In respect to said content, Tully has me falsely(192), falling out of a speeding car after robbing a grocery; then at (198), he has me as a suspect in the murder of three (3) blacks during a prison riot in the Missouri penotentiary in 1966. Then of course Pimp Tully quoates various convict informants(obviously from FBI files), abvot statements attributed to me.
