of Security employee who reviewed the tax records be ascertained. It would appear from the file, however, that cited tax information was obtained from the New York City, New York Internal Revenue Service office.

Tab E - GARBLER, Paul

Information concerning the federal tax records of Paul Garbler for the years 1962 and 1963 appears to have been obtained circa April-June 1965. The identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information is not contained in the Garbler file. It would appear, however, that Mr. John Salb, a former Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Office of Security's Washington Field Office, had obtained the tax information. Mr. Salb, now retired, last resided at 6400 Inwood Street, Chevy Chase, Maryland 20785.

Tab F - MARCHETTI, Victor

Information concerning the federal tax records of Victor Marchetti for the years 1964 through 1971 was obtained on 5 April 1972. Neither the identity of the IRS official who provided the information nor the identity of the Agency employee who obtained the information are contained in the Marchetti files. It is likely, however, in view of the time period during which the tax information was obtained, that Mr. Ralph True, previously identified under (b) above, had obtained the tax information.

Tab G - BROWNE, Jerome, Jr.

Mr. Ralph True, a former Agency employee identified above under (b), attempted to review Mr. Jerome Browne, Jr.'s tax records for the years 1962 through 1966. However, upon checking, IRS reported that Mr. Jerome Browne, Jr., had not filed federal income tax forms during that period. Instead, Mr. True

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was allowed to review the federal tax records relating to the individual's father, Mr. Jerome Browne, Sr., for the years 1962 through 1966. It would appear from the pertinent files that the federal tax information had been provided to Mr. True by Mr. Gil Haley, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service, Washington, D.C.

Tab H - Partnership of Butler, Lyons, and Kapusta

Information concerning the 1966 federal tax records relating to the partnership of Butler, Lyons, and Kapusta was received by the Office of Security on 2 April 1969. The Agency employee who reviewed the above IRS information was Mr. Ralph True, previously identified under (b) above. The identity of the IRS official who provided Mr. True with the tax information is not reflected in the pertinent files.

Tab I - LYONS, George - AKA: Rafael Goldfarb

Information concerning the 1969 individual federal tax records relating to George Lyons was received by the Office of Security on 15 March 1971. The Agency employee who reviewed the IRS records was Mr. Ralph True, previously identified, although the identity of the IRS official who provided the information is not contained in the pertinent files.

Tab J - KAPUSTA, Peter

On 18 March 1969, Mr. Ralph True, previously identified, reviewed the 1966 and 1967 individual federal tax records pertaining to Peter Kapusta. The identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information is not reflected in the pertinent files.

Tab K - MILLIGAN, Ellen T.

In connection with the investigation of Ellen T. Milligan, the Office of Security reviewed the federal tax records pertaining to Ellen T. Milligan for the years 1964 through 1966. In addition, the

Office of Security reviewed the federal tax records for the years 1962 through 1967, pertaining to one William Woodson, a paramour of Ellen T. Milligan. Mr. Woodson was then a GS-12/3 tax consultant employed by the Internal Revenue Service. The tax records pertaining to Ellen T. Milligan had been provided to the Agency by Mr. Leon C. Green, Deputy Assistant Commissioner, Compliance, Internal Revenue Service. The tax information pertaining to Mr. Woodson was made available by Mr. Gil Haley, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service. The Office of Security employee who reviewed the information in both cases was Mr. Thomas Tripodi. Mr. Tripodi is no longer employed with the Agency, and his last address is unknown. However, it is believed Mr. Tripodi is now employed by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency.

It should be noted that certain information not germane to the review of federal tax records has been sterilized from tabs A through K. This sterilization has been accomplished primarily to protect the identity of other individuals, such as neighborhood informants or character references, and no information relating to the individuals' tax records has been deleted.

Attached hereto as Tab L is a memorandum prepared by Mr. Ralph O. True on 26 January 1971, which describes a discussion between Mr. True and Mr. John Morrison, of the Agency's Office of General Counsel, concerning Mr. True's liaison with the Internal Revenue Service. As indicated in cited memorandum, Mr. True stated that while his liaison with IRS had not been extensive, any such liaison had been conducted with the knowledge of Mr. Leon Green, the then Deputy Commissioner of IRS. Further, Mr. True stated that all liaison with IRS on his behalf had been at the direction of the Agency's Director of Security.







SUBJECT : Background on Tax Audit of Edward A. Novick
in October 1965

1. The attached memo for the record dated 18 October 1965 from the Assistant General Counsel (Attachment A) explains that Novick was notified by the Falls Church Office of the Richmond District, IRS, of an office audit of his 1963 income tax return.

2. Through cleared contacts in the National Office, IRS, the Agency arranged to transfer his file from Falls Church to the National Office. It was then ascertained that the reason for the audit was because Novick had opened a savings account with \$3,000 cash in the Old Dominion Bank, 4707 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia.

3. The Assistant General Counsel, through discussions with Peter Baranowski and Donald French of SR/CIS, as well as Novick, obtained a reasonable explanation for the deposit. The cash transactions explaining the deposit are described in detail in the attached memo and were designed to break any possible trail between Novick's old and new name.

4. On 15 October 1965 these facts were given to Leon Green, Special Assistant to the Assistant Commissioner Compliance, IRS, who was a cleared contact of the Agency. Mr. Green was not told about Novick's previous names. The facts explaining the deposit satisfied him and the case was closed.

5. Novick's file was to be returned by Mr. Green to the District Director, Richmond, another cleared contact, who was requested to close the case without further action.

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6. The Finance Division and SR/CIS were cautioned about the danger of large cash transactions which often come to the attention of IRS. In May 1965, another large cash payment (\$10,000) was made to Novick which he again deposited in his checking and savings accounts. (Attachment B; See attached memo of 12 October 1965 for deposits of this money.) Mr. Green was advised of these transactions but indicated nothing can or should be done about them at the time. If they come to the attention of IRS, Mr. Green said IRS would handle the case in the same manner through our cleared contacts. The files reflect no further action on this matter.

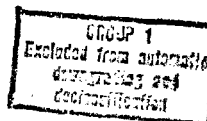
SUBJECT: Edward A. Novick - Federal Tax Audit

1. On 21 September 1965, the Falls Church Office of the Richmond District, IRS, notified subject by letter of an office audit of his 1963 income tax return. Through cleared contacts in the National Office, IRS, we arranged to transfer the file from Falls Church to the National Office. It was then ascertained that this return was selected for audit because information had come to the attention of IRS that on 11 October 1963 subject had opened a savings account in the Old Dominion Bank, 4707 Lee Highway, Arlington, Virginia, with \$3,000 in cash.

2. Through inquiries of subject, discussions with Peter Baranowski and Donald French, of SR/CIS, and examination of Agency financial records, we have gotten a reasonable explanation of the deposit. On 1 October 1963 subject received a \$10,000 award in addition to his normal compensation--\$4,700 of this was in a cashier's check payable to subject, \$1,800 represented tax withholdings, \$1,475 was given to him in cash, and \$2,025 was given to him in "E" Bonds. On 10 September 1963, he had received a \$750 cash advance. Baranowski recalls that in late September 1963 subject closed an account in his former name in the American Security and Trust Company, Washington, D. C., and deposited the cash in the new account in the Old Dominion Bank. The cash transactions were designed to break any possible trail between his old name and his new one.

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3. On 15 October 1965 these facts were given to Leon Green, ✓
Special Assistant to the Assistant Commissioner Compliance, IRS,
who is a cleared contact of this Agency. Mr. Green was not told
subject's previous names. The facts satisfied him and the IRS case
will be closed. The Falls Church Office has no interest in the file
since it was removed from that Office in a routine manner. It
will be returned by Mr. Green to the District Director, Richmond,
another cleared contact who will be requested to close the case
without further action.

4. The Finance Division and SR/CIS have been cautioned of
the danger of substantial cash transactions of this nature which often
come to the attention of IRS. Unfortunately in May 1965, another
large cash payment was made to subject, and he deposited cash to
the following accounts: (a) \$4,000, First and Citizens, Alexandria,
Virginia, checking account; (b) \$2,000, Interstate Building Association,
Washington, D. C., savings; (c) \$2,800, Old Dominion Bank, Arlington,
Virginia, checking and savings accounts. Mr. Green was advised of
these transactions but indicated nothing can or should be done about
them at the present time. If they come to the attention of IRS, we
assume the taxpayer will get in touch with us, and we will handle the
case in the same manner through our cleared contacts.

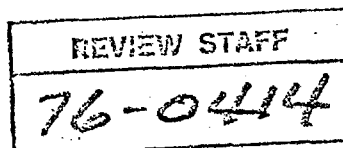

SUBJECT : Marchetti Tax Disclosure

1. Reference is made to previous memoranda which concern the interviews of various current/former Office of Security employees by the Internal Revenue Service, in an attempt to identify the IRS employee who disclosed taxpayer data to the Agency concerning Victor Marchetti.

2. On this date, the undersigned received a telephone call from Mr. Walter Rourke, Internal Security Division, IRS, who advised that on 14 April 1976 he presented the results of his interviews thus far to Mr. Robert Andary, Department of Justice. Mr. Rourke stated he presented these results to Mr. Andary with the recommendation that no further interviews be conducted.

3. According to Mr. Rourke, Mr. Andary observed that Mr. Howard Osborn, former Director of Security, had stated that he had initially requested that the Marchetti taxpayer data be obtained, but could not specifically recall the identity of the individual who obtained the data. Further, Mr. Edmund X. Klipa, former SAC/WFO, had indicated that he was not aware that the Marchetti disclosure had occurred, but that Mr. Klipa had stated that on occasion Mr. Osborn would task WFO employees with special assignments without Mr. Klipa's knowledge.

4. Mr. Andary then asked Mr. Rourke if the next step should involve turning the investigation over to a federal grand jury, to which Mr. Rourke vigorously objected. Mr. Rourke apparently told Mr. Andary that the probability for identifying the IRS individual involved in the Marchetti disclosure appeared minimal, even if further interviews were conducted. Further, Mr. Rourke stated that this is not a typical criminal investigation, in that the information obtained by the Agency would have been legally available had the Agency

requested the data in writing. Mr. Rourke also speculated, and Mr. Andary apparently agreed, that even if the IRS employee responsible for the disclosure is identified, the disposition would probably be administrative in nature, rather than in the form of criminal proceedings.

5. Mr. Rourke stated that Mr. Andary accepted his comments, and has decided to recommend to his supervisors that the case be closed, and that the Department of Justice issue a declination of prosecution in this matter. Mr. Rourke theorized that should Mr. Andary's supervisors fail to accept this recommendation Mr. Rourke may be required to continue his interviews, with primary emphasis on former WFO personnel. Mr. Rourke expects the Department of Justice to make a decision in this regard within the next few days, and said that he will notify the Agency as soon as he hears from Mr. Andary.

SUBJECT : Department of Justice Request
(Review of IRS Records Regarding
Victor Marchetti)

1. Reference is made to our previous discussions concerning a request from Mr. Robert Andary, Department of Justice, to interview certain current/former Office of Security employees in an attempt to identify the IRS employee who provided taxpayer data to the Agency concerning Victor Marchetti.

2. Mr. Andary has been in touch with Mr. Gary Breneman, OGC, and has requested a meeting between the undersigned, Mr. Breneman, an as yet unidentified U.S. Attorney, and Mr. Walter Rourke of the IRS. Mr. Breneman today advised the undersigned that he is attempting to schedule this meeting for Friday, 19 March 1976. Mr. Breneman has discussed this matter with Mr. Warner, General Counsel, and apparently OGC would not object to the interviews, so long as the OS employees do not receive Miranda warnings prior to the interviews.

3. The above is provided for your information, and I will advise your office of any further developments regarding this matter. Based on my discussions with Mr. Breneman, there does not appear to be any possibility of prosecution as it relates to Agency employees, and the Department of Justice is presumably just trying to identify the IRS employee who made Marchetti's taxpayer data available.

SUBJECT : Request for Name Traces for Tax Information

1. Reference is made to your memorandum of 2 December 1975 (OGC 75-4497), which asks that the Office of Security check its records to determine if federal tax information had been requested or obtained from the IRS regarding nine individuals named therein.

2. A search of the Office of Security indices disclosed no evidence that the Agency had requested or obtained IRS tax information regarding any of the nine individuals. Specifically, the search disclosed no record concerning Barbara Denning or Louis Honig, and no identifiable subject files concerning Patricia Griffith, Warren Hinkle III, or Frederick Mitchell.

3. The Office of Security does maintain files on Grace Newman (SF #544 368); Diane Bevel (SF #541 198); Edward M. Keating (SF #499 115); Joseph Ippolito (SF #261 479); Dr. Wallace Chan (SF #74 519); and Dr. Charles Freeman Geschickter (SF #47 650). However, a review of these files disclosed no indication of any request for or receipt of federal taxpayer information concerning these individuals.

4. It should be noted that the Office of Security files concerning Dr. Gescheckter and Dr. Chan were reviewed by staff members of the Senate Select Committee, and the Committee was then provided with numerous sanitized documents from these files.

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PROPOSED STATEMENT CONCERNING CIA ACCESS
TO INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE TAX RECORDS

As recently disclosed by one of the committees investigating the Central Intelligence Agency, there have been limited instances where the Agency has obtained certain Federal income tax data on an individual or firm. These instances have been few in number and over three years has elapsed since such data was last obtained.

The nature of the Agency's mission requires that it have liaison with the Internal Revenue Service to insure that the correct taxes of its employees of proprietaries are paid with due respect to the dictates of the security and confidentiality of operations. Over the years the Agency has had a close and effective liaison with the Service at the highest level.

