SUBJECT: Congressional Notification/Identification of a CIA Employee (Marrell McCollough) in *Time* Magazine

- (U) The purpose of this correspondence is to notify the oversight committees of the identification of a CIA employee in a recent *Time* magazine article (*King Conspiracy Update*, page 29, dated April 14, 1997). The article identifies Mr. Merrell McCullough (sic), who was with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., when Dr. King was assassinated on April 4, 1968.
- (U) The article contains a photo of Mr. McCollough kneeling over Dr. King moments after he was shot. According to the article, conspiracy theorists are focusing on Mr. McCollough as a participant in a US Government conspiracy to murder Dr. King. These theorists believe that Mr. McCollough was a secret US agent who helped cover up the plot. Mr. McCollough was a Memphis, Tennessee, policeman working undercover at the time of the assassination. In the late 1970s, Mr. McCollough testified before the House of Representatives "Stokes" Committee regarding Dr. King's assassination.
- (U) Preceding the Time article, Mr. McCollough's name was mentioned on an episode of ABC's Prime Time Live which aired 3 April 1997. The show identified Mr. McCollough as a CIA employee and implied that he could have been working for the Agency at the time of the assassination. After the show aired, other members of the media began contacting the CIA's Public Affairs Staff (PAS).
- (C) Mr. McCollough entered on duty with the CIA on 23 June 1974 and served as a covert employee from 1974 to 1991; his cover was lifted as of 15 December 1991. Since Mr. McCollough is now an overt CIA employee, we were concerned that the media would attempt to link CIA and the Dr. King assassination. PAS, with direction from the Acting Director of Central Intelligence, gave background information to Mr. Jack White of Time magazine confirming Mr. McCollough's employment with the CIA since 1974. PAS emphasized to Mr. White the fact that Mr. McCollough was not hired until six years after the assassination took place.
- (U) Following Agency policy, Mr. McCollough has reported all contact with the media to PAS.

# **King Conspiracy Update**

For years, conspiracy theorists who beeve that the U.S. government plotted the murder of Martin Luther King Jr. have forused on Merrell McCullough, an uncover Memphis, Tennessee, policemen who was seen crouching beside Ting's body moments after the civil rights leder was shot at the Lorraine Motel 29 reers ago last week.