Since 1957 we know of only twelve Agency-internal investigations where Federal income tax information was requested or received from the Internal Revenue Service, and all but one of these centered on very sensitive Agency concerns of a counter-intelligence nature. The one exception occurred in 1957 when the Agency sought and obtained Federal tax data on an employee who was suspected of using his position of trust and responsibility for his own financial advantage. In no known instance did the Agency request or receive copies of Federal income tax returns. The Internal Revenue Service generally provided limited information to the Agency verbally or permitted an Agency officer to view tax records and take notes.

The tax data obtained was used solely as an adjunct to the sensitive investigation being conducted. It was not provided to any other Federal agencies and its dissemination within the Agency was tightly controlled and restricted to those individuals directly involved in the investigation.

In all of these instances the Federal tax data obtained would have been available to the Agency under existing statutes and regulations if a request to the Internal Revenue Service had been in writing. However, the sensitivity of each of the investigations coupled with the close liaison relationship between the two agencies caused the information to be sought and provided on an informal basis primarily to protect the identity of the individuals involved.

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(2) The close liaison which OS and OGC had with senior IRS officials enabled the Agency to obtain the required data without the prescribed written requests.

4. Recommendations

a. Because of the ongoing IRS investigation of the disclosure of income tax information to the CIA, it is not considered timely or appropriate for the DCI to make any public comment on this matter, or submit any statement to either of the Select Committees.

b. On the chance that a critical IRS report may be issued, or that a Select Committee may indicate an interest in exploring the matter during a hearing, it is recommended that an unclassified statement be prepared for DCI use. This statement, based in part on the material at Tab, should include:

(1) A summary of the cases involved, with emphasis on their small number and on the legitimacy of the investigations of which access to the IRS data was a part.

(2) An explanation of the use to which the information was put, with emphasis on the propriety of such use in furtherance of the security and counterintelligence mission of the Agency.

(3) Stress on the need for confidentiality in the conduct of CIA business of the Agency is to be an effective organization.

c. If the IRS report should indicate an intent on the part of the IRS to deny future CIA access to information of the type which has previously been made available, it is recommended that OGC be tasked to work out with the IRS an agreement which will meet CIA's legitimate needs for confidential IRS



OUTLINE OF CIA REVIEW OF U.S. INTERNAL
REVENUE SERVICE INCOME TAX RECORDS

I. ALLEGATIONS

- A. The Central Intelligence Agency has obtained U.S. Internal Revenue Service (IRS) income tax information without following proper procedure as outlined within Section 6103 of the Internal Revenue Code.
- B. The CIA has misused IRS tax data to harass individuals, firms, and/or organizations and has influenced the IRS to take certain actions on the CIA's behalf.

II. ISSUES

- A. Has the CIA, or any of its employees, violated Federal statutes pertaining to the disclosure of IRS tax information?
- B. Were the CIA's reviews of federal income tax information improper, or were these reviews justified?

III. SUMMARY

- A. During the period November 1957 through April 1972, the Office of Security obtained IRS income tax information concerning fourteen individuals during the course of ten Office of Security investigations.
 - 1. The number of individuals concerning whom the Office of Security obtained income tax data is subject to variation, in view of the fact that some of the ten investigations involved several individuals (such as parents and associates) as well as one case involving the review of a three-man partnership's tax records.

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2. The above figures include the Office of Security's 1968 review of federal income tax data concerning a former high-ranking Agency employee.
- B. The Office of General Counsel was also in contact with the IRS on two occasions circa 1967 through 1972 which appear relevant to the allegations.
1. The Office of General Counsel obtained certain federal tax information concerning the magazine Ramparts in 1967, based on Ramparts' disclosures of the CIA's relationships with certain tax exempt organizations.
 2. The Office of General Counsel contacted IRS in 1972 concerning Mr. Philip B. F. Agee, in an attempt to determine Mr. Agee's overseas address, although no taxpayer information was obtained in this instance.
- C. All but one of the above cases in which the Office of Security and the Office of General Counsel were in contact with the IRS were of concern to the Agency from a counterintelligence standpoint. The single exception was a 1957 investigation of an Agency employee suspected of misusing his position of trust and responsibility to his own financial gain.
- D. The information obtained from IRS varied with each case.
1. The federal tax information ranged from minimal data (such as an individual's reported yearly income) to rather extensive information indicating that an Agency employee had viewed the IRS tax forms from which copious notes were taken.
 2. In none of the cases referred to above has the Agency obtained copies of federal tax forms.

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IV. COMMENTS

- A. None of the cases above appear to fall into the category of harassment.
- B. The tax information would have been legitimately available to the CIA if requested via the established regulatory procedures.
 - 1. Written requests were apparently not used due to the sensitivity of those cases in which the federal tax data was required.
 - 2. A close liaison relationship existed between the Office of Security, Office of General Counsel, and senior representatives of the IRS, thus enabling the Agency to obtain the required data without the prescribed written requests.
- C. The IRS currently is conducting an extensive investigation into the illegality/impropriety of these disclosures of tax data.
- D. In view of the manner in which the Agency's records are maintained, there is no way to be certain that the cases referred to herein constitute the total number of instances where such disclosures have occurred.
- E. This outline does not address those instances where the Office of General Counsel or other Agency components have engaged in liaison with IRS with regard to such items as covert tax returns and/or cover problems.

SUBJECT: Review of U.S. Internal Revenue Service
Income Tax Information

1. Allegations: The Central Intelligence Agency has obtained U.S. Internal Revenue Service income tax data regarding individuals, firms, and/or organizations without following the prescribed procedures pertaining to the disclosure of such federal tax data as outlined under Section 6103 of the Internal Revenue Code. Further, it is alleged that in some of these instances the Agency used the tax information to harass these individuals, firms, or organizations and influenced the U.S. Internal Revenue Service to take certain actions on the Agency's behalf.

2. Issues: Has the Central Intelligence Agency, or any of its employees, violated Federal statutes pertaining to the illegal disclosure of federal tax information? Was the purpose of the Agency's review of taxpayer information as alleged, or were these reviews properly justified?

3. Summary: During the Rockefeller Commission's inquiry concerning the Agency, all known cases in which the Office of Security had obtained federal income tax data were reported to the Commission. Since the conclusion of the Rockefeller Commission's inquiry, one additional case has been discovered wherein the Office of Security obtained federal tax information concerning a former high-ranking Agency employee. The Office of General Counsel also maintains liaison with the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, and it was found that in one instance it obtained federal tax data concerning a magazine (Ramparts) which was at the time publishing classified information concerning the Agency's relationships with certain tax-exempt organizations. The Office of General Counsel was also in contact with the Internal Revenue Service concerning a former Agency employee (Philip B. F. Agee), who was writing a book containing highly classified Agency information, although no federal income tax information concerning this individual was obtained.

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The Office of Security contacts with the Internal Revenue Service occurred during the period November 1957 through April 1972. It is extremely difficult to affix a numerical figure to the number of instances where federal tax information was obtained in view of the fact that some of these cases involved more than one subject, as well as in one case the review of a three-man partnership. However, the tax information was obtained during the conduct of ten (10) investigations by the Office of Security, all but one of which were of a counterintelligence nature in an attempt to determine if an individual associated with the Agency was receiving money from or recruited by a foreign intelligence service. The exception was a 1957 investigation of an Agency employee suspected of misusing his position of trust and responsibility to his own financial gain. The tax information obtained during the course of the above investigations involves fourteen (14) individuals, although this figure includes parents and/or other individuals who were considered in connection with the ten investigations.

With respect to the two instances referred to which were handled by the Office of General Counsel, it would appear that in the case of the magazine the purpose of the request for federal tax information centered on the suspicion the magazine's activities were being funded by a foreign intelligence service, in view of the nature and extent of the magazine's disclosures. The Office of General Counsel's contact with the Internal Revenue Service concerning the former Agency employee (Mr. Agee) centered on an attempt by the Agency to determine the former employee's overseas address. Although no taxpayer information was obtained in this instance, it would appear that the prime interest in the former Agency employee dealt with the possibility that he had been in contact with a foreign intelligence service.

Thus, all but one of those instances in which the Office of Security and the Office of General Counsel obtained federal tax information were based on sensitive counterintelligence investigations. The information obtained through this liaison with the Internal Revenue Service ranged from very minimal data (such as an individual's reported total income for a given tax year) to rather extensive data, indicating that an Agency employee actually viewed the tax forms from which copious notes were taken. However, in none of these instances does it appear that copies of tax forms were obtained by the Agency.

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4. Comments: None of those cases referred to above would appear to fall into the category of harassment, and all were linked to legitimate concerns by the Agency. The tax information would have been legitimately available to the Agency if requested via the established procedures which govern such disclosures. However, by virtue of the close liaison relationship between the Office of Security, Office of General Counsel, and senior representatives of the Internal Revenue Service, as well as the sensitivity of the cases which predicated the requests for tax data, the Agency was able to obtain the required information without submitting the requests in writing.

At the present time, the Internal Revenue Service is conducting an extensive investigation into the possible illegality/impropriety of these disclosures of federal tax information to the Agency. In this regard the Internal Revenue Service investigators assigned to this task have been briefed concerning each instance outlined above, although in the sensitive case involving the former high-ranking Agency employee an Internal Revenue Service request for written material pertaining to this disclosure is still outstanding.

It should be noted that there is no way to be certain that the cases referred to herein constitute the total number of instances where the Agency has obtained federal tax information as Agency records are not maintained in a manner which would make such incidents retrievable. As a matter of fact, the cases of the high-ranking Agency employee and the magazine were brought to the attention of the Agency by the Internal Revenue Service during a recent review of its own records.

While the above is a general description of the Agency's past activities in obtaining federal income tax data, each of the cases was complex and involved extensive investigative efforts by the Agency. Accordingly, it is difficult to put the request for the federal income tax data in each instance into proper perspective without a rather detailed summary of each case. Further, this memorandum does not address those instances where the Office of General Counsel or other Agency components have engaged in liaison with the Internal Revenue Service with regard to such items as covert tax returns and/or cover problems.



1. Reference is made to a verbal request from Mr. William Grant of The Review Staff that the undersigned meet with Mr. Peter Hughes, House Select Committee Staff, on 7 October 1975 to discuss the Office of Security's relationship with the U.S. Internal Revenue Service.

2. From 1400-1500 hours, 7 October 1975, the undersigned met with Mr. Hughes in the conference room located within The Review Staff. Mr. Hughes was provided with a verbal briefing concerning those instances where the Office of Security has reviewed U.S. Internal Revenue Service tax records concerning individuals and/or firms, as previously reported to the Rockefeller Commission, Senate Select Committee, and the U.S. Internal Revenue Service. In addition, Mr. Hughes was allowed to review the Office of Security's 17 June 1975 letter to the Internal Revenue Service, which outlined those instances where tax records had been reviewed by the Office of Security.

3. Mr. Hughes' primary interests seemed to center on the types of cases in which the Office of Security has reviewed tax records and was informed that such cases would fall into two categories--a counterintelligence investigation or in a case where an Agency employee is suspected of misusing his position with the Agency to his own financial or personal advantage. As stated to Mr. Hughes, all but one of those instances where the Office of Security has reviewed U.S. Internal Revenue Service tax records could be categorized as a counterintelligence investigation.

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4. Mr. Hughes was also interested in determining a firm numerical figure for the number of times the Office of Security has reviewed tax records, and after an explanation of the difficulties in applying a statistical figure to these checks, Mr. Hughes agreed that the figure would fluctuate depending on how one counted each case where tax records had been reviewed. Mr. Hughes asked if there were any additional instances where the Office of Security had reviewed Internal Revenue Service tax records and was advised that one recently discovered case is not contained within the 17 June 1975 letter to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service. Mr. Hughes was advised that this particular case is extremely sensitive and that any release of information concerning this case would have to be obtained from the Director of Central Intelligence. Mr. Hughes then asked if this sensitive case was of a counterintelligence nature and if it occurred within the time frame of those cases previously reported. The undersigned replied in the affirmative to both questions, and Mr. Hughes stated that he required no further information concerning this case.


5. Mr. Hughes took notes during the above interview but did not evidence an interest in the names of the individuals involved in each case. Mr. Hughes' notes primarily consisted of a breakdown of each case as to the dates it occurred; the type of tax information obtained; and the category into which each case would fall. Further, Mr. Hughes stated that for his purposes the identities of the individuals would not be necessary, adding that his primary interest was in determining the circumstances and manner in which the Office of Security had obtained tax information. Mr. Hughes asked how the Office of Security might currently undertake to obtain tax information on an individual and was advised that should such an event occur, it would be handled in full compliance with all existing regulations.

6. Mr. Hughes did not request that the Office of Security furnish him with any documents concerning the review of tax records and seemed satisfied with the information provided verbally. Apparently, Mr. Hughes is also seeking to obtain information from the Office of General Counsel concerning their relationship with the Internal Revenue Service.

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7. The above is provided for your information.

1. Reference is made to a 30 September 1975 request from Mr. Pat Shea, Senate Select Committee Staff, (Review Staff 75-3093) asking that a portion of a 17 June 1975 letter to the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, which was furnished to the Senate Select Committee, be declassified. Cited letter contains information relating to the Office of Security's review of U.S. Internal Revenue Service tax records, and referenced request asks that those portions of the letter relating to the review of Mr. Victor Marchetti's tax records be declassified.

2. Forwarded herewith are three copies of that portion of cited letter pertaining to Mr. Marchetti, which have been declassified. It should be noted that the attached declassified portions of the letter have been rewritten in order to substitute Mr. Marchetti's name in place of an Office of Security cryptonym which referred to the special investigative coverage of Victor Marchetti.

3. Referenced request from Mr. Shea also requests that information which was originally deleted from the 17 June 1975 letter prior to its release to the Senate Select Committee, which appeared in the brief summary describing the review of Mr. Marchetti's tax records, be provided to the Senate Select Committee. As discussed with Mr. Shea on 29 September 1975, the deleted portion dealt with an erroneous speculation identifying the Office of Security employee who might have reviewed Mr. Marchetti's tax records. Mr. Shea agreed that in view of the fact that additional research disclosed that this speculation was incorrect, the deleted portion need not be provided to the Senate Select Committee.

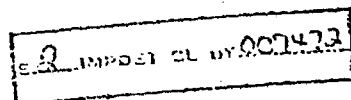

This disclosure occurred between CIA and IRS between November 1957 and April 1972. There is no evidence that any of these disclosures were made based upon written authorization. Written authorization has been required by regulation during all relevant periods.

The requests for the information were made in two categories of cases:

A. The counter-intelligence type investigations where evidence indicates that individuals associated with the Agency might have been recruited by a foreign intelligence service and where it becomes necessary to determine the amount and/or source of any income the individual might be receiving.

B. Those cases where an individual occupying a position of trust and responsibility within the Agency was suspected of misusing the trust to his own financial or personal advantage.

These criteria were contained in a memorandum dated June 17, 1975 from Charles W. Kane, Director of Security, CIA, to the IRS.

There is no documentation in IRS files that the CIA gave the specific reason for their requests at the time the requests were made, since any such requests were apparently oral.

In most of these requests, there is no documentation as to any discussions which may have transpired between any specific IRS employee and the CIA. These requests were apparently made through a liaison relationship which existed between the IRS and CIA.

One former IRS employee does recall transmitting information to the CIA but does not recall if he had specific authorization to do so.

In one case, that of Mr. Victor Marchetti, he has given his permission to publicly release the information furnished by the IRS to the CIA. This information, obtained in April 1972 through the CIA's request for information from Marchetti's individual tax return for the years 1964 through 1971, is contained in a memorandum supplied by the CIA which was written contemporaneously to their receipt of such tax information.

Because the investigation of these disclosures is still under investigation by IRS Inspection, the committee and IRS have agreed to restrict the publication of the results of the investigation in detail and to withhold names in the interest of the privacy of the persons who were the subjects of the request.

Pursuant to our conversations on 13 June 1975, the following information is provided in regard to those instances where the Central Intelligence Agency's Office of Security has obtained federal tax information from the Internal Revenue Service.

Attached hereto as Tabs A through K are copies of the pertinent portions of Office of Security investigative reports and/or memoranda, which pertain to each of those instances where IRS information has been obtained. However, it should be noted that in many of these cases the information contained in these reports is quite limited and does not reflect the extent to which the IRS tax records had been made available.

Further, there is a discrepancy in the number of cases where the Agency has received federal tax information concerning an individual or firm as indicated in the report prepared by the Presidential Commission to Investigate the Central Intelligence Agency. Due to a typographical error on a summary chart provided by the Agency to the Presidential Commission, which numerically listed the entire spectrum of cases of "Alleged Illegal Domestic Activities," two cases were listed on the chart as "IRS reviews," when in fact they should have been listed under the "mail covers" section of that chart. As a result, there are actually only fourteen (14) instances, as opposed to the sixteen (16) reported by the Presidential Commission. In addition, the fourteen IRS reviews occurred

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during the Office of Security's investigation of only nine (9) cases, which in some instances had involved the investigation of more than one individual.

All of the cases where the Office of Security has received information from the IRS are considered extremely sensitive, and in all such cases prior approval to initiate contact with IRS officials had been received from senior Agency officials. At no time has an Office of Security employee been allowed to independently seek to obtain IRS information without prior Headquarters approval. In general, cases where the Agency has deemed it necessary to obtain IRS tax information can be divided into two categories:

a. The counterintelligence type of investigation, where evidence indicates that an individual associated with the Agency might have been recruited by a foreign intelligence service and where it becomes necessary to determine the amounts and/or source of any income the individual might be receiving.

b. Those cases where an individual occupying a position of trust and responsibility with the Agency was suspected of misusing the trust to his own financial or personal advantage.

With specific reference to your request that the identity of the Office of Security's contacts within IRS be furnished, the following consists of all available information concerning those IRS officials with whom Office of Security employees were in contact. Further, where the identity of the IRS official cannot be determined, the identity of the Office of Security employee who reviewed the IRS records is provided where known.

Tab A - BLUM, Robert I.

Information relating to Robert I. Blum's tax records for the years 1953 through 1958 was obtained by representatives of the Office of Security's San Francisco Field Office on 18 December 1959 and 5 January 1960. As indicated in Tab A, the IRS official who provided the information is identified as

Mr. Robert Leonard, the then Acting Chief of the Regional Inspector's Office, Internal Revenue Service, San Francisco, California.

Tab B - CORSO, Philip James

Very limited information relating to Philip James Corso's federal tax records for the years 1969 and 1970 appears to have been obtained circa July 1971. As indicated in Tab B, the Office of Security files contain very little information concerning the review of Mr. Corso's tax records and do not identify the IRS official who provided the tax information. Although not specifically indicated in Tab B, it would appear from the Office of Security file relating to Mr. Corso that the Office of Security employee who obtained the information was Mr. Ralph O. True, who formerly served as the Chief, Special Activities Division. Mr. True is now retired and last resided at 7816 Falstaff Road, McLean, Virginia 22101.

Tab C - CUBERO, Clifford Arcadio

Information concerning the federal tax records of Clifford Arcadio Cubero, including that of his parents, for the tax year 1968 was obtained by the Office of Security's San Francisco Field Office circa 12-19 August 1969. The Cubero file does not reflect the identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information nor does it specify whether the tax information was obtained through the San Francisco, California, or Honolulu, Hawaii, Internal Revenue Service offices. The Office of Security employee who appears to have reviewed the tax information is Franklin R. Geraty, a current Agency employee who is assigned to the San Francisco Field Office. Since Mr. Geraty is a current Office of Security employee who is under cover, any contact with him should be coordinated with this Office.

Tab D - BUTTS, Roger Crawford

Information concerning Roger Crawford Butts' federal tax records for the "calendar" year 1956 appears to have been obtained circa November 1957. The file pertaining to Mr. Butts

does not reflect the identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information nor can the identity of the Office of Security employee who reviewed the tax records be ascertained. It would appear from the file, however, that cited tax information was obtained from the New York City, New York Internal Revenue Service office.

Tab E - GARBLER, Paul

Information concerning the federal tax records of Paul Garbler for the years 1962 and 1963 appears to have been obtained circa April-June 1965. The identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information is not contained in the Garbler file. It would appear, however, that Mr. John Salb, a former Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Office of Security's Washington Field Office, had obtained the tax information. Mr. Salb, now retired, last resided at 6400 Inwood Street, Cheverly, Maryland 20785.

Tab F - MARCHETTI, Victor

Information concerning the federal tax records of Victor Marchetti for the years 1964 through 1971 was obtained on 5 April 1972. Neither the identity of the IRS official who provided the information nor the identity of the Agency employee who obtained the information are contained in the Marchetti files. It is likely, however, in view of the time period during which the tax information was obtained, that Mr. Ralph True, previously identified under (b) above, had obtained the tax information.

Tab G - BROWNE, Jerome, Jr.

Mr. Ralph True, a former Agency employee identified above under (b), attempted to review Mr. Jerome Browne, Jr.'s tax records for the years 1962 through 1966. However, upon checking, IRS reported that Mr. Jerome Browne, Jr., had not filed federal income tax forms during that period. Instead, Mr. True

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was allowed to review the federal tax records relating to the individual's father, Mr. Jerome Browne, Sr., for the years 1962 through 1966. It would appear from the pertinent files that the federal tax information had been provided to Mr. True by Mr. Gil Haley, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service, Washington, D.C.

Tab H - Partnership of Butler, Lyons, and Kapusta

Information concerning the 1966 federal tax records relating to the partnership of Butler, Lyons, and Kapusta was received by the Office of Security on 2 April 1969. The Agency employee who reviewed the above IRS information was Mr. Ralph True, previously identified under (b) above. The identity of the IRS official who provided Mr. True with the tax information is not reflected in the pertinent files.

Tab I - LYONS, George - AKA: Rafael Goldfarb

Information concerning the 1969 individual federal tax records relating to George Lyons was received by the Office of Security on 15 March 1971. The Agency employee who reviewed the IRS records was Mr. Ralph True, previously identified, although the identity of the IRS official who provided the information is not contained in the pertinent files.

Tab J - KAPUSTA, Peter

On 18 March 1969, Mr. Ralph True, previously identified, reviewed the 1966 and 1967 individual federal tax records pertaining to Peter Kapusta. The identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information is not reflected in the pertinent files.

Tab K - MILLIGAN, Ellen T.

In connection with the investigation of Ellen T. Milligan, the Office of Security reviewed the federal tax records pertaining to Ellen T. Milligan for the years 1964 through 1966. In addition, the

Office of Security reviewed the federal tax records for the years 1962 through 1967, pertaining to one William Woodson, a paramour of Ellen F. Milligan. Mr. Woodson was then a GS-12/3 tax consultant employed by the Internal Revenue Service. The tax records pertaining to Ellen F. Milligan had been provided to the Agency by Mr. Leon C. Green, Deputy Assistant Commissioner, Compliance, Internal Revenue Service. The tax information pertaining to Mr. Woodson was made available by Mr. Gil Haley, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service. The Office of Security employee who reviewed the information in both cases was Mr. Thomas Tripodi. Mr. Tripodi is no longer employed with the Agency, and his last address is unknown. However, it is believed Mr. Tripodi is now employed by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency.

It should be noted that certain information not germane to the review of federal tax records has been sterilized from Tabs A through E. This sterilization has been accomplished primarily to protect the identity of other individuals, such as neighborhood informants or character references, and no information relating to the individuals' tax records has been deleted.

Attached hereto as Tab E is a memorandum prepared by Mr. Ralph O. True on 26 January 1971, which describes a discussion between Mr. True and Mr. John Morrison, of the Agency's Office of General Counsel, concerning Mr. True's liaison with the Internal Revenue Service. As indicated in cited memorandum, Mr. True stated that while his liaison with IRS had not been extensive, any such liaison had been conducted with the knowledge of Mr. Leon Green, the then Deputy Commissioner of IRS. Further, Mr. True stated that all liaison with IRS on his behalf had been at the direction of the Agency's Director of Security.

It is hoped that the information contained herein and in the various attachments will satisfactorily answer any questions you may have concerning the Office of

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Security's liaison with representatives of the Internal Revenue Service. If additional information is required, I will be pleased to assist you in any way possible.

Pursuant to our conversations on 13 June 1975, the following information is provided in regard to those instances where the Central Intelligence Agency's Office of Security has obtained federal tax information from the Internal Revenue Service.

Attached hereto as Tabs A through K are copies of the pertinent portions of Office of Security investigative reports and/or memoranda, which pertain to each of those instances where IRS information has been obtained. However, it should be noted that in many of these cases the information contained in these reports is quite limited and does not reflect the extent to which the IRS tax records had been made available.

Further, there is a discrepancy in the number of cases where the Agency has received federal tax information concerning an individual or firm as indicated in the report prepared by the Presidential Commission to Investigate the Central Intelligence Agency. Due to a typographical error on a summary chart provided by the Agency to the Presidential Commission, which numerically listed the entire spectrum of cases of "Alleged Illegal Domestic Activities," two cases were listed on the chart as "IRS reviews," when in fact they should have been listed under the "mail covers" section of that chart. As a result, there are actually only fourteen (14) instances, as opposed to the sixteen (16) reported by the Presidential Commission. In addition, the fourteen IRS reviews occurred

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during the Office of Security's investigation of only nine (9) cases, which in some instances had involved the investigation of more than one individual.

All of the cases where the Office of Security has received information from the IRS are considered extremely sensitive, and in all such cases prior approval to initiate contact with IRS officials had been received from senior Agency officials. At no time has an Office of Security employee been allowed to independently seek to obtain IRS information without prior Headquarters approval. In general, cases where the Agency has deemed it necessary to obtain IRS tax information can be divided into two categories:

- a. The counterintelligence type of investigation, where evidence indicates that an individual associated with the Agency might have been recruited by a foreign intelligence service and where it becomes necessary to determine the amounts and/or source of any income the individual might be receiving.
- b. Those cases where an individual occupying a position of trust and responsibility with the Agency was suspected of misusing the trust to his own financial or personal advantage.

With specific reference to your request that the identity of the Office of Security's contacts within IRS be furnished, the following consists of all available information concerning those IRS officials with whom Office of Security employees were in contact. Further, where the identity of the IRS official cannot be determined, the identity of the Office of Security employee who reviewed the IRS records is provided where known.

Tab A - BLUM, Robert I.

Information relating to Robert I. Blum's tax records for the years 1953 through 1958 was obtained by representatives of the Office of Security's San Francisco Field Office on 18 December 1959 and 5 January 1960. As indicated in Tab A, the IRS official who provided the information is identified as

Mr. Robert Leonard, the then Acting Chief of the Regional Inspector's Office, Internal Revenue Service, San Francisco, California.

Tab B - CORSO, Philip James

Very limited information relating to Philip James Corso's federal tax records for the years 1969 and 1970 appears to have been obtained circa July 1971. As indicated in Tab B, the Office of Security files contain very little information concerning the review of Mr. Corso's tax records and do not identify the IRS official who provided the tax information. Although not specifically indicated in Tab B, it would appear from the Office of Security file relating to Mr. Corso that the Office of Security employee who obtained the information was Mr. Ralph O. True, who formerly served as the Chief, Special Activities Division. Mr. True is now retired and last resided at 7816 Falstaff Road, McLean, Virginia 22101.

Tab C - CUBERO, Clifford Arcadio

Information concerning the federal tax records of Clifford Arcadio Cubero, including that of his parents, for the tax year 1968 was obtained by the Office of Security's San Francisco Field Office circa 12-19 August 1969. The Cubero file does not reflect the identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information nor does it specify whether the tax information was obtained through the San Francisco, California, or Honolulu, Hawaii, Internal Revenue Service offices. The Office of Security employee who appears to have reviewed the tax information is Identity 1, a current Agency employee who is assigned to an Office of Security Field Office. Since Identity 1 is a current Office of Security employee who is under cover, any contact with him should be coordinated with this Office.

Tab D - BUTTS, Roger Crawford

Information concerning Roger Crawford Butts' federal tax records for the "calendar" year 1956 appears to have been obtained circa November 1957. The file pertaining to Mr. Butts

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does not reflect the identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information nor can the identity of the Office of Security employee who reviewed the tax records be ascertained. It would appear from the file, however, that cited tax information was obtained from the New York City, New York Internal Revenue Service office.

Tab E - GARBLER, Paul

Information concerning the federal tax records of Paul Garbler for the years 1962 and 1963 appears to have been obtained circa April-June 1965. The identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information is not contained in the Garbler file. It would appear, however, that Mr. John Salb, a former Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Office of Security's Washington Field Office, had obtained the tax information. Mr. Salb, now retired, last resided at 6400 Inwood Street, Cheverly, Maryland 20785.

Tab F - MARCHETTI, Victor

Information concerning the federal tax records of Victor Marchetti for the years 1964 through 1971 was obtained on 5 April 1972. Neither the identity of the IRS official who provided the information nor the identity of the Agency employee who obtained the information are contained in the Marchetti files.

Tab G - Identity 2

Mr. Ralph True, a former Agency employee identified above under (b), attempted to review Identity 2 tax records for the years 1962 through 1966. However, upon checking, IRS reported that Identity 2 had not filed federal income tax forms during that period. Instead, Mr. True

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was allowed to review the federal tax records relating to the individual's father, , for the years 1962 through 1966. It would appear from the pertinent files that the federal tax information had been provided to Mr. True by Mr. Gil Haley, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service, Washington, D.C.

Identity
Tab H - Partnership of Butler, 3 and Identity 4

Information concerning the 1966 federal tax records relating to the partnership of Butler, Iden 3 and Iden 4 was received by the Office of Security on 2 April 1969. The Agency employee who reviewed the above IRS information was Mr. Ralph True, previously identified under (b) above. The identity of the IRS official who provided Mr. True with the tax information is not reflected in the pertinent files.

Tab I - Identity 3

Information concerning the 1969 individual federal tax records relating to Identity 3 was received by the Office of Security on 15 March 1971. The Agency employee who reviewed the IRS records was Mr. Ralph True, previously identified, although the identity of the IRS official who provided the information is not contained in the pertinent files.

Tab J - Identity 4

On 18 March 1969, Mr. Ralph True, previously identified, reviewed the 1966 and 1967 individual federal tax records pertaining to Identity 4. The identity of the IRS official who provided the tax information is not reflected in the pertinent files.

Tab K - MILLIGAN, Ellen T.

In connection with the investigation of Ellen T. Milligan, the Office of Security reviewed the federal tax records pertaining to Ellen T. Milligan for the years 1964 through 1966. In addition, the

Office of Security reviewed the federal tax records for the years 1962 through 1967, pertaining to one William Woodson, a paramour of Ellen T. Milligan. Mr. Woodson was then a GS-12/3 tax consultant employed by the Internal Revenue Service. The tax records pertaining to Ellen T. Milligan had been provided to the Agency by Mr. Leon C. Green, Deputy Assistant Commissioner, Compliance, Internal Revenue Service. The tax information pertaining to Mr. Woodson was made available by Mr. Gil Haley, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service. 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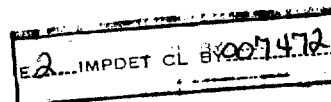
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CORSO, PHILIP JAMES

CORSO was born [redacted] at California, Pennsylvania, and served in the U.S. Army from 1942-1963 retiring in rank of Lt. Colonel. During his military service he served with G-2 components in Italy. After his retirement, he was unofficially associated with [redacted] and, at one time, was a privately paid investigator of [redacted]. In the latter capacity he once interviewed a former high-ranking Soviet defector [redacted] who had become emotionally disturbed and was making certain public statements regarding [redacted] of the CIA. These allegations, although totally inaccurate, were the subject of several sensational articles in the New York "Journal American." CORSO presently resides at Arnold, Maryland, and with his son, operates a modest automobile repair shop in Falls Church, Virginia. He has also claimed to be a manufacturer's representative in the local area, but inquiry into pertinent corporate tax records fail to substantiate the alleged affiliation. Federal tax records indicate that CORSO's income for the past two taxable years was approximately \$20,000 and \$15,000, respectively.

SUBJECT: BUTANE - Vice Mr. Marchetti

On 5 April 1972, a Confidential Informant reviewed BUTANE's income tax forms from 1964 through 1971 and advised that there appeared to be no serious discrepancies.

From September 1969, when BUTANE resigned from the Agency, through December 1971 BUTANE's total reported income was less than \$7,000. This consisted of a payment in 1970 of under \$7,000 from a publishing firm known as Granada, Ltd., in England and a reported income of approximately \$900 in 1971. An investigation is being conducted to obtain information regarding Granada, Ltd. The only other income reported was approximately \$4,800 in both 1970 and 1971 received by BUTANE's wife from the Fairfax County Hospital where she became employed late in 1969.

At the time the above information was obtained, our Informant was extremely interested in the fact that BUTANE had authored and published a book but still only reported a total income of less than \$7,000 for 1970 and 1971. In this regard, our source would be ready to conduct, at our request, a routine audit of BUTANE's income tax for the past three years.

1. On even date, I met and conferred with Mr. Leon C. GREEN, Deputy Assistant Commissioner, Compliance, Internal Revenue Service. Mr. GREEN produced income tax returns for the years 1964, 1965 and 1966 filed by Ellen T. MILLIGAN. These returns appear to be in order and no irregularities were noted.
2. Her highest claimed income was for the year 1966 in the amount of \$9,993.00. Additional income was in the amount of \$2,640.00 for alimony received from ex-husband Eugene MILLIGAN. Real estate interest paid was in the amount of \$630.00, indicating that a mortgage of approximately \$10,000.00 is outstanding on her residence. Total contributions claimed as deductions were in the amount of \$125.00. These were claimed for organizations such as the Boy Scouts, Cancer Fund, etc. The only contribution deduction worthy of note was the amount of \$10.00 given to the Institute of Human Studies.
3. Mr. GREEN stated that his office will attempt to review bank records at Riggs National Bank in the near future relative to the subject's account there. He stated he would achieve this only after it was certain the investigation would not be compromised.

1. On even date, I met and conferred with Mr. Gil HALEY, Intelligence Division, U.S. Internal Revenue Service, relative to the cases of William WOODSON, paramour of BOOTS, and the unrelated case of Identity 2

2. With reference to WOODSON, HALEY produced the income tax returns for the previous five years submitted by WOODSON. These returns were in order and no irregularities were noted. WOODSON is a GS-12/3. He claimed no deductions and availed himself of the standard fixed deductions. He was divorced from RUBY in 1957 and pays for the support of a male child born in 1956. His return for the year 1966 was audited concerning a discrepancy in support payments. This was subsequently resolved. WOODSON is employed as a tax consultant with the excise tax division of the Internal Revenue Service.

3. HALEY was advised that this Agency has no reason to request any delay in any action contemplated by the IRS in proceeding against Identity 2 and wife for allegedly failing to file their income tax returns.

4. Mr. HALEY noted that there appears to be a violation of the Federal Income Tax Statutes and that an investigation is therefore warranted. In view of Identity 2's employment, the investigation will be conducted by the Intelligence Division rather than the Audit Division. He further noted that the investigation will be initiated with an interview of the Subjects, Identity 2, His wife and father, and that following the interviews all bank records will be reviewed to be followed by a net worth evaluation. Mr. HALEY assured me that he will keep this office apprised of all significant developments and make an oral weekly status report. He further advised that a transcript of all confrontations with the Subjects will be furnished.

1. On this date, I visited the office of Mr. John Morrison in the Office of the General Counsel. Mr. Morrison discussed with me liaison with the Internal Revenue Service and, particularly, the extent to which the undersigned might have been in liaison with IRS.

2. Mr. Morrison was advised that the liaison by the undersigned had not been extensive, had only been at the direction of the Director of Security, and had been conducted with the knowledge of the then Deputy Commissioner, Mr. Leon Green, of IRS.

3. Mr. Morrison then stated "if Mr. Green had been aware of the liaison he was not concerned." Mr. Morrison did ask the undersigned, "what type of information do you ask for?" I replied that it was information pertaining to listings of outside income such as corporations, etc. He then asked, "did you have access to the tax forms?" I simply replied that the type of information I needed did not require the IRS to violate their restrictions.

4. There did not seem to be any further interest on the part of Mr. Morrison about our liaison activity with IRS. Before my departure, I told Mr. Morrison that since I had not been in liaison with IRS for quite sometime that it would probably be necessary for me to re-establish contact, and if I should run into any difficulty I would call upon him to assist me in getting re-established. To this he agreed.

Dear Mr. Rourke:

Pursuant to our conversation on 27 August 1975, the Office of Security files relating to Victor Marchetti (aka: Project BUTANE) have again been reviewed.

There is no indication in the files that Mr. Ralph True, a retired Office of Security employee, had been made aware of or involved in any portion of the Victor Marchetti case. Although no "bigot" list dated during the approximate time of the special investigation of Mr. Marchetti was located, subsequent "bigot" lists of those individuals knowledgeable concerning the case (prepared in response to the Rockefeller Commission inquiry) do not contain Mr. Ralph True's name. Further, this review again failed to reflect who might have arranged for or conducted the review of Mr. Marchetti's income tax records.

Our original response to you on 17 June 1975 indicated that Mr. Ralph True might possibly have arranged for the review of Mr. Marchetti's tax records. This information, however, was based on the erroneous assumption that Mr. True occupied the position of Chief, Special Activities Division in April 1972, combined with Mr. True's previous liaison relationship with the Internal Revenue Service. Further research indicates that the Special Activities Division was disbanded in January 1970, at which time Mr. True became Chief, Investigation Division, within the Office of Security, where he served until his retirement in June 1972. As Chief, Investigation Division, Mr. True's duties would have concerned routine clearance-type investigations and would not

SUBJECT : David E. MURPHY

1. On 27 May 1968 the Undersigned contacted a confidential source who was in a position to furnish information concerning Mr. Murphy's income tax returns from 1964 through 1967. In general the returns reflected nothing which appeared to be unusual in that Subject's income is limited to his salary, plus returns from investments. In 1964 he declared his salary and \$515 in interest, dividends, etc; in 1965 salary plus \$44.16; in 1966 salary plus \$314.16; and in 1967 salary plus \$605.


2. To ascertain Subject's true net worth would be difficult unless income and outgo from his bank statements could be obtained. However, by interpolating the largest amount of income obtained in excess of his salary, i. e., \$605.00 would represent somewhat over \$12,000 in savings. This amount does not appear to be unusual in light of Subject's salary.

3. Outside income was listed from mutual funds and stocks as well as bank and credit union interest. The only stock owned by Subject was United Aircraft and this was held as of the end of 1967. The largest amount of outside income came in 1967 from the L. Johnson Mutual Fund and amounted to somewhat over \$600. Other mutual funds held by the Subject between 1964 and 1967 were the J. Loomis Sayles Fund and the Affiliated Mutual Fund. The only other outside source of income

is in the name of Subject's wife and it represents a building consisting of four apartments at 66 Heather Avenue, San Francisco. His wife Marianne owns one fourth, Michael Escovy owns one fourth and Zina Baskett owns one half. Michael Escovy is apparently Subject's wife's brother and Zina Baskett is Subject's wife's sister. No additional information was obtained as a result of the review of these records which appears pertinent to this inquiry.



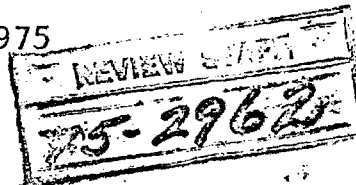

Pursuant to our conversation on 27 August 1975, the Office of Security files relating to Victor Marchetti (aka: Project BUTANE) have again been reviewed.

There is no indication in the files that Mr. Ralph True, a retired Office of Security employee, had been made aware of or involved in any portion of the Victor Marchetti case. Although no "bigot" list dated during the approximate time of the special investigation of Mr. Marchetti was located, subsequent "bigot" lists of those individuals knowledgeable concerning the case (prepared in response to the Rockefeller Commission inquiry) do not contain Mr. Ralph True's name. Further, this review again failed to reflect who might have arranged for or conducted the review of Mr. Marchetti's income tax records.

Our original response to you on 17 June 1975 indicated that Mr. Ralph True might possibly have arranged for the review of Mr. Marchetti's tax records. This information, however, was based on the erroneous assumption that Mr. True occupied the position of Chief, Special Activities Division in April 1972, combined with Mr. True's previous liaison relationship with the Internal Revenue Service. Further research indicates that the Special Activities Division was disbanded in January 1970, at which time Mr. True became Chief, Investigation Division, within the Office of Security, where he served until his retirement in June 1972. As Chief, Investigation Division, Mr. True's duties would have concerned routine clearance-type investigations and would not

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

1. Paragraph 2 of referent letter reads as follows:

"Please furnish a list of proprietaries that were precluded from such assessment by intervention of CIA officials with officials in IRS. Provide the name and title or level of the CIA officials and who in IRS they contacted to stop in-depth tax audits for the period July 1, 1966 to date."

2. In compliance with the request, OGC and CCS have compiled a list of CIA interventions during the period 1966 to the present. This list shows that CIA intervened as follows:

It should be noted that the above compilation is primarily based on OGC index cards, a partial review of IRS files, and memory. The completeness of the list can, therefore, not be guaranteed. It should be further noted that the above statistics include duplication in cases where the same proprietary was subject to audit in a number of years and intervention took place each time.

3. From a policy point of view, release of this material would provide the House Select Committee with information on true names of proprietaries which has, up to now, been denied to it under the rule that true names of cover mechanisms, cooperating individuals, and corporations would not be provided. On the other hand,

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it must be recognized that CIA's refusal to provide the requested information will inevitably lead the committee to request it from the IRS; and the IRS may not be in a position to withhold it, particularly since according to Jerry Brown, Review Staff, one reason for the committee's interest in this area is a possible "CIA abuse of IRS." Finally, it must be noted that intervention was not restricted to CIA proprietaries but included some individual cases and some real corporations and foundations who cooperated with CIA.

4. The attached list is arranged chronologically and is self-explanatory in its content. The only activities terminated by CIA, which would lend themselves to true name release to the committee because they have been exposed in public, are:

Radio Free Europe
Southern Air Transport

Psychological Assessment Associates

5. A policy decision on how to reply to referent request is required.

1. Mr. Ralph True, former Office of Security employee, contacted Mr. Bob Gambino regarding a contact he had had from an Agent of the Internal Revenue Service. He indicated that sometime ago Mr. Walter Rourke of IRS had contacted him regarding certain cases whereby the Office of Security had obtained IRS records in connection with investigative cases. These cases were noted in the Rockefeller Commission Report and information furnished to IRS by the Agency indicated that Mr. True had obtained some of this information from IRS. Mr. Rourke was seeking details concerning these contacts from Mr. True.

2. His first contact with Mr. True was in about mid-June. More recently he contacted Mr. True for more details indicating that he had sworn testimony that Mr. True had some how been involved in obtaining information from IRS concerning Victor Marchetti. Mr. True could not recall any of these incidents and on 30 July 1975 he came to my office requesting assistance in determining whether he had ever been involved in obtaining IRS information in connection with Victor Marchetti.

3. Mr. Gambino and the undersigned talked to Mr. True for some time. Mr. True indicated that he wanted to assist IRS if at all possible but he could not remember whether he had been involved in a case with IRS concerning Victor Marchetti, nor could he recall any information other than that already furnished IRS in connection with any inquiries at IRS. He suggested that perhaps a review of the files here in the Agency might assist him in refreshing his memory.

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4. After some discussion it became apparent that IRS was seeking specific information and from our conversation with Mr. True it was very difficult to ascertain the type of information of interest. We suggested to Mr. True that quite possibly the best thing for him to do was for him to answer any questions with IRS honestly and truthfully and should they require any information which might be located in our files we would be more than happy to make such information available to IRS. Mr. True appeared to be satisfied with that suggestion and said he would refer IRS to the Office of Security for any information of which he is not certain and which may be located in our files.



After placing Mr. Stewart under oath, the Special Agents consumed about 5 minutes discussing the information provided to Mr. Stewart by Mr. Leonard and he asked how it was done and why it wasn't done through the established formal process. Mr. Stewart reportedly told him that he was an investigator in the field and he had simply set up the contact with Mr. Leonard and was provided the information by showing his official identification. Mr. Stewart told Agent Rourke that he was not aware of any formal process for requesting this information and he thought that maybe Mr. Leonard was not aware either.

After completing the brief questioning about obtaining IRS information and Mr. Leonard, the Special Agents proceeded to question Mr. Stewart about CIA's field offices. They asked how many field offices there were and Mr. Stewart listed about five. The Agents then asked him if we didn't have one in Miami and if we didn't have one in Los Angeles. Mr. Stewart responded affirmatively to these questions and negatively when asked if we didn't have one in Seattle. (These questions lead Mr. Stewart to believe that the investigators were well aware of our entire field office organization.) When the negative reply on Seattle was given, they asked if we didn't have men assigned there. Mr. Stewart said yes. They proceeded to question Mr. Stewart about the different covers of the field offices and asked about several different federal agencies that might have served as cover for CIA investigators. They asked about the Office of Chief Coordinator which they seemed to be aware of. They asked if there ever was a person appointed Chief Coordinator and who he was. They inquired as to whether Mr. Stewart had ever attended a Chief Coordinator's meeting and then asked Mr. Stewart about his contacts with the post office. They asked Mr. Stewart whether he knew if post office representatives had attended the Chief Coordinator's meetings.

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They also inquired about Gene Rossides and asked whether he was really Treasury or Agency. 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

1. Special Agent Rourke of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) contacted Mr. Edward Stewart in San Francisco on Saturday afternoon, 28 June 1975. Mr. Stewart had been advised by the Chief of Operations (PSI) to anticipate this visit by Agent Rourke and to protect any classified information, as well as cover when he was talking to Agent Rourke. He was further advised that none of our people's names except McCabe and Geraty had been mentioned and it was suggested to Mr. Stewart that he not mention any others if he could avoid it. He was also advised that Agent Rourke had been given the name of Mr. Leonard as an IRS employee who had provided IRS information.

2. On 1 July 1975 the Special Agent in Charge of the San Francisco Field Office, Mr. Walt Richardson, advised that he had had a lengthy discussion with Mr. Stewart this date and outlined the following information about the interview conducted by Agent Rourke and his fellow female agent on Saturday, 28 June. After placing Mr. Stewart under oath, the Special Agents consumed about 5 minutes discussing the information provided to Mr. Stewart by Mr. Leonard and he asked how it was done and why it wasn't done through the established formal process. Mr. Stewart reportedly told him that he was an investigator in the field and he had simply set up the contact with Mr. Leonard and was provided the information by showing his official identification. Mr. Stewart told Agent Rourke that he was not aware of any formal process for requesting this information and he thought that maybe Mr. Leonard was not aware either.

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3. 5. The rest of the inquiry that Mr. Stewart can remember was questions about what field offices he had served with and who was in charge of the San Francisco Field Office when Mr. Stewart conducted the IRS checks. Mr. Stewart provided the names of Harry Murphy and Dick Jones.

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6. It is the undersigned's opinion that the two IRS investigators went substantially beyond the parameters of the inquiry that we expected them to make. Further, it is understandable since they had placed Mr. Stewart under oath that he provided as much information as he did.



1. Reference is made to the attached 18 October 1975 memorandum from the Chief, Cover and Commercial Staff, which concerns interest by the Senate Select Committee Staff in InterArmco, as well as individuals associated with that firm. The DDO has previously responded to such inquiries, in response to a 17 September 1975 request (Review Staff #75/2962a), and to date, the Office of Security has not been tasked with any action concerning this request.

2. The attached memorandum outlines certain sensitive identities connected with InterArmco, which cannot be released to a Congressional Committee without prior coordination with the Chief, Cover and Commercial Staff. It is therefore recommended that a copy of referenced memorandum be filed with SAG's Senate/House soft file entitled "Cooperating Companies," as well as within the Office of Security files pertaining to InterArmco and Mr. Samuel Cummings.

3. This memorandum will then serve as a flag to Office of Security personnel should some action be requested concerning InterArmco in connection with the current Congressional inquiries.

SUBJECT: Agency Relationships with INTERARMCO

REFERENCE: Mr. Fuller's Memo, 16 Oct 75, Same Subj [SA/DDO 75/65]

1. My reading of Mr. William Miller's request of 15 September 1975, RS memorandum 75/2962/a, dated 17 September 1975, does not, repeat not, require the release of any of the attached papers. Mr. Miller's request is for the Agency to "authorize the IRS to release and review with the Senate Select Committee Staff." The items in paragraphs one and two pertain to IRS documents, not CIA files.

2. It is clear from the attached documents that the CIA proprietary, International Armament Corporation (IAC), was indeed a DDP project, and that C/CISPD had the operational responsibility for it. However, all activities pertaining to CIA's continued relationship with Mr. Samuel Cummings, after he acquired IAC from CIA through purchase, have been handled by the Office of Logistics and the Office of General Counsel.

3. A review of the papers shows 3 documents signed in true name by Victor I. DITCHMAN (P) in his capacity as Assistant General Counsel. Since DITCHMAN is now the Project Manager of MHMUTUAL, documents containing his name cannot be made available to the investigating committees without removing DITCHMAN's true name or his identification in true name pertaining to the continued relationship and involvement of CIA with Sam Cummings and INTERARMCO. If it should become necessary to make DITCHMAN available for interviews or testimony on his involvement with these activities, it will have to be in alias in order to safeguard the continued operational security of Project MHMUTUAL.

4. It is requested that any action pertaining to IAC or INTERARMCO, which might identify DITCHMAN in true name to outsiders, be checked with me personally before such action is undertaken.





SUBJECT: Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Organizations
(Testimony of Current and Former CIA Employees)

1. On this date the Director of Security informed me that he had been in touch with Mr. John Clarke, Associate Deputy to the DCI for the Intelligence Community, and Mr. Walt Lloyd, a member of Mr. Clarke's staff. The substance of this meeting was to discuss procedural aspects involving staff members of the Senate Select Committee contacting former and present employees for interviews. According to Mr. Clarke, the Committee reserves the right to contact anyone they desire in pursuing their goals; however, the Committee has informed Mr. Clarke that in each instance they will notify the Agency whenever they are going to contact a former or present employee. The Committee has been in contact with Mr. Rostislav G. Issaev and Mr. William Edward Dolaney, former Office of Security employees. Mr. Issaev will be interviewed in Washington, D.C., on 14 May 1975 and Mr. Dolaney will be interviewed on 15 May 1975.

2. Since these are the first two individuals to be contacted, Mr. Clarke's office is presently working out the procedure to handle coordination within the Agency. It is planned that when notification is received from the Committee that in each instance the Office of Personnel, Office of Security and Cover and Commercial Staff will be notified. Coordination will also be effected with the DDO, DDS&T, DDI, etc. if appropriate.

3. The Director of Security suggested that perhaps a form letter should be worked out to respond to these requests. The Office of Security would be interested in alerting Mr. Clarke's office to any significant security problems, i.e., cover, whether or not a contractual relationship exists and the area of probable concern. As an example, Mr. Kane suggested

that in response on Mr. Issaef, the Office of Security should alert Mr. Clarke's staff that Mr. Issaef retired in a cover capacity and that he is presently under contract as an independent contractor performing field investigations. The probable area of concern is mail intercepts since Mr. Issaef was the principal officer involved with SRPOINTER. In the case of Mr. Delaney, he assisted Mr. Issaef in the SRPOINTER project.

4. In addition to the above, the Director of Security requested that the undersigned coordinate with Mr. Walt Lloyd regarding Messrs. Issaef and Delaney. Accordingly, I advised Mr. Marvin Smith on Mr. Clarke's staff of pertinent data on these two former Office of Security employees. According to Mr. Smith, Mr. Clarke's staff is presently working out procedural aspects of handling future cases.

4. I promised to advise him if we were required to brief the Senate Select Committee on this matter.

1. This memorandum is submitted for information only.
2. Reference is made to your verbal request of 2 October 1975 for information concerning the Office of Security's funding relationship with ITEK as it relates to Project MHBOUND.
3. During July 1969, Messrs. Gary Breneman, OGC, Richard Kuh, Office of Security, and TABLANTE (P), Comptroller of MHBOUND/3, an Office of Security proprietary located in California, met with Messrs. Howard B. Sprague, Vice President of ITEK; Peter S. Pedulla, Corporate Comptroller, and Frances A. Tenore, Corporate Security Officer, to work out an arrangement wherein ostensible contractual relationships could be established between ITEK and MHBOUND/3 to facilitate the passage of Agency money into MHBOUND/3 from ITEK. The mechanics of this operation are as follows: ITEK would sign work orders or contracts with MHBOUND/3. The Agency would send treasury checks, usually on a quarterly basis to ITEK where they would be deposited in the corporate books in such a way as to protect the source of funds. Monthly, MHBOUND/3 would bill ITEK citing the work orders or contracts and receive an ITEK check in payment. This check would be recorded on MHBOUND-3 financial records as earned income.
4. The first check amounting to \$16,250 was sent to ITEK on 29 August 1969. Since that time \$322,000 has been funded through ITEK. A balance of \$9,000 remains. No additional funding is anticipated as MHBOUND/3 is being liquidated on or before 30 June 1976 and probably has sufficient funds in the closed circuit pipeline (7 companies) to continue business until liquidation.

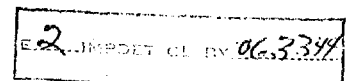
Dear Mr. Sprague:

This letter states the Agency's understanding of the arrangements which have been made between the Agency and Itek Corporation involving General Personnel Investigations, Inc. (GPII). We have specific reference to our discussions and agreement with you concerning the passing of money from the Agency to GPII through Itek.

The Agency has desired for some time to effect an arrangement with Itek whereby ostensible contractual relations could be established between Itek and GPII to facilitate the passage of Agency money into GPII from Itek. Consequently, we have requested that ostensible contracts or work orders be executed and funds as agreed be passed from Itek Corporation to GPII. Such funds will be deposited with Itek by means of a U. S. Treasury check on a quarterly basis and Itek will pay out the funds to GPII according to monthly billings. It is understood that Itek does not require any fee or charge for its cooperation in this matter.

The purpose of this arrangement is to assist the Agency in the performance of certain of its tasks in the interests of the national security of the United States. The ostensible contractual arrangements between Itek Corporation and GPII are acknowledged to be of no force and effect and the true parties in interest are the U. S. Government, as

represented by the Central Intelligence Agency, and Itek Corporation. It is recognized that Itek might call on GPII to render actual services in which event such transactions would not be within the scope of this understanding and arrangement.

The information in this letter of understanding and the information conveyed by representatives of the Agency in the course of discussions which culminated in it are classified SECRET and regarded by the Agency as very sensitive. Such information must not be divulged to unauthorized persons without the prior written consent of the undersigning officer of the Agency.

The purpose of this letter is to record our mutual understanding of the existing arrangement and while all copies will be retained within the Agency, it is available for inspection by you or other appropriately cleared people of Itek Corporation at any time. If the above accurately expresses our mutual understanding, would you please acknowledge by signing in the space indicated below.

The Agency also wishes to express its deep appreciation of the wholehearted cooperation of Itek Corporation and its representatives.







1. I met with the DDA, ADDA and the General Counsel on 19 October with regard to a request from the Office of General Counsel for this Office to make available a number of files relative to current and former employees to the Department of Justice. According to the written request from Mr. Ed Cohen, Department of Justice attorneys desired to review these files in connection with the ITT/Chile investigation.

2. I was quite concerned that this was a major departure from Agency security procedure and informed Mr. Blake of my concern on 15 October. He totally agreed and requested that no files be made available pending his further review of the matter.

3. Mr. Blake subsequently advised me that not only was the Director totally unaware of the request for the Department of Justice attorneys to review the files, neither was Mr. Tony Lapham, the General Counsel. Apparently Mr. Cohen, Associate General Counsel, had initiated this request totally on his own authority. Mr. Blake indicated that we would have a subsequent meeting with Mr. Tony Lapham to resolve the matter. That meeting occurred on the morning of 19 October at which time it was agreed that Mr. Lapham would consult

on DGC - Copy has been placed in referenced OS files

with the Department of Justice attorneys to determine if it would not be possible for the Office of Security to review the individual files and advise the Justice attorneys of any information that might be pertinent to their interest. If this suggestion is not amenable to the Justice Department attorneys then we will regroup with the thought of asking the Director to communicate with Attorney General Levi indicating to him our philosophy of security files and our concern over releasing them without any control. Further we would consider allowing the Department of Justice attorneys to come directly to the Office of Security and a security officer would review the individual files with the attorneys advising them of the data that is in the file and marking information that they consider pertinent to their investigation. This latter process would be used to avoid subpoena which, we all recognize, is a possible recourse to the Department of Justice to have total access to the file.

4. Both Mike Malanick and Tony Lapham called during the evening of 19 October to advise me that the Department of Justice has withdrawn their request for security files on present and former employees as a result of Lapham's conversation with them.

Excerpts

1. This memorandum transmits my comments on selected items from those designated by DOJ representatives. OIG has no real proprietary interest in most of the information contained in the items, so most of my comments will be in the form of questions to ensure that appropriate consideration is given when the items are handled for sanitization and/or release.

a. 20 March 1972 - We discussed the problems in the first item and no further comment is required here. I have no problems with the item on the Marchetti case. I have no objection to release of the item mentioning a meeting with the IG and others on Chile; Mr. Broe's diary confirms that such a meeting occurred.

b. 21 March 1972 - I see no problem in release of the item at the bottom of the page. It does not appear to raise the "advice and counsel" issue that is of concern to OLC.

c. 22 March 1972 - The item concerning discussion of Congressional hearings on ITT does not appear to raise the "advice and counsel" issue.

d. 23 March 1972 - No objections to release of the item on a pending press story on ITT.

e. 24 March 1972 - No objection to release of the item on the NYT story on ITT.

f. 27 March 1972 - No objection to release of the first two marked items on page 2 of the minutes. However, the name of George Doole should be considered for possible sanitization, although he has received considerable publicity for his Air America role. It is noted that Angus Thuermer's name appears here and in a number of other places (23 March) for example. He is now going overseas under cover and continued publicity of his name may pose a problem.

g. 28 March 1972 - The third item in the minutes raises the third Agency rule in citing a specific State Department cable. The next to last item on the first page of the minutes may raise the OLC issue of "advice and counsel," although OLC may release it as a borderline case.

h. 29 March 1972 - The last four items on the first page of the minutes seem to deal with budget hearings and strike me as releasable. The two items marked on the second page of the minutes appear releasable, although the reference to a "Chilean agent" ought to be reviewed by a DDO representative.

i. 30 March 1972 - The first item in the minutes identifies a CIA report by date and release might serve as a revealing confirmation. The next to last item in the minutes for that day seem releasable.

j. 31 March 1972 - The next to last item in the minutes for this day names an Agency employee. Otherwise it seems releasable.

k. 3 April 1972 - No problem.

l. 10 April 1972 - Routine comment on scheduling Congressional hearings.

m. 12 April 1972 - No problems.

n. 14 April 1972 - The first item identifies CIA reports and should at least be sanitized. The next three marked items do not appear on their face to present problems, although D/NIO may wish to review the reference to an ONE memorandum on Chile, publication of which might expose it to public attention.

o. 19 April 1972 - I would think that a discussion of the newspaper stories can be released. The next item that is marked raises the question of international relations and the very fact that the issue was raised puts it in a special category and should be considered carefully.

p. 21 April 1972 - No problems with the item on Marchetti, although as in other instances the appearance of Thuermer's name presents a question.

q. 1 May 1972 - No problems. Of the four items marked on the second page of the minutes the only question that I have is the use of the name of Brittenham. If released, and I assume it will be, Brittenham should probably be advised.

r. 3 May 1972 - The two items on the second page of the minutes have to do with Congressional hearings and are releasable. The marked item on the Moscow signals merely reveals interest on a subject that has subsequently received considerable publicity, as well as confirmation.

s. 4 May 1972 - No problem with the first and last items except the question on Thuermer's name. The items on sensitive ORD and TSD contracts (the 5th item in the minutes) present problems, but possibly can be sanitized.

t. 17 May 1972 - No problems, except for the reference to specific budgetary figures and the NRO reference.

- u. 18 May 1972 - No problems.
- v. 19 May 1972 - No problems; this indicates a false Jack Anderson story rather than confirming a real Agency report.
- w. 22 May 1972 - There may be a problem in reference to "Soviet Navy Delivery Systems" and the items at the bottom of the first page of the minutes. Otherwise it seems O.K. The last item in the minutes on SALT merely reveal the subject but not the substantive contents and probably is releasable.
- x. 23 May 1972 - No problems with the three marked items, although OLC may feel that the first of them raises the "advice and counsel" issue.
- y. 25 May 1972 - No problems.
- z. 1 June 1972 - No problems.
- aa. 7 June 1972 - No problems.
- bb. 8 June 1972 - The DDI should comment on the reference to a specific OCI report. No problem with reference to a Jack Anderson column.
- cc. 9 June 1972 - The reference to the Jack Anderson column indicates that the reference to an "intercept" is probably correct. It raises the question of confirming a COMINT activity. The reference to British concern is an additional revelation in terms of US-UK intelligence relations.
- dd. 26 June 1972 - Specific reference to USIB estimates may have to be sanitized.
- ee. 27 June 1972 - While publicity of the existence of formal briefing material on the SALT subject may lead to FOIA requests, it is assumed that their continued classification and the sensitivity of the subject would result in a denial. I don't see how we can withhold it. No problem with the last item on the first page of the minutes.

ff. 29 June 1972 - The item on Jack Anderson's report on Sino-Soviet relations does not, by itself, present a problem. However, the reference to intelligence coverage of a Soviet military exercise probably should be paraphrased if not completely deleted.

gg. 12 July 1972 - No problem with the reference to a SALT briefing, previous remarks on the subject applying here.

hh. 13 July 1972 - The reference to use of Agency reports mentioned in Anderson's column presents the old question of official confirmation. Any decision on release of this should take into consideration what was done under FOIA requests. No other problems.

ii. 14 July 1972 - I have no problems with release of the information on a SALT briefing.

jj. 19 July 1972 - No problem on the reference to a SALT briefing, except the same comments made earlier on the existence of briefing materials.

kk. 21 July 1972 - I have no problems with the report on the Senate briefing, but OLC may find that the "advice and counsel" issue may be raised by the phrasing of the comment.

ll. 24 July 1972 - No problem with the item marked on the first page of the minutes. The DDO should comment on the item marked on the second page.

mm. 25 July 1972 - No problem.

nn. 27 July 1972 - No problem.

oo. 21 August 1972 - I don't see how we can object to this, whatever it really refers to.

pp. 4 December 1972 - No problems.

qq. 5 December 1972 - The reference to a "recently completed memorandum" on Saudi Arabia should be checked with D/NIO. Critchfield's name probably should be deleted.

ss. 12 December 1972 - The first item in the minutes not only confirms the Anderson reference to a State cable, it raises the third Agency rule.

uu. 18 December 1972 - No problem, although OLC might want to look at it carefully.

vv. 19 December 1972 - No problems.

ww. 20 December 1972 - No problems.

xx. 21 December 1972 - No problems.

2. It is noted that all of the minutes have a Top Secret-Sensitive marking. Some of the material, obviously, does not fall into that category. Some, conceivably, may involve special code words that don't appear in these minutes. People with technical competence ought to weigh in on consideration of that question.

3. If my comments are a little cryptic I'm sorry, and I am ready to discuss these with you further if it is at all useful to you.

SUBJECT : ITT Investigation - Fingerprint Analysis of
Original Agency Documents

1. Reference is made to your 28 September 1976 memorandum (OGC 76-5292) asking for comments concerning your proposed response to a Department of Justice request to conduct a fingerprint analysis of certain original Agency documents.

2. I will, of course, arrange for an Office of Security representative to accompany these documents to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) facility and remain during the examination of the documents. However, I have some reservations concerning the suggestion of Mr. George A. Carver, Jr., of the Department of Justice, that the Office of Security representative be armed during this process.

3. It is my recommendation that we agree to the procedures proposed by Mr. Carver, with the exception of an armed security escort. I am confident that the classified documents involved here can be adequately protected by our security officer without the need for a firearm.

4. If you agree, please have Mr. Edmund Cohen of your office contact Mr. Bruce Solie, Chief, Security Analysis Group, Extension 7683, to arrange for the necessary security support.



Dear Mr. Thornburgh:

This is in response to your letter to me dated September 7, 1976, in which you request that we furnish you originals of 11 documents which will be subjected to fingerprint analysis in the Federal Bureau of Investigation laboratory. Mr. Edmund Cohen of my office noted to Mr. George Allen Carver, Jr. of your office that up to this point the Agency has not released originals of documents and has not made available documents prior to deletion of certain sensitive information. Mr. Cohen also expressed concern that a large number of Agency employees under cover who are unconnected with the investigation might have handled the documents. Fingerprint analysis could compromise the cover of such individuals. An agreement was struck between the two attorneys as to the procedure which might be followed in order to satisfy Agency concerns and at the same time meet your requirements. Mr. Carver proposed that an armed Office of Security employee accompany the documents to the FBI facility. While the security officer waited, the documents would be photographed and FBI officials would only seek to determine whether the fingerprints of certain selected Agency officials appeared on the documents. After this had been done, the originals and any photographs and photographic negatives would be returned to the Agency by the security officer.

This procedure is acceptable to us, and pursuant to these conditions, we stand ready to make the requested documents available.

2. With respect to the first list, numbered 1 through 32, documents numbered 30, 31, and 32 were originated within the Office of Security. Forwarded herewith as Tabs A through C are two copies of documents numbered 30, 31, and 32 for release to the Department of Justice. Documents 30 and 31 have been sanitized to facilitate their declassification. The names of current Agency employees who are under cover, and in one case the name of a former Agency employee who recently retired after serving his entire career in a cover status, have been deleted. Additionally, the names and identifying data of selected individuals not related to the DOJ investigation have been deleted from these memoranda on the basis of privacy. All deletions have been replaced with an appropriate descriptive phrase.

3. None of the other documents listed within these two lists were originated within the Office of Security. However, documents numbered 115, 116, and 129 on the second list are of interest to the Office of Security, and arrangements have been made with the Latin America Division/DDO for us to coordinate on these documents prior to their release to the DOJ.

SUBJECT: Project MUD HEN

1. On 14 March 1972, the Director of Security advised two CIA cover employees and the undersigned that on 17 March 1972, the Director will lunch with BRANDY. This meeting will take place at the Montpelier Room Restaurant of the Madison Hotel, Washington, D. C. The Director has further advised that the purpose of the confrontation will be to attempt to dissuade BRANDY from publishing certain sensitive classified material in his forthcoming book. It is of particular significance that this luncheon appointment was made at the request of the Director and, obviously, the arrangements concerning the locale were facilitated by BRANDY.

2. It was pointed out to the Director of Security that the Director should be apprised of the possibility that BRANDY may seek audio coverage of the meeting. This conclusion can be based on the following factors:

a. Recent SUGAR coverage at the Empress Restaurant, Washington, D. C. revealed BRANDY in possession of portable recording equipment;

b. There is a distinct possibility that BRANDY may utilize the services of a local private investigator, whose business associate may be a former MPD officer. The private investigator is currently under indictment for selling audio equipment to a foreign government.

His associate, a known audio and polygraph operator, was directly involved in unearthing BRANDY's audio installation in the hotel room of another individual.

c. Positive information that BRANDY has recently visited the U.S. Recording Company, such firm being a known supplier of sophisticated audio equipment; and

d. The fact that BRANDY may well have viable contacts or relationships with the staff of the Madison Hotel and, indeed, might be leasing permanent space at that establishment which could be utilized as an audio listening post.

3. On 15 March 1972, the Director of Security advised that he had briefed the Director regarding the above considerations, but that the latter is still intent on going through with the proposed luncheon meeting.

4. It was proposed to the Director of Security that certain limited SUGAR coverage should be effected in the Montpelier Room during the meeting between BRANDY and the Director. Two (2) teams of two (2) agents each will also lunch at the restaurant and maintain general SUGAR observations particularly on the possibility of any audio or photographic coverage of the Director while he is in BRANDY's presence. If such a contingency is discovered before the Director's arrival at the restaurant, Headquarters should be immediately notified through appropriate WFO communications channels. In the event such developments arise while the Director is in the establishment, no action should be taken by SUGAR team members excepting the notification, at the earliest opportunity, to WFO supervisory personnel. At no time should the Director be made aware of SUGAR coverage within the restaurant although it should be noted that he is agreeable to our intended operation. The Director of Security has subsequently consented to the above-described SUGAR proposal.

5. The bulk of the SUGAR team will be positioned in the vicinity of the Madison Hotel and it is most important that (a) they be alert for any possible counter-surveillance which may have been designed by BRANDY for this meeting; and (b) be ready to resume full and effective SUGAR coverage on BRANDY at the conclusion of his luncheon with the Director. At the present time, there is no way to measure BRANDY's potential reaction to the Director's proposal. But one thing is certain, that being the meeting involving the Director will surely alert BRANDY to this Agency's interest into, at least, a phase of his activities. It is, therefore, imperative to obtain comprehensive information as to BRANDY's concern to the Agency's incursion into his professional or personal operations.

6. In conjunction with the BRANDY coverage, it is desired that, on 17 ~~December~~^{March} 1972, SUGAR coverage be maintained on CORDIAL and EGGNOG since, if there is to be any counter-surveillance, audio or photographic operations against the Director, either of these individuals would necessarily play a major role.

7. In view of the Director's concern over the proposed BRANDY book, SUGAR coverage should be predicated on obtaining any information relating to the possible collaborator or publisher of this work. It is thought that the central point for this segment of BRANDY's activity may be in New York City and, at such times he may travel to that location, it is hoped that a sufficient number of the SUGAR team members be able to accompany him on such journeys. Arrangements have already been made with NYFO to render support to the applicable WFO SUGAR team members who may be required to conduct operations in the New York City area.

They entered the Montpelier Room Restaurant where they lunched and engaged in a rather animated conversation. BRANDY and the Director departed the restaurant at 1338 hours. BRANDY returned, on foot, to his office.

The SUGAR teams advised that there was no evidence of photographic and/or audio coverage during the above meeting. Additionally, SUGAR coverage in the immediate area of the Madison Hotel found no indication of possible hostile counter-surveillance. Neither patrons within the restaurant nor that establishment's staff exhibited any particular interest towards the Director or BRANDY.

SUBJECT : Department of Justice Request for Declassification of Documents

1. The Department of Justice has requested that the Agency review the 168 items listed in the attachment for declassification. It may be that some of the documents included in the 168 items are unclassified or may now be declassified. It may be that some may be declassified by the removal of certain names or other classified information. And it may be that some of the documents must remain classified in their entirety.

2. The judgment as to whether information remains classified must be made against what the Government has officially placed in the public domain. In this regard the following publications are relevant:

a. Multinational Corporations and U.S. Foreign Policy, Hearings before the Subcommittee on Multinational Corporations, Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Parts 1 through 6, 1973 and 1974.

b. Alleged Assassination Plots Involving Foreign Leaders, Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities, 1975.

c. Covert Action in Chile 1963-1973, Senate Select Committee to Study Governmental Operations with Respect to Intelligence Activities, 1975.

d. Nomination of Richard Helms to be Ambassador to Iran and CIA International and Domestic Activities, Senate Foreign Relations Committee, 1974.

e. Nomination of William E. Colby, Senate Armed Services Committee, 1973.

f. CIA Foreign and Domestic Activities, Senate Foreign Relations Committee, 1975.

3. Further, the judgment as to what information must remain classified must satisfy the classification criteria currently applicable. For that information that must remain classified the Agency must specifically set forth to the Department the facts on which the Agency's position is based. 4. No one other than the members of this task force should be apprised of the purposes of or activities of the task force without prior coordination with the Acting General Counsel or Assistant General Counsels Clarke or Dietel.

SUBJECT: Department of Justice Request for Agency Material


1. In December 1974 Director Colby requested that the Department of Justice investigate allegations of violations of law with respect to Agency activities that are generally described as "ITT/Chile." Subsequent to that referral to the Department, attorneys of the Department have reviewed a large number of Agency records that are relevant to this subject. Further, they have interviewed a number of employees regarding this subject.

2. The Department has recently requested that all components of the Agency search for any other materials that may be relevant to this subject matter. The types of materials sought are described below and are from the period 1 March 1970 to the present. The Department is seeking any and all documents of any kind or description which relate to the listed subject matters. Several of those matters listed below are rather broad. Accordingly, before the actual search is begun, I ask that you and your immediate subordinates study this request and discuss with me or those in my Office handling this matter any questions you have as to the scope of any of the listed matters. Several such matters have already come to mind and have been discussed with the Department. For example, our various Agency libraries may have library books which fall within the subject matter of "Agency activities in Chile in 1970." The Department is not interested in our identifying or furnishing such library

books. You should complete such discussions with me prior to Friday, 28 May. In accordance with any such discussions and further guidance resulting therefrom, each component of the Agency should search its records from 1 March 1970 to the present (including any retired records) for any document or material of any kind or description which relates to the items listed below:

- a. Agency activities in Chile in 1970.
- b. ITT or other corporations as such records indicate a connection with Chile.
- c. Jack Anderson's 21 and 22 March 1972 articles and related articles dealing with contacts between William Broe and ITT officials.
- d. Agency connections with congressional oversight committees or members thereof concerning Chile.
- e. Connections with the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, subcommittees thereof, or members thereof concerning Chile.
- f. Connections with anyone relating to testimony given or to be given by Richard Helms to any congressional committee or member thereof concerning Chile.
- g. Cables sent to or received from Ambassador Helms in conjunction with Department of Justice, including the "Watergate" Special Prosecutor, and/or congressional inquiries or proceedings relative to "Watergate" or "ITT/Chile."
- h. Any and all documents previously reviewed by the Department of Justice regarding ITT/Chile.

3. Searches should include "personal" or "soft" files held by individual Agency employees in their Agency offices, and should include all documents and materials of any kind, including, but not limited to, documents, files, memoranda, calendar sheets, etc. All copies of all materials identified within the scope of the above-listed subject matters should be furnished to my Office. We will act as the responsible Agency office for their subsequent control. Obviously, we will coordinate any further Department requests with regard to those materials with the furnishing office. Further, I should be informed of any copies retained for record purposes by the furnishing component. This matter was brought to the Director's attention on 24 May and he concurs therein.



1. Reference is made to Review Staff memorandum 75/3682/a dated 22 December 1975 which forwards a letter dated 18 December 1975 from Mr. William R. Bader, Senate Select Committee Staff, to Mr. Walter Elder, The Review Staff. In the letter Mr. Bader requested information pertaining to possible Agency use of four companies and six individuals.

2. A check of Office of Security indices in regard to the cited companies and individuals and the indicated areas of interest disclosed the following information:

International School Services
Dr. John Sly, President
Mr. Ken Schultheis, Vice-President

A "Special Inquiry" was made regarding International School Services by the Office of Security in June 1964 based upon a request by the Domestic Operations Division, DDD. The investigation was based upon public sources only, and there was no evidence that the CIA has or had a direct or indirect relationship with the company nor any indication that it ever provided educational cover for CIA personnel abroad. Dr. John Sly, the president of International School Services, was a former IC Division contract agent, now privately employed by International School Services in New York City. Dr. Sly was utilized in a witting capacity promoting certain overseas activities of DTHANDCAR for which he was regional representative. There was no indication that International School Services was ever utilized by CIA, and there was no record regarding Mr. Ken Schultheis.

Peter Juge

A file in the name of Peter E. Juge, born [redacted], Louisiana, (who may or may not be identical to the subject of interest) disclosed that he was initially a State Department employee who was granted security approval for liaison with this Agency in 1965. In 1969 an Operational Approval was requested for Juge's possible use as an access agent in Nigeria by the Africa Division, DDC. It appears that Juge was used as a Lagos (Nigeria) Station asset while employed by Mobil Oil Company until at least February 1972. There was no evidence of current utilization of Juge.

Mobile Oil Indonesia

A file in the name of Mobil Petroleum Company, Incorporated reflected that the Office of Security conducted a "Special Inquiry" regarding Mobil Oil Corporation in 1971. The inquiry consisted of Dunn and Bradstreet records only and there was no evidence of a direct or indirect relationship by this Agency with the aforementioned firms. The file did not contain any allusions to Mobile Oil Indonesia nor any Mobil subsidiaries. It should be further noted that there was no record in the name of Mobile Oil Indonesia, but it is believed that the latter firm is perhaps a subsidiary of the multinational Mobil Oil Corporation.




1. Reference is made to Review Staff memorandum 75/3673A dated 17 December 1975 requesting comment on the accuracy of certain FBI statements relative to the above secondary caption.

2. The Office of Security is in no position to attest to the accuracy of the FBI report. Therefore, we will only address the question as to whether the Office of Security knows of information in conflict with the basic statements of FBI, to wit:

"The FBI has no information indicating that Soviet KGB officers (emphasis added) have infiltrated any Congressional Staffs;" and...."there were no known cases involving Soviet KGB penetration of current (emphasis added) Congressional Staff. There have been KGB attempts at penetration in the past."

3. The Office of Security knows of no information of substantive conflict with the above statements.

4. As to the question of whether the Office of Security has any other information on this subject, the Review Staff before replying may wish to determine through FBI liaison whether in the briefing by the FBI of Mr. William G. Miller the case of former congressional employee Kenneth Ralph Tolliver was broached concerning past KGB activities relative to Congress.



Dear Mr. Chairman:

Under date of October 28, 1975, Mr. John T. Elliff, Director, Domestic Intelligence Task Force, addressed a communication to Assistant Director W. Raymond Wannall of this Bureau. Mr. Elliff advised that your Committee has recently learned of allegations that the Central Intelligence Agency is in possession of information indicating that there are Soviet agents on seven Senators' staffs. Mr. Elliff requested that the Committee be given a brief written statement of the FBI's position regarding these allegations which may be made public by the Committee. Moreover, Mr. Elliff requested that the Committee be furnished the substance of a briefing which was afforded to Mr. William G. Miller, Staff Director of the Select Committee, and himself several weeks ago. The latter item was requested for the Select Committee's confidential consideration.

On October 9, 1975, accompanied by Assistant Director Wannall, I appeared before the Congressional Seminar on Intelligence and Internal Security sponsored by the American Conservative Union in Washington, D. C. During the question and answer period following my prepared remarks, several Seminar participants asked for clarification and comment regarding a reported statement by Senator Barry Goldwater that KGB intelligence officers had infiltrated seven Congressional or Senate staffs. The Seminar was advised that the FBI has no information indicating that Soviet KGB officers have infiltrated any Congressional staffs. Mr. Wannall stated that it was not a



case of infiltration but "more of an effort on the part of hostile intelligence services to make contacts not only on Capitol Hill but elsewhere with individuals who are in positions of influence or in a position to furnish information which is of value to the hostile intelligence services." Mr. Wannall continued that if the FBI did obtain such information indicating infiltration of a Congressional office or staff, such information would be promptly furnished to the appropriate Senator or Congressman.

Pursuant to the request of Mr. Elliff, there is attached a memorandum summarizing the briefing that was afforded to members of your staff on August 7, 1975.

SUBJECT: FBI Briefing on KGB Activities on Capitol Hill

On August 7, 1975, members of the Select Committee staff were briefed by Mr. Wannall, Assistant Director, Intelligence Division, and Mr. Brannigan, head of the Soviet Section of the Counterintelligence Branch, on the KGB threat on Capitol Hill.

Mr. Wannall stated that there were no known cases involving Soviet KGB penetration of current Congressional staff. There have been KGB attempts at penetration in the past. In one instance, a Congressional aide to a sensitive committee was approached by a Soviet agent. Initially, the questions raised by the Soviet agents were matters of public record. After the first contact by the Soviets, the Congressional aide immediately informed the FBI. The Bureau in turn asked the Congressional aide's superior if he would allow his aide to be a double agent. The Congressman agreed. As a result, the Bureau was able to monitor the progression of the penetration attempt. As noted earlier, the recruitment effort went from questions on routine matters of public record to more sensitive, classified material. As the questions escalated in their sensitivity, initial gifts of vodka and dolls changed to small, then large, offers of cash payments. The idea was to entrap the aide, then simply blackmail him into turning over classified material.

This Soviet effort failed, but the Bureau believes there is continuing reason to stay alert. Their reasoning is based on the changes in the political relationship between the Soviet Union and the United States. With the coming of detente, the Bureau is of the view that the Soviets and, in particular, the KGB have become more acclimatized to the United States and more skillful in their techniques. The KGB no longer stand out as they did in the '50's with their

grey suits and oversized overcoats. Because of this, it is more difficult to monitor their activities on Capitol Hill, or anywhere for that matter.

The Bureau also is aware that the Soviets have begun to make limited lobbying efforts, largely through legitimate activities of diplomats and distinguished visitors from the U.S.S.R., particularly in the area of international trade. The Bureau asserts that although the Soviets have a legitimate interest in particular legislation before the Congress, the Bureau is of the view that careful monitoring is required to insure that U.S. laws are enforced and covert operations are not started on the hill.

I suggested that Congressional staff might follow the practice, as State Department employees are required, to write a memo summarizing any significant contact they have with any Soviet. The memos would be given to the supervisor of the staff person involved, as well as the Bureau or the State Department as appropriate.

1. Reference is made to your request of 4 October 1976 (OGC 76-5403) in relation to a Department of Justice investigation concerning the past activities of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) which were directed at the late Reverend Martin Luther King. Reference asked that the Office of Security determine through its files the nature and extent of any contact between the Agency and the FBI concerning Reverend King.

2. A search of our files has disclosed numerous FBI documents which either mention or concern Reverend King as well as a limited number of internal Office of Security documents which relate to FBI/CIA interest in Reverend King. Forwarded herewith as Tabs A through J are copies of each of these documents. A brief description of these documents together with an explanation of the Office of Security files from which these documents were obtained appears below:

a. Tab A consists of both Office of Security and FBI originated documents from our file on Reverend Martin Luther King (OS#353 062) and which appear to relate to referenced request. No sanitization has been effected on these documents.

b. Tab B consists of documents taken from the Office of Security file on Mr. Jay Richard Kennedy (OS#172 527) and which appear to relate to referenced request. It should be noted that Mr. Kennedy was a confidential informant of the Office of

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Security circa 1958 through 1969 and reported to this Office primarily on matters pertaining to the activities of various civil rights leaders. The documents within Tab B refer to The Reverend Martin Luther King, together with other civil rights leaders, and it is presumed that the substance of the information contained within these documents was passed to the FBI through our routine liaison channels. Limited sanitization has been effected on two of these documents to delete certain information which is completely unrelated to civil rights and/or the Reverend King.

c. Tab C consists of a 23 May 1967 FBI study entitled "Racial Violence Potential in the United States This Summer," which refers in part to Reverend King. This document was obtained from the Office of Security file on Stokely Carmichael (OS#493 507). No sanitization has been effected on this FBI document.

d. Tab D consists of several FBI documents which refer to either Reverend King and/or Mrs. Coretta (nee: Scott) King obtained from Volumes IV, VII, XIV, XIX of the Office of Security file entitled "Vietnam Peace Drives" (OS#467 849). No sanitization has been effected on these documents.

e. Tab E consists of a 23 August 1961 FBI document entitled "Southern Conference Educational Fund" which mentions Reverend King and was obtained from the Office of Security file concerning the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Incorporated (OS#358 151). No sanitization has been effected on this document.

f. Tab F consists of two FBI documents from the Office of Security file on Mrs. King (OS#541 487). Both of these documents appear to be portions of two separate FBI documents--the first being an excerpt from a 2 July 1968 electronic message and the second being page five of an FBI memorandum identified only by

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the number "NY 100-95954." Mrs. King's file does not contain either of these documents in their entirety. No sanitization has been effected on these documents.

g. Tab G consists of a 15 June 1965 FBI memorandum entitled "Demonstrations Protesting United States Intervention in Vietnam and the Dominican Republic" which mentions Mrs. King. Cited document was obtained from the Office of Security file on the Congress of Unrepresented People (OS#466 698). No sanitization has been effected on this document.

h. Tab H consists of a 5 January 1968 FBI memorandum entitled "Demonstrations Protesting United States Intervention in Vietnam" which mentions Mrs. Coretta (nee: Scott) King. This document was obtained from the Office of Security file pertaining to the Women's Strike for Peace (OS#356 394) and has not been sanitized.

i. Tab I consists of two internal Agency documents and selected pages from an FBI document, all of which concern and/or refer to Reverend King and the FBI's interest in that regard. These documents were obtained from the Office of Security file pertaining to the Black Power Threat (OS#534 051). The selected pages from the FBI document appear to have been extracted from a December 1967 FBI memorandum entitled "The New Left: Road to Anarchy," and the entire document could not be located. No sanitization has been effected on these documents.

3. Also attached hereto as Tab J is a copy of an Agency dispatch from the JMWAVE Project in Miami, Florida, to Headquarters, dated 15 July 1966. This dispatch relates to a joint Dade County Police Department/FBI surveillance of Reverend Martin Luther King which occurred on 19-20 May 1966 and was obtained from the Office of Security file relating to the Peace Center of Miami (OS#333 467). The information within the dispatch concerning the surveillance had been provided to JMWAVE officials in confidence by a representative of the Dade County Police


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Department, without the knowledge of the FBI. This dispatch should be coordinated with the Latin America Division/Directorate of Operations prior to our showing the dispatch to the Department of Justice.

4. Please note that all of these documents are forwarded to you on an "on loan" basis and retain their present classification. It is our recommendation that the Department of Justice be allowed to review the attached documents here in Headquarters in the presence of representatives from both the Office of Security and your Office. Should the Department of Justice determine through this review that they require copies of any of the attached material, additional coordination and/or sanitization could then be accomplished prior to transmitting any of these documents to the Department of Justice.

5. We defer to you as to whether any coordination with the FBI is necessary prior to showing the attached FBI memoranda to the Department of Justice. Please contact Mr. Bruce L. Solie, Chief, Security Analysis Group, extension 7682, when arrangements for the Department of Justice review of this material have been established. Mr. Solie will insure that an Office of Security representative is present during the review.

1. At the Attorney General's direction, a task force was established in May 1976 by the Office of Professional Responsibility of the Justice Department to review the activities of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in relation to the late Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., his assassination and the Bureau's investigation of that murder.

2. Pursuant to the Attorney General's directive, Justice is canvassing those investigative agencies of the Government which might have been contacted by the FBI to secure or deliver information for intelligence, for investigative assistance (before or after the assassination), or for any form of counterintelligence action in relation to Dr. King.

3. It is requested that a check be made of your records to determine the extent and nature of any contacts with CIA by the FBI in regard to the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.

4. DoJ has expressed some urgency in responding to their request. Therefore, please advise this Office of the results of your search at your earliest convenience, but no later than close of business, 21 October 1976.

1. On 12 December 1975, Walter Elder of the Review Staff asked for a file check on James E. Ray, in response to an informal inquiry from Senate Select Committee Staff member Patrick Shea. The SSC is studying FBI activities, including the King assassination and the recently publicized Hoover/King controversy.

2. The bulk of Ray's file consists of news media material. There are two State Department cables reporting information on his extradition from England and two memoranda regarding Ray's first lawyer, Arthur J. Hanes. (Hanes was a confidential correspondent for the Office of Security from 1952 to 1959 and was on the OGC cleared Attorney Panel in 1961. He was identified in news media as a former contract employee of CIA.)

3. Mr. Elder will advise Shea of the above, and the fact that CIA had no file on Ray prior to the King assassination. A formal request is not expected and no further action *appears* necessary at this time.





SUBJECT : Interview of Mr. Edmund X. Klipa by IRS

1. On 13 April 1976 Mr. Edmund X. Klipa, former Special Agent in Charge of the Washington Field Office, now retired, was interviewed in his residence in McLean, Virginia, by Special Agents Sally Grau and Walter Rourke of the Internal Security Division, Internal Revenue Service. Cited interview was conducted in an attempt to identify the IRS employee who disclosed federal taxpayer data concerning Victor Marchetti to the Agency in April 1972. The interview was conducted under ground rules established by the Office of General Counsel in the attached memorandum.

2. Mr. Rourke began the interview by showing Mr. Klipa the blind, undated, and unsigned memorandum which reflects the substance of the Marchetti tax disclosure, which indicates that the taxpayer information had been obtained from a "confidential informant." Mr. Rourke then asked Mr. Klipa if he could place him under oath. Mr. Klipa stated that he did not wish to be placed under oath, that he had never seen the blind memorandum before, that he was not aware that the Agency ever contacted IRS to obtain taxpayer data concerning Marchetti, and that if Mr. Rourke wished to draw up a statement to that effect, Mr. Klipa would sign the statement.

3. Mr. Rourke indicated that he doubted that an affidavit would be necessary, but if so, Mr. Rourke would prepare a formal statement regarding Mr. Klipa's statements during the interview and then present it to Mr. Klipa through the Agency for signature. Mr. Klipa then stated that he felt he could not provide any more information in that he had not been released from his secrecy agreement by the U.S. Attorney General.

4. At this point the undersigned showed Mr. Klipa the attached memorandum prepared by the Office of General Counsel which establishes the agreement between the Agency and the IRS concerning Mr. Klipa's interview. Further, the undersigned explained to Mr. Klipa that the only limiting factor during the interview was that questions concern federal tax disclosures and that in this context Mr. Klipa would not be held to his secrecy agreement. The undersigned also explained that Mr. Klipa was one of several current/former Office of Security employees who had been interviewed in this regard.

5. Mr. Klipa then stated that during the period he was assigned to the Washington Field Office as Special Agent in Charge (July 1972 through June 1973), he was not aware of any requirements to contact the IRS for information nor was he aware of any individuals within WFO who might have maintained such liaison with IRS. Mr. Klipa qualified this statement by indicating that Mr. Howard Osborn, the former Director of Security, had on occasion tasked WFO personnel with sensitive support assignments without Mr. Klipa's knowledge.

6. Mr. Klipa was quite adamant in attempting to confine Mr. Rourke and Ms. Grau's questions to his lack of knowledge of the Marchetti tax disclosure and was quite hesitant to comment further concerning any other cases of which he might have knowledge through his long career with the Agency.

7. In short, Mr. Klipa was somewhat less than cooperative and despite reassurances concerning the purpose of the interview apparently felt that the questions should not extend beyond the Marchetti tax disclosure. Mr. Rourke and Ms. Grau ultimately said that they had no further questions, adding that should the Department of Justice require a sworn statement from Mr. Klipa Mr. Rourke would contact the Agency in order to arrange for Mr. Klipa to sign an affidavit.

8. Upon departing Mr. Klipa's house, enroute back to Headquarters, both Mr. Rourke and Ms. Grau indicated to the undersigned that they were quite sure that Mr. Klipa has knowledge concerning other IRS disclosures to the Agency, although they are convinced he was not aware of the Marchetti tax disclosure. However, Mr. Rourke stated that he intends to

present Mr. Klipa's negative statements concerning the Marchetti disclosure to the Department of Justice and does not intend to flavor his remarks with any indication that Mr. Klipa was concealing information. Mr. Rourke again indicated his hope that this interview would terminate the investigation and result in a declination of prosecution from the Department of Justice.

1. Mr. Edmund Klipa, who is to be interviewed by you in the presence of an Office of Security employee on 13 April 1976, is a former employee of this Agency.

2. It is understood that Mr. Klipa is to be interviewed as a prospective witness and not as a defendant and that he will not be given the so-called "Miranda warning." Also, it is understood that the IRS investigator involved will limit the scope of his inquiry to those questions which relate directly to investigating the disclosure of certain taxpayer information.





1. On this date Mr. Raudenbush from the office of the DDO called the undersigned re the KONICKI case. KONICKI is one of six former employee cases which the Department of Justice is reviewing through the Office of General Counsel. The Department of Justice review is in connection with an examination of Agency cases within the last six years (Statute of Limitations is 5 years for any prosecution and six years for restitution action) where an Agency employee was terminated for some illegal or possibly illegal action, and the Department of Justice was not previously advised.

2. Mr. Raudenbush advised that his interest was in having the Office of Security file on KONICKI made available to the Domestic Collection Division for review in order for DCD to reply to OGC concerning possible ramifications to DCD operations if any legal action was initiated against KONICKI.

3. Mr. Raudenbush was advised that the above request should be directed to the DD/PSI or the Director of Security. However, Mr. Raudenbush was also advised that the Office of Security file would contain little specific information regarding the various DCD activities of KONICKI which would be necessary for DCD impact consideration and that the Office of Security had replied to OGC re any investigative matters of interest in the KONICKI case.

1. Reference is made to OGC 75-2967 which is a 13 August 1975 memorandum from Mr. Richard L. Thornburgh, Assistant Attorney General/Department of Justice, to Mr. John Warner, General Counsel. In the memorandum Mr. Thornburgh requested copies of certain memoranda and other material relating to fourteen specific items.

2. Item 1 of the above request is the only activity involving the Office of Security. Item 1 requests certain memoranda and material concerning "Office of Security File #40287 (October 20, 1971)." This is a reference to the Office of Security file #49287 entitled Wallace Walter Konicki. There was an error in the number on the composite report of domestic surveillance and technical activities furnished to the Rockefeller Commission.

3. It would appear that the Department of Justice concern in the Konicki case is whether an illegal telephone or recording device was used by the Office of Security. It also appears that technical activities involved were with the full knowledge and under the control of the contract employee who alleged that Konicki was, because of veiled threats, receiving money from the contract employee.

4. In order that the Department of Justice can be assured that no illegal telephone tap or illegal microphone was involved in the Konicki case, the pertinent portion of the security file on Konicki has been made available to Mr. George W. Clarke,

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

1. Attached is a Department of Justice request (Tab 1) for all documents and files which reflect the authorization and implementation of certain "domestic" communications intercepts. The files containing these documents should be identified and segregated so that they may be made available for DOJ review at Headquarters.

2. Since there may be confusion about the precise projects or activities in which DOJ is interested, the following is provided as the best information available to this Office concerning the particular paragraphs of the DOJ letter:

a. Paragraph 2: This project is apparently the interception of drug trafficking communications at Brandy Station, Virginia (Memo for D/OC fm C/Special Programs Div/OC, dtd 17 Nov 72, Subj: Drug Related Intercept at Brandy).

b. Paragraph 3: This project appears to be the same as that referred to in Paragraph 2 of the DOJ letter. Information to confirm or refute this assumption is requested.

c. Paragraph 4: Project LONGSHAFT was a program designed to intercept microwave communications from the Peoples Republic of China through the use of a U-2 aircraft. The files on this project are believed to be maintained by the Office of ELINT, DDS&T.

d. Paragraph 5: Project IRONCLAD was an OEL training facility in Southern Florida which routinely intercepted telemetry from the Eastern Test Range for training purposes.

i. Paragraph 10: Foreign radio-telephone intercepts of domestic calls. Based on information provided by the Inspector General, it is believed that this request relates to and is the same as Paragraph 2 of the DOJ letter.

j. Paragraph 11: Equipment tests in Miami in 8/71. See Paragraph 4, Memo for DDO fm C/Division D, dtd 7 May 73, Subj: Potentially Embarrassing Activities Conducted by Division D (Tab 5).

k. Paragraph 12: Division D as distributive channel (See Paragraph 3 of Tab 5).

l. Paragraph 13: Introduction of cleared contacts to NSA (See Paragraph 5 of Tab 5).

m. Paragraph 14: Hearing Ability Tests in San Francisco. (See Memo for IG fm Edward Ryan, dtd 29 May 73, Subj: CIA Intercept of U.S. Communications in San Francisco, California, 8 to 12 May 1971).

3. It is requested that this matter be given priority attention so that DOJ may begin to review the designated files commencing 4 September 1975.

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
